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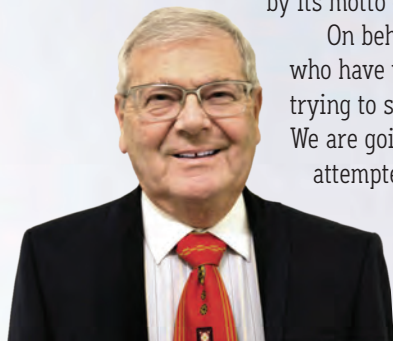


# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



The theme of this month's LINK is Security Patrol. This wonderful community organization is operated by a little over 200 of the best volunteers that a community could have. Every member of the Patrol is a resident of Sun City. Others may write about what the Patrol does and perhaps some of the things that they are not allowed to do. I would like to point out one of the attributes of the Patrol that might be forgotten at times. Security Patrol is accessible! 911 or 311 calls may not be responded to as quickly as some would like but other than serious police matters, the Patrol will dispatch a car to assist residents with their problems. Sometimes the Patrol receives a wide variety of questions that only one could imagine. "Where can I find a plumber?" "My garage door is broken", "My irrigation system is leaking", "I am locked out of my house", and a hundred other matters that are very important to the resident calling the Patrol. The dispatchers have several notebooks (reference books) that have been developed over the years and updated annually. These books have names and phone numbers of repairmen in all areas that a resident might need. There is also a directory of city services with contact numbers for various city departments. The same information is available for the Water District and Clark County. The Administrative Offices of our community are only open a little over a third of each day, the Patrol is open 24 hours per day, and residents call the Patrol with numerous questions that are answered, or an appropriate employee's name and phone number is provided.

Sometimes, more often than one would believe, a resident just needs someone to talk to, or vent to, or listen to them complain about something. The dispatchers do this on a regular basis, and the drivers encounter and speak with residents daily about a variety of subjects. One of the things that has always impressed me about the members of the Patrol, is how patient they are with the residents. Sometimes being a person that a resident can vent to is enough to make a problem go away, at least for a while. Do me a favor? When you see a Security Patrol member thank them for their hours of volunteer time. If that doesn't work for you, just wave to them when they drive by you. Patrol members will always wave back and appreciate the friendly gesture. On these hot days be aware that the drivers will be carrying extra bottles of water with them in case a resident should need to hydrate. The Patrol lives by its motto every day, "Neighbors Helping Neighbors."

## Messages From the Heart

The members of Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol, are also members of the community who volunteer their time and efforts for their neighbors. The patrol is not a police-type agency, but a group of hard-working individuals helping to keep our neighborhood safe. We do not enforce any laws, rules, or regulations. We are here to make life easier for our neighbors and the Administration and to help protect folks with our eyes and ears on duty 24/7.

In the latest issues of the LINK, we have had input from the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department and Las Vegas Fire and Rescue on ways to stay safe.

Now, we will hear from our Security Patrol members, who give of their time to patrol our community, welcome visitors, and man/woman the office located at the rear of the Desert Vista Community Center. We see many issues as we travel the streets of Sun City, and would like to share some of our observations. So this is our turn to speak. You will read many of the same suggestions you have heard often. Knowing they are from your friends and neighbors on the Patrol, perhaps you will take them to heart. Most wanted to remain anonymous, so there are no names with any of the remarks. The following are actual words from our Security Patrol members:

### What do the patrol members do?

"I have learned more about our great community in just a few short months with Security Patrol than I or others knew who had lived here for years! Also, I discovered joining the Patrol has other benefits as well, such as making new friends, information exchange, exercise, and an all-round sense of contributing to something worthwhile. Try it. You may just really like it!"

"We take an abundant amount of phone calls at Security, that have nothing to do with the job; dispatchers still try to help them in any way possible on whom to call for their questions."

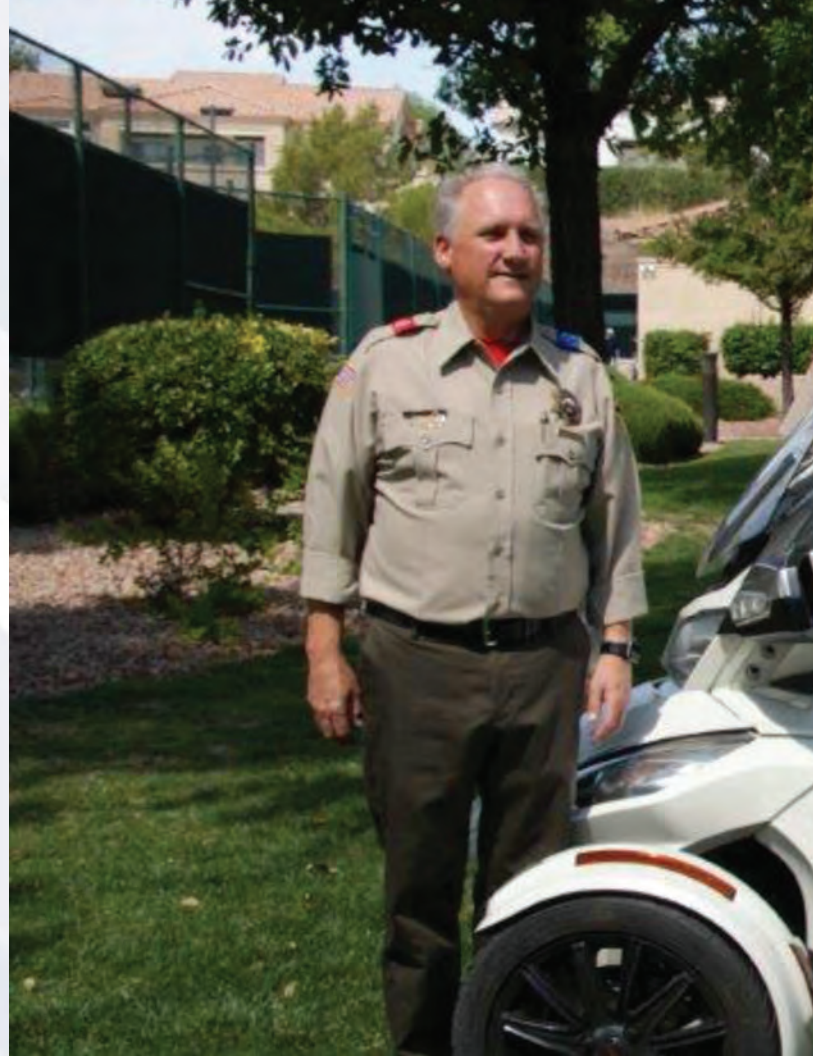
"Even the IC's (Information Centers located at the entrances) help people on where to go when lost or the truck drivers that stop and ask if they have to check-in."

"We are a group of individuals dedicated to protecting our community."

"Security Patrol does not have the authority to enforce anything, including

violations of speed limits, parking regulations or CC&Rs. These should be referred to Metro, City Code Enforcement, and Community Standards."

### Garage Doors

"We are, per Metro, the safest community in the valley and beyond. But, as we know, it is not a perfect world! Yes, we have some bad actors, who if they see a garage door even slightly open; they can and will slither in. Two-legged, four-legged and no legs-just sayin'."

"Remember to close your garage door when you leave the house or turn in at night. Also, lock that interior garage to the house door."

### Lights in our Community

"I wish folks would turn on their porch lights at night. Darkness is what thieves want for their miserable acts."

"Please make sure your address number lights are working!"

### Emergency Contact Form

"Please fill out a blue emergency contact form and turn it in! Either to base or at a social monitor's station. As a night driver, I have experienced firsthand, how important this form is."

"Emergency contact sheets! We need them!"

*check with any Patrol driver or pick one up at the Security Patrol office at the far end of Desert Vista parking lot.)*

**Using Community Roads and Sidewalks**

"Please do not walk or run in the road. It's illegal and dangerous. Many drivers in Sun City have poor eyesight. I have seen people walking in the road, in the dark, with their back to the traffic, wearing dark or non-reflective clothing while listening to something through a headset or earbuds. This is suicidal."

"Whenever you hit the road, always give driving your full attention. Security Patrol is a happy resident contribution to our community."

"People who walk dogs after dark should wear reflective clothing."

"Please do not obstruct any part of the sidewalk by parking improperly!"

"Remind yourself to STOP at those big red signs and please do not speed."

**Why are you part of Sun City Security Patrol?**

"My wife made me do it."

"When we were new here, we went to a community meeting. There was a big sign on the wall about joining the Security Patrol. I found out that they do it for this community,

so I thought we can do that if they can."

"I've met so many nice, retired folks in our community, you never would have known."

**A Final Remark**

"The more eyes the better! We must all look out for each other. Get to know your neighbors, and pay attention to any suspicious vehicles, persons, or activity. If you see something, say something! Make that call if you think you have seen something suspicious. No one will get mad at you; in fact, we appreciate as many vigilant people as possible. Residents calling in a suspicious license number, for instance, have solved crimes."

Explore the possibility of becoming a part of the Security Patrol.

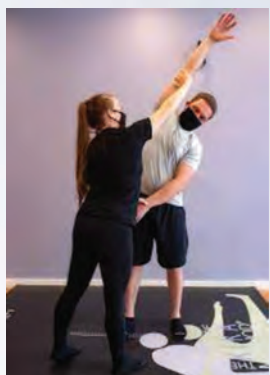

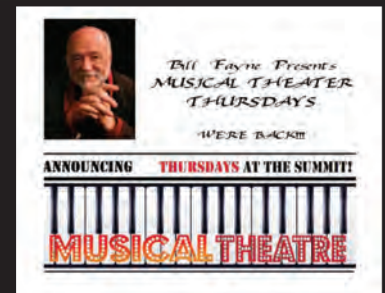

it's Vegas, it's summer, so it's gonna be HOT!*



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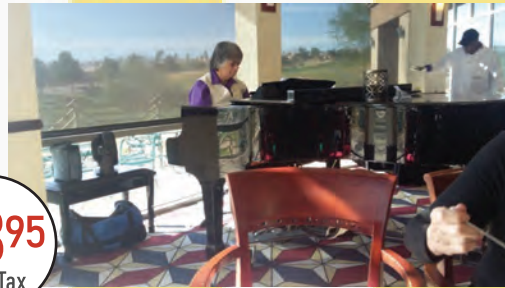

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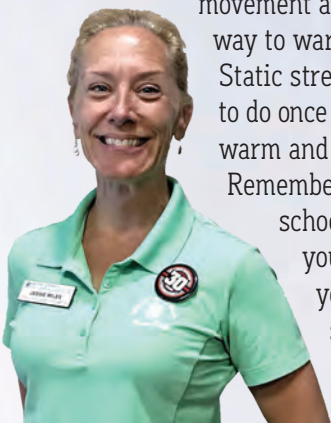

## Staying Flexible as We Age: In More Ways Than One

**F**lexibility is the theme for the Health & Fitness Department during the months of July, August, and September. Flexibility has several definitions that can relate not only to our physical body but to our mind. The ability of a joint or series of joints in the body to move through an unrestricted, pain free range of motion, the quality of bending easily without breaking, the ability to be easily modified, and the willingness to change or compromise. These definitions extend to our whole person and as we age, we tend to lose our flexibility throughout. Losing a small amount of flexibility is a result of the normal aging process, but the good news is that we have the ability to slow down some of these changes in our body and in our mind. Stretching our body to improve range of motion and opening our mind to adapt and adjust is the key to leading a healthy, happy, and balanced life.

**Physical Flexibility.** Stretch every day. Simple stretching can increase range of motion and decrease pain. You can stretch at anytime and anywhere, and it only takes a few seconds to a few minutes. Two basic types of stretching are dynamic and static. Dynamic stretching takes a specific movement and allows the joints and muscles to move through their full range of motion. Examples are rolling your neck in a half-circle from ear to ear, walking lunges, and arm circles. The focus is on controlled, smooth movement and is a great way to warm up the body. Static stretching is great to do once the body is warm and after a workout. Remember back in middle school gym class where you reached to touch your toes or the thigh stretch? These stretches put light tension on the muscle and are held for at least 30-60 seconds. Breathing deeply helps facilitate lengthening the muscle and increasing your flexibility.

**Mental Flexibility.** Resilience experts Karen Reivich and Andrew Shatte reported that, according to psychological research, "the most resilient people are those who have cognitive flexibility and can identify all the significant causes of the adversities they face without being trapped in any specific explanatory style." And what that really means is that when something bad happens, mental flexibility will keep you from rigidly seeing the problem from just one perspective. If our minds are rigid, they're not open to adapt and to adjust and certainly in the year we've had, the practice of openness and remaining flexible has never been more important. One of the ways we can stay open is to be mindful. Mindfulness is bringing our awareness to the present moment and realizing when we are being inflexible in our thinking. We need to be elastic enough to handle the unexpected and to find ways to thrive no matter what the conditions.

Staying flexible is the key to longevity, not just in terms of the body, but also in the mind. When we create more space



throughout the body by lengthening the muscles and providing freedom throughout our joints, we become more open mentally as well. When the body is open, the mind follows.

Welcome to the 2021 pool season. It is important to follow a few simple rules for everyone's safety and enjoyment. Each fitness center has facility rules printed at the Fitness Monitor station.

- Food and Drink are allowed only at the outdoor pools and must be kept at least 4 feet away from water.
- Bottled water is allowed in any pool area. Glass containers, alcohol, and gum are prohibited.
- **Children must be 42" tall without shoes.**

Here is a little "Intentions Worksheet"

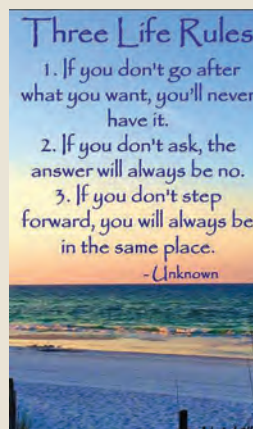
- What intentions can I set to treat, nurture, and rejuvenate myself?

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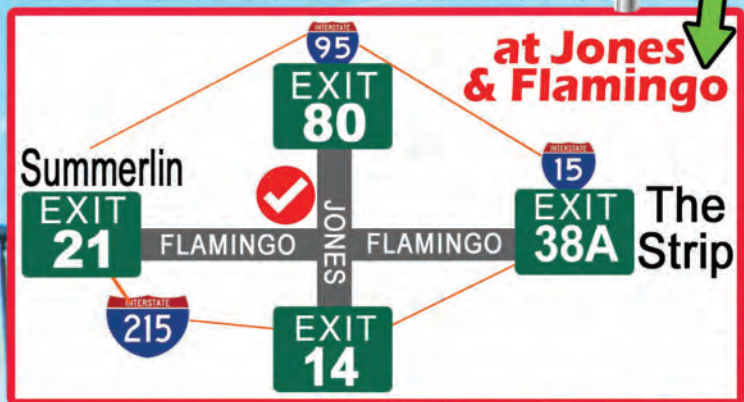


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# Riding Roller Coasters Through the Years

I lived in Freehold and Englishtown New Jersey when my daughters were growing up and every summer, we bought season tickets and spent many days at Great Adventure, which was a 20-minute car ride away. My daughters grew up and I did not visit Great Adventure again for many years until last May when, after being vaccinated, I traveled back to Jersey to see my daughter and 13-year-old granddaughter, Julissa.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions Great Adventure was open but ticket numbers were limited, reservations required, and "Coaster Power Hours" was promoted. Wow, a chance to ride the coasters with no lines and in four hours my granddaughter and I rode all the coasters and the experience was exhilarating. The coasters of today are nothing like the ones that existed when I grew up, when the Cyclone in Coney Island was tops. Moving forward to the 1990's when Rolling Thunder, Lightnin' Loops, and some of the "newer" steel frame coasters like Shockwave and Viper, (both which have since been dismantled), were considered extreme.

Well, let me tell you, there's no comparison between the coasters in Great Adventure today, in 2021, to those from the mid-1990's. Rolling Thunder (closed in 2013) was a wooden coaster that was 96 feet high and had a top speed of 56 MPH, today El Toro is 181 ft tall and goes 70 MPH.

Onward to the steel coasters; Nitro is 230 feet tall, goes 80 MPH and you experience over four G-forces one second and are weightless the next. Green Lantern is a stand-up coaster that is 154 ft high and (only) has a top Speed of 63 MPH, but you also go through four loops hanging upside down. The last coaster I will mention is Kingda Ka, a launched coaster that shoots you to a speed of 128 MPH in 3.5 seconds, pushes you back in your seat at 5 G-forces, goes straight up 456 feet and then straight down 418 feet.

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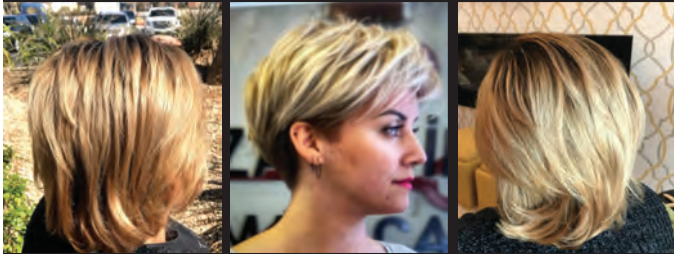
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# MEET YOUR NEW NEIGHBORS

### SUN CITY SUMMERLIN COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, INC. 55 YEAR AGE RESTRICTION POLICY<sup>1</sup>

Sun City Summerlin is qualified for the exemption as a community for 55 year or older persons. In accordance with the *Fair Housing Act* (“the Act”) and *HOPA*, Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc. (SCSCAI) has clearly indicated its intent to qualify as housing for older persons aged 55 years or older as stated in the CC&R's (Article 4 Section 2 (a)<sup>2</sup> and By-laws (Article 2.6)<sup>3</sup> as well as by the age restriction rules and regulations found within this Policy, adopted by the Board, and enforced by the Association.

This document's purpose is to cumulate in one place for easy reference the age restriction policy adopted by the Board of SCSCAI within the rules and broad discretion permitted under the *Act* and *HOPA*. The Board of Directors, in its sole discretion, may add, delete, or amend its policies within the scope permitted by the *Act*, *HOPA*, and Nevada State or local laws.

#### Understanding the Age Restrictions<sup>4</sup>

There are four factors required for a facility to claim the 55 and older exemption:

- (1) that the housing be intended and operated for persons aged 55 and older;<sup>5</sup>
- (2) that at least 80 percent of the occupied units be occupied by at least one person who is 55 years of age or older;<sup>6</sup>
- (3) the housing facility or community must publish and adhere to policies and procedures that demonstrate its intent to operate as housing for persons fifty-five (55) years of age or older;<sup>7</sup>
- (4) the housing facility or community must also comply with rules issued by *HUD* for the verification of occupancy.<sup>8</sup>

#### Occupancy Age Restrictions

- 1.1 There must be at least one person that is fifty-five (55) years of age or older (age qualified) residing in each dwelling unit;<sup>9</sup>

- 1.2 No person under the age of 19 may permanently reside in Sun City Summerlin.
- 1.3 Persons under the age of 19 may reside in Sun City Summerlin as an invitee for a maximum period of 90 days in any 12-month period if there is an age qualified person also occupying the dwelling unit.
- 1.4 Persons 19 years of age or older may reside in Sun City Summerlin if there is an age qualified person also residing in the dwelling unit.
- 1.5 These age restrictions apply to Owners, tenants and to invitees who occupy the dwelling unit in the absence of the age qualified Owner or tenant.

#### Occupancy Exception

- 2.1 The policy of SCSCAI is not to permit underage occupancy in any dwelling unit.
- 2.2 The only exception to the 55-age qualification is for the non-age qualified surviving spouse of an age qualified decedent Owner who had occupied the dwelling unit, until such time as the non-age qualified surviving spouse remarries at which time the exception expires. At that time, membership, if any, shall be determined pursuant to Article 2.6 (d)<sup>10</sup> of the By Laws.
- 2.3 There are no exceptions for other non-age qualified heirs or any other non-age qualified persons who come into possession of a dwelling unit in Sun City Summerlin.
- 2.4 Appeal for a temporary exception to the occupancy rules must be made in writing to the Executive Director for consideration by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors, in its sole discretion, may grant or refuse to grant a temporary exception in any case. The grant of a temporary exception in a particular case does not invalidate or waive the occupancy rule in any subsequent cases.

#### “80/20 Rule”<sup>11</sup>

- 3.1 *HOPA* requires that no less than 80% of the occupied dwelling units shall be occupied by at least one age qualified person. This does not mean that 20% must be occupied by non-age qualified persons. It means that as long as 80% of the dwelling units are occupied by at least one age qualified person SCSCAI maintains its exemption under *HOPA* as a 55-year age restricted community.
- 3.2 One of the primary reasons for the 80/20 rule by Congress was to accommodate underage surviving spouses of age qualified decedents and to permit flexibility in specific situations at the sole discretion of the Board of Directors without endangering the *HOPA* exemption. Such exemption is permitted if the minimum 80% age qualified requirement under *HOPA* is not reduced. *HOPA* was enacted for the protection of the age restriction exemption and not to grant any rights to underage per-

sons to occupy the 20% which is solely within the discretion of the Board of Directors.

- 3.3 The policy of SCSCAI is to maintain the percentage of age qualified occupancy as close to 100% as possible without mandating a greater percentage than the minimum 80% required by *HOPA*.

Verification of Age<sup>12</sup>

4.1 All residents, whether Owners, tenants or invitees of absentee Owners or tenants, must show evidence or proof of occupancy that at least one resident in the occupied dwelling unit is age qualified. **A photo ID with a birth date** must be produced (without exception) to verify the age of the occupants in the dwelling unit. Documents that can be used for age verification include:

- a) Driver's license
- b) Passport
- c) Immigration card
- d) Military identification
- e) Any other state, local, national, or international official documents containing a photo ID and birth date of comparable reliability.
- f) A certification in a lease application, affidavit or other document signed by any member of the household age 19 or older asserting that at least one person in the unit is 55 years of age or older.

4.2 Such evidence must be shown at the time such Owner or tenant initially comes to obtain the association membership card, which is mandatory for use of all amenities and facilities. The process then confirms age compliance of 55 plus in accordance with *HOPA*.

4.3 An Owner as a landlord is responsible to ensure that the administration office receives the necessary certification that at least one person in the unit is 55 years of age or older each time a lease is signed, extended, or renewed. Failure to do so will be considered a violation of the 55 Year Age Restriction Policy.

Surveys for Compliance

- 5.1 SCSCAI will conduct occupancy surveys at least every two years and maintain a data base to verify age compliance as required by *HOPA*. All residents of Sun City Summerlin are required to respond to the surveys. Proof of occupancy by at least one age qualified person in the occupied dwelling unit as noted above must be provided in response to the survey unless a photo ID with a birth date is on file in the administrative office.
- 5.2 Copies of supporting information gathered for the proof of occupancy verification may be segregated in a separate file, are considered confidential and, not available

for public inspection. They are created for the sole purpose of complying with *HOPA* and are to be kept separate from the general or resident files that may be widely accessible by employees or other residents.

- 5.3 A summary of occupancy surveys shall be available for inspection upon reasonable notice and request by a unit owner.

Disclosure of 55 Age Restriction Policy

6.1 Any Owner or Realtor who sells or leases real property in Sun City Summerlin shall disclose in the advertisements, signs posted on the property and in purchase or lease documents that Sun City Summerlin is a 55 year age restricted community under *HOPA*.<sup>13</sup> In the case of a lease of real property in Sun City Summerlin the lease agreement shall verify that at least one occupant is age qualified by specific current age or date of birth recorded in the lease agreement.<sup>14</sup> This age verification information within the lease agreement shall be provided to SCSCAI administration within 30 days of the lease being signed. This includes each lease extension and renewal.

6.2 A copy of this Age Restriction Policy shall be provided by every Owner/Seller/Lessor to any prospective buyer or lessee to read and acknowledge. This document is to be included as part of the Purchase or Lease documents.

6.3 Disclosure shall also be made to any persons permitted by the Owner or tenant to occupy the dwelling unit as invitees in the absence of the age qualified Owner or renter. At least one house guest of such absentee Owner or lessee must be age qualified. The under 19 years of age occupancy prohibition rule also applies to such house guests.

6.4 Non-disclosure by the Owner/Seller/Lessor shall not prevent SCSCAI from enforcing this age restriction policy against any Owner and tenant for noncompliance.

6.5 All "For Sale" or "For Rent/Lease" signs in Sun City Summerlin, whether by Owner or by a Realtor, shall prominently display that this is a "55 YEAR AGE RESTRICTED COMMUNITY".

Enforcement

- 7.1 SCSCAI will vigorously seek all remedies provided by statute and the governing documents including, but not limited to, the assessment of fines and liens or the suspension of rights and privileges against the offending Owner, tenant, or invitees for non-compliance with this policy.
- 7.2 The reporting and enforcement procedures for non-compliance with this Policy shall be according to the Complaint Protocol and Hearing Protocol and all Hearings will proceed in front of the Board of Directors of SCSCAI.

**APPENDIX A**  
**FOOTNOTES and REFERENCES**

1- As established by the FAIR HOUSING AMENDMENTS ACT OF 1988 (the "Act") HOUSING FOR OLDER PERSONS ACT (HOPA) 1995: FINAL RULE (Department of Housing and Urban Development: 24CFR Part 100)

2- Each Dwelling Unit in Sun City Summerlin, if occupied, shall be occupied by at least one (1) person not less than fifty-five (55) years of age and no person eighteen (18) years of age or under shall reside in any dwelling unit. To the extent required by any applicable Federal or State Law, at no time shall less than eighty (80%) percent of the Lots subject to this Declaration be occupied by Single Families where at least one member of the single Family is fifty-five (55) years of age or older.

3- Bylaw 2.6 Residency

(a) Sun City Summerlin is an age fifty-five (55) or older age restricted community, The Association shall maintain Sun City Summerlin Community Association as an age qualified community in compliance with the federal Housing for Older People (HOPA) law. The 'age qualified occupancy" restriction applies to owners and renters and to house guests who occupy the dwelling unit in the absence of an age qualified owner or renter. Except as set forth below, at least one (1) person that is fifty-five (55) or older must reside in each occupied dwelling unit in Sun City Summerlin.

(b) Persons nineteen (19) years or older may reside in a dwelling as long as an age qualified person also resides in the same dwelling unit. Person eighteen (18) years of age or under may temporarily visit as guests in a dwelling unit occupied by an age qualified family member for a maximum period of ninety (90) days in any twelve (12) month period.

(c) The "age qualified" occupancy restriction does not apply to the non-age qualified surviving spouse of an age qualified decedent owner, both of whom were living in the dwelling unit at the time of the decedent's death. This exception remains in effect until such time as the non-aged, qualified surviving spouse remarries at which time the "age qualified occupancy" restriction again comes into effect.

(d) The Board of Directors, in its sole discretion, may grant or refuse an exception to the "age qualified occupancy" restriction. Any request for such an exception must be made in writing, setting forth the specific circumstances under which the exception is sought. The granting of an exception in a particular case does not invalidate or waive the "age qualified occupancy" restriction in subsequent cases.

4- The Fair Housing Act (Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act) exempts "housing for older persons" from the Act's prohibi-

tion against discrimination because of familial status. Section 807(b)(2) ( C ) of the Act exempts housing intended and operated for occupancy by persons 55 years of age or older which satisfies certain criteria HUD has adopted implementing regulations further defining the "housing for older persons" exemption at 24 CFR part 100, subpart E (Housing for Older Persons Act, hereinafter: HOPA).

**APPENDIX B**  
**GLOSSARY OF DEFINITIONS**

**CFR:** Code of Federal Regulations issued by the United States Government.

**Fair Housing Act:** The **Fair Housing Act** is a law that prohibits discrimination in the buying, selling, renting, or financing of **housing**. This includes discrimination based on race, skin color, sex, nationality, religion, disability and children or any other characteristics from a protected class.

**HOPA:** The Housing for Older Persons Act (HOPA), signed into law by President Clinton on December 28, 1995, amended the housing for older persons exemption against familial status discrimination. HOPA amended the statutory definition of housing for older persons to mean housing intended and operated for occupancy by at least one person 55 years of age or older per residence. HOPA eliminated the requirement that housing for older persons have significant services and facilities specifically designed for its elderly residents. It required that facilities or communities claiming the exemption establish age verification procedures.

**Occupant:** as defined in the CC&R's *shall mean any person, other than an Owner, in rightful possession of a Lot.*
