## HELP SUN CITY SAVE \$15,000 OR MORE A YEAR, EVERY YEAR

**T**he Nevada State Legislature has imposed a tax on all non-profit Article 81 corporations, including Sun City Summerlin that will cost us at least \$15,000 per year. We can avoid this tax by simply amending our corporate status to a non-profit Article 82 corporation. Neither Sun City, nor its Board of Directors, will gain or lose any authority due to this amendment. At the same time, we can avoid many expensive problems in the future by amending the life of the corporation to perpetual, rather than the 50-year life we currently have.

These changes have been vetted and recommended unanimously by our counsel, accounting manager, executive director and unanimously approved by your Board of Directors.

You will receive, in an upcoming Link magazine, a ballot to approve these two changes. We must receive a majority approval from all our members to make these changes effective. Please **DO NOT** ignore the ballot. Vote YES.

The money you will save will be your own.

# PRESIDENT **President's Message**

## Improvements Vital to Selling Sun City to New Residents

**A**s Sun City Summerlin approaches its 30th year, your Board of Directors has entered into a phase that requires upgrading and refreshing our community facilities.

Your Association is required by state of Nevada law to put aside funds for replacements known as "reserves." Each unit owner contri-

butes to the reserves each month from their \$107 Association assessment. Each component has an estimated useful life and funds are set aside according to that lifespan so that we can have adequate cash available to replace things like the radios used by Security Patrol.

It came to our attention that the radios had to be replaced in order to keep up with technology. Old radios were changed out for digital ones to help keep Security Patrol current.

In recent months, the Board of Directors has taken on several other large projects including:

- New parking lot lighting: \$200,000.
- Hillside landscaping below the homes on No. #18 at Highland Falls Golf Course: \$240,000.
- Desert Vista indoor pool deck: \$40,000.
- Sun Shadows pool and spa resurfacing: \$55,000.

Many of you are aware of the new display monitors in our community centers that keep our residents abreast of programs and meetings. Soon, we will be ordering a new integrated community management software system to replace our old, outdated system. With these projects, Sun City will arrive in the high-tech arena.

Tavern at the Falls and the pro shop are undergoing an upgrade, as well.

It is obvious that all of these projects take cash without getting a loan from an institutional lender. The only way to achieve this preferred method of funding is good management of our reserve funds. This is the case in Sun City. Reserve calculations are reviewed often and adjustments are instituted as needed. Keeping our assets up-to-date and fresh is vital to selling Sun City Summerlin to new residents.

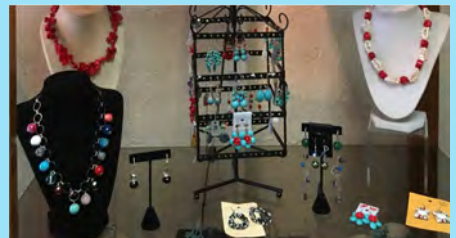

# The Serious Business of Fun

## Sun City Goes All Out for Toys for Tots

**N**othing in life is certain. Except, of course, for the inevitability and taxes. That said, there is something fantastic that's been happening in Sun City Summerlin for the last 22 years. For a little more than two decades, residents and staff members have been participating in the United States Marine Corps' Toys for Tots program. Every October, the Community Services Department coordinates delivery of the big white boxes with the iconic red train logo to Desert Vista, Mountain Shadows, Sun Shadows and the Pinnacle social centers. And, according to several monitors whose desks are within eyeshot of the boxes, when residents see the containers show up the bags of toys start arriving.

"I just love doing this," said one Sun City resident as she placed two Hefty bags full of toys beside a drop-off box at Desert Vista. "I buy toys all year long and squirrel them away until I can bring them down. It's so much fun to shop all year long."

The Marines will accept new, unwrapped toys in Sun City through December 18. In addition to the community-wide drive, several clubs sponsor their own collection throughout the month that benefits Toys for Tots.

The Pickleball Club will hold a tournament at its courts at Desert Vista, December 2-4. All registration fees, donations and toys will go to support Toys for Tots. As in year's past, admission to the Residents' Forum's annual holiday party on December 14, which is open to all residents, is a brand new toy. And then there's the Aquacize Club, where members generously support Toys for Tots with their own activity.

### THE DAY AFTER CHRISTMAS

Working on Toys for Tots does not end when all the shiny new gifts make their way into childrens' hands. In fact, the program remains in full force throughout the year as volun-

teers work to recruit new sponsors, plan more events and strategize ways to exceed the previous year's goals.

For Sun City resident Thomas Boyce, signing up to work on the Toys for Tots campaign was easy – as easy as a former Navyman enlisting in a U.S. Marine Corps. Project.

"Being the only Navy person on the board you can only imagine some of the ribbing I get," Tom said. "You have to be Marine/Navy to understand that, but it's all good and all in fun."

Tom says he was drafted, so to speak, into Toys for Tots by a friend who thought it would be a good fit for both Tom and TFT.

"I've got to tell you, when I get up in the morning I have Toys for Tots on the brain. When I go to bed I keep a pad and pen alongside the bed.

There have been many mid-morning wake-ups due to an idea and sometimes it's hard to fall back to sleep, so I hit the computer and work it.

It's no surprise Tom's commitment to the program stems from the Marines' credo: "Every child deserves a Christmas."



“I wear my heart on my sleeve. Just making conversation with people on subjects of the need around us for kids, the elderly, the poor, animals the list goes on and on, I become emotional because I need to support the things that cannot support themselves.”

And channel that energy he has.

Before TFT, Tom worked on the Las Vegas Police vs. Firefighters’ charity golf event from 2002 to 2008. Proceeds from the event benefitted both the Police Athletic League and the University Medical Center burn unit.

Over the years, Tom has been involved with fundraising for various groups. For him, it’s all about the journey toward the goal.

“Every year a non-profit wants to outdo itself and this year we did just that with the annual Toys for Tots golf tournament that took place in November. Auction prizes were amazing and the money raised for the charity will help a lot next year. Looking forward, I intend to continue non-profit work and charge ahead with my beliefs because I am proud to be a part of a group of men and women – Marines, Army, Navy, Coast Guard, active and non-active, as well as civilians alike – who not only have served our country but have the same passion. They are all simply wonderful people to work with and that is another win-win for me.”

**A**t the October Common Area Properties meeting, Jim Weniger and Fred Baniecki from Sun City's Softball Club offered a presentation to the committee for upgrading the ballfield with artificial turf. According to both

Brandon finished his report by updating the committee on the recent work completed at Highland Falls. While the golf course was closed for overseed in September/October, the pro shop office was expanded, new paint and tile were added, and the outside of the building was painted.

As to special projects, it was noted that special projects chairman Ken Resnik recommended that the committee complete a survey of the lights around the community by taking a tour of Sun City and making notes of possible improvements.

Louis Darling, SCSCAI landscape manager, reported on several upcoming projects, including the color plantings at the Rampart/Del Webb entrance, the addition of two trees at the Mountain Shadows fountain and patio-area renovations.

As for golf maintenance, Brian Bagwell, golf course maintenance general manager, told the committee that overseed was a success. SCSCAI Executive Director Paul Henderson added that the golf course supervisors did an excellent job. The common areas behind residents' houses will be addressed next.

Under new business, Paul presented the plan for the Highland Falls patio enclosure that was approved in the budget. A motion was made and passed. Committee member Rhoda Ring presented her sub-committee's renovation plans for Tavern at the Falls, which CAP turned over to Paul in order to develop a timeline to coordinate the project.

Ken Caroccia then reported that Paul had completed a water expense chart that showed reduced water usage over the last four years. From 2013-2016, savings along the golf courses have resulted in \$100,000 and approximately \$170,000 for landscaping with even bigger savings projected next year. Overall, SCSCAI's water bill averages \$1.7 million a year.

Team leader Sherry Gunderson inspected Sun Shadows and Brandon has the work orders. Team leader Murray Waks inspected the Pinnacle and most issues have been taken care of.

Next, SCSCAI Building Maintenance Supervisor Brandon Balek reported that he would put together a cost estimate for the proposed shade covers for the Sun Shadows bocce ball courts for the committee to review. CAP would then be able to give its recommendations on the project to the Board of Directors. Brandon also reported that the hot water heater at The Summit restaurant had been replaced, and that the ballroom lighting controls at Desert Vista are old and need to be replaced. A motion to upgrade the lighting now was made and passed.

## Community Preparedness Committee

**Sun City's K-9 Corps seeks to provide an ideal opportunity for dog owners to contribute a simple but meaningful service to their community**



If you have a dog that you regularly take for walks, you are encouraged to learn about Sun City's K-9 Corps. The committee is enlisting pet owners who routinely walk their dogs throughout the community, day or night. If you follow a common route you are familiar with the people and places that you pass, as



and a good one," said Kathy Cassell, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department crime prevention specialist. The focus is on crime prevention, but the real premise is neighbors helping neighbors. Sun City Security Patrol Assistant Chief, Dick Clark, agreed: "Any time we can get our residents involved, it's a good thing. I support it."

All K-9 Corps dogs participating in the program must be leashed. Pet owners do not confront anyone or intervene in suspected criminal activity. Depending on occurrences, K-9 volunteers are asked to notify Security Patrol, 702-254-2303, or if they intercept an emergency situation, they may take it upon themselves to dial 911. That's all there is to it.

Much the same as organized Neighborhood Watch groups, participants act as the eyes and ears of the community. In Neighborhood Watch, residents note papers and packages collecting in driveways, as well as empty trash cans left outdoors for prolonged time periods. Lights that are not lit after dark, or not switched off at daylight are among clues that might signify something is amiss.

Sun City's K-9 Corps will provide increased visibility to Security Patrol cars that monitor the community. Red dog tags will be worn by participating dogs. K-9 Corps volunteers won't wear badges or official credentials that might encourage anyone to venture beyond "eyes and ears only."

The bottom line: If you see something, say something. Personal contact with residents always will remain the responsibility of Security Patrol or LVMPD officers.

Please note we will only prepare returns for electronic filing, no paper returns. Also note that we cannot prepare state returns, rental property deductions, business or partnership (K-1) income other than simple interest, dividends or capital gains. ### What to Do If you Receive More Than One Copy of the Link

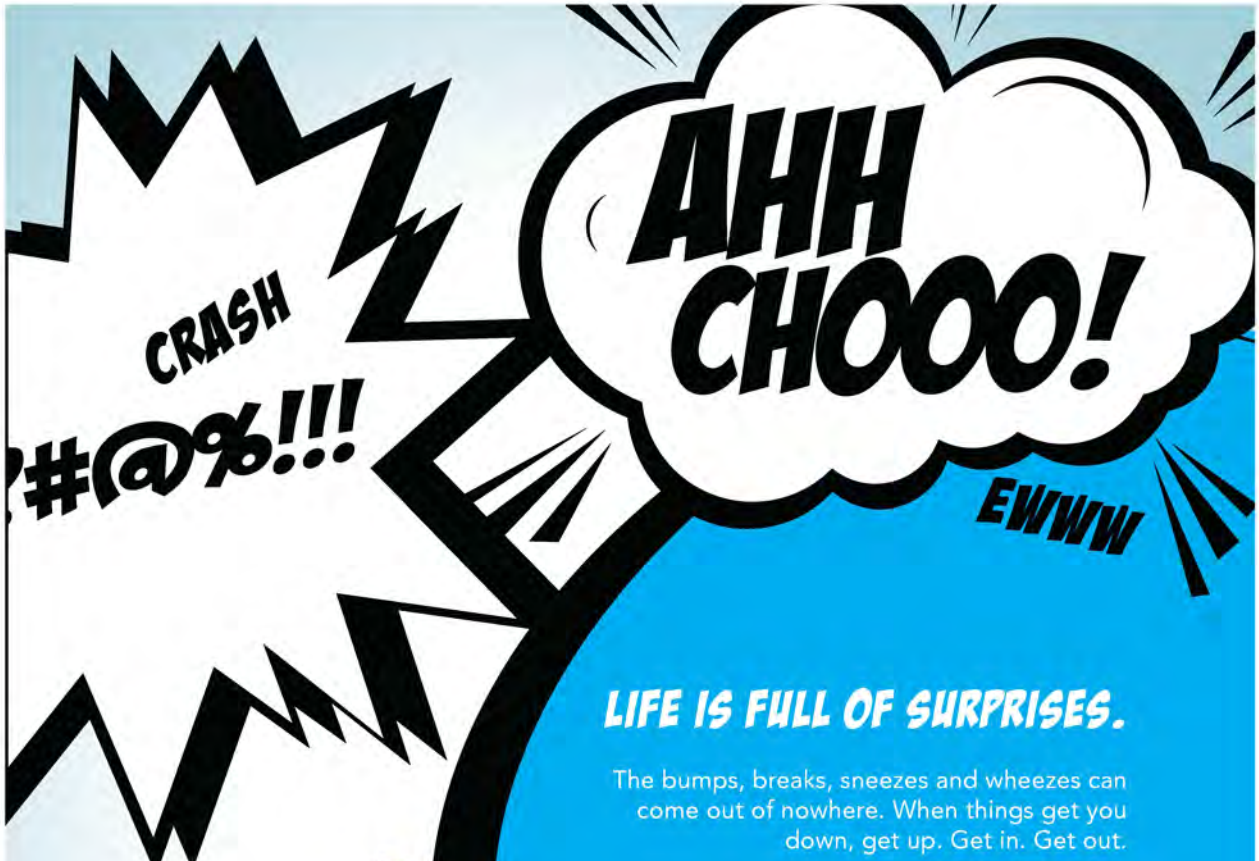

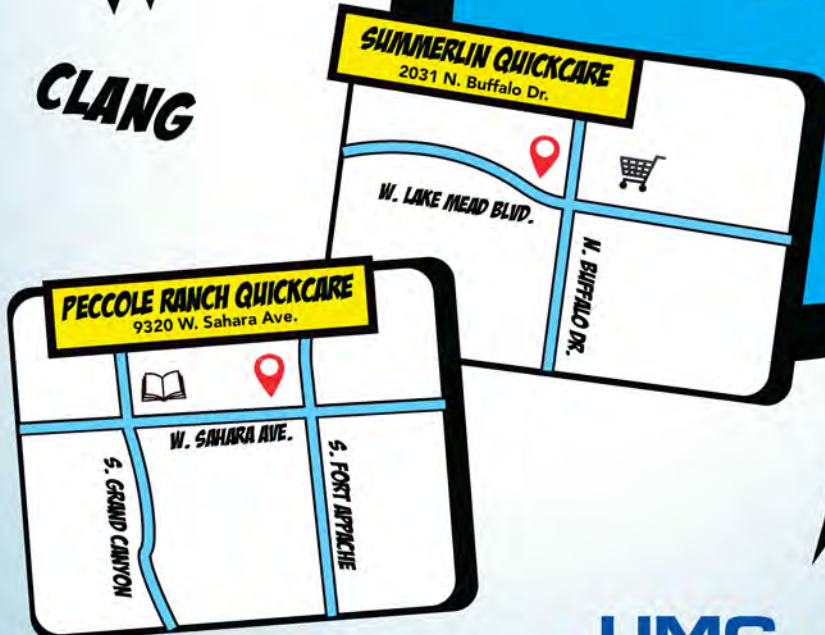

## Charli's Corner

*Using Dumbbells.  
One Arm Row  
With Triceps  
Kick Back*

**A**s I discussed last month, using dumbbells comes with many benefits. You can work more than one muscle group at a time, strengthen your core and learn functional movements. This month's exercise – the one arm row with a triceps kick back will do all of those! The one arm row will strengthen your back, specifically the Latissimus Dorsi, and the back of your arm, the tricep.

When doing a new exercise, practice the movement with a lighter dumbbell to work on your form. Then add weight so you can feel the muscle groups you're targeting.

1. Start by placing one knee on a flat bench and place your same side arm at rest in front of you on the bench. Place your other leg, stepped out wide for balance, on the floor.
2. Keep your back straight and abdominals pulled in. Start with your arm extended and the dumbbell facing toward the floor.
3. Pull your elbow up, keeping your arm by your side until your upper arm is line with your torso to create a 90-degree angle with your elbow.
4. Press the dumbbell back and up by extending your lower arm as you straighten out your elbow.
5. Return your elbow to a 90-degree angle.
6. Slowly lower the dumbbell back to the starting position.
7. Do 1 to 3 sets of 10 to 15 repetitions.

**“We Need You!”**

**A**s the World War II poster of Uncle Sam said, “We Need You!” Yes, indeed, Security Patrol needs you.

There are 73 miles of streets and just under 7,800 residences in Sun City Summerlin. The Sun City Security Patrol has helped the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department make this community one of the safest places to live in the United States. We have 216 volunteer members who serve as watch

commanders, dispatchers, drivers, information center officers, as well as fill board positions and 33 staff duties.

Security Patrol has six four-hour shifts. The shifts begin at midnight, 4 and 8 a.m., noon, and 4 and 8 p.m. The Information Centers are open every day from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On average, we run about three cars per shift.

Assuming we have three drivers on each shift, we need 22 volunteers per day. That equals 660

volunteers needed for a 30-day month. With only 216 volunteer members (and that number is reduced by members who are sick, on vacation or extended leaves of absence). So, you can see we face a difficult task. It is obvious that many members are covering multiple shifts, and burnout is a major concern.

There are more than 15,000 residents of Sun City, but only about 1.4% are contributing to the safety of the community. (This does not include vigilant citizens.)

There are 168 hours in a week, but take out time for sleeping, eating and hygiene and that leaves only about 84 hours of free time. We ask for only four hours a week of that time, or 4.8%. Isn't your security and that of your neighbors worth four hours a week of your time?

As you would assume, the midnight and 4 a.m. shift has the most critical need. We provide the training, and the Association provides the cars and uniforms, as well as several other needs.

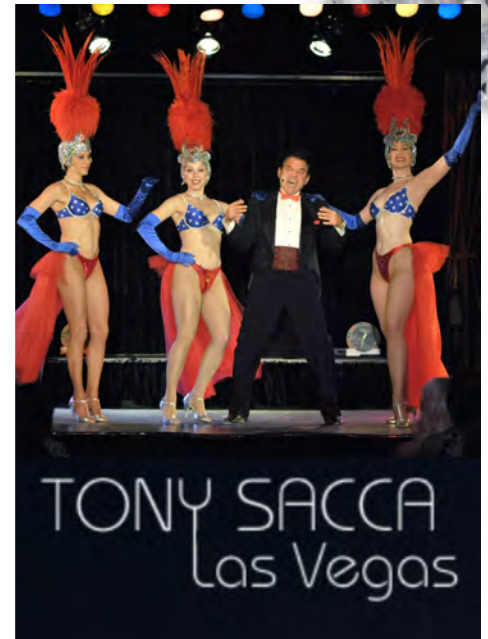

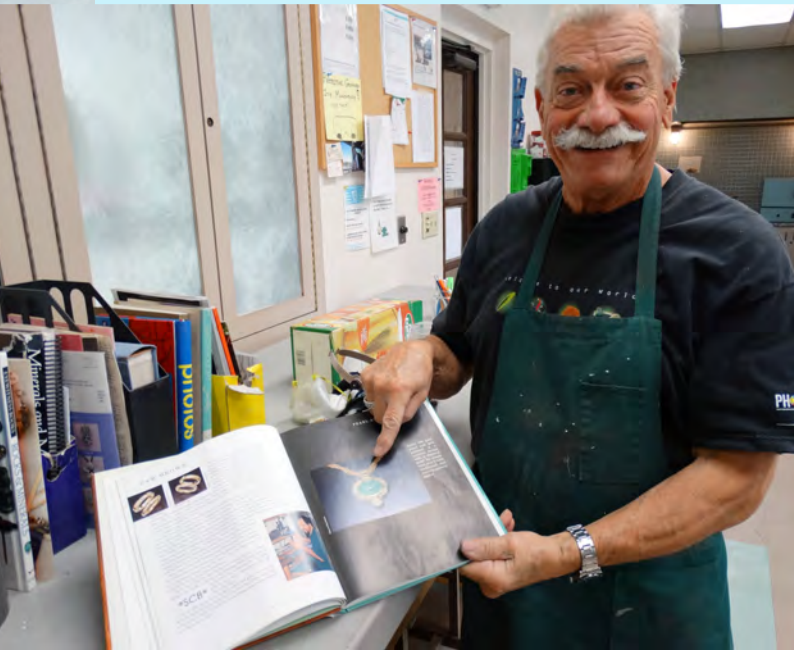

## CLUB SPOTLIGHT: Silversmithing One Side of Three-part Club

**A** couple of years ago we bought a home here in Sun City. I remember walking through all of the community centers and seeing the variety of arts/crafts to explore. At the Mountain Shadows craft building, the glass fusion display window caught my eye and I couldn't take my eyes off of it. I loved the shininess, the textures and the glow of the glass. I knew I had to try it.

I had the "I can't do that," and "I've never done that before, I'm not creative" jitters. Then, I took the introductory class offered by a club member and learned about the tools and materials to begin making wonderful, shiny glass items from bowls to pendants to plates to wall art. Now, I can't stop loving it. So, the moral of this story is give yourself a chance to try something new. Club members are available to teach you everything you need to know.

The full name of this amazing club is Silver, Lapidary & Glass Fusion. While the three mediums are taught and crafted by members, the December display at Mountain Shadows focuses only on the silver and lapidary sections of the club; glass fusion is given its own display in January.

**Silver** – The Silver Club uses the old cast method that involves making a mold and shooting silver (using a centrifugal vat) into the mold. Following the initial training class, and after a resident opts to join the club, he/she can learn flat wax applications (bracelets, pendants, belt buckles, earrings and necklaces) and soldering. The studio is amazing, housing all the necessary equipment that is available to all club members.

**Lapidary** – This section of the club features all the equipment needed to shape, form and polish rocks. Classes are offered to help orient members to the equipment and safety. A perfect place for all you rock hounds out there. Club members will teach you everything you need to know.

Give yourself a chance to try something new; come in and check us out. Make your own art, join a group of folks who have like interests in creative endeavors, who are willing to share what they have learned from their experiences.
