Another golf employee – Shane Sanchez was chosen as Captain, to represent our state of Nevada to take four top teen golfers to play in the 46th Annual America's Cup in Montana. This is a very prestigious event. It is good to see our golf "pros" recognized in this way.

I have gotten back to drive for our Security Patrol on Tuesday evenings. It is very rewarding and interesting work. There are lots of different jobs at the Security Patrol. If you feel up to it, volunteer to help keep our community the safest place in Las Vegas.

We have a very nice community. Be nice to your neighbors, especially Amos.

Sun City Summerlin Charities, Inc. Adds Volunteers to Its Name

As of September 2018, the Sun City Summerlin Charities, Inc., also will be known as “Sun City Volunteers.”

Since 1995, the Charities has been providing transportation and handyman services to residents of our Sun City Summerlin community. Since 2007, the group has provided more than 10,000 transportation, handyman and referral calls in support of neighbors. During this time many residents have lamented about the group’s name, which includes the word “charity.” Many Sun City residents wish to maintain independence, and they do not like to be associated with accepting “charity” support. Therefore, the Charities’ Board of Directors has approved the new operating name of Sun City Volunteers. The organization will retain its formal original name and tax-exempt charitable (501(c) (3) status. Donations may be made to either the Sun City Summerlin Charities, Inc., or Sun City Volunteers. The organization’s goal remains the same – to assist our neighbors in maintaining an independent lifestyle.

TRANSPORTATION

Medical, physical therapy, dental, surgical, ophthalmologist/cataract, banking, income tax preparation, beauty salon, grocery store shopping, drug store, dry cleaning/laundry pickup, veterinary. (Transportation services are viewed as official business only. Volunteers does not make trips to casinos or to local clubs for recreational activities. We cannot provide support for open-ended shopping/window shopping at a local mall. Although some of our volunteers can manage wheelchairs, we are not qualified to help residents in and out of wheelchairs.)

HANDYMAN

Smoke alarm batteries, interior/exterior light bulbs, street address bulbs, heating/cooling system air filters, kitchen/

bath cabinet drawer slide supports and hinges, reset landscape water timers and popped circuit breakers, put water in golf cart batteries.

(Support is generally in the category of honey-do’s. We cannot accomplish repair/installation tasks that require a Nevada State Contractors License.)

SHORT-TERM SHUT-IN SERVICE

(This is a new service, pending availability of Volunteers)

Grocery shopping, prescription pick-up, daily contact phone calls, empty mail box, place/return trash bins. (Shut-in services are intended to accommodate a short duration problem. There is a limit of four weeks for these services. Referral will be made to a local Clark County assistance program or other charitable/professional organization if longer term assistance is needed.)

Volunteer services are provided

by Sun City Summerlin residents. Of our 51 members, no one is paid for their work. However, a small stipend is paid to our drivers to help defray automotive expenses. We have 12 members who staff our office and process resident requests, making volunteer assignments Monday through Friday, 8:30-11 a.m. The remaining 39 volunteers are drivers, handymen or both. Our volunteers accept assignments seven day a week.

DONATIONS ARE ACCEPTED

Sun City Volunteers accepts a \$10 donation for services provided; drivers and handymen do not accept tips.

THE TRUE STORY OF HUNTING DINOSAURS IN THE SAHARA

Renowned Paleontologist Shares Epic Discoveries in 'National Geographic Live!' Series

When Nizar Ibrahim recalls the early adventures of his paleontology career, they sound straight out of an Indiana Jones movie.

His mid-20s found Ibrahim as one of the youngest people to ever lead an excavation into the treacherous Sahara Desert, where he braved deadly temperatures and would-be kidnappers.

"I thought, 'The people I'm taking out there, it's a big responsibility. I want to bring them back alive,'" Ibrahim remembers with a laugh.

His passion would pay off, with Ibrahim uncovering the long-lost skeleton of the near-mythical Spinosaurus, the largest predatory dinosaur yet discovered.

How did he do it? Ibrahim will reveal this and more in his multi-media "National Geographic Live!" speaking engagement on September 28 at The Smith Center.

UNEARTHING AN ANCIENT WORLD

During his presentation, Ibrahim will dive into his hazardous excavations across the Sahara Desert, where he's unearthed a bevy of animal fossils from an "ancient, lost world."

"It was home not just to Spinosaurus, but lots of predators, like crocodiles as long as school buses," Ibrahim says.

Ibrahim will even show this ancient world with immersive, advanced CGI. "There will be really breathtaking recreations of this lost world of Sahara dinosaurs," he says.

MR. MOUSTACHE, I PRESUME

Ibrahim's story of finding the Spinosaurus is "a unique mix of science, adventure, history, drama and detective story," he says. His interest in the Spinosaurus was first sparked by mysterious fossils unearthed by an unknown fossil hunter in Africa.

"I absolutely had to track down that guy," Ibrahim recalls. "The problem was, I didn't have his name or phone number or address. All I knew was that he had a moustache."

If you're curious how Ibrahim found him, "I will tell the whole story at the speaking engagement," he vows.

Los Angeles Museum of the Holocaust and L.A. Farmer's Market



Los Angeles Museum of the Holocaust (LAMOTH) is the oldest survivor-founded Holocaust museum in the United States. In 1961, at Hollywood High School, a group of survivors taking English as a Second Language classes found one another and shared their experiences. They discovered that each of them had a photograph, a concentration camp uniform, or other precious primary source objects from the Holocaust era. They decided that these artifacts needed a permanent home where they could be displayed safely and in perpetuity. They also wanted a place to memorialize their dead and help educate the world so that no one would ever forget. Some of these founding survivors remain active on the LAMOTH Board of Directors today.

CREATING YOUR OWN MEDITATION PRACTICE

(Part three of our three-part series)

Most of us find it hard to start a new habit. We tell ourselves that we would like to exercise more, eat better or meditate. However, we never seem to find the time. Here are a few tips to help you get started on creating your own meditation practice. It may even help you to follow through on other positive habits you would like to create. Decide where you want to meditate. Make it a place that is quiet and where you won't be disturbed. An outside patio, your living room or den are a few places to consider. Experiment with each location to see what works best for you. Choose a time of day that is good for you. If you are an early riser, you might prefer first thing in the morning. If not, what would be the best time for you to meditate? Select how long your session will be. Start with 10 minutes and increase it to 15, then 20 minutes or longer.

A FEW TOOLS CAN HELP YOU GET STARTED:

A comfortable chair to sit upright in, with your feet touching the floor (a cushion may be required under your feet to touch the floor). If you are doing a guided meditation, you will need a Smartphone or other audio device to listen with.

Set up some reminders – an alarm on your phone for 5 or 10 minutes before your starting time is a good idea. Sticky notes on your mirror or refrigerator door also work great.

Create rewards for yourself when you have followed through on your commitment. For example, after 10 sessions, celebrate with a special cup of coffee, call a friend you haven't talked with in a while, or buy a new book to read. When we reward our good behavior it becomes easier to continue on our path.

Be accountable to others. Tell your best friend that you have started a meditation practice and give them permission to ask if you're sticking to your goal of meditating three days a week. Post on your Facebook page (or other social media) that you have started a meditation practice.

MS. POOL ETIQUETTE



How do you get to use the pool swimming lanes? All pools have designated swimming lanes (except the Pinnacle outdoor pool). They also have a designated area, which does not have to be requested, for free, aqua-type exercise or swimming. Desk and/or pool monitors are always available to request a lane from. When all lanes are occupied, the monitor keeps a waiting list. As soon as a lane becomes available, the next person is assigned a lane and so on. When the lanes are full, the 30-minute lane use is in effect. If no one is waiting when your first 30 minutes is up, you can signal the monitor that you would like more time and a new 30-minute period is started. During open swim times, lanes can be used to swim, walk, exercise, etc. However, during busy times the fitness monitor may ask you to share a lane. Keep in mind when the swimming pools are being used by the various aqua clubs, the lanes are not open or available for use by non-club members unless the club invites you to use lanes that will not interfere with their club activities.



MR. GYM ETIQUETTE

Getting the perfect temperature in a gym can be a challenge. Taking into consideration the number of

people working out, the size of the room and the temperature outdoors, it can be a moving target. Also, each individual in that room may have a different preference. Some like it hot and others like it a bit cooler. We aim to keep the temperature in our gyms at 68 degrees, using the fans to circulate air and reduce the temperature when necessary. You may request that the fitness monitor turn the fans on or off, keeping in mind that others might not agree with your choice or your request. The monitor will do his or her best to accommodate you.

There are people who always bring me candy, a 92-year-old pinochle player, one guy who lays in the sun for hours that I have to keep checking on. I've met so many people here who I wouldn't have gotten to know if I didn't work here."

Darrell is the inspiration for his son's career. Darrell Junior is now a private chef for several Las Vegas notables, as well as chef at several local banquet halls. Darrell Junior trained at our former Summerlin Le Cordon Bleu.

Darrell expresses his love for our Sun City by stating he is so grateful for the support he has received from residents and all levels of management and staff during his years at our restaurants.

"It is easy to come to work. Sun City feels like home," he said.

AARP sponsors an important program in Sun City to prepare income tax returns for residents. This program is staffed by volunteers who, last year, prepared more than

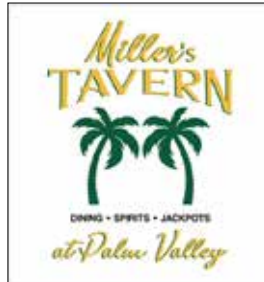

Republic Services to Deliver New Trash Cans



Republic Services will start delivering trash containers to Sun City in preparation of the new trash pickup service on Friday, August 24.

- **August 24 - September 6** - Trash containers will be delivered to each home in Sun City Summerlin. Each home will receive two 35-gallon containers - one for regular trash and one for recycle items.
- **September 11** - New trash pickup service begins. **DO NOT PUT OUT THE NEW TRASH CANS UNTIL SEPTEMBER 11.** The current trash service will remain in effect until Friday, September 7.
- As a reminder, both containers are put on the same day of the week (Tuesday) and **trash will only be picked up once a week.**
- Containers must be placed in the street in the front of your home with the back wheels pushed up against the curb.

The Architectural Review Committee is working with SCSCAI's Board of Directors to formulate a plan for outside enclosures in which to store the new trash cans. Until a plan is approved, homeowners will be able to store their trash cans in their garage or on the side of their homes, behind the front line of the house. The goal is to store the trash cans out of view from the street. If you live in a sub-association you will need to contact your sub-association's Board of Directors or management company for direction as to where to store the containers.

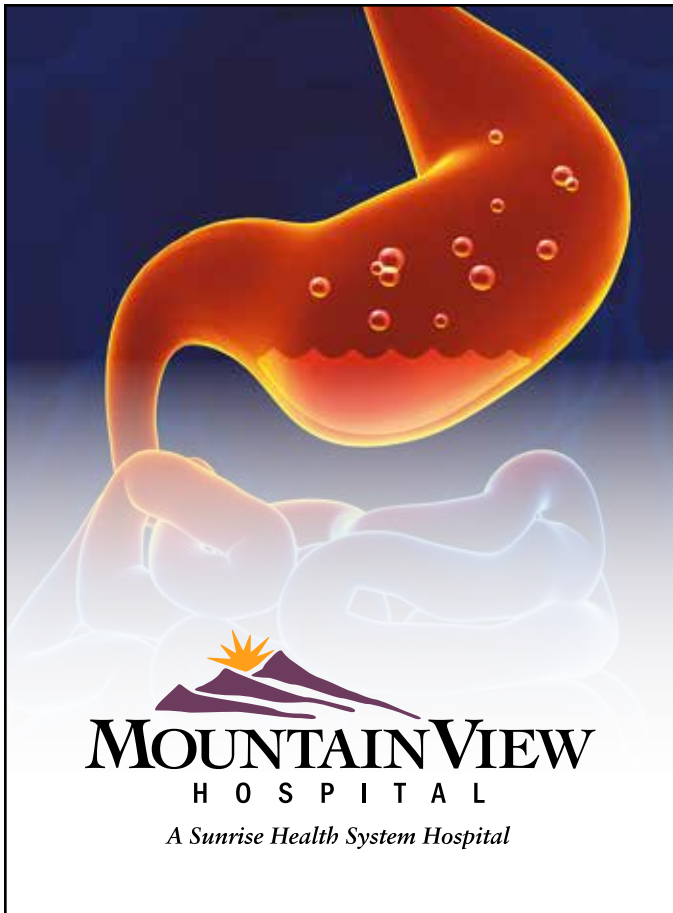

Committee OKs Review of Project to Raise Softball Field Fence

At the July Common Area Properties Committee meeting, the Men's Softball Club, represented by President Rob Robinson, requested authorization and approximately \$16,000 in funding to raise the outfield fence from 3 feet to 8 feet. A well-documented and illustrated report, highlighting safety issues to both players and residents caused by the fences being so low, was presented to the committee. After some discussion, the committee asked SCSCAI Executive Director Mitzi Mills to do a Conceptual Idea study on the request for further review by this committee as well as others. SCSCAI Director of Facility Maintenance Brandon Balek reported that the Association is waiting for estimates for paving the area near the Mountain Shadows administration area to increase golf cart parking. The committee asked Brandon to come back with drawings and an estimate for the project. Brandon also stated that he was not satisfied with the shuffleboard resurfacing that was recently completed, and that further action will be required. He also reported that a trial of a background

music service was underway at the Mountain Shadows Community Center.

There was a discussion regarding the need for additional parking at the Highland Falls Golf Course and restaurant. An area in front of the building has previously been identified as a possibility. The committee is waiting to see a street view, an overhead view and a drawing showing the layout.


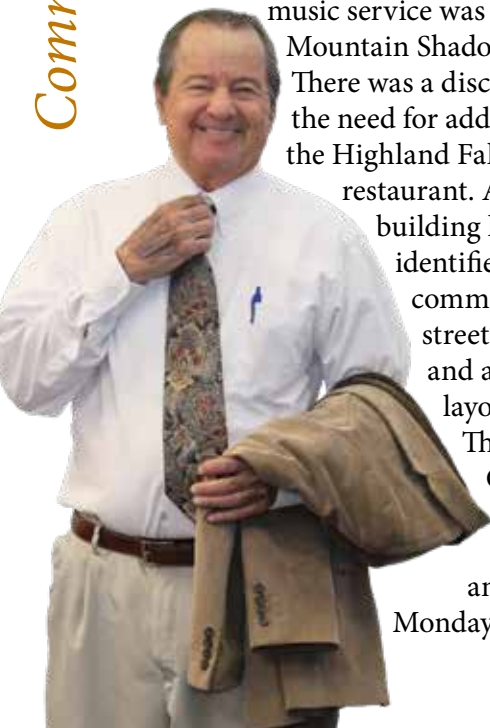

Security Patrol and Lost Pets

A Security Patrol driver radios the dispatcher reporting that he has spotted a dog running through the neighborhood he is patrolling. As the driver describes the animal, the dispatcher reads the lost/found pet log to see if a lost pet has been reported. Finding an entry that matches the lot animal, the dispatcher radios the dog's name to the driver and asks the volunteer to leash it. Once the driver radios that the dog is secure, the dispatcher phones Security Patrol's pet officer, Helen Bubenheim. Animals are not allowed in Patrol cars, so the driver waits with the dog until Helen gets to him.

"I take the dog to my garage," said Helen. "If the dog doesn't have a collar with the owner's information, I take it to either the Sun City Animal Hospital or the Summerlin Animal Hospital to see if it has an identification chip."

In addition to her duties as the Patrol's pet officer, Helen also serves as assistant head of the Information Centers. "If the pet doesn't have a chip, I either take them home or leave it at the vet's. After four or five days, I take the dog to the ASPCA.

"The vet hospitals are so generous and good with the lost dogs. They do not charge Security Patrol or me if the dog is left there or needs medical care. The hospitals work with us. It is very much appreciated."

On a hot July day, Helen received a call from the dispatcher informing her that a resident had found a dog and asked if the Patrol could pick it up from the neighbor. When Helen arrived, she took the small white dog with brown patches to Summerlin Animal Hospital

and Sun City Animal Hospital hoping that the staff might recognize it. The dog had no identification. "The dog, possibly a mixed springer, was in good condition for being loose for, I think, at least three days," Helen said. "He was friendly, didn't bark and was well-mannered. ...He was so cute. I hope we find his owner." It's been Helen's experience that many times a neighbor will find a lost dog.

"Once, Security Patrol got a call from a neighbor who had rescued an old dog. The dispatcher called me and as I was putting the dog into my car, I saw a younger woman looking around the neighborhood. I asked if she was looking for a dog. The woman described the dog and was so excited to see it. The pet belonged to her elderly parents and had left the house as company was arriving."

Lost cats are more difficult to rescue. Like a recalcitrant three-year old, cats defy rescue unless it is on their terms. "We do not chase cats. We can't," Helen said.

Security Patrol does keep a log for lost cats, but relies on neighbors to spot the cat and lure the animal into their garages or homes.

"If a neighbor sees a lost cat, I recommend leaving a bowl of water out, and maybe the cat will either stay around the house or allow the neighbor to take it inside," said Garnet Wynant, Helen's assistant.


If a cat is found, a report should be made to Security Patrol, where dispatchers will contact the owner if the cat has been placed in the lost and found pet log.

In another incident, Helen described receiving a call to pick up an English bulldog that was rescued by a neighbor.

“The owner reported it to the dispatcher and then spoke with me. They were thankful. The family has been breeding English bulldogs for generations.”

For their safety, Helen recommends that all dogs have identification. If they are not chipped (an identification chip that’s implanted with an owner’s contact numbers), then a collar should contain the owner’s contact information and the dog’s name.

Helen has been a Patrol volunteer for nine years and the pet officer for five years. She recalled her first dog rescue: “Cicero was the first dog I rescued. He was pretty big and once in my house, he jumped into my husband’s lap. He looked like he planned to stay. Cicero did stay overnight, then I called the owner. A few months later, Cicero ran out again and I recognized him. It is so rewarding to re-unite a lost pet with its owner. We have a 95 percent reunion-with-owners rate.”

Rosemary (Rozi) Heredy

A Military Career, Motherhood & More

She is a UCLA graduate, an Air Force officer, a wife and a mother of four. She is a first-generation American born in Ohio to Hungarian refugees, raised in California and steeped in the culture of the old country. She served 28 years in the Air Force and was named the UCLA Woman Veteran of the Year upon retirement in 2009. She is Sun City resident Rosemary “Rozi” Heredy. “My parents escaped Hungary in 1956 when the Soviet Union crushed the Hungarian revolution, but they never quite left the old country behind. I grew up speaking Hungarian as my first language,” Rozi said. “We were living in Ohio when I was born, but moved to Los Angeles when I was 10 months old. I lived in Southern California until my husband, Laszlo, and I moved to Sun City in 2012.” “When I was 9, my parents sent me to a Hungarian boarding school in Germany. They felt that I would get a better education there, taught entirely in Hungarian, and perhaps they were right because when I returned to Los Angeles I was able to enroll in Immaculate Heart high school in an advanced grade. I graduated at 16 and was accepted into UCLA with a major in German,” Rozi recalled. Rozi also enrolled in the USAF ROTC program at UCLA and upon graduation in 1979 was awarded a Distinguished Graduate designation and a commission

in the Air Force reserve. She began what was destined to be a 28-year career with an assignment at Los Angeles Air Force Base (El Segundo) as a buyer/contract officer* for the Space Division. Her next assignment was at the Hughes Air Force Plant Representative Office. Rozi was in her second four-year hitch with every intention of staying in the service when she met and married Laszlo, also a refugee from the Hungarian uprising who was 8 years old when he arrived in the U.S. During the second hitch Laszlo and Rozi had two children. Rozi’s assignments up to that time had all been in Southern California, but if she re-enlisted she was looking at an assignment sure to be elsewhere in the world. Laszlo’s career in finance was progressing nicely and was solidly in place at a Los Angeles-based major insurance company. It was time to re-evaluate her career goals. It was 1985 and in addition to her other accomplishments, Rozi had earned an MBA at Cal State-Dominguez Hills. A career in the business side of the Air Force would definitely be promising. Balanced against that was Laszlo’s career advancement, the two children here now and the desire for a larger family. Bottom line: After six years of active duty, then-Captain Rosemary Heredy resigned and looked for a reserve slot to maintain her affiliation with the Air Force. But Rozi was looking for something special – an assignment

that would let her use her education and experience while still allowing her to be a stay-at-home mom for her growing family. She explored various opportunities until she found the perfect fit: Individual Mobilization Augmentee (IMA). Simply put, IMAs train alongside active-duty personnel and learn how to perform their job if and when they are deployed. Her assignments were varied both in time and in duties. Some assignments were as short as one week, others years long. At one point she taught an Air Force ROTC class at UCLA (although not really an IMA assignment), filling in for an officer on maternity leave who then decided to retire. That assignment lasted a full academic year. Her first IMA assignment found her filling in at her old job at Hughes Aircraft. Her next assignment took her

to the Pentagon, where, for nine years, she was assigned first to the Contracting Division and then to the Deputy Under Secretary of the Air Force for International Affairs.

In the Spring of 1995, Rozi was offered the opportunity of a six-month active duty tour as Deputy Team Chief, Military Liaison Team, Hungary, a part of Headquarters, European Command.

"That was an exciting assignment, something I really wanted to do because it was back in Hungary and allowed me to use my Hungarian language skills," she said. "We had four children by that time so it was something I could not even consider if it weren't for the complete support of my husband."

During her six-month tour, Rozi was invited to appear on a Hungarian TV talk show, where her fluency in the Hungarian language and her own success story made her an instant hit. To her audience, she was a local girl made good, really good!

At the end of her six-month assignment, Rozi had an opportunity of a lifetime – becoming a determining factor in Austrian defense policy. At that time, ...

Longtime Friends Reconnect in Sun City

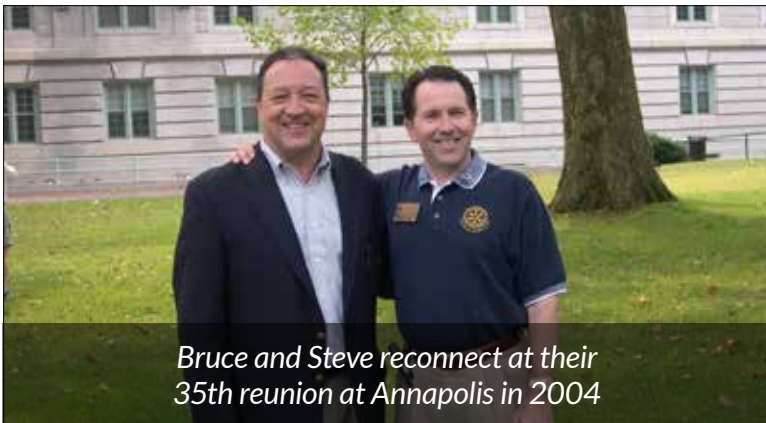
We follow many paths during our lifetime; some we choose, some are chosen for us. During that trip we cross paths with many, many people, some for mere minutes, some for decades. So it was that the paths of two teenagers, one from Michigan, one from Pennsylvania, met and ran in parallel for a couple of years before diverging once again only to rejoin 35 years later. The first intersection came at the United States Naval Academy (Annapolis) and that almost didn't happen.

Both Steve Linder of Pennsylvania and Bruce Adams of Michigan had wanted a military career. Steve focused on Annapolis from the beginning; Bruce hedged his bets. "I applied to both the U.S. Military Academy (West Point) and Annapolis," Bruce said. "I received an appointment to West Point and was planning on attending there. On my high school graduation day I received a telegram stating that I had been selected to attend Annapolis. It didn't take long to make my decision. I reported to the Naval Academy on 30 June, 1965, to be sworn in as a Midshipman and a member of the Class of 1969."

Steve also was a member of that class. He and Bruce met, attended classes together and participated in sports together. No one ever described the military academies as party schools, especially for fourth-class men (freshmen). But they survived and in their first class (senior) year, Bruce and Steve became roommates. And the friendship blossomed.

June 4, 1969, was graduation day, a memorable day for them both that also marked the beginning of the divergence in their life paths. Bruce was commissioned as an Ensign in the Navy; Steve chose a Marine Corps career and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant. But the paths didn't split just then. The newly minted officers and gentlemen had two months' leave after graduation and, after four grueling years at the academy, they intended to make the most of it.

"We planned a trip to Europe using the 'Europe on \$10 a Day' tour book as a guide," Bruce said. "Neither of us had ever been to Europe before. We took a free, military hop from Dover AFB to Germany followed by a train to Paris. We hitch-hiked to London, took a ferry to Amsterdam

While visiting Steve and Janet, Bruce couldn't help but notice Steve's hobby, model building. The models were everywhere. At one point, Steve gave Bruce a model kit, but that first attempt didn't work out so well.

"I got stuck and gave the kit back to Steve," Bruce recalled. "But many months later I noticed the unfinished model in the corner of his garage. I took it back, finished it and was hooked. Today, both Steve and Bruce are active members of the Sun City Model Builders Club. Bruce is club

and drove to Frankfort for a flight home. We lived on \$10 a day by staying at cheap tourist hotels and refilling our wine bottles (refills only cost 25 cents). We saw the sights."

"Some of us did more than see the sights," Steve interjected with a laugh. "Like the time in Paris when Bruce and I climbed Notre Dame and he wrapped himself around a gargoyle."

Their leave over, they both reported for active duty. Bruce attended Naval Gunnery School in San Diego; Steve the Marine Corps Officers' Basic School in Quantico, Va. Their life paths diverged,

not to reconnect for 35 years. A lot had changed in that time, but the underlying friendship was still there, though buried deep in their memory.

In 2004, they both independently decided to attend the Class of 1969 reunion in Annapolis and the friendship was back on track. Steve's civilian career had brought him to Las Vegas in 1993 (and to Sun City in 2007). Las Vegas is a great place to visit, so Bruce and his wife, Linda, quickly accepted Steve's invitation to visit – two or three times every year.

"In 2010, we liked Las Vegas so much we decided to buy a home in Sun City, so we could visit more often," Bruce said. "We did that for three or four years and permanently moved here in 2013."

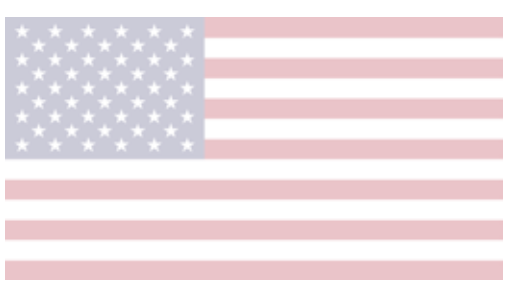

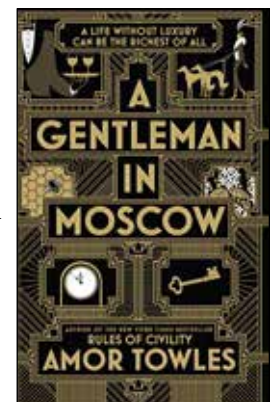

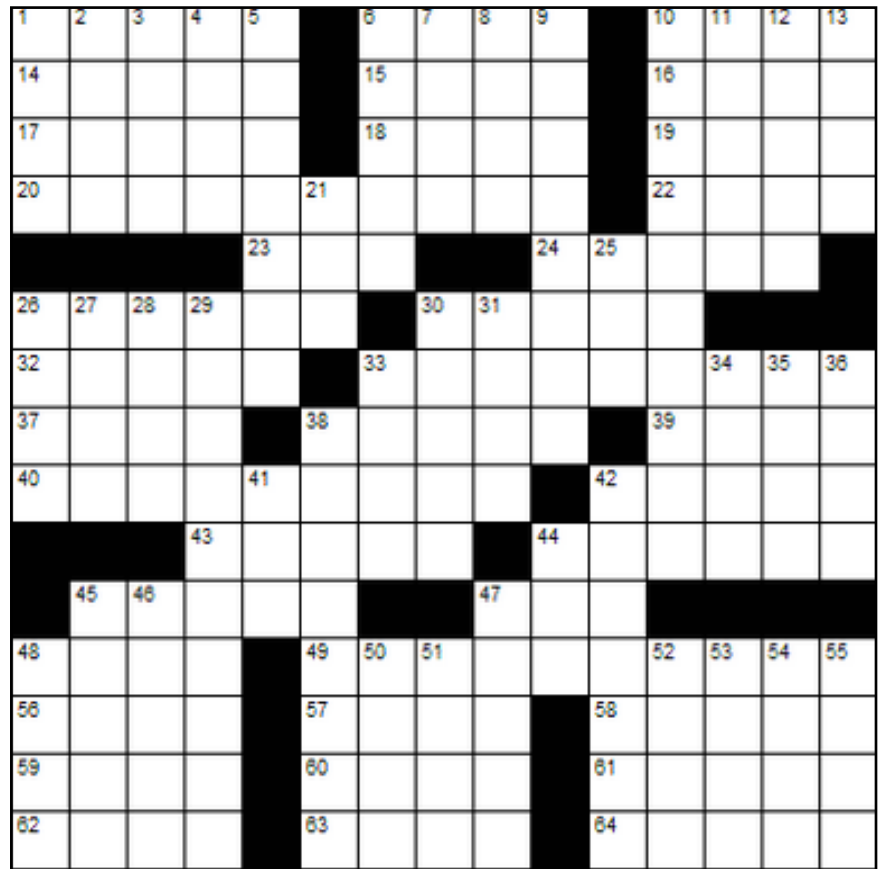

Executive Director's Report for the period ending August 11, 2018

Republic Services Trash Container Delivery – On August 10, we were notified that Republic Services is ahead of schedule and will start delivery of the trash containers to each home on August 24. I will be sending out a blast email to let our residents know all of the following information.

August 13 – Starting the week of August 13, Republic Services will be sending a welcome packet to each home in Sun City Summerlin letting the resident know the schedule for the delivery of the trash containers to their home, when the new service will start, what the process is for putting the containers out for pickup (placement is on the street with the back wheels against the curb. Do not put them on the sidewalk) and what items can be recycled. Please watch for the packet, the return address is Republic Services but the packet is addressed to “Resident” and it can easily be mistaken for junk mail. Once I get a sample packet I will be sending it out by blast email as well so those residents who are out of town have the information they need in order to arrange with a friend or neighbor to have the containers put in their garage or on the side of their home, or to delay delivery until they return.

August 24 – September 6 – Trash containers will be delivered to each home. Each home will receive two 35-gallon containers. One for regular trash and one for recycle items. Do not put these containers out for pickup until September 11. The current trash service will remain in effect until Tuesday, September 11, 2018.

September 11 – New trash service using containers begins today. As a reminder, both containers are put out on the same day of the week (Tuesday) and you will only have once-a-week pickup. As a reminder, do not place the containers on the sidewalk for trash service, the containers must be placed in the street in front of your home with the back wheels pushed up against the curb (handles facing your home).

New Website Launched - Doug Wong our Information Technology manager launched our new webpage on August 1. This was following 45 days of review by the Information Technology Committee. The review provided input on what should be on the website and how to improve accessibility to information. The most common concern was accessing the site and the primary cause of issues was that users had not cleared their cache and their computers were trying to take them to the old site. We have received many compliments on the appearance of the new site, as well as how easy it is to move around and find information. Within 51 hours of the site going live we had received 537 visits, 1,654 page views and 441 Sun City Summerlin members had signed up and created an account by entering log-in information.

End-of-Year Financials and 2017/2018 Fiscal Year Audit – The Accounting Department, under the direction of Helen Little, has

worked hard over the last three months to check balance sheet line items and test the items posted to each line item for accuracy. Where necessary, corrections have been made and new line items have been created to project a clearer picture of the Association’s assets, liabilities and equity (fund balances). The Accounting Department is now using our accounting software for 98 percent of the accounting duties and work is no longer being done on spreadsheets and uploaded into the software. This has created efficiencies, will improve accuracy and will allow us to stay current and create financials in a timely manner. It has been a long process and it will be evident to the Finance Committee and the Board of Directors that not only were the changes needed, but the reports will now provide more information to the reader. The June financials will be closed the week of August 13, and the auditors will come in to do the field work on the year ending June 30, 2018. The great thing is with the changes in procedure and reporting, all of the information for July was entered in real time and the reconciliations and reports should be produced with very little delay. Moving forward our accounting calendar will be adhered to and the Finance Committee will have the reports approximately one week before their meetings, allowing them time to review and send the reports onto the Board of Directors for acceptance at their monthly Board meetings.

Insurance Claims – As of July 17, 2018, we had 10 open insurance claims against the Association’s insurance. Of these, six are claims filed by residents and two are claims filed by non-residents. Two are internal property damage claims. Following is a breakdown by year of when the claims were filed: 2015, one claim; 2016, three claims; 2017, two claims; 2018, four claims. Trip-and-falls remain the No. 1 claim. We continue to look for ways to reduce our claims in an attempt to try to control our Association insurance costs. Presently, the property and casualty portion of our insurance is approximately \$65 per home, per year. Staff and homeowners working together can keep these costs down. So, if you see something that you believe is a potential liability please report it to my office.

Update on Outstanding Action Items: The date listed is the date the item was approved at an open Board of Directors’ meeting, except for the items dated June 14, 2018. These are follow-up items from issues that were pending from the past.

1/9/2018 – Disposal by Auction of two Maintenance Trucks - COMPLETE

The trucks were sold at auction on June 23. One of the buyers did not produce the amount bid for the Dodge and that truck was put back out for bid. The auction was handled by Neil’s Auctions and we received fair market value for the amount of wear and tear on the maintenance trucks. The Chevrolet was sold for \$3,000 and the Dodge was sold for \$1,400.

2/16/2018 – Reserve Study – IN PROGRESS

Complex Solutions has spent several weeks on the property inspecting the community buildings, equipment, vehicles, pumps and other assets that have a life of 1 to 30 years. The study is in process and we should have it in the next 30 days for review by the Common Area Properties Committee, Finance Committee and Board of Directors. There were items noted that had been left out or possibly removed from previous reserve studies that have been added to make sure funds are available for future replacement.

4/3/2018 – Change from Century Link to Cox Communications – IN PROGRESS

Cox is doing the work. Sun Shadows is complete. Pinnacle/Summit will be completed by August 20. All other areas are in different stages of construction.

5/1/2018 – Palm Valley Golf Course Irrigation Project – IN PROGRESS

The Palm Valley Golf Course irrigation is on schedule. There have been a couple of issues that have delayed the progress, but so far they have been able to make up the time. The extreme heat has slowed the crews down as they are not able to work as many hours and need to take more breaks than normal. The main water lines (the big pipe) has been installed on all nine holes and they are now installing the lateral lines (the smaller pipe) that attach to the sprinkler heads. Under the watchful eye of Brian Bagwell, Director of Golf Maintenance, the irrigation lines are inspected prior to be covered up and the damage to our landscape has been minimal.

5/1/2018 – Rental Policy – ON HOLD FOR RESEARCH

The Board of Directors has asked the Legal Services Committee and the Executive Director to research if there is a need for a policy for registration or tracking of homes that are not owner occupied and are rented out.

5/1/2018 – Club Cart for Painting – COMPLETE

A Club Cart was purchased for use by the Maintenance Department to be set up as a paint vehicle. The cart was purchased from Golf Carts Etc. in the amount of \$8,299 (PO 11345). This is a gas engine cart and is equipped with a cargo box, head lights and an hour meter to keep track of time used. The cost included freight.

6/5/2018 – Replacement of Outdoor Furniture for Tavern at the Falls

This item has been put on hold for further investigation and to see if the area is used and new furniture is needed.

6/5/2018 – Palm Valley Restaurant Tenant – IN PROGRESS

The timeline for the opening of Miller's Tavern at Palm Valley was on schedule to open for food and beverage on or around September 12, until we received word that the Las Vegas City Council had vacated the September 10 meeting due to the Yom Kippur holiday. We will not know if they plan to meet on another date until they hold their August 15 council meeting. If they do not hold a meeting in September, the opening will be delayed until October.

July 18 – Las Vegas City Council reviewed and approved Sun City Summerlin's application to transfer the liquor license for the Palm Valley Restaurant from Five Star Tavern back to Sun City Summerlin. The lease agreements for the Palm Valley Restaurant include a clause that transfers our liquor license to the tenant for as long as they are tenants and then back to Sun City Summerlin once the lease is terminated. Even though in the lease agreement the transfer still must go before the Las Vegas City Council for formal approval.

August 7 – The following documents were executed so our new tenant, Miller's Tavern at Palm Valley, can move forward with its liquor license application and gaming license. Landlord Suitability Statement Addendum (gaming), Liquor License Agreement and Liquor License Transfer Agreement (liquor).

August 7 – Randy Miller (owner) and Curtis Deal (restaurant manager) were interviewed by Jeannette Carrillo, managing editor of the Link Magazine. Their story and plans for Sun City Summerlin will appear in the September issue of the Link Magazine.

August 9 – Sun City Summerlin's Architectural Review Committee reviewed, amended and approved the signage design and placement for Miller's Tavern at Palm Valley. The amendment included the denial of placement of fluorescent tube lighting in the brown stripe line of the Sun City Summerlin monument signs and building trim.

August 14 – 18 – Deep cleaning of the Palm Valley restaurant, bar, kitchen and patio area will be done by Sun City Summerlin maintenance crews.

August 20 – 29 - Preliminary inspection of Palm Valley restaurant, bar and kitchen by an independent contractor for health department requirements, building and equipment repairs. All repairs required by Sun City Summerlin completed. Health Department inspection scheduled.

August 30 – September 9 – Health Department inspection and tenant improvements.

September 10 – City Council meeting vacated for the Yom Kippur holiday. The expectation was that Miller's Tavern, LLC dba Miller's Tavern at Palm Valley, would be on the September Las Vegas City Council meeting agenda for approval of the liquor license. We will not know if this meeting will be rescheduled or if the approval for the liquor license will be held until their October meeting. The opening will be held off until the liquor license is granted by the city council.

TBD (Based on City Council meeting date) – Tenant move in, prep and announcement of open date. Please note, it is possible to get a temporary license if there is not a meeting and Mr. Miller already has things in process to pursue this.

6/5/2018 – Sun shade for bocce courts - COMPLETE

The installation of Sun Shades for the bocce court social area is complete. The work was done by our in-house maintenance team and welder. The majority of the supplies were purchased when the shades were added over the benches at the bocce courts, however, some additional steel and beams were needed. These supplies were purchased from Curtis Steel Company in the amount of \$613.78.

6/14/2018 – Desert Vista LED Lighting Retrofit – IN PROGRESS

This work is being done by our in-house staff and is done as time permits and rooms are not in use.

6/14/2018 – Desert Vista Tennis Courts and Pickle Ball Courts Windscreen Replacement

On May 2, Superior Courts was given a deposit of \$2,600 to take down the damaged windscreens and take measurements so new windscreens could be manufactured. As of August 12, we are still waiting for delivery and installation of the wind screens. Total cost \$5,200, remaining balance of \$2,600 due when the windscreens are installed.

6/14/2018 – Pinnacle Tennis Courts Wind Screen Replacement

On May 2, Superior Courts was given a deposit of \$2,100 to take down the damaged windscreens and take measurements so new windscreens could be manufactured. As of August 12, we are still waiting for delivery and installation of the wind screens. Total cost \$4,100, remaining balance of \$2,100 due when the windscreens are installed.

6/14/2018 – Mountain Shadow Tennis Court #3 Resurfacing - COMPLETE

The resurfacing of the Mountain Shadows tennis courts is complete. The work was done by Superior Courts (PO #11337). Total Cost \$8,000. Work included exposing and cleaning out the cracks and damaged areas, and removing all loose debris. Filling cracks with an approved plexifill crack filler, sanding all repairs until they were level, pressure wash or acid wash as needed, applying two coats of acrylic resurfacer, applying two coats of textured Laykold color finish with the final coat fortified with UV protection and lining the court with a laser "proliner" to exact location.

6/14/2018 – Mountain Shadows Shuffleboard Court Resurfacing – IN PROGRESS

At the July Common Area Properties Committee meeting, Brandon Balek, Director of Building Maintenance, reported the work had been done but the surface was not acceptable to the Shuffleboard Chartered Club as it is too rough and is not the

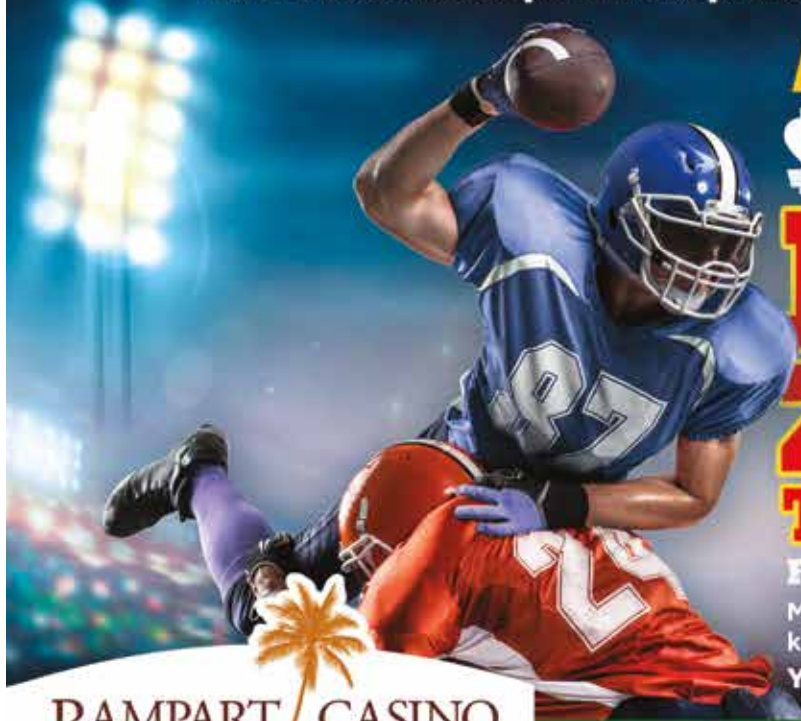
