# PREPAREDNESS **Neighborhood Watch**

## Neighborhood Watch Is on the Job



The next Neighborhood Watch/CPC Committee meeting will be Wednesday, February 21, 9 a.m., at Desert Vista.

**W**hen something doesn't appear quite right, a Sun City Neighborhood Watch volunteer, a K9 Corps member or a Watchful Walker may note a person's description or a car's license number and call the Security Patrol's dispatcher and ask to have a Patrol driver take a closer look at the setting.

Neighborhood Watch volunteers pay attention to young adults when they're noticed in the community. Possibly, some may be coping with a difficult economy that has compelled them to return home to stay in Sun City with their resident parents. They might be jobless, financially struggling, therefore tempted by an open garage yielding golf clubs, tools, bikes, or other items of value. Routinely, Neighborhood Watch volunteers alert Security Patrol about garage doors that are forgetfully left open.

While it is acknowledged that there have been burglaries in Sun City, the community's

crime figures remain among the lowest in Clark County. The Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department attests that the community's Security Patrol and Neighborhood Watch volunteers influence that favorable statistic.

As a Security Patrol Watch Commander, I reviewed the dispatchers' reports and reviewed about a dozen calls a month from Neighborhood Watch walkers who witnessed something out of the norm, including open garage doors, newspapers piling up, suspicious people or vehicles and fake solicitors. The Neighborhood Watch program, thanks to our active residents, is a hit. We wouldn't do as well without them.

Consider becoming actively involved with your community's Neighborhood Watch Program. Learn more at the next meeting, February 21, 9 a.m. in the Committee Room at Desert Vista.

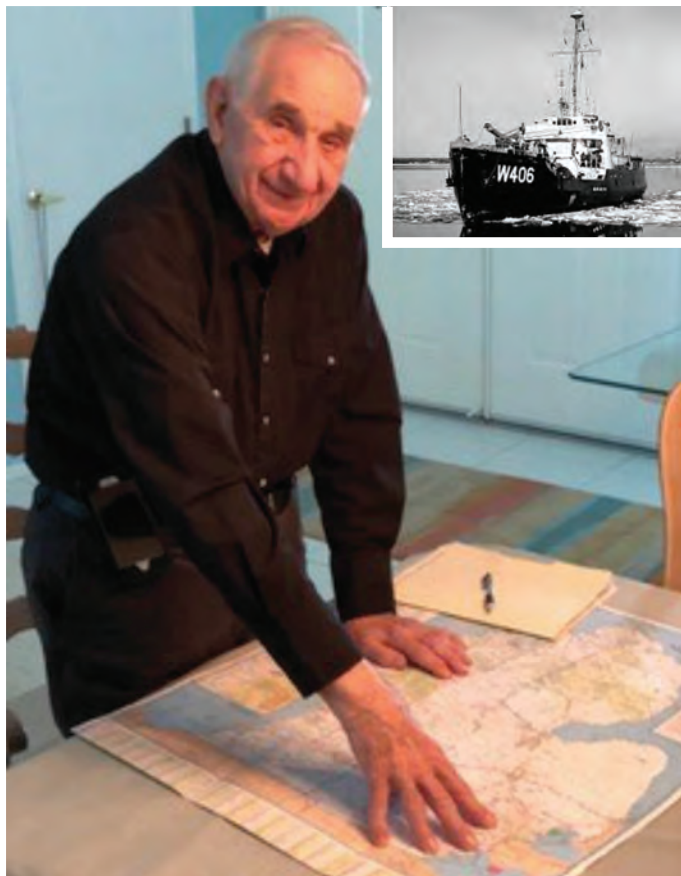

## Service in U.S. Coast Guard Clears a Path to Law Enforcement Career

**Question:** What is the longest continually serving American military sea force?

**Answer:** The U.S. Coast Guard, founded in 1790. (The Navy was founded in 1775, but disbanded after the Revolutionary War and not reauthorized until 1794.) Originally founded as the Revenue Cutter Service, its mission was to interdict smugglers. That is but one of its missions today. In 1790, the smugglers were bringing in goods to evade taxes; today's smugglers are more concerned with bringing in illegal cargoes, including drugs and people. Other missions of today's Coast Guard are: ports, waterways & coastal security; aids to navigation (lighthouses, buoys & VTS); search & rescue, living marine resources, marine safety, defense readiness (national security & military preparedness), maritime environmental protection, polar, ice & Alaska operations (including the International Ice Patrol)

and law enforcement. A very large charter for the nation's smallest service.

It was into this service that Detroit native and Sun City resident Bill Zsenyuk enlisted in 1954 after graduating high school. Bill's older brothers were serving in the Navy and he planned on following in their footsteps, "But for reasons they never fully explained, they told me to join the Coast Guard," Bill recalled.

As many vets can attest, the Services have a perverse sense of humor when it comes to base assignments: Ask for a West Coast billet and you get assigned to New Jersey. Bill was from Detroit, and he was assigned to Coast Guard Station Belle Island near Detroit!

"It was the beginning of an eight-year love affair. Home and all of my friends were close by," he said.

Bill's first assignment was on board the USCGC Acacia (WLB-406) a 180-foot-long multi-purpose vessel built in 1944. She was nominally, a buoy tender, but with equipment and capabilities for ice breaking, SAR, fire-fighting and logistics. During Bill's service, the Acacia's primary mission was as an icebreaker with a secondary mission of logistics, supplying the many lighthouses on Lake Michigan. During the cold winter months, and it was really cold Bill said, the Acacia participated in Operation Coal Shovel, keeping the channels between Toledo and Detroit open for the coal ships that supplied power plants and industries in Detroit.

Bill's next assignment was in port security. Assigned to a 40-footer, Bill and his crew mates patrolled the busy waters around Detroit, performing search and rescue missions as required and escorting the many sailboat races that were held in the area. "Parts of the race courses were in Canadian waters. We coordinated with the Canadians, of course, but all of the escort vessels were American," Bill said.

In 1960, after serving two months on a buoy tender, Bill was reassigned as a Port Security Bosun Mate 3 and spent the remainder of his enlistment as an instructor in port security for USCG Reservists.

In 1961, with his eight-year military service commitment completed, Bill traded one blue uniform for another; he joined the Detroit Police Department, a step that was to span the first 20 years of a 27-year career in law enforcement. ## Voting Information – How to Vote



**Election Day  
Is Tuesday,  
February 27**

**1. Note: This year we will be electing five (5) residents to serve on the Board as Directors. The four candidates with the highest votes will be elected for two-year terms. The fifth successful candidate will serve a one-year term. (Reference Bylaw Art. 5.3(b))**

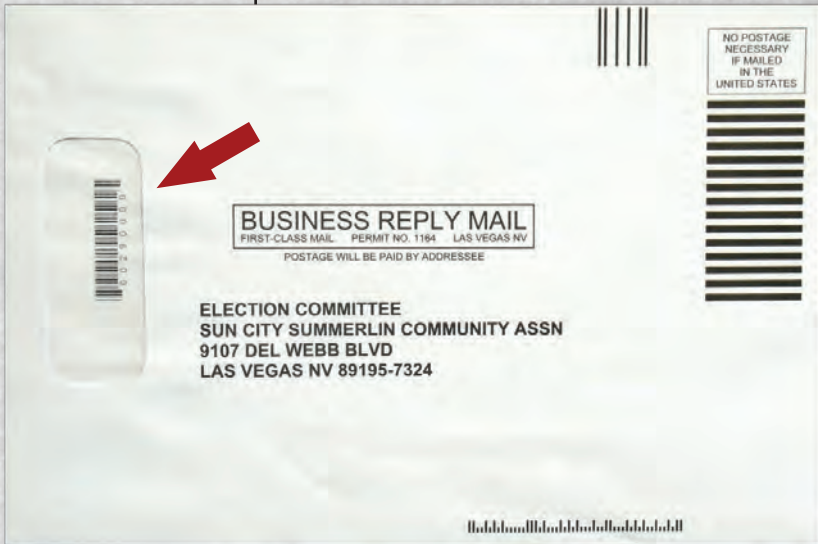
**2. The ballot is the address label on this February Link, and a pre-posted return envelope is included. Instructions are printed on the ballot. A household has (five) 5 votes.**

On vote-counting day, the Election Committee will cut off the bar code before removing your secret ballot. We will use optical scanners to count the ballots and tabulate the votes electronically.

**4. If you make a mistake marking your ballot, DO NOT correct it. EXCHANGE the old ballot for a new one at the Administration Office.** Each member household will receive one ballot and will have five (5) votes. Before requesting a replacement ballot and envelope, be certain that another member of the household has not voted. Should two ballots be received from the same home, BOTH WILL BE VOIDED. Casting more than five votes also will void the ballot. Your votes may all be cast for one candidate or divided among two or more candidates.

**5. Validation and counting of the ballots occurs at an official SCSCAI Association meeting on Wednesday, February 28, starting at 8 a.m. at Mountain Shadows.** The election results will then be announced by the secretary of the Association. All those who wish to witness the ballot tabulation are invited to attend the ballot-counting meeting.

**3. After marking the ballot, remove the “Instructions” side to remove your name and address. Insert the ballot half into the envelope so that the bar code, which is used for validation, shows through the envelope’s window.**

## **PURSUANT TO NRS 116.31034 SECTION 12**

An association shall not adopt any rule or regulation that has the effect of prohibiting or unreasonably interfering with a candidate in his campaign for election as a member of the executive board, except that his campaign may be limited to 90 days before the date that ballots are required to be returned to the association. A candidate may request that the secretary or other officer specified in the bylaws of the association send, 30 days before the date of the election and at the association's expense, to the mailing address of each unit within the common-interest community or to any other mailing address designated in writing by the unit's owner a candidate informational statement. The candidate information statement: (a) Must be no longer than a single typed page; (b) Must not contain any defamatory, libelous or profane information; and (c) May be sent with the secret ballot mailed pursuant to subsection 8 or in a separate mailing. The association and its directors, officers, employees and agents are immune from criminal or civil liability for any act or omission which arises out of the publication or disclosure of any information related to any person and which occurs in the course of carrying out any duties required pursuant to this subsection.

At Security Patrol's annual banquet held in November, Stavros Anthony, Ward 4 representative to the Las Vegas City Council, Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's Northwest Area Command representative,

and Mitzi Mills, Sun City's executive director, praised the Patrol and its membership for the important work it does. Metro reminded the Patrol that our presence on the roads aids them in countering the number of burglaries and other potential nefarious deeds. We are the first responders to suspicious situations and residents in distress.

Security Patrol was organized in 1991. Ron Gagne, a retired detective, was the first Security Patrol chief. He worked with Del Webb and the nascent Association to be the "eyes and ears of Metro." In 1992, the membership was 160 and Del Webb provided two cars.

So, who are we?

Today, we are about 229 resident members. Membership spans every year from 21 years to one year. Among our officers, two have served 21 years; five have served 20 years. Additionally, six members have served ten years; eight members have served eight years; sixteen have been volunteers for five years; and our first-year members total 18. Our new chief, Darlene Vaturi, has served thirteen 13 years in various positions.

Security Patrol's membership reflects the community. We are retired professionals and union members. We are retired small business owners, CEOs, COOs and CFOs. We are retired nurses,

physicians, attorneys, bankers, writers, poets, journalists. We are retired museum curators, people who have devoted their careers to volunteerism in various organizations. We are retired postal workers, electricians, plumbers, police officers, firefighters, first responders. We are retired military and spouses, government workers, teachers, professors, scientists and homemakers.

Security Patrol members are your neighbors. They have relocated from other parts of the country, although some are Nevada born and raised. Upon completion of the training, the candidate receives the Class A uniform, shield and a service bar. The Association provides the Security Patrol uniforms, with no cost to the trainee. People who complete the training are diligent and steadfast. They perform their duties with the professionalism they gave to their previous careers, understanding that to have a safe, viable community, residents must get involved. Retirement offers new doors to open – Security Patrol's door is always open.

There is a natural attrition in Security Patrol's membership. New people are always welcomed. The community will be a better place with you joining Security Patrol. The training is slightly demanding. But, if you can take it and don't mind being guided by instructors, consider this worthy organization.

## Making Resolutions a Reality

**H**eat disease knows no age and can strike without warning. Your eating habits and exercise regimen play an important role in the health of your heart. Cholesterol is a type of lipid that travels through our blood stream in particles called lipoproteins. There are two distinct lipoproteins called LDLs, low-density lipoproteins, and HDLs, high-density lipoproteins.

LDLs are considered bad cholesterol because they can lead to the buildup of plaque in our arteries. The buildup of plaque can narrow arteries and restrict blood flow. Everyone needs to keep the buildup of plaque to a minimum or it may lead to blood clots, which may cut off the flow of blood, oxygen and nutrients to the heart and brain.

HDLs are considered to be good cholesterol because they pick up the LDLs clogging your arteries and take them to the liver, where they are processed and eventually excreted. Keeping your cholesterol lower may reduce the risk of heart disease. Diet can affect the amount of cholesterol you ingest.

Some of the following foods help to keep your cholesterol at a lower level: almonds, garlic,

apples, beans, flaxseeds, oatmeal (whole grain type) and soy protein.

Regular exercise also increases the good cholesterol, HDLs. Maintaining a weekly cardio program to speed up blood flow in your arteries will reduce your chance of inflammation and clotting. Work up to 30 consecutive minutes of some type of cardiovascular exercise five days a week (i.e. recumbent bike, walking, swimming and cross-trainer) to jump-start a new you.

Here are tips on how to get back on track with your exercise program or start a new one.

- ◆ Find fun and easy ways to exercise so it won't seem like a chore.
- ◆ Check with your health care provider if you are new to exercise or plan to make major changes in your exercise program.
- ◆ Choose the time of day you feel you have the most energy.
- ◆ Realize all the additional benefits from exercising such as stress relief, body trimming, sleeping and energy.
- ◆ Set goals that are achievable and realistic.

## Charli's Corner

*Cardio Training: Fun and Fabulous*

**W**e are often creatures of habit and tend to do the same workouts and exercises over and over again. We head for the same elliptical, bike or treadmill day in and day out. Regular cardiovascular exercise is good for you, but it's also important to vary your exercise routine in order to improve your fitness level. Your body and brain can benefit when you do the same exercises in a new way. Here are a few ideas to help you get more from your cardio workouts.

**Vary Your Machines.** Start with 5 to 10 minutes using a different cardio machine, then return to your old standby to finish off your 30 minutes. Each day add 2 to 5 minutes on the new machine and finish with the old one until you can do the new cardio machine for 30 minutes. Now you can alternate your workouts between two different machines.

**For example:** Monday and Friday use the bike. Wednesday use the NuStep or treadmill.

**Add Intervals.** If you like the cardio machine you're using, or it's the only one your body will allow you to use, and you are feeling like you're not seeing or feeling any changes, you're right! Your body is a great adapter. Your body will find

ways to do less work and burn fewer calories even though you are doing the same speed or time. Adding intervals to your cardio training will help you increase your strength, burn more calories, and make the time fly.

- Start with a 5-minute warm up at your usual pace.
- For 30 seconds increase your speed, tension, resistance or incline.
- For 1 to 2 minutes recover at your normal pace or resistance.
- Repeat this three times the first day; add an interval every other day until you are doing a total of six to eight intervals per workout.

The best part about intervals is that you only have to do them one to two times per week to make a difference. You can do your regular cardio workout the rest of the week.

If you would like more help with changing or updating your workouts, contact the Fitness Department and speak with one of our fitness specialists.

**D**id you know that diabetes leads a disease list of health-care spending in the United States worth \$245 billion? According to [www.diabetes.org](http://www.diabetes.org), one in three adults will develop Type 2 diabetes in their lifetime, and nine out of 10 of them don't even know that they have the disease. Diabetes is a problem with your body that causes blood glucose (sugar) levels to rise higher than normal. In Type 2 diabetes, your body does not use insulin properly, which is called insulin resistance. Management of blood glucose levels is critical for those with diabetes, as they will become susceptible to other health problems associated with the disease.

In the Fitness Department, we strive to educate residents because the more you know about your condition, the better able you are at making lifestyle changes and decisions that will improve your health. That's why we are offering our Diabetes Empowerment Education Program (DEEP). Taking an active role in your health is a step toward a healthier and happier life.

DEEP is for those with prediabetes, living with or supporting people living with diabetes who need information on how to better manage the condition. The program will help those with diabetes improve and maintain their quality of life, prevent complications and disabilities,

improve eating habits, maintain adequate nutrition, increase physical activity, develop self-care skills, improve patient and health-care team relations and increase the use of available resources.

DEEP is an evidence-based diabetes self-management program. It is a no-cost program that will provide you with information and practical skills to help you manage your diabetes. DEEP is accredited by the American Association of Diabetes Educators and is managed by trained diabetes educators. DEEP classes will be taught by SCS Fitness Assistant Heather Senn, trained DEEP educators and several community experts.

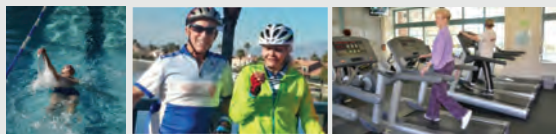

# CCOC Chartered Clubs & Community Organizations

## Club Presidents to Weigh In on Streamlining Procedures Manual

The next meeting of the CCOC will be Thursday, February 1, 1 p.m., Desert Vista.

**T**he January 4 meeting of the CCOC had a quorum and the agenda was approved.

**Community Services Director's Report.** Melissa Spina reported that as of January 4, 64 clubs have turned in their new club officer forms, and that clubs have started to turn in their financial reports to Community Services. She thanked the clubs for a successful 2017.

## Tips to Help Keep Your Online Information Secure

In today's high-tech world, Internet use has become a common part of everyday life. In addition, while cyber security is a concern for everyone online, those of us who did not grow up using the Internet may find ourselves more vulnerable to viruses, identity theft and other forms of cyber crime. To help keep your information safe:

**Limit Websites That Have Your Personal Information.** When you make purchases online, you usually have the option of saving your financial and contact information for future use on that site. While it may seem convenient to do that, saving your information on multiple sites heightens your risk of data breaches. For safety, you are better off re-entering your information each time you use a website.

Think about the websites on which you have stored information in the recent past. Delete any account data that is not required. Also, consider keeping a list or spreadsheet of websites that have personal data stored about you, so you can be better aware of possible security issues.

This list can include banks, mortgage lenders or landlords, credit card companies, doctors' offices and pharmacies, online retailers, online payment processors, like Paypal and social media websites.

**Set Secure Passwords.** Your passwords for every site should be as secure as possible. This means using a combination of letters, numbers and special characters. While it is tempting to use easy-to-remember passcodes like your birthday or address, it makes it all too easy for cyber criminals to access your information.

Be sure to change your passwords regularly (some websites even demand it). However, it can be challenging to keep track of all these passwords, especially if you are using random words or characters. If you are concerned about remembering passwords, download a secure app like LastPass to help you keep track.

**Beware of Phishing.** Phishing scams are a type of cyber crime in which hackers try to get you to give up sensitive information by appearing to be a legitimate entity. Phishing scams often come in the form of emails that look like they're from your bank, a credit card company or a trusted

retailer. Other emails may say you've won money or some kind of prize. Tips to avoid these scams include:

- ◆ Never open an email from someone you don't know, or from an email address that looks fake.
- ◆ Never respond to an email citing you've won money, or requests money from you, especially if it's from a foreign email address.
- ◆ Never confirm personal or financial information online. Your bank, credit card and mortgage contacts already have that information and would never ask for it in an email.
- ◆ Never click on links in suspicious-sounding emails.

If you are in doubt about the validity of a request for information, you can always contact the institution by phone and ask if they have requested information from you.

**Keep Your Computer Up to Date.** Make sure to keep your computer up to date by running the latest versions of your operating system, browser, software programs and anti-virus programs. You should also make sure your home Internet connection is secured with a password, and that you have a firewall activated.

If you keep important files on your computer, back up your data on an external hard drive or a cloud-based storage system. You should also have an emergency plan in place if your data is lost or compromised. Keep a list of all websites you would need to cancel credit cards, change PIN numbers or passwords, or report fraud or theft in the event of a data breach.

**Be Careful on Social Media.** Be careful about what information you share on social media. Do not include your phone number or address on your profile, and avoid adding a location to the photos or posts you publish. Make sure that only your friends can see the information on your profile, and only accept friend requests from people you know.

Computers are a wonderful way to make life easier and more fun. Nevertheless, everyone needs to exercise caution when it comes to sharing sensitive information online.

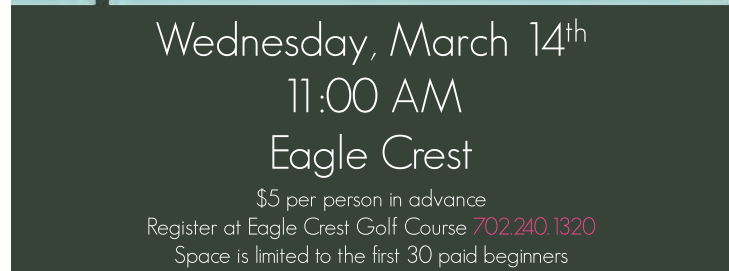

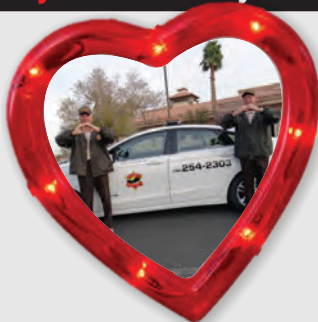

## DEBORAH STRONG STRIKES A MEDAL-WINNING POSE

(Editor's note: This is a follow-up to the July 2016 story "Warrior Spirit.")

**T**he first time Deborah Strong walked into the Link office, the semi-retired body builder said she wasn't sure if she had the desire or passion to ever compete again. Battling through a diagnosis of post traumatic stress syndrome that routinely sends her in and out of depression, Deborah said that her PTSD is so bad sometimes that performing simple tasks like getting dressed and out of the house feels almost insurmountable.

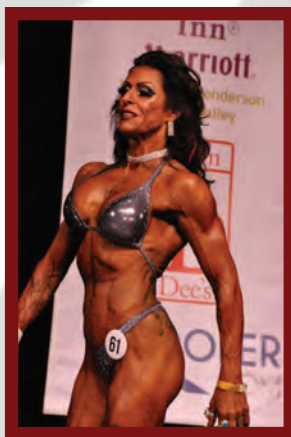
Many who work out at the Mountain Shadows Fitness Center may recognize Deborah. The Sun City gym has become a place where she feels comfortable since moving into the community two years ago.

"The people here are great, very supportive," Deborah said. "They always ask me when I'm going to do another show. I usually tell them I don't know."

But last November, Deborah made a commitment to herself. She set a goal to compete one last time. Or, at least that's how she said the idea started.

Normally, it would take someone months of preparation before they could even think of taking the stage at a formal body-building competition. But Deborah said, "My training was seven weeks. I can do that because I stay in shape all year long. Once I set my mind to it, I needed to tune myself up and cut muscle."

Deborah, who is 56 years old, entered the Open Division in Women's Master Physique of the Steve Kerr Las Vegas Classic. The category welcomes women aged 30 years old and up. Overall, Deborah placed fifth, taking home a medal from the event that took place at Cashman Center over the Thanksgiving weekend.

## SO WHAT EXACTLY DOES IT TAKE TO BUILD A BODY INTO AWARD-WINNING SHAPE?

"You have to pose every day because muscle develops better when you pose and flex" Deborah said. "But it's hard, especially the diet, because you are hungry. I'm like everybody else. I like sweets. I like to go to buffets. I have a cheat meal, NOT a cheat day. And that's a cheeseburger and French fries because it's delicious."

The bottom line of the diet is low carb and precise measurements – 6 egg whites, 1 tablespoon coconut oil, 5 ounces of chicken, 4 ounces Jasmine rice, 1 ounce of almonds, 7 spears of asparagus, a gallon and a half of water a day and so on.

"There's no fruit because it has sugar and sugar makes the muscle smooth," Deborah said. "You can feel your body changing. It gets hard. You look at yourself and you can't believe you look like a super hero."

Then there's the fun stuff.

"You look for your suit. I found a local lady who made mine for me. Most women pick blue suits, but I wanted to stand out so I picked a gun-metal one with crossover straps. The suit is cut for certain poses. It's all custom-made. It cost around \$250," Deborah said.

## REALLY, THE LAST TIME?

According to Deborah, the Kerr Classic was going to be her last show. But now, she says her mind is open. And that's due mainly to her supporters, James Juge, a former professional bodybuilder and trainer who, she said, critiqued her physique to excellence and helped her prepare her diet. "A great big thank you goes to Alyssa, as well," Deborah said. "She pushed me to have fun, and did my hair and makeup for the show. You guys are truly the best."

Fitness has been a way of life for Deborah for 35 years. Couple that discipline with her determination to coexist with PTSD and the combination is a powerful one.

"Sometimes, I feel like I'm in a pit. I look up and grab onto a rope and I crawl up and I slip. I'm not perfect. People see this perfect-looking person. But the anxiety and depression; it's not easy."

Originally diagnosed with PTSD following her husband's suicide, which Deborah witnessed, she said, "I want him to know that I am going to persevere. That I am a strong woman and that I'm going to move forward. He would be so proud of me."

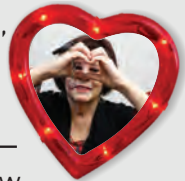

### Herme & Josie Labsan

#### Chronicling the History of Sun City's Clubs

Herme and Josie Labson have been residents of Sun City since 1995. They built their home, which was one of the first homes of Phase II in Sun City. They moved here from their winter home in Naples, Fla.; their summer home was in Saginaw, Mich., where Herme practiced as a neurologist for 35 years. He was a neurological consultant to 11 hospitals in northeastern Michigan.

The Labsans were originally from the Philippines. Herme came to the United States as a Fulbright Scholar in Medicine to specialize in Neurology at Baylor University College of Medicine in Houston. His work eventually led him to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), where he became responsible for monitoring the health of the chimpanzees used in the test rocket program. When Herme was set to return to the Philippines to be the first professor of neurology WHERE? It was his work with NASA that resulted in him staying in the U.S., becoming a citizen and bringing Josie and their son to America.

Josie was a Philippine movie actress and the daughter of the Philippine Presidential Yacht's skipper. Their daughter, Jocelyn, is a professional ballet dancer; their son, Herme Jr., is a school teacher. Herme and Josie were ballroom dance instructors, and Herme was one of the founders and president of the Dance Connection for nine years in Sun City. He also was president of the Philippine American Club for 14 years.

It is Herme's dedication to detail that helped him develop and maintain a photographic history of the Dance Connection, which is proposed to be available for your enjoyment in our new Sun City library at the Mountain Shadows Community Center.
