Happiness Comes From Within


The older we are the quicker the years pass by. 2018 is almost gone. Think about what you did to make the year a good one and try to do those things again. Of course, try to avoid what made it difficult. I will not be on the Board next year, so it feels like the whole year will be a vacation. I will be able to enjoy the improvements in our golf courses. Maybe my scores will improve – probably not!

The new garbage cans are a pretty good success. On Monday nights there are a ton of cans in the street. Even Tuesday night when I drive for the Security Patrol I see them still out there. They are very dark and hard to see. I put reflective numbers on mine and they are still hard to see. If you want them to keep from getting hit by cars – we have a lot of old eyes, get some reflective tape to put on each side.

We have curbs that are rounded and easy to drive over. Many of our residents think this means it is OK to put their cars onto a little of the sidewalk. It is not. Some even put their car in the middle of the sidewalk. This is not legal. Anyone can call Metro at 311 and report you. They will not come out and ticket anyone unless the car is actually blocking the sidewalk. If you do not like seeing people parking on the sidewalk, give them a call. (Happy Bob?)

This past summer we fixed nine holes of the Palm Valley golf course irrigation system. While it was closed Brian Bagwell did an excellent job of also improving the fairways by putting down new Bermuda sod in some of them. They look great. However, they need a break from people who drive right down the middle of the course. We have a 90-degree rule that requires golfers to use our cart path and then turn 90 degrees to their ball. The cart paths may last forever. Last Saturday my wife and I sat out on the first hole and watched as almost everyone drove right down the fairway. It is not “outsiders,” it is us. Some credit should be given to the Gautreaux group as they actually used the 90 degree rule. The cart paths are perfect – please use them.

Since we moved our coyote family out of Sun City we have developed other problems – rats. We have attempted to work on this by employing a professional extermination company to put out bait on our properties. This includes buildings, golf courses, and green belts. If you have a problem get with your neighbors for a concentrated effort to get rid of them. If you do your house alone they will just move next door where they probably came from in the first place. I have received many calls to somehow bring back the coyotes. They are doing this on their own. With all our rabbits, feral cats and rats, they are starting to come back in our neighborhoods.

Your Board of Directors does a pretty good job of trying to provide what it is that we need to live happily here. As president, I get a lot of calls asking for my help to fix an individual's problem. When I tell them I cannot, sometimes they get a little hostile. There is only so much your Board can do for you. Remember – happiness comes from within ourselves. Right Amos?

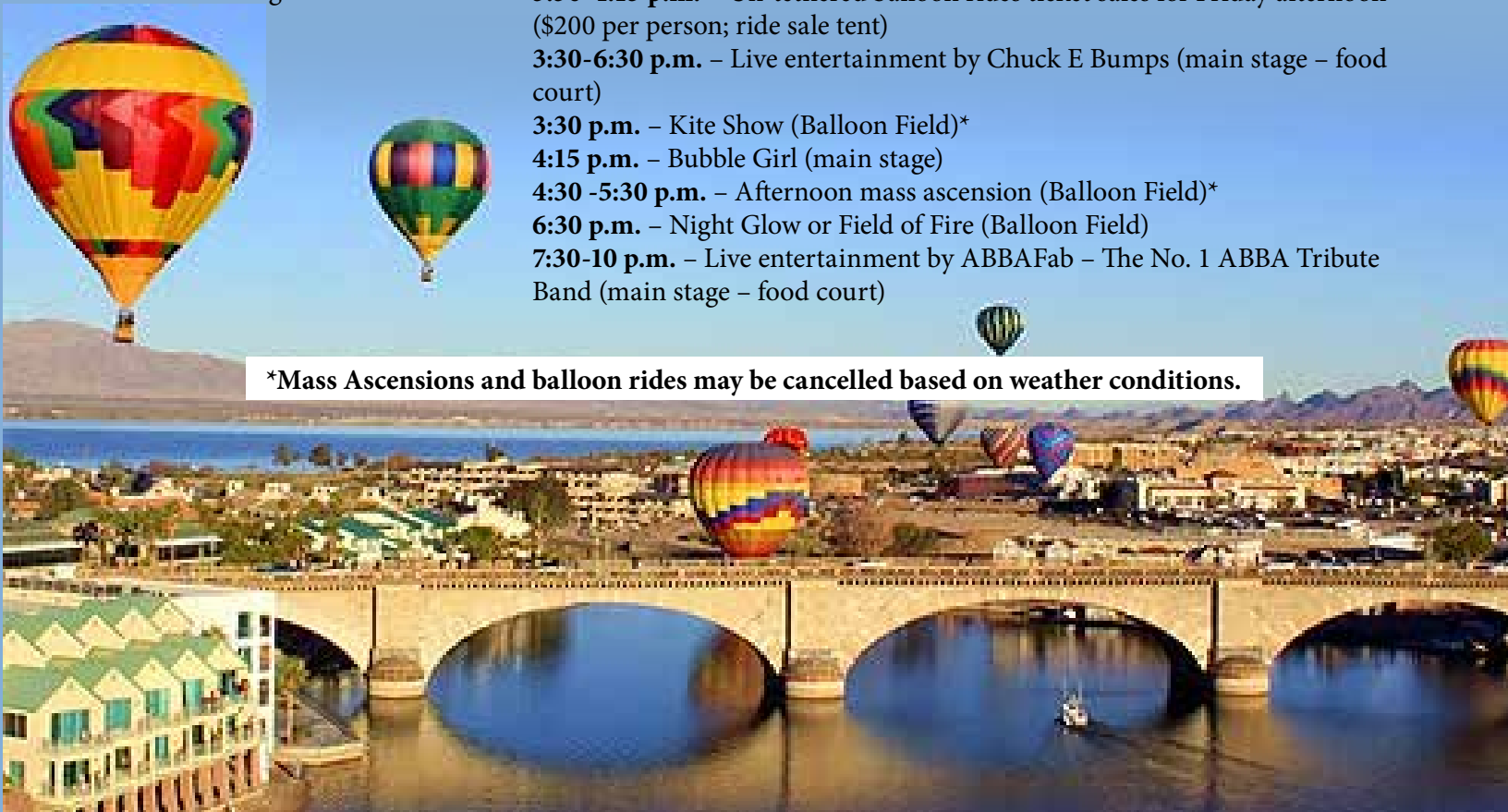

Your local firefighters at Las Vegas Fire & Rescue Station 107 need your help with a recurring false alarm issue. The problem we are facing in Sun City is medical alert pendants being accidentally activated and going unnoticed until we arrive at the residence from which the alarm originated. This creates a situation that has caused Engine 107 to be unavailable for an actual medical emergency, fire or other life-threatening occurrence that happens simultaneously because we were assigned to the false medical pendant alarm. When Engine 107 is assigned to a 911 call for help, including false alarms, the next closest fire engine is assigned to subsequent calls in Sun City. Typically, that engine responds from outside of Sun City. In order to better serve our beloved Sun City residents, we ask that if you are a subscriber to a medical alert pendant service, please help us out by doing the following simple things: **Know the name of the company** that provides your medical pendant and accompanying service, and have their contact information readily available at all times. Update your contact information with your medical pendant provider. If possible, give them a secondary contact who can check on you in the event of pendant activation.

Be sure to answer your home/cell phone (whichever you gave your provider to contact you) whenever it rings, even if you do not recognize the number. In the event of a pendant activation, not only should your provider call you to see if you actually need help, our 911 dispatchers will, too. By answering the phone, if you are able, you can give us vital information to help us better meet your needs in an emergency. In the event that the pendant was accidentally activated, you can tell the caller that you are OK and do not need us to respond. To that end, it is also a good idea to keep a phone on or near you whenever possible.


In the event that you do accidentally activate your pendant, call your provider right away to let them know you are OK and do not need us to respond.

Check with your provider to see if they have pendants available that will alert you in the event they have been activated. Ideally, the pendants themselves would emit a vibration, an audible warning and some sort of light flash when they are activated. Any or all of those features would make it much easier to tell when the pendant is activated.

Keep a combination lock box on or near your door that contains keys to security screen doors and solid exterior doors. Be sure your medical pendant provider has the code to that box, and give the code to our 911 dispatcher when they call to check on you. If we do respond to a 911 call for help and the patient is unable to get to the door this allows us to get in faster without having to damage doors or windows.

In the event that you accidentally activate your medical pendant and do not receive a call from your provider to see if you need help, call them and inquire as to why they did not contact you. Next, request that they do so in the future.

On an unrelated but equally important note, with cooler weather setting in, it is a good idea to open windows and or doors and run your heater for 20 minutes while it is well ventilated to allow it to eliminate all of the dust that builds up here in the desert.

Your collective help in this matter is much appreciated and will go a long way toward our continued goal of providing ever better service. Rest assured, we, your firefighters here at Las Vegas Fire & Rescue Fire Station 107, are humbled and grateful to serve you, our great citizens of Sun City.

Sun City Makes Great Gains on Its 2018 To-Do List

In January, a group of Sun City residents, working with SCSCAI Executive Director Mitzi Mills and Board member Barbara Holden, organized an online survey designed to gather opinions on how to keep the community moving forward. The idea to solicit resident feedback came at a time when Sun City Summerlin started thinking about how to mark the HOA's upcoming 30th anniversary in 2019. While there are still many original residents living in the community, as well as countless others who have been here for 20-plus years, incoming homeowners expressed a desire for the Association to evaluate adding new and/or different amenities to help keep the community current. Items included things recent homebuyers said they found in other communities they visited while researching their home purchase. The wish list contained ideas like nighttime events and meetings, advanced fitness classes and equipment, solo activities, improved communication and a comprehensive website. As the data from the survey rolled in it became apparent that many of the requests seemed tied to a change in the overall retirement lifestyle. At 55 and even 65 years old, many residents still seemed to be working, and so evening events seemed like a natural request.

Months later, as the data was recorded and presented to SCSCAI's Board of Directors, interesting things began to happen.

Within weeks, meeting schedules began to change and Coffee With the Board, one of the most popular monthly resident meetings, added a quarterly evening date to its roster. In its first outing at 5:30 p.m., attendees packed the house. Next came the Neighborhood Watch/Community Preparedness Committee, which also added nighttime meetings and safety classes at night that attracted many residents.

"Sun City is committed to being inclusive and looking across the diversity and life schedules of our residents," said SCSCAI Board member Barbara Holden. "The commitment to offering nighttime meetings, events and classes has seen an overwhelming delight by our residents who believe our community is listening and taking action." In addition to extended career years, Sun City has seen a rise in residents who go it alone. Events like the free film series at the Starbright Theatre gives solos an easy activity to enjoy. And while they may go to the movies alone, they don't have to be alone as a group of residents has created an informal klatch that shows up for the monthly classic film that screens at 11:30 a.m. on the third Friday of the month.

After the movie, the group heads to The Summit Snack Bar, where they enjoy lunch and discuss the film. Classic Film Fridays was organized by Gloria Ouano, who moved into Sun City with her husband, Rod, three years ago. “People have come up to me after the movies and said if it wasn’t for you I wouldn’t have met anyone here,” said Gloria. “When we moved to Sun City I didn’t know anyone and didn’t start meeting people until Rod started playing piano at The Summit.”


“Some people like to go to the movies alone and that’s OK. But others like to talk about the movie afterward and that’s what we do. We meet to see the film then talk about it over lunch. This group can do so much by bringing people together who have a common interest in classic movies,” Gloria said.

Then, in the fall, the Fitness Department welcomed a philosophy shift that switched up seminars and events from dealing with aging to embracing prevention. During this time, the Mountain Shadows Fitness Center also took delivery of a long-requested rowing machine. In 2019, SCSCAI Fitness Director Pam Shields reports the department will embark on presenting monthly events to coincide with “The Year of Living Healthy” theme.

Is there still a lot of work left to do? Of course there is, and Sun City is committed to pushing forward. More than ever, residents are encouraged to reach out to staff and the Executive Director to share their ideas on how to make the Association more competitive to those seeking to relocate here while increasing viability for those who enjoy its vast amenities.

Also note that we cannot prepare state returns, rental property deductions, business or partnership (K-1) income other than simple interest, dividends or capital gains. Plan for the Unexpected – Help SCSCAI Help You

Following are some of items requested:

(This is important if you are unable to respond to specific account-related issues. Remember, we can only discuss account information with the owners, their legally appointed representatives or authorized designees.)

Republic Trash Tour an Education in Recycling

Marise Mizel, president of Sun City's Travel Club (Local) had the brilliant idea of getting a bus trip together to take interested residents to the Republic Services Learning Center. The trip was designed as an education in recycling and to simply explain the proper ways to recycle.

The trip was well organized and very informative. When we arrived at the center, our guide, Jeremy Walters, community relations manager, led our group around the facility, demonstrating how various things are recycled and what is not recyclable.

To my surprise, some of the things I believed I was doing perfectly with regard to recycling was not perfect.

For me, one of the biggest things that jumped out as to what I've been doing wrong was shredded paper. I thought for sure paper was an item that could be placed in the recyclable bin. It is not. According to information provided on the tour, paper is too small to be of use and so it should go into the trash bin.

Another surprise was the use of any type of shrink plastic wrap and plastic bags – both of which gum up the recycling machines and create problems. Those two items also belong in the trash. An example of shrink



wrap would be the plastic that a case of water bottles is wrapped in. This also includes bubble wrap.

A good question was asked during our tour: What about a pizza box that's made of cardboard? Well, the bottom part, which would be the messy part, should go in the trash, but if the top of the box is clean and dry, then that could be ripped off and put in the recycle bin.

In addition, an eye opener for me was something like a cardboard carton that holds, for example, broth. The inside of it is plastic; the outside may be coated with plastic, as well. This is not recyclable and belongs in the trash.

So, what goes into the recycle bin then? Clean and dry is key!

The categories that are acceptable would be clean, dry cardboard, paperboard such as cereal boxes and towel rolls, magazines and catalogs, junk mail, office paper, phone books, aluminum cans, plastic bottles (but NOT Styrofoam), brown paper bags, newspapers, and glass bottles and jars. If something outside of glass containers is dirty or wet, in essence contaminated, it needs to go into the trash.

Note: Regarding glass containers, jars, etc., Jeremy emphasized that he certainly didn't expect people to wash and dry out bottles of ketchup or peanut butter. But, if one could just rinse out the jar so it's relatively clean of debris and then put the lid back on top of the container, that would greatly help.

Jeremy also noted that there are some myths that need dispelling: One is that Republic Services is making a ton of money on recyclables. In truth, there is little profit for Republic to make. In fact, Republic pays to have the glass items recycled.

Another myth is that Republic receives money from the state or government to assist in recycling. This, he said, is absolutely not true. Not one tax dollar goes to Republic to help in this endeavor.

The trip was educational and fascinating, and certainly worth my time. I would recommend Jeremy's presentation to anyone even remotely interested in how recyclables work.

After talking with Jeremy, I asked our Executive Director, Mitzi Mills, if Jeremy could present a town hall meeting just to speak to people about the recycling aspect of our trash collection.

My understanding is that Mitzi will be looking into this and you may hear about an upcoming meeting in the future. Again, it surely opened my eyes to things I thought I already knew. I think you might find it equally interesting, as well.

In the meantime, if you have a question about recycling, Jeremy recommended the website <https://recyclingsimplified.com>.

A Career Takes Flight

“I was born in Oak Ridge, Tenn., but the family moved around a bit, and I graduated from high school in Pittsburgh, Penn. Early on, I knew I wanted a career in the military and that I wanted to fly. My dad was an aeronautical engineer and I guess I inherited my love of planes from him. Tradition was also very important to me. West Point didn’t offer a career in the sky. The Air Force Academy lacked tradition. That left the Navy and the Coast Guard. Easy decision, although I did apply to and was accepted by both,” recalled Steve Linder.

Steve graduated from the United States Naval Academy on June 4, 1969, with a degree in aeronautical engineering, and was commissioned a 2nd Lt. in the United States Marine Corps.

Why the Marine Corps? “Esprit de Corps! The Marine Corps is smaller and tougher, and I wanted to prove to myself that I could do things the hard way. Also, the chances of flying jets were greater in the Marines,” Steve said.

His first duty station was The Basic School (TBS) in Quantico, Va., for six months. TBS is where all Marine officers are taught to be rifle platoon commanders prior to further training in any specialty (or supporting arms, such as artillery or aviation).

Because of the Vietnam War, the Navy, which usually trains all Marine pilots, did not have the capacity to train enough Marine pilots to fulfill the demand. So, the Marine Corps contracted with the Air Force for several years to provide initial training. Steve was one of those chosen to go through Air Force Undergraduate Pilot Training (UPT) at Reese Air Force Base in Lubbock, Texas, starting in February 1970. After qualifying in the

T-41, T-37 and T-38, he finished the 53-week program in February 1971, graduating with Air Force silver wings. He then returned to the Marine Corps at the Marine Corps Air Station in Yuma, Ariz. There he went through a six-month tour in VMT-103 (Fixed-wing “V” Marine “M” Training “T” squadron 103) in the two-seat TA-4 Skyhawk aircraft to add to the Air Force basic training. This required air-to-ground (bombing) training, air-to-air (dogfighting) training, and aircraft carrier landing qualification to earn the gold wings of a Naval Aviator in August 1971.

Then, to qualify as an attack (bomber) pilot, Steve was transferred to VMAT-102 (Marine Attack Training Squadron 102) in Yuma, which was in the hangar next to VMT-103. After six months of further training in attack techniques in the single-seat A-4 Skyhawk, Steve was designated as an attack pilot (April 1972) and transferred to an operational attack squadron (VMA-214 Blacksheep) at Marine Corps Air Station in El Toro, Calif. For those of you who remember the 1970s TV program “Baa Baa Black Sheep,” showcasing the antics of Pappy Boyington and his crew of misfits in the WW2 Pacific campaign, VMA-214 is the same unit but without the misfit

reputation.

At El Toro, Steve received additional training in nuclear weapons delivery (a specialized mission of the A-4 aircraft) and in aviation safety. Steve was designated as an Aviation Safety Officer. His next duty station was to be Vietnam, but the need for Marine pilots was dwindling and no orders to Vietnam were forthcoming. Steve chose to request a transfer to

2018 Achievements



CCOC marked several firsts in 2018, including recommending a revised club manual to Sun City's Board of Directors. The changes, which were the result of many hours of work by dedicated committee members, reduces policy redundancies that are found in other SCSCAI documents, said CCOC Chairman Bruce Alitt.

According to Bruce, the revisions make it easier for the clubs to function. Additionally, it has been made easier for residents to start a new club because the ruling that once required 50 members to start a club has been reduced to 25.

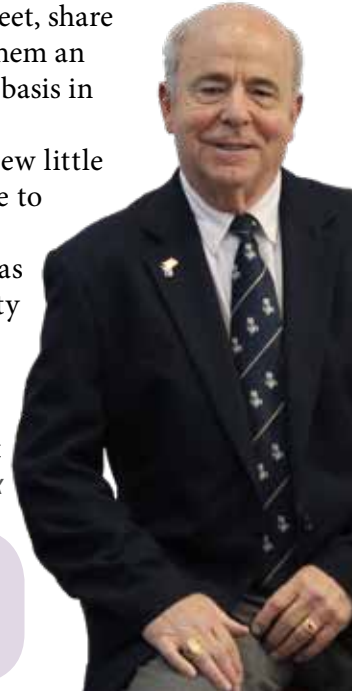
The very first Conceptual Idea or CI was introduced to the committee, and CCOC paved the way for its rollout. The CI is a process for vetting requests that seek to add resources to Sun City that require the expenditure of Association funds. As a result of this first clubs CI, the Sawdusters was able to add two new table saws to its equipment list that has helped improve the overall safety of its workshop.

Last but not least, CCOC recommended the addition of Sun City's newest club, the Band Jam Club, to SCSCAI's Board of Directors. In August, the Board approved the

club, increasing the official number of chartered clubs to 80. The Band Jam Club will begin its meetings in the Music Room at the Pinnacle. The gatherings will be a place for community musicians to meet, share their love of music while providing them an opportunity to perform on a regular basis in front of a live audience.

"When I started (as chairman) I knew little about CCOC, and it has amazed me to learn about the variety of interests the clubs serve in Sun City, as well as services that the staff of Community Services offers," Bruce said.

Starbucks Pumpkin Spice Latte

Nutrition count: 200–510 calories, 0–21 grams of fat and 39–66 carbs. How to burn it off: 21–54 minutes of burpees; 1.6–4.5 miles of jogging; or 40–102 flights of stairs.

Even the most basic healthy person needs to understand the nutritional consequences of their seemingly inconsequential ordering habits.



Considering a tall Pumpkin Spice Latte with nonfat milk and no whip contains 200 calories, 0 grams of fat and 29 carbs. You'd have to do burpees for 21 minutes or jog for 1.6 miles to burn that off. To expend the 510 calories, 21 grams of fat and 66 carbs of a venti Pumpkin Spice Latte with whole milk and whipped cream, you'd need to perform 54 minutes of burpees or jog for 4.6 miles.

Or, think of it this way: To burn off the 200 calories of the smaller, non-fat

seasonal favorite, you'd have to take the stairs to the 20th floor of the Olympic Tower in Manhattan. But to burn off the larger, fattier option, you'd have to climb all the way to the top, 51st floor.

SCSCAI OKs New Door Colors

Architecture Review Committee

This has been a very busy year for the Architectural Review Committee. So, as we approach the end of 2018, we thought you might be interested in knowing just what Committee members do on a day-to-day basis, as well as learn about some of the accomplishments made by our dedicated ARC Committee members.

Application Review and Process

When a resident submits an ARC application for approval, it must be reviewed and approved by three (3) Committee members.

January 1 to October 30, 2018, – 1,441 applications were reviewed and processed.

Variations

If a project is denied during the review process, the applicant has the opportunity to appeal to the full Committee for a variance at the next monthly meeting.

January 1 to October 30, 2018, – 20 requests for variances were brought forward at the monthly meetings. Of those 20 requests, 11 variances were granted.

Project Inspections

After 120 days following the completion of any work, applications are divided between Committee members and the work is inspected. This process helps to verify that the work was done as approved.

January 1 to October 30, 2018, – 1,271 projects were inspected and closed.

Other ARC Accomplishments

Welcomed three (3) new ARC committee members to the group.

Revised Article III, Section O of Sun City Summerlin’s Development Standards to be consistent with the new Republic Services trash schedule.

Approved two design concepts for residents for trash enclosures.

Added seven (7) new front door colors to the Association’s paint palette.

Approved a process and colors for concrete coatings.

Sun City is as beautiful as it is because of its residents who generously volunteer their time to keep it that way. An enormous “Thank You” is due to the Architectural Review

Committee for its effort in these accomplishments.

Members Work on Checking Projects Off Annual Work List

The Common Area Properties Committee is tasked by SCSCAI's Board of Directors to inspect all of the Association's real and personal property, and to work with the Executive Director and staff to ensure that said property is properly maintained. Additionally, the Committee reviews all recommended major purchases and projects, and provides appropriate recommendations to the Executive Director and the Board of Directors.

Much of the efforts expended by Committee members center on ongoing maintenance. However, during the year, the Committee reviewed and recommended for approval a number of major projects and upgrades, including:

- Equipment additions and upgrades for all three fitness centers
- The replacement of five table tennis units
- Upgrade of three monitor stations
- Installation of six golf cart parking stations at Mountain Shadows Fitness Center
- Renovation of three golf pro shops
- Acquisition and installation of new dust collection units for the Model Builders Club
- Discussion of installation of solar panels at Mountain Shadows*
- Re-stripping of tennis courts and pickle ball courts
- Discussion of installation of carport cover for Security Patrol vehicles*
- Acquisition of two computer-controlled table saws for the Sawdusters Club
- Acquisition of two larger sinks for the Stained Glass Club
- Redesign of the Highland Falls driveway to eliminate traffic bottleneck*
- Raising of the Softball Field fences*
- Resurfacing the shuffleboard courts
- Acquisition of three circulating pumps for the golf courses.

October Meeting:

First on the agenda of open projects was the reworking of the Highland Falls entrance to widen the driveway by removing part of the existing sidewalk. SCSCAI Facilities Director Brandon Balek provided a proposal of just under \$9,400. The project was proposed in order to remove the bottleneck that occurs when deliveries are being made or when golfers drop off their clubs. The wider driveway would make it easier for cars to pass the unloading vehicles. The committee voted to approve the design and cost estimates and forward them to the Board of Directors for approval. Another sub-committee is still reviewing other possible changes to the Highland Falls exterior.

Brandon also reported that the resurfacing of the shuffleboard courts was completed in May at a cost of \$4,000. However, the vendor used the wrong finishing surface. The issue is being addressed with the vendor. SCSCAI Fitness Director Pam Shields reported that a new, Concept 2 Rowing Machine has been delivered to the Mountain Shadows Fitness Center.

The fate of the Desert Vista basketball court was discussed extensively. Suggestions included moving it to Sun Shadows or removing some horseshoe pits at Mountain Shadows to accommodate the half court. In the end, SCSCAI Executive Director Mitzi Mills was asked to monitor the usage and to provide the Committee with a better understanding of the economics behind the move.

The previously submitted Highland Falls patio furniture request was rejected over cost concerns. The Committee voted to resubmit the request for four tables.

SCSCAI Director of Golf Course Maintenance Brian Bagwell stated that his department is operating without any reserve circulating pumps. He requested the Committee approve three new pumps, one of which would be held in reserve at each of the three courses. The Committee approved a motion to be forwarded to the BOD. The estimated cost is \$18,000.

Under new business, Brandon submitted a \$14,000 estimate to replace all of the carpet for the miniature golf course at Mountain Shadows. It was agreed that the project would be presented to the BOD after receiving two more bids.

SCSCAI Director of Golf, Donny Long, proposed closing the Palm Valley Golf Course at noon next summer. The closure would be tied to the closure of the back 9 for irrigation construction. No decision was reached, but Donny agreed to collect more information.

Finally, it was noted that Republic Services has approved the use of reflective tape on trash and recycle cans to improve nighttime visibility.

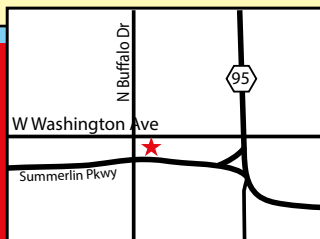

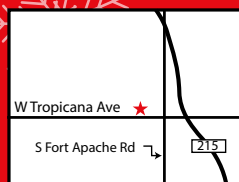

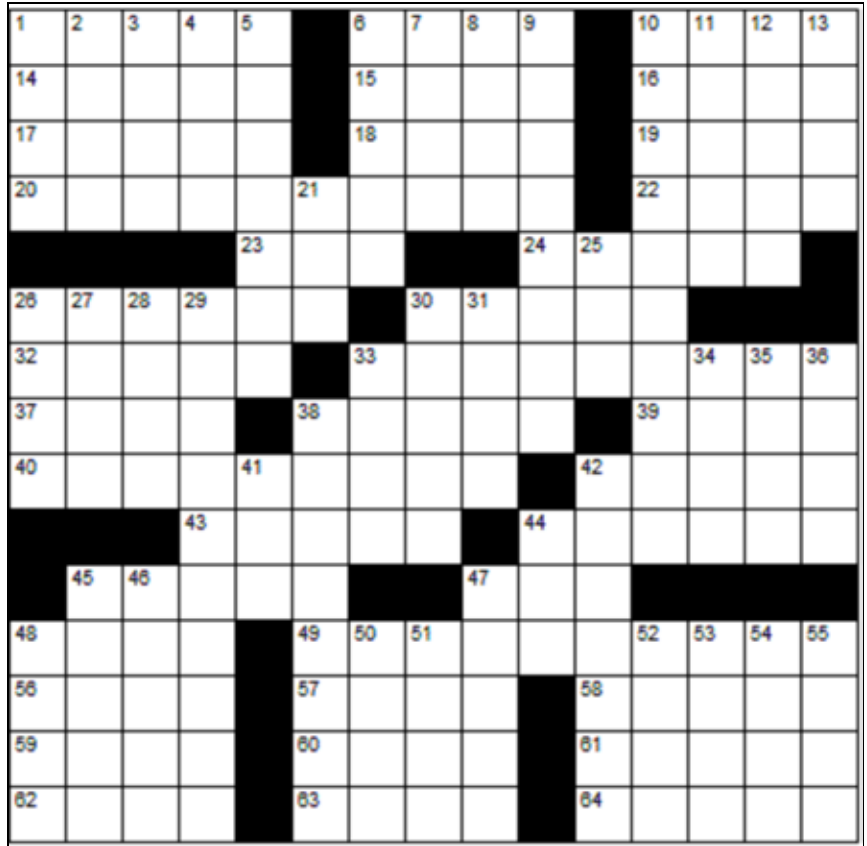

Executive Director's Report

Dear Sun City Summerlin Homeowners,

The revised amendment to SCSCAI's Rules & Regulations is noted below. The amendment to the existing Rules & Regulations will appear in red the black lettering indicates existing wording. These amendments represent ONLY the revised section of the Rules and Regulations that were adopted at the November 13, 2018 Board of Directors meeting and are hereby published in the December Link for official notification to SCSCAI homeowners of the amendment and change.

SUN CITY SUMMERLIN COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION RULES & REGULATIONS

Article IV. Common Facilities Tennis/Pickleball Courts Sales

H. Tennis/Pickleball Courts

1. The Association's tennis/pickleball courts are private facilities and all members, residents and guests must

- sign in at the monitor station in the Fitness Center. Operating hours for this facility coincide with those posted in the Fitness Center.
- 2. The courts will be locked when not in use. The monitor will issue a key to the court requested if not in use, and will hold the Association card of the member or resident receiving the key. Upon returning the key, the member or resident's card will be returned. Monitors will ensure the security of the courts.
- 3. All players must wear proper attire and tennis shoes.
- 4. Food, drink, chewing gum and tobacco products are not allowed in the court enclosure. Non-alcoholic beverages in non-glass containers are permitted.
- 5. (Amended 11/13/18) Except for Tennis or Pickleball Club reserved times, there are no court reservations. Except for Tennis and/or Pickleball Club events, there are no court reservations.
- 6. (Amended 11/13/18) First come, first play policy is in effect. Time limits are as follows:
Singles play: 1 hour court time including warm-up
Doubles play: 1½ hours court time including warm-up
Rotation: 2 hour court time including warm-up
Clubs are limited to 4 times per year to reserve courts.

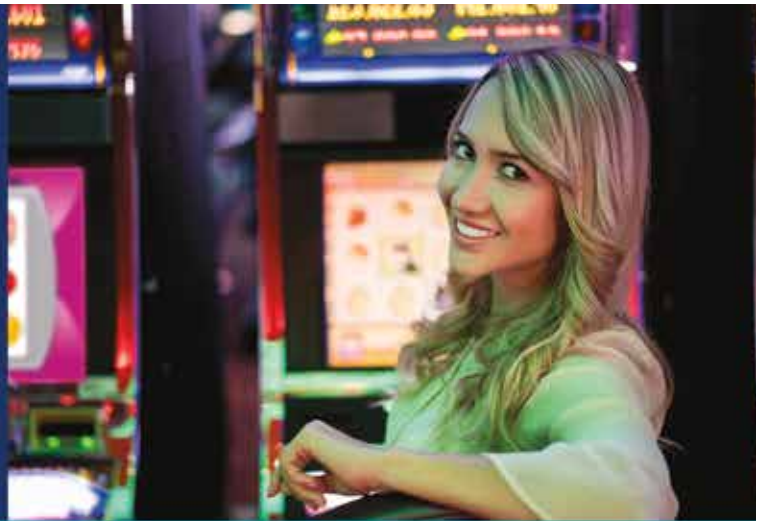
