April Crime Spree Puts Community On Alert

Sun City Summerlin is working closely with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, Northwest Area Command, on several incidents that occurred in the community last month.

Those incidents, which occurred from Thursday, April 7 to Sunday, April 10, included two attempted robberies of residents at gun point, two break-ins of the Sun City Computer lab and classroom at the Pinnacle Community Center and three home break-ins.

Sun City's Board of Directors is exploring expanding the current alarm and video surveillance systems throughout our facilities, including installing security cameras at all of our main entrances. In addition, the Association is committed to working with Metro to help residents stay vigilant during this time of heightened alert.

Please remember that if you see something, say something. Everyone needs to be aware of what is going on in their neighborhoods to help ensure our community continues to remain one of the safest places to live in Las Vegas. If you don't know your neighbors, get to know them. Metro officers cite establishing relationships with your neighbors as a key deterrent to crime. It is important. Don't hesitate: If you see something suspicious, call 311; if you see a crime taking place, call 911.

Metro's Neighborhood Watch program remains a strong, viable option for residents seeking to secure their neighborhoods. I would encourage all members to take advantage of the Association's policy of offering a free meeting room to those seeking to organize a Neighborhood Watch on their block. At the Coffee With a Cop event on May 26, Neighborhood Watch will be discussed at great length. Please see the ad on page 26.

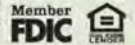

Digital Projects Keep Sun City Up to Speed

The Information Technology Committee is responsible for evaluating and reviewing the adequacy of the hardware and software requirements of Sun City. Over the last couple of years, Leo Crawford and the strong IT Committee has recommended cost-effective changes along with progressive additions and improvement to our digital community. The current IT committee looks forward to continuing the good work.

Golfers can already see the benefit of upgrades to the reservation system. But there are more changes coming to help all of Sun City.

One major step is the replacement of our old, outdated phone system. Changes will not only bring the equipment up to date, but also will considerably reduce the phone bills saving Sun City literally thousands of dollars each month.

Mountain Shadows Community Center has new technology. The new addition is an electronic

information bulletin board. The dynamic, active display shows what is happening at Mountain Shadows, as well as Sun City's coming attractions. This pilot program will be coming to other community centers in the near future. If you haven't seen the display, stop by and take a look.

Desert Vista is benefiting from a very important technical addition. Wi-Fi will be available throughout the facility including poolside. There will be some, but very few, restrictions on access to the Internet, so when you are at Desert Vista, feel free to check your email, log on to Facebook or stream music. Check it out! Again, this project is just the beginning. Look for Wi-Fi next year at Mountain Shadows and the Pinnacle.

Keep your eyes and ears open, Sun City residents. The IT committee will continue to work with the Board of Directors and Administration to keep our community technically and digitally up to date.

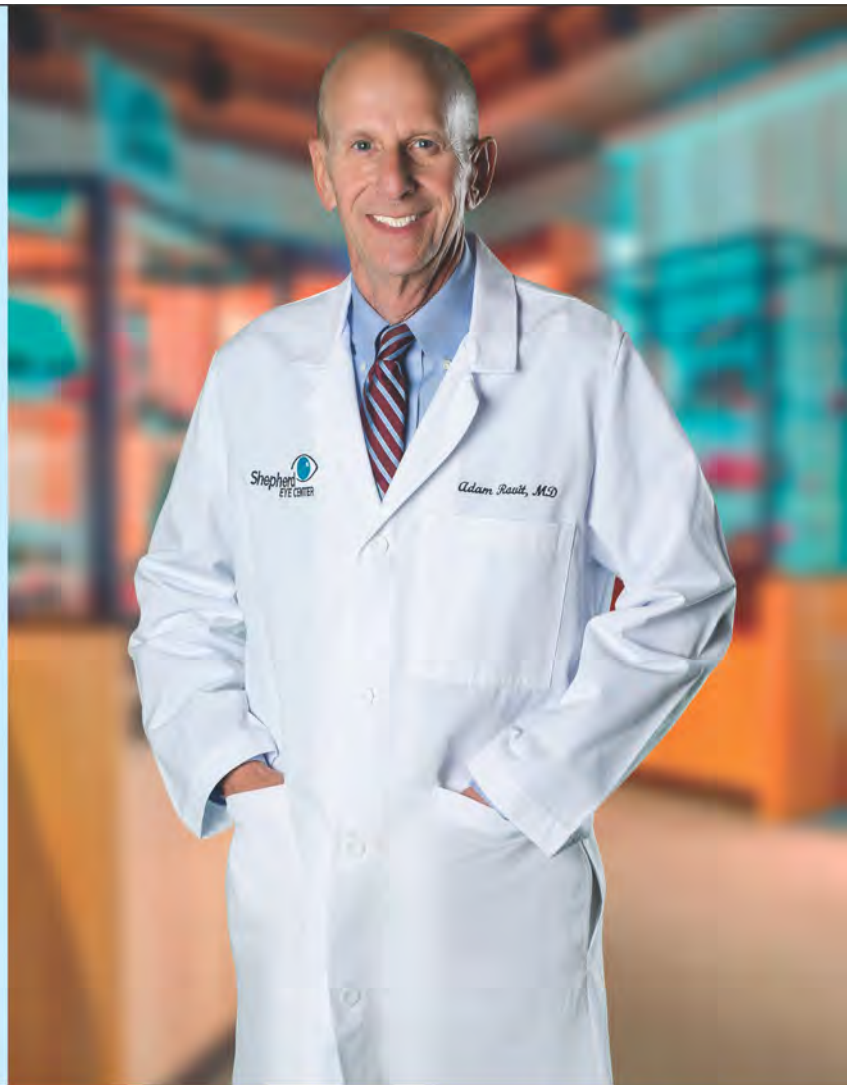

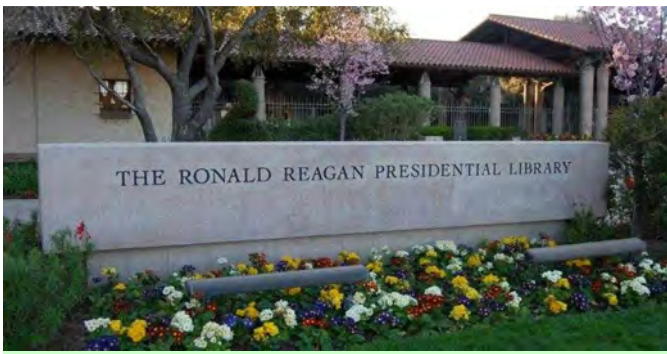

- ◆ **Highland Falls Golf Course bunker project** – Rebuilds sand traps plagued by stones that contaminate the sand and make play difficult.
- ◆ **Highland Falls Golf Course driving range expansion** – Increases the driving range to 18 practice tees, levels the practice greens and improves the practice bunkers. This should bring more golfers to play the course.
- ◆ **Free Wi-Fi at Desert Vista** – Includes the ballroom, fitness centers and outdoor pool, as well as the club rooms. This is a test that will be extended to Mountain Shadows and Pinnacle in 2017 (if determined to be successful and useful).
- ◆ **Turf reduction throughout the golf courses and social centers of Desert Vista and Pinnacle** – Reduces water usage by 10 percent or \$200,000 per year.

- ◆ **Switch to LED lighting in all parking lots and sports courts** – Expected to reduce electricity costs by \$100,000 per year.
- ◆ **New Golf Summerlin Website** – Updated and current look to help promote play on the courses.

Proposed for Approval on June Budget:

- ◆ **New pool furniture for Desert Vista and Pinnacle outdoor pools** – With the successful and attractive look of the Mountain Shadows pool area, it is time to make all the pools look refreshed and beautiful.
- ◆ **New patio furniture for all three golf courses** – So the restaurants can serve food outside and our golfers can have comfortable seating overlooking the courses.
- ◆ **Installation of public information display units** in all social and fitness centers to advertise Sun City events, club meetings and specials at the golf courses and restaurants. A test unit will be installed first at Mountain Shadows.
- ◆ **New Sun City Summerlin website** that will incorporate both the Link and SCSCAI information, while also promoting our great community and lifestyle.
- ◆ **New furniture in the Desert Vista ballroom and auditorium** – The chairs and tables are moved so much that they are worn out and uncomfortable.

What You Can Do to Avoid Being Burglarized

Most crimes occur between 10 a.m. to noon and 5 to 9 p.m.

The Security Patrol is well aware of the burglaries within our community. At March's Coffee With the Board, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department Northwest Area Command Lieutenant Nick Farede led a discussion on community crime, taking resident questions and listening to first-hand experiences.

"Year-to-date, from January to last night (March 17) at 11 p.m., there have been 14 burglaries in Sun City," Farede said. "There are many rumors of higher numbers, but this is it. A lot of those are crimes of opportunity. The majority of homes involved back up to the golf courses because they are easy-access properties. Most crimes occur between 10 a.m. to noon and 5 to 9 p.m."

Metro clarified that there is little that the department or the Patrol can do about this.

BUT YOU CAN BY:

1. Lock all your doors and windows **ALL THE TIME**, and that includes your garage door – even if you are working around your property.
2. Deadbolts and doors matter. The deadbolt with at least a 1-inch throw bolt into a solid wood, metal or security door can deter forced entry. Use 3-inch screws in the strike plate. Two locks are better than one.
3. Light the night. Criminals do not seek out well-lit homes to break into. Nor do they seek out well-lit areas to hide, vandalize, or commit other crimes. Be sure the front and back are completely illuminated so you can see what is going on.
4. Glass is vulnerable. All windows and sliding doors have weakness due to the ease of breakage. Reinforce with security laminate film and do not have any locking devices near glass. Reduce the opportunity to maneuver the glass out of the door or window tracks by using secondary locking devices or screw in the track to prevent lifting.
5. Spare keys let anyone in. Do not leave spare keys outside for any reason. Carry a spare yourself, or give it to a trusted friend/neighbor/relative. Unattended keys are a risk.
6. Be found easily. Make sure your home address is visible night or day. Emergency responders look for address information when responding to your home for any emergency. Flashing light. When you summon emergency help, be sure to turn on your flashing light on the switch at your front door. Check that the Association and Security Patrol have an up-to-date emergency contact form.
7. Create the look and sound of occupancy whether at home or away. Use timed lights, radios or TVs turned on. Always answer the door, but do not open to anyone you do not know or are not expecting. Say, "I don't open my door to strangers. Go away!"
8. Who are the people in your neighborhood? Meet your neighbors. Begin or participate in Neighborhood Watch. Look out for each other and create a sense of surveillance over your neighborhood.
9. What do you own? Create and maintain a home content inventory list. Be sure you record the serial number of each item if it has one. Photos or a video of your home's contents would be valuable in possible recovery following a theft.
10. Pay attention! Listen and observe. When you see and what you hear may need to be reported to Metro and/or the Patrol. Be aware of all activity. Write things down (our memories are not so good as when we were much younger). Report suspicious people, cars and activity.
11. The hardware stores have the devices referred to above, and the staff to help you. Consider visiting the following websites: www.nevadasecurityassociation.org or www.lvmpd.com, or contact the **Metro Crime Prevention Specialist, Kathy Cassell, at (702) 828-4305**. She will evaluate your home's security at no charge.

ONE BIG DILEMMA

Consider this. According to the National Center for Biotechnology Information, in the year 2000 the average adult human attention span was 12 seconds; in 2015, 8.25 seconds. Compare that to the generally accepted 3-minute attention span of a 3-month-old puppy by several leading dog-training camps, and we're in trouble.

Why? Because despite the many signs posted throughout the community, whether by the administrative association or residents on their own property, a dog cannot read. It is unfortunate that in Sun City Summerlin many look upon dogs as a nuisance when, in fact, it would make more sense to transfer their ire to the offending party – the irresponsible dog owner.

It is a fact: Dogs bark. Dogs take bathroom breaks. Many dogs need and enjoy walks with their owners, and some

dogs crave play dates with their pals around the community.

A quick scan of the Internet yields numerous articles on the health benefits of dog ownership by senior citizens. In addition, data by the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA) reports that roughly 37 percent of all seniors living in the United States own at least one dog. So, if one-third of the U.S. senior population owns a dog, how can such a small, three-letter-word entity cause so much frustration?

Same Answer: Irresponsible dog owners.

That is not to say that all dog owners are negligent. In fact, most are great – they are respectful of property, courteous to their neighbors and they obey civic ordinances. But like everything else, it's the bad apple that spoils the bushel.

"It is really a great experience to walk dogs in Sun City, especially along the main boulevards where the mature trees provide patches of welcome shade all along the way," said resident Vicki Carnes (left). "Me and the boys



enjoy the pretty landscaping, the incredible views, the occasional benches to take a break on and, most of all, the super friendly people who stop to comment on how adorable Higgins and Chummy are. There is a very high level of pride in the neighborhood as I rarely see a dog mess or litter anywhere along the streets. Now if I could just keep my dogs from wanting to chase bunnies. I just love walking my dogs in Sun City!”

According to Sun City resident Carmen Sorvillo, “The issue to me is that of private property. When I lived in a villa it wasn’t too unusual to have strangers walk their dogs on the common property up front and behind. It’s one of the reasons that we bought a house. No one has the right to allow their dog to roam on my front yard and driveway, urinating on my garage door, eliminating on my rocks and kicking them across the sidewalk.”

Other observations from residents who call the Link to discuss dog-related issues and story ideas revolve around waste bags they see left behind or disposed of in a neighbor’s trash can. While there may not be a law against it, ditching your dog’s droppings in someone else’s trash can is not a good idea. Neither is picking up after your dog and then leaving the sealed bag on the sidewalk or in someone else’s front yard to be picked up. C’mon.

As for the law: The city of Las Vegas requires all dogs be on a leash when outside their homes and yard areas. Any dog owner caught breaking the law could face a penalty ranging from a warning up to as much as a \$1,000 fine. Failure to scoop up after your four-legged friend is technically a misdemeanor and a complaint regarding barking can land you in mediation court. If your dog bites

someone, you can be held civilly liable for personal injury and, depending on circumstances, criminally prosecuted. After that, the potential for citation gets furry. According to Las Vegas Animal Control, officers do not patrol neighborhoods for such infractions. Rather, they are dispatched to calls that involve public safety. And they are busy. A recent conversation with an Animal Control officer revealed that their phone lines are live, 24/7. That said, be warned, if an Animal Control officer happens to be in the neighborhood and all forces align, you could get a ticket.

AREA DOG PARKS

When Del Webb created the master plan for Sun City Summerlin nearly 30 years ago it did not account for a dog park. The amenity simply was not on the drawing board as it is now for so many communities that have come online in the last dozen years. To allow for a designated space after the fact is challenging. Concerns for property values, maintenance, parking, landscaping, right of way, etc. are real. However, if you are looking for an organized park to visit with your dog/dogs, you’re in luck. Whether you live at the top of the hill or the bottom, the city has provided for a number of nearby parks that are fully fenced. While some offer sections for small and large-size dogs, all have tons of cushy grass and a water source, while others are lit for nighttime enjoyment.

What Is CarFit?

CarFit technicians will work with each resident to ensure they fit their vehicle for maximum comfort and safety

CarFit is an educational program created by the American Society on Aging and developed in collaboration with the American Automobile Association (AAA), American Association of Retired People (AARP) and the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA). This month, the Fitness Department will offer two events on older driver safety.

The CarFit screening event is scheduled for May 20 at Desert Vista. It is an educational program that offers older adults the opportunity to check how well their personal vehicle fits them. Residents will receive information and materials on community-specific resources that could enhance their safety as drivers, and/or increase their mobility in the community.

At our CarFit screening event, a team of trained technicians and/or health professionals will work with each resident to ensure they fit their vehicle for maximum comfort and safety.

A CarFit check takes approximately 20 minutes to complete. Residents will need to sign up in advance with the Desert Vista Social Monitor for an appointment. You must have your car with you at this event.

In addition, we will have an educational seminar on May 24 presented by occupational therapist Debbie Hanson, who will discuss in further detail about older driver safety and what you can do to improve your driving situation. Residents may sign up for this event with any social monitor.

Driver safety programs help improve adult driver safety by addressing cognitive abilities and skills. However, older drivers also can improve their safety by ensuring their cars are properly adjusted for their use. A proper fit in one's car can greatly increase not only the driver's safety but also the safety of others.

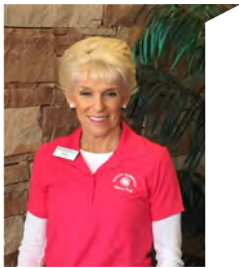

Charli's Corner

*How to
Work Your
Core –
Part II*

Back extensions improve your posture and core. Let's review. There are three major muscle groups that make up your core – rectus abdominus for crunching (demonstrated in last month's Link), obliques for rotation, and back extensors for standing upright. For a strong and healthy core you need to include exercises that strengthen all three muscle groups.

Sun City fitness centers have two different machines that do a great job in working back extensor muscles.

♦ **Back Extension Machine located at Pinnacle and Mountain Shadows.** Sit on the machine, align your hip with the pivot point of the machine (colored dot) and place your upper back against the back pad. Engage your core by pulling your abs in tight and slowly move the pad backward until your shoulders are behind your hips. You'll know when you've gone too far when your back begins to arch. Return to start position. Perform 2 to 3 sets of 10-15 repetitions.

♦ **Low Back Angled Apparatus located at Mountain Shadows and Desert Vista.** Adjust the upper leg pad to rest on your upper thigh. Step on the foot pad while holding on to the handles (toes facing towards floor). Your body



will be at a diagonal. Begin to slowly lower your upper body toward the floor. Start with a small range of motion. Return to an upward position by lifting your upper body until you feel your body is at back to a diagonal angle to the floor. Avoid hyper-extending your lower back. Lower and repeat upper torso lift for 2 to 3 sets of 10-15 repetitions.

Next month, we will discuss how to do rotation exercises to complete your core training.

MR. GYM ETIQUETTE

Nobody likes to wait in line – and waiting for a pool lane or a piece of fitness equipment is no different. Our 30-minute time limits help make sure that no one has to wait too long for any one machine or swim lane. Be as respectful of the time for others as you expect them to be for you.

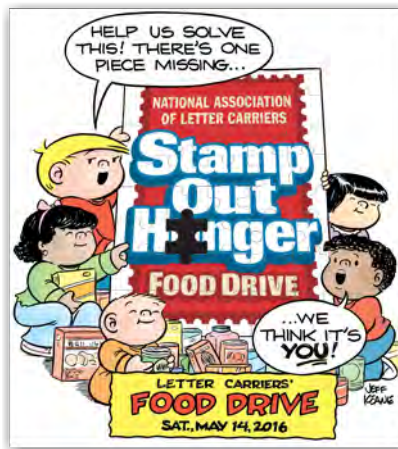
Help Stamp Out Hunger on May 14

Members of the National Association of Letter Carriers will once again pick up food donations while on their regularly scheduled mail delivery routes through Sun City. Some postal customers may receive a Stamp Out Hunger plastic bag in the mail as a reminder of the largest one-day food drive in the nation.

However, it is not required to use the Stamp Out bag to donate. To take part in the food drive, simply leave a bag or bags of non-perishable food items at the base of your mailbox. When your letter carrier delivers your mail, he/she also will pick up your food donation. It's that easy.

Top requested non-perishable food items are cereal, pasta, pasta sauce or spaghetti sauce, rice, canned fruits and vegetables, canned meals (such as soups, chili and pasta), 100 percent juice, peanut butter, macaroni & cheese, canned protein (tuna, chicken and turkey) and beans (canned or dry).

All food collected in Las Vegas stays in the city to be divided among local food banks.

Bereavement Group Helps Members Move On

The loss of a loved one is a major life-changing event. Those left to mourn suffer the most profound pain of the human experience. We react with a full measure of emotion: rage, guilt, fear, confusion and doubt as long-held precepts are challenged.

When Hariet Miller, a Sun City Summerlin neighbor, experienced the sudden loss of her son and then the illness and loss of her husband, she struggled alone to piece together her shattered existence. Sustained by an inner strength one would not expect in this petite, seemingly fragile woman, Hariet set about putting her life in order.

In the throes of anguish Hariet learned what she could about living with bereavement and loss. She immersed herself in classes on bereavement counseling and braved two years of one-on-one sessions with a bereavement specialist. She learned that the agony cannot be cured, but it can be managed. As the loss finds its place in our existence it is reassuring to know that life becomes livable once again.

Hariet resolved to apply her newly found knowledge to help others. Seven years ago she started the bereavement/grief support group in Sun City Summerlin. The skills learned from her own counseling sessions enable Hariet to comfort and support the members, who, in turn, sustain each other.

Bereavement group members report that in the early days of loss they spend a lot of time crying, especially in the evening. And then there's the guilt. Why did I...? Why didn't I...? What if I had...? If only I had...

Being among kindred spirits enables members to vent without

inflicting their emotional havoc on friends and family. Helping others in the group is fundamental. In addition to the biweekly sessions, members may get together in social settings; dinners and shows are the most common. New friendships are often formed within the group. Some members gain comfort from pets; other find solace in writing. "Whatever helps to enhance the

healing process is worthwhile," Hariet maintains.

"The biggest healer is time," Hariet said. "It is important for the member to understand that life does get better. Change does come about. Life does become worth living. But it takes time."

Membership in the group has ranged from a few to as many as 20 men and women. The number changes as people work through their suffering and begin to heal.

"When a member leaves the group, I count that as a success," Hariet said. "It means that person has found a way to cope with the loss."

In addition to emotional support, the group offers practical information. For example, the family should order, at the very least, five death certificates for future needs, such as probate and inheritance taxes. If the deceased was a veteran, the VA may require a copy. It is easier and usually cheaper to order a large number of copies at first and save the need to reorder later.

The bereavement/grief support group meets at Sun Shadows Community Center. The first Monday of the month meeting is at 1 p.m.; the third Monday meeting is at 1:30 p.m. For information, call 471-0203.

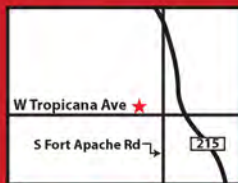

CLUB SPOTLIGHT: Silver, Lapidary & Glass Fusion

Think of it as three clubs in one – silver, lapidary (working with stones and gemstones) and glass fusion or kilnformed art. Members working in the media of the first part of the Club's name, silver and lapidary, claim the lobby display cases at Mountain Shadows in January to showcase their work. A few months later, in May, members who work with fused glass take center stage.

According to Club President Sam Miller, "There are many forms of glass art. Fused glass is one of them. The basic idea behind fused glass is that art objects can be created by melting glass in a kiln. Fused glass is an accessible and rewarding art form for many people, and, unlike stained glass, fused glass has no lead lines."

Basic techniques involved in fusing glass entail placing two or more pieces of glass in a kiln and heating the objects until they blend "fuse" together into a single piece. When an artist places a piece of glass over an object and heats it 'til the glass "melts" over the shape, the result is slumped or draped glass.

Not everyone who joins the club is an experienced artist. In fact, Sam says that's the fun of it. As long as there is an interest in creating art, Sam guarantees there is a member who will help newbies through the process. Come next January and May, new members will have a chance to display their creativity for all to see.

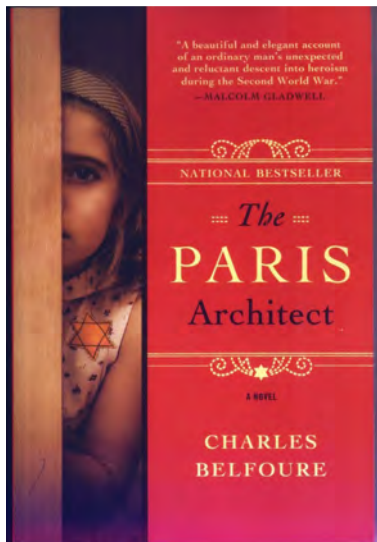

CLUB SPOTLIGHT: Gun Club Sun City Club Teaches Responsible Ownership

The Primary Rule of gun safety: “Always keep the gun pointed in a safe direction,” said Gun Club President Allen Sakaguchi.

This year, for the first time ever, the Gun Club will offer novice gun owners a workshop that provides training in safe gun handling, including the disassembling, cleaning and reassembling of firearms. The three primary instructors are retired law enforcement firearms instruction professionals who emphasize careful storage of guns so that visiting grandchildren never discover a weapon that is not secured.

Fifteen men and women attended the first three-hour class in March. To learn of future classes, Allen advised members to check the Gun Club listing in the Link.

Of the first workshop, Allen said his takeaway was that the attendees were comfortable with the degree of information provided. In creating the class, Allen said he focused the message at the novice level, covering such basics as what is a bullet, various types of firing mechanisms, as well as maintenance and, when buying a gun, why one weapon might be more practical than another. Along the way, Allen stopped to show examples of several of the firearms covered during the class.

“My involvement in the Gun Club is encouraged by strong personal support of the Second Amendment and the opportunity to use my firearms’ skill sets to serve the community,” Allen said.

In a senior community, gun safety issues may involve handling a weapon left behind by a deceased gun owner. Often, surviving family members have never touched a gun and the gun they find in a closet or drawer is armed. If that ever happens, Allen welcomes the call from a resident looking for assistance.

Aside from the class, the Club focuses on familiarizing members with local firing range facilities. And experienced Club members offer personal marksmanship training at nearby firing ranges.

There are many reasons why some people choose to own guns and others do not. When a Gallup poll surveyed why Americans own guns, 60 percent replied, “For personal protection.” Other gun owners listed hunting, recreation, sport, target shooting and their Constitutional Second Amendment right to keep and bear arms.

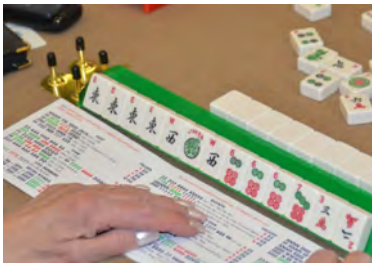

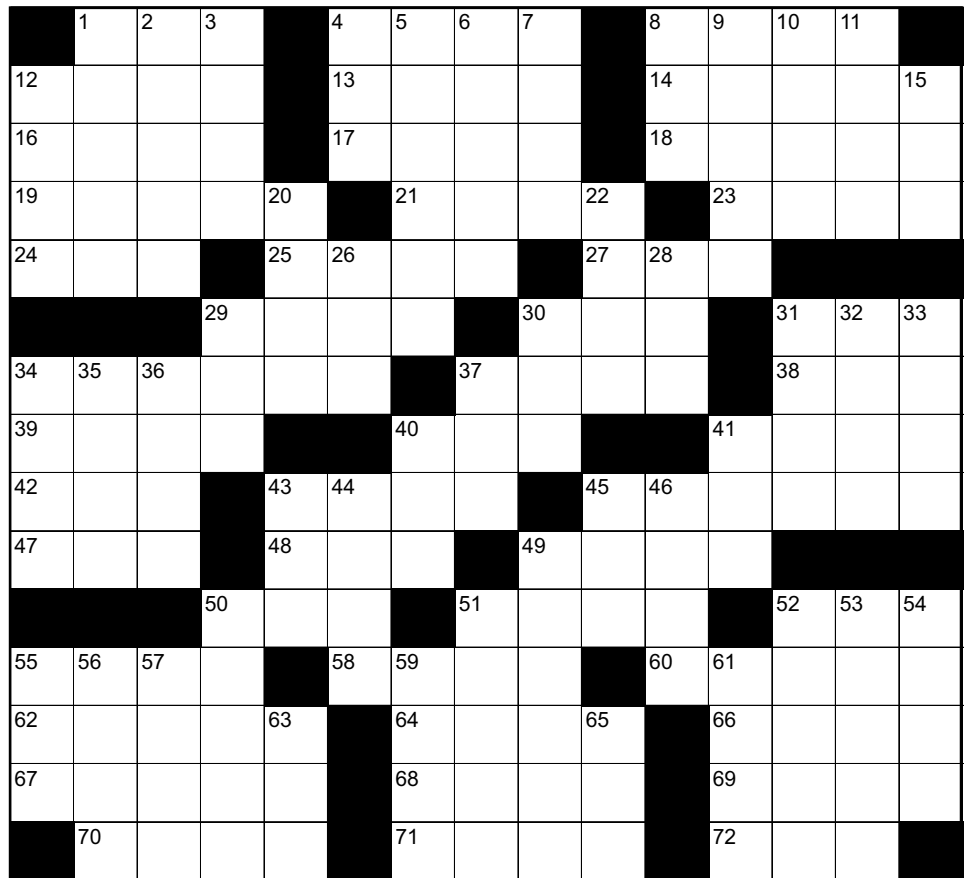
