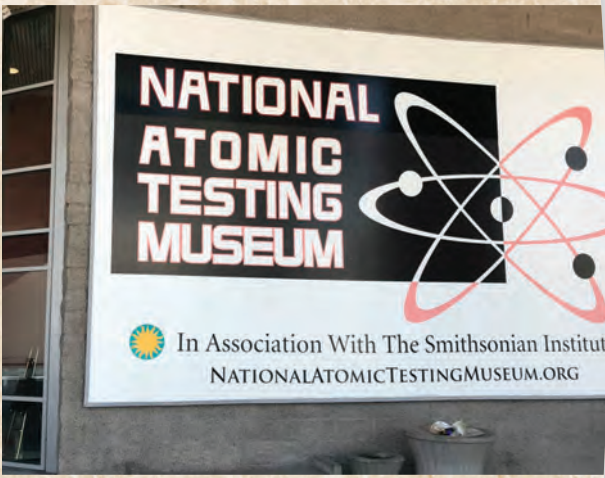

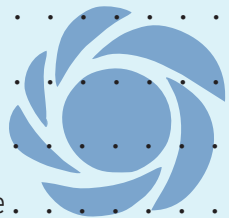

Questions Remain About Sub-association Rules

As you read this note, the results of the election for SCSCAI's Board of Directors will have been announced, and the next Board President and other Board officers will have been elected. It was my distinct honor and pleasure to serve as the SCSCAI Board President for the past year, and special thanks to my fellow Board members, all the resident volunteers on our committees and the great SCSCAI staff who worked so hard on behalf of our community. Thanks for a great year. When you consider all the great facilities and amenities in Sun City Summerlin and then you add to that the great people who live here, it's no wonder there are so few homes for sale, and the homes that are for sale tend to sell quickly.

Of all the comments over the last year that were included in the President's Message, the one that brought the most questions was the note on sub-associations (called "Sub" in this note). These were the most frequent questions.

1. Who is my management company? Each month (Page 73 in the February issue), the Link includes a list of the 39 Subs, as well as the name and telephone number of their management companies.
2. What services does my management company provide? The management company provides the services specified in their contract, typically such tasks as landscape maintenance. The exact tasks performed by the management company can vary from Sub to Sub but most management companies are also responsible for exterior maintenance such as roofs and painting. Your governing documents should specify what services the Sub provides and who pays for what repairs/maintenance.
3. Where does the money come from if I need a new roof or my home needs painting? Nevada Revised Statue 116 is about 400 pages of HOA do's and don'ts. NRS116 applies equally to ALL Nevada HOAs, including the SCSCAI master association and all 39 Subs. One of the NRS116 requirements (116.31151) is that HOAs must have a reserve fund set aside for capital equipment items such as roofs. You can get a copy of your reserve study through your Board or management company. If there are unanticipated capital expenses or the reserve fund is underfunded, you may collect a special assessment for the needed expense. The purpose of the reserve study and reserve fund is to avoid the need for a special assessment.
4. When does my Board meet? Check with your Board officers or management company. Board actions, with the sole exceptions of legal and personnel matters, must be made in public at a noticed meeting where all homeowners in that Sub can attend. As an example, the contract for your management company must have been voted on and approved at an open meeting of your HOA Board. NRS 116.31083 thru 31088 discusses Board meetings.
5. Do we have to follow the master association rules? Yes. The Sub can make the rules more restrictive, but not less, i.e., the master might limit house colors to 12 choices, but the Sub can choose to limit house colors to only one. The master can send a complaint to a Sub for violating a master Development Standard – such things as failure to pull weeds or maybe painting a home blue with pink stripes.

As a final note, once again, the weeds are starting to show up. We had a fairly wet year and the weeds will no doubt reflect that abundance of water. Be good neighbors and get rid of your weeds. Let's save the Community Standards staff (Barbara and Julie) a bunch of postage on violation letters.

Presentations Deliver Ideas of Opportunity

Common Area Properties (CAP) Committee members heard two very different and impressive presentations during the February meeting at Desert Vista.

SCSCAI Fitness Director Pam Shields led the presentation agenda with her recommendation to transform the Sun Shadows Community Center into a functional fitness center that would maximize training space, and set aside rooms for massage, physical therapy and nutritional consultants. The long-held idea of changing over the venue from a catchall space for clubs, recreation events and community meetings to a center dedicated to health and wellness has grown in popularity as the community welcomes new homeowners with different fitness needs.

According to Pam, the plan would take three years to complete and start with discussions during the upcoming FY2020-21 budget process.

Further details of Pam's plan included relocating the monitor station to the center of the lobby and adding a small café bar that would serve coffee, smoothies and healthy snacks.

The second presentation delivered to CAP members included a request by the Silver, Lapidary & Glass Fusion Club to rehab its current studio at Mountain Shadows. Club members cited age and function as their reasons for requested equipment.

"They want new tables, new lockers and new shelving," said CAP Chairman Dick Clark. "Their membership now is over 100, where 30 years ago it was under 30. The lockers they use are 11 inches square where most of the glass they use is 12 inches, so it doesn't even fit."

Overall, Dick said he was very pleased with both presentations.

"Pam and the fitness staff did a great job. It was obvious they did their homework, and I was very impressed with the Silver, Lapidary and Glass Fusion Club's presentation because they brought pictures that were circulated around the room," he said.

Staff reports to the Committee included SCSCAI Facilities Maintenance Director Brandon Balek reporting that the new

sound board for the Starbright Theatre had been ordered. Installation of the unit is expected to boost the sound quality inside the theater. Brandon said the sound board will be installed in-house by Sun City's lighting and sound technicians Dale Meeker and Dirk Kleutgens.

Brandon also told the committee that work to resolve the pigeon issues at Highland Falls and Palm Valley golf courses was underway.

SCSCAI Landscape Director Louis Darling followed up last month's report by alerting members to the upcoming work to level the uneven concrete of the patio area between Mountain Shadows' administration and craft wings.

National Atomic Testing Museum

Tuesday, March 3

The National Atomic Testing Museum (NATM) is a national science, history and educational institution that tells the story of America's nuclear weapons testing program at the Nevada Test Site. Nowhere else can you see a large nuclear reactor that was used in the development of the nuclear rocket and the first air-to-air missile, Genie. Personal atomic weapons that were developed to use in place of conventional weapons such as the Backpack Nuke and the Davy Crockett Weapon System (recoilless gun) are placed throughout the 8,000 square feet of museum exhibits. From Atomic Age culture to the scientific and technological advances, the Museum highlights 70 years of nuclear testing.

Black Canyon River Float

Wednesday, March 25

This is an extremely rare view of Hoover Dam that very few people have the opportunity to see. Guests board large comfortable rafts that have been carefully constructed with safety in mind. Rafts have multiple air chambers and are outfitted with all of the Coast Guard-required and recommended safety equipment. During this excursion, experienced and knowledgeable guides share the history of this magnificent geological area. Be prepared to see desert bighorn sheep, osprey and great blue heron in their natural setting. The tour stops along the shore to give you a chance to enjoy the cool, clear and calm

West Rim Grand Canyon and Skywalk

Tuesday, April 21

Bus departs Pinnacle at 8:30 a.m.; returns at approximately 5 p.m.

This 10-foot-wide, horseshoe-shaped glass bridge extends 70 feet out over the rim of the Grand Canyon. Look down and you can see right through the glass platform 4,000 feet to the floor of the Canyon below. It's Dark Out There. Are Your Lights On?

Sun City Security Patrol encourages residents to be aware of the effect of having exterior lights on at night as a deterrent to thieves. Although most burglaries take place during the daylight hours, burglaries do take place during the dark hours.

The simple installation of outside fixtures with LED lights can prevent a potential burglary because the nefarious person will be seen. He or she will move on to the house where darkness looms outside and the lights inside are not on. Additionally, dog walkers would feel comfortable during the late-night stroll with their pet when exterior lights illuminate the neighborhood.

Security Patrol volunteers drive 24/7, maintaining a presence in our community. Exterior and interior lights are important in assisting drivers to determine if help is needed at a residence. For instance, the dispatcher receives a call from a resident requesting a Patrol person to come to their home to check on a problem. While drivers are familiar with the neighborhoods, it is important that your address light is working. For new neighbors, it's the light mounted on the outside garage wall. When properly working, the light displays your address and the driver can find your house quickly. The lightbulb number is 1891 and can be purchased at Pep Boys and other locations. For assistance with installation, call Sun City Charities/Volunteers 702-254-5831.

Another important light is the blinking light in the light fixture next to your front door. It blinks when the switch is pushed half-way instead of all the way up. It is easily engaged, and if your home does not have a front window, you might not be aware of it blinking. These lights were originally installed by Del Webb as an emergency light for residents needing immediate assistance. For Security Patrol, the blinking light means someone needs physical assistance and is unable to contact 911.

Flashing 911 lights are responded to immediately by the Security Patrol dispatcher who radios the driver assigned to that neighborhood. The driver then goes to the residence. Last year, drivers responded to approximately 536 flashing 911 lights. Most of the lights were on in error. Residents were either unaware that the light was flashing, or they turned on the light as a signal for a delivery person. Please check the switch to see if

the exterior light to your house is working properly. (Remember, half-way up flashes the light and Security Patrol drivers will ring your doorbell to inquire if assistance is needed. All the way up turns the outside light on.)



Neighbors have suggested leaving a light on in your home when you leave the house. Experiment with the different lamps/lights to see which source reflects outside to indicate that someone is home. It is another way to deter possible burglaries. Combining exterior lighting with an interior light is a good way to keep you and your neighborhood safe. When you are on vacation, it's a good idea to place household lights on a timer. Last but not least, request a vacation house check from Security Patrol. These checks allow Patrol drivers to check the exterior of your home for any signs of attempted entry, or problems with the irrigation. But, that's another story.

CCOC ADOPTS NEW PROCEDURES MANUAL

Early last year residents and club members expressed a desire for additional, more detailed guidelines related to the administration of clubs and organizations. In response, the Clubs and Community Organizations Committee (CCOC) began the task of reviewing what was the current manual and offering suggestions on how the procedures manual could be made more user-friendly and helpful to the administration of Sun City Summerlin's official organizations.

The process was careful and considerate, incorporating suggestions from club officers, the Community Services staff, SCSCAI Administration and CCOC members. Dick Clark, CCOC Chairman, patiently spearheaded meetings that resulted in various discussions incorporating gender-neutral language, "How To" guidance and example attachments for Sun City's more than 80 clubs and community groups.

The resulting document covers topics, including but not limited to, requirements for membership, elections and meetings, contractual relationships, utilization of dedicated rooms, guests, kitchen use, operating and safety rules, and IRS and SCSCAI accounting and record keeping.

"The new Policies and Procedures Manual's main purpose is to provide guidance to club officers, especially new officers. It also encourages clubs to have bylaws, as that is how the individuality or uniqueness of a club's desires can be defined," Clark said.

As always, the Community Services Department is residents' resource for additional information. Melissa Spina, Director of Community Services, said, "We are here to assist in any way we can and have every confidence that the new manual will serve as a road map for our clubs and organizations."

The CCOC is a standing committee of SCSCAI's Board of Directors that operates under its guidance and is subject to its review. CCOC serves as a liaison between clubs and the BOD for the purpose of recommending changes in policy, endorsing special programs and arbitrating matters of conflict.

The new Policies and Procedures Manual for Clubs and Community Organizations was approved at the January 14, 2020, Board of Directors' meeting. The manual is available at the Community Services office at the Desert Vista Community Center.

SUN CITY CLUBS ALIVE & WELL

The residents of Sun City Summerlin Community Association Inc., have 76 clubs, representing a variety of social, creative, recreational and athletic endeavors. In addition, five

philanthropic organizations are manned by resident volunteers who serve the community through individual networks.

To say Sun City's clubs and community organizations are vibrant groups that reflect the pulse of what's going on globally is an understatement.

When the Pickleball craze hit the national scene, active Sun City residents couldn't wait to establish a home court club. Five years after its founding, the Pickleball Club has grown to become one of Sun City's largest clubs with more than 150 members. Pickleballers meet several times a week at the courts at Desert Vista to engage in friendly competition. In fact, the group's organization is so impressive that it caught the eye of the Nevada Senior Games, which hosted its statewide tournament here in 2019. This year, the NSG will return to Desert Vista in October.

Other newly founded clubs that reflect topical interests include the Band Jam Club, which appeals to retired musicians; the Social Club (formerly the Boomer Connection) that enjoys partying - traveling to members' homes for potlucks, wine tastings, and excursions to baseball outings and more; the Men's Club, which has given men a place to gather and meet. Special events designed for significant others are always sold out; the Library Club that has refreshed Sun City's book repositories; and Social Duplicate Bridge, which has expanded play into Saturdays and offers mini lessons.

And that's not all. The Link often accepts classified ads for new club queries. Over the years, ideas for new groups have included volleyball, scuba diving, ocean cruising, gardening and more.

Functional Fitness: How Do I Get Started?

(In the first two articles of this Functional Fitness series, we discussed what Functional Fitness is and how it can improve your health and quality of life. In this last installment, we will outline how to get started with your own program. We'll cover specific exercises, discuss what makes them "functional," and explore ways to work functional training into your daily routine.)

"(Functional Fitness) trains your muscles to work together and prepares them for daily tasks by simulating common movements you might do at home, at work, or in sports." – Mayo Clinic

Functionality is not just about how strong your muscles are, it is about how efficiently all your muscles work together, making it easier to move and increase your performance in whatever you may be doing. If you think about it, most things/movements we do in life, whether we are at home, at work, or playing a sport can be boiled down to five basic movements – push/pull, bend, squat, lunge, and twist.

Push: Pushing exercises support activities moving weight away from your body and incorporate chest, triceps, fronts of the shoulders and quadriceps. Examples are pushing a door open or throwing a softball.

Pull: Pulling exercises support activities that move weight toward your body and incorporate your back, biceps and hamstrings. Examples include picking up your grandchild to hug him/her or using a rowing machine.

Bend (or hinge): Hinging exercises support activities that require you to bend at the hips and incorporates the hips, glutes, hamstrings and core. Examples are bending to pick something up off the floor, making a bed or gardening.

Squat: Squatting exercises support activities requiring you to lower and raise your body to/from a standing position and incorporates your lower body muscles and core. Examples include sitting down or getting up from a chair, getting up from the floor, picking up an object or a person.

Lunge: Lunging exercises involve one leg stepping away from your body, in any direction, bending the knees to bring you closer to the ground. This incorporates primarily



lower body and core muscles, as well as agility and balance. Examples are tying your shoes, climbing stairs, or reaching for the ball in Pickleball.

Twist: Twisting exercises utilize primarily your core (abs and back) and are usually combined with other movements such as lunge or push/pull. Examples are reaching to get something from the back seat of your car or swinging at a golf ball.

You are probably already familiar with these functional exercises that can be performed almost anywhere and can be incorporated throughout your day – walking, climbing stairs, sit-to-stand and push-ups or wall push-ups. Some functional exercises that you may not be familiar with that provide a good starting point for functional training and incorporate the key five movements are air squat, kettlebell swing, reverse wood chop, plank and farmer's carry.

Incorporating all of these basic movements into your workout will utilize all your major muscle groups and support performance of your daily activities.

Some other points to consider:

- ◆ Determine what your goals are and tailor your exercises.
- ◆ Consider a personal trainer to help you get started safely.
- ◆ Consider your level of health and fitness when choosing where to start.
- ◆ Include exercises that train strength, endurance, power, flexibility, balance and coordination.

Beginning in March, the Health and Fitness Department will provide (at each fitness center) instructions on how to perform the above safely and effectively. We also will host a functional training workshop this month, where you will be able to learn and perform the exercises. See Page 26.

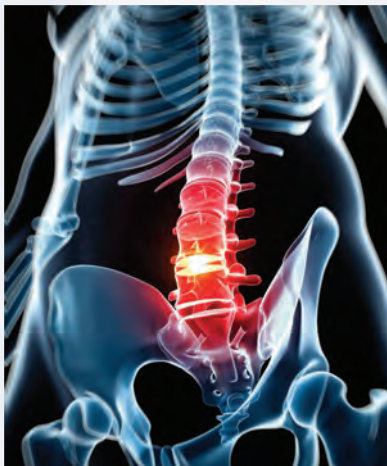

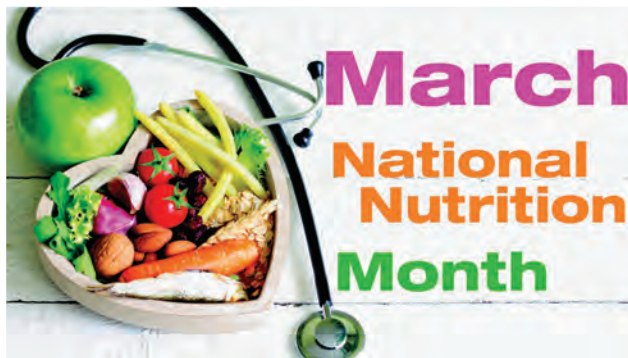

Office 365 Is On Its Way

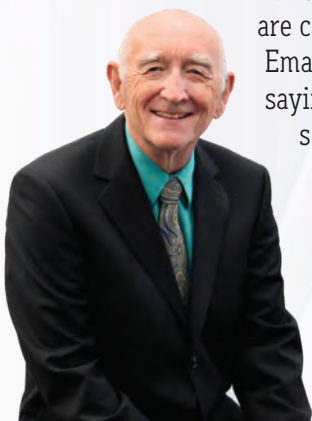
You may have heard the term the "Cloud" in reference to computers. A simple explanation is to have your application such as Microsoft Office running on a server somewhere at a location on the Internet, the "Cloud," rather than in your own data center. For Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc.'s (SCSCAI's), Microsoft Office application, we will move Word, Excel and the other Office applications to the Cloud, where the application will run just as if the application was running on your computer or in your own data center. There are many advantages to going to the Cloud and a few disadvantages. But, overall, it's a good idea.

To do the changeover to Office 365, SCSCAI had to upgrade many of its computers to a current operating system level, and even replaced some of its computers. Our IT staff and our vendor are very busy preparing for the upgrade. One of the important tasks included in the project plan is educating staff on the changes Office 365 brings. If all goes well, Sun City will be close to moving its Office to the Cloud when you read this. The other activity keeping IT staff busy is getting the budget ready for next year, where decisions have to be made as to what IT resources will be needed next year.

The Internet is sometimes referred to as the "Wild, Wild West of computing." The Internet is a worldwide computer network connecting billions of users. What are the chances that all of those billions of users will be honest? Well, the answer is, no chance. Those bad actors try to get your credit card information, your bank information, your sign-on credentials and so on. How do they get your information? By tricking you into making a mistake. Some of the more common schemes, and they apply to smartphones as well as computers, include:

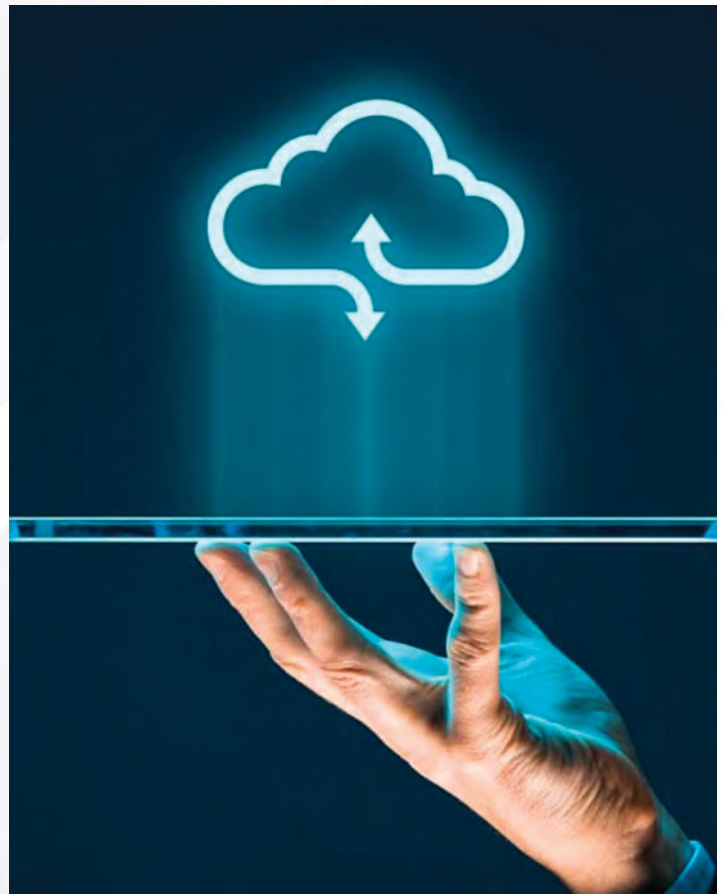
1. Be careful opening attachments. If you get an email with an attachment, do not open it unless you are confident it comes from a trusted source. Emails with attachments should have a note saying something that makes the note personal. When you send an email with an attachment, add a comment so the recipient knows it's from you. If it's a bad attachment, when you open it, it will start a program that can steal your information, or it might even let someone know everything you do on your computer or smartphone.

2. Never respond to an email that purports to be from your bank, eBay, or anyone saying that "There is a prob-

lem with your account and you will need to fill out the following form to correct the problem." You may get a real note from a company you deal with asking you to update your user information. If you do get such a request, log onto that company's website directly, not from any form on an email, and check to see if, indeed, you need to do an update.

3. If it sounds too good to be true, it's probably not true. Offers to share \$6 million from a Nigerian finance director if you will only send \$XXX as good faith money is not a good idea. If you get a call from, supposedly, your grandson in jail and he needs \$XXX to get out of jail, it's a scam. If you really think it's true, call the parents.

4. It's not a good idea to send money via Western Union for any product or service unless you are sure, very sure, of the need and who the recipient is. Once the money is sent, if it's a scam there is no tracking or recourse.

5. Social Security fraud is a common source of scamming. For instance, if you get a call saying there is an issue with your Social Security check and you need to send the money back – to the scammer, of course – always go directly to the Social Security Administration to see if there is a question about your account.

These are just a few of the ways someone might try and get you to make a mistake. The common thread is that common sense should give you a hint that something is wrong. If you feel uncomfortable about it, don't do it.

LARRY KOENIG: TOUR OF DUTY IN KEEPING WITH THE FAMILY TREE

Coming of age in 1967, America's young men didn't have to worry about finding a job. The U.S. government was hiring. In fact, employment offers were made to 228,263 men via induction notices from their local draft boards. The Vietnam War was ramping up. Eventually, 1,857,304 men would be drafted for that war – more than the Korean War, but 1 million less than WWI.

Some avoided the draft by leaving the country; others by using political influence. Still others by volunteering for service, thus being allowed to choose their branch of service. Larry Koenig fell into that last category.

assignment, Larry went to Guam for a month. Guam in 1967 was vastly different than Guam in 1945. Still not so bad.

"There were still reminders of the WWII battle there. Once I was skin diving fairly close to shore and spotted the wreck of a Japanese mini-sub," Larry recalled.

The month flew by and Larry was on a plane headed to Vietnam. His one-year tour was about to begin.

"Among other duties that I was assigned, I was the assistant manager of an NCO club for E5 and E6 ranks. Part of that job was arranging for entertainment. A lot better duty than being in a for-



Larry, the son of a career Air Force Sr. Master Sergeant, was quite familiar with the military life. During his youth, Larry lived in California, Florida, Massachusetts, New Mexico, Germany and Spain. A typical military kid.

"When I graduated high school I figured that I would go to Vietnam. But if I had to go, I thought I would be much better off on a ship sitting offshore and pounding the enemy so I enlisted in the Navy for four years. I was half right. I did go to Nam, but not on a ship. I was at a Navy supply base across the Han River from Da Nang for the entire year there," Larry said.

Of course, Larry didn't go to Nam directly from the enlistment office in El Paso, Texas. He completed boot camp in San Diego and was sent to Pearl Harbor for three months. Pearl Harbor was paradise; maybe this wouldn't be so bad. After his Pearl Harbor

ward fire base or being on a river boat. One day a friend from boot camp came into the mess hall. He was assigned to a river boat. They were 32-foot, shallow draft boats used to patrol the rivers. He told me stories of being attacked by VC machine guns on both sides of the river. Da Nang was a lot better duty!"

His Vietnam tour completed, Larry was sent to Port Hueneme., Calif., assigned first to the 205-foot Fleet Ocean Tug USS Cree (ATF-84) and later, as a ship serviceman to the Seabee (construction battalion) unit stationed there.

His four-year tour completed, Larry returned to San Diego for a year of college and then moved on to work in the automotive and construction trades. He retired as a carpenter in February 2019. Larry had moved to Las Vegas in 1972. He and wife, Sherri, moved to Sun City in 2016.

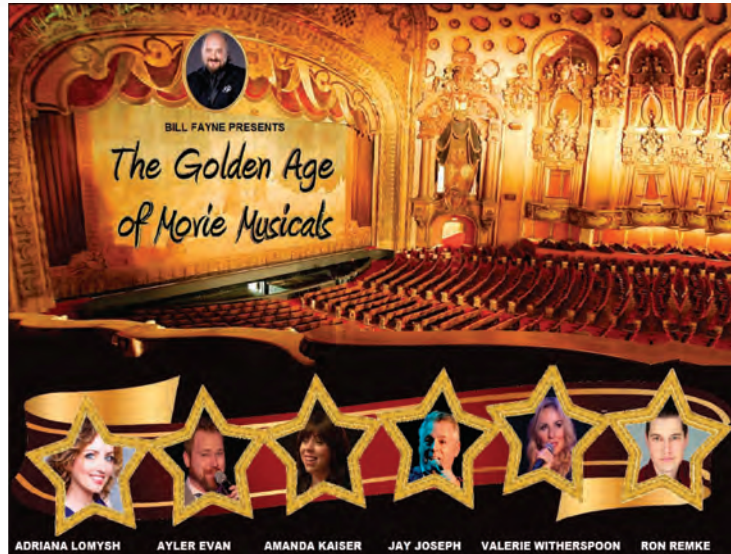

Organ, Piano and Keyboard Club

Members Love to Make Music

Have you ever thought that it might be fun to play an instrument? Did you take piano lessons as a kid, but haven't touched a keyboard in years? Do you want to exercise your mind by learning something new? If you have an electronic keyboard, would you like to learn how to use it and its features? Have you ever wondered what's in the room with the piano located next door to the Starbright Theatre?

Answers to all these questions can be found at the weekly meeting of the Organ, Piano and Keyboard Club on Tuesdays at 8 a.m. inside the Music Room at the Pinnacle. The Club formed as a Chartered Club in Sun City Summerlin on January 20, 1993. New students grab the attention of members from 8-9 a.m., while 9-10 a.m. is time set aside for everyone to play with our instructor – she comes to class every other week; and the hour of 10-11 a.m. is reserved for "Musicality," where people with all skill levels play for fun. The Club has a piano and two organs (a Lowrey and a Roland) ready and waiting for your attention.

You don't have to have any background in music. In fact, members have all levels of experience. Our instructor, Sandy Jackson, is from Family Music Center, a local music store, and she comes to us to help us learn. She assigns a new piece of

music and Club members have two weeks to practice and perfect their techniques. We use E-Z Play music, arranged by Hal Leonard. Some students prefer to work on their own selections. All participants on any of the instruments are welcome.

Here are some thoughts from some of our members:

"Come visit us just to see the miracle of wonderful music. We don't practice for church or for funerals or for concerts. We play because we love making music."

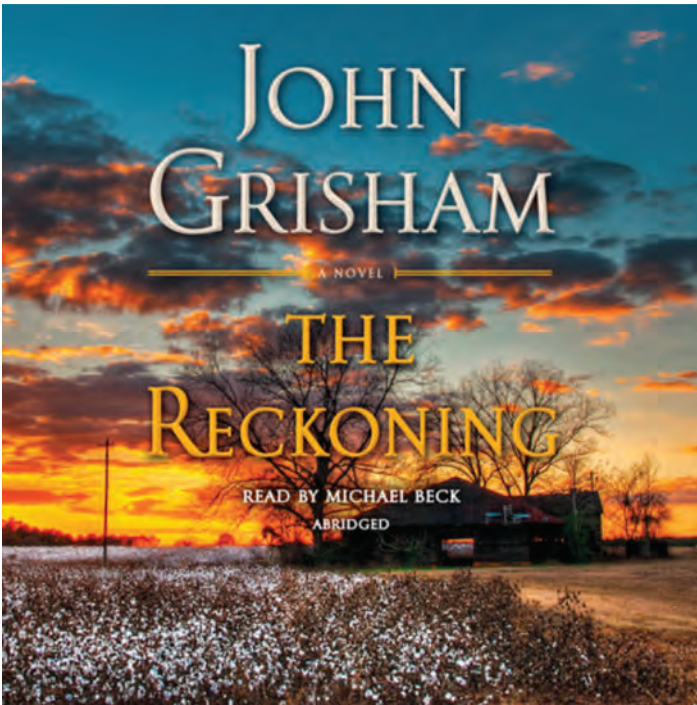

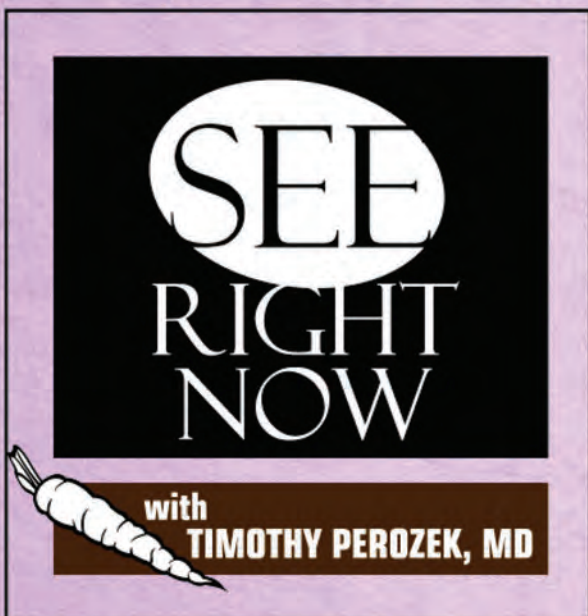

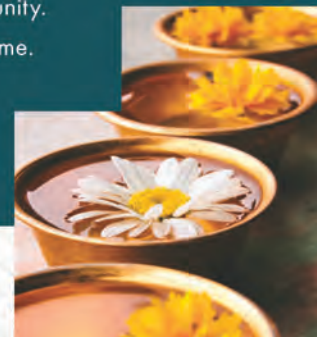
