From the Executive Director

Annual Budget Ratification Set for June 24

During the week of March 18 to 20, the Association held budget presentations for the residents of Sun City Summerlin. The purpose of the meetings was to have each department director, representing Community Services, Link, Fitness, Information Technology, Golf Course Maintenance, Golf Course Pro Shops, Food and Beverage, and Administration including Community Standards, Human Resources, the Community Preparedness Committee and Security Patrol, present their budgets and answer any questions or concerns that residents had. These budget presentations are extremely important in learning how your assessments are allocated. I cannot thank enough all of those board members who attended, along with the administrative staff that made sure everything ran smoothly, and all of the directors for working very diligently on their budgets for the following year.

The annual and 2015 budget ratification meeting is scheduled for 9 a.m., June 24, during the monthly Board of Directors' meeting at Desert Vista.

Five Star Tavern has begun its transition with the Vista Grille, not only with a brand new menu but with

the renovations of the interior and patio areas. I hope everyone has had an opportunity to stop by and see the improvements and try the new menu.

With driver safety being the No. 1 priority in our community, Sun City Summerlin was acknowledged by the Association of American Retired Persons with a plaque from AARP's Driver Safety State Coordinator. SCSCAI Board President Sue Papilion was presented with the award at the April Board meeting. This honor is given to the top 100 organizations nationwide that support the importance of safe driving and AARP's Smart Driving Course. Sun City Summerlin ranked 47 out of the top 100 communities reviewed.

In total, 18,000 host organizations participate in the program. The AARP Driver Safety program wants to ensure that it does all it can to help make communities safer for everyone. A big thank you to Sun City Summerlin's homeowners who participated in the program.

With summer upon us, our facilities are in full swing. The outdoor swimming pools opened April I, with the exception of the Pinnacle pool, which opened a few days late, due to re-plastering work.

Whether you like to swim laps, do some exercising, or just like to relax around the pool, there is something for everyone.

You may have noticed throughout our facilities that we now have recycling containers. Please use these containers and do your part to keep our environment clean.




their neighbors to create anger and issues between us. Here are a few reminders:

restaurant, a banquet room for Sun City residents and an event venue for public events. When not in use, The Summit dining room and its little sister, the adjacent Skylight Room, are locked up tight and opened only to scheduled events or to show off the rooms to prospective clients looking to book a party, wedding or business event.

But all that's changing as SCSCAI plans call for The Summit to open in July as Sun City's newest social spot.

The venue, with undoubtedly the best view in Las Vegas, will soon welcome golfers, residents and their guests and others every day from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. To help draw in customers, new Food & Beverage Supervisor Tony Verrengia has been working on a new creative small plates menu that will feature new wines, craft beers and cocktails.

"I would say to residents that they need to come out and enjoy a relaxing afternoon with a glass of great wine or a draft beer, then enjoy a plate of cheese, fruit and crackers, watch the sun go down and the lights of the Strip come on. There will be no better place to be than at The Summit," he said.

According to Tony, menu items will range in price from \$5 to \$10 each, and he has plans for a daily happy hour and events down the road. Food selections will include salads, chips and salsa, sandwiches, and pretzel bites with cheese sauce.

As to how this latest idea for The Summit materialized, SCSCAI Board President Sue Papilion, who crafted the idea earlier this year and fine-tuned it with the help of the

of our seasoned residents."

It was the success of that club, paired with the need Sue saw for residents seeking a nearby gathering spot, that put The Summit on her radar.

"Our residents were hungry for a venue that allowed them the chance to meet others," Sue said.

So, when July rolls around and the doors at The Summit open, it will be time for residents to get out of the house for some fun and socializing without going too far.

"No one should be lonely in Sun City, but many of us are, especially because life around us is changing so fast," Sue said.

And that's where The Summit's room plan comes in.

Not only will residents be able to order a cup of coffee at the snack bar, sit down, look at the Strip, watch the golfers practice, or meet up before or after a Starbright Theatre show, but they also will have the opportunity to check out and play a variety of board games from chess to Chinese Checkers to backgammon. All game pieces will be held at the monitor's station for easy checkout.

The concept will be a winner only if it is used by residents, Sue said.

"Its success will be reviewed by the Board of Directors in January. It is hoped that the snack bar will have an average sales of \$500 a day, which includes the golfers so that it pays for the server from opening to closing."

Tony started working in Sun City Summerlin in 2012. He was hired as a part-time cook at Highland Falls and moved up to kitchen supervisor at the Vista Grille. From there, Tony worked on banquets at The Summit.

Prior to coming to Sun City, Tony was the Food & Beverage Operations Manager at the Boathouse, a private country club on Martha's Vineyard. Over the years Tony, a 10-year veteran of the United States Army (where he learned to cook), held management positions at Pinehurst Resort in North Carolina for 10 years, and worked for the Riverside Resort and Casino in Laughlin.

"The people here are the best, and I could not ask for anybody better to work for than Sun City residents," Tony said.

Landscape

Too Much Water a Problem for Most Plants

Summer is here again and I'm going to talk about the biggest plant killer again – over watering.

All plants enjoy water, some more than others, but most plants can be over-watered, which will cause root rot. Signs of over-watering are usually yellowing of the leaves and sometimes blackening occurs. What usually happens in an over-watering scenario is the lower leaves on the branches start turning yellow and then the person starts adding more water. This, in turn, causes more yellowing and more watering until the plant dies.

Normally, if yellowing occurs at the bottom of the plant and continues to work its way up, it's a sign of too much water. If a plant yellows from the top and works its way down, there is not enough water.



If your plants are turning yellow and you are not sure what is going on, a hand moisture sensor can be a big help. All my irrigators carry one. An investment in this garden tool is something you might want to consider.

I hope this helps you out and saves your plants and your water use.

Exercise & Bone Health

When you think of strength training or exercise you may automatically think of big and bulky muscles. Do you ever think of big and bulked up bones? You should. Bones are active, dynamic structures. When demands are made of muscles, they, in turn, make demands of the bones they're

attached to, and the bones, in response, become more dense. If you stop exercising you will lose both muscle and bone mass or density.

Often overlooked, bone strength or mass is critical to one's health and well-being. A fracture late in life can be devastating. According to the United States surgeon general, 20 percent of seniors who fracture a hip will die within one year. Further, the surgeon general reports that an estimated 10 million Americans over the age of 50 have osteoporosis, while another 34 million are at risk. So what do you do? Get a scan and get exercising!

A DEXA (dual-energy X-ray absorptiometry) scan is the gold-standard test for assessing bone health and can be prescribed by your doctor. Once your doctor has cleared you for exercise you should start exercising at his or her recommended level, or start exercising with a personal trainer or physical therapist. It is important to have an exercise program that addresses your individual needs.

An exercise program for those with osteoporosis or osteopenia should include both weight-bearing and strength training exercises. Weight-bearing exercises would include walking, dancing, tai-chi or anything that makes your bones and muscles work against gravity. Strength training exercises include using dumbbells, tubing or weight machines that put your muscles to work lifting heavier loads than normal. Both types of exercise provide stress to the bones that is necessary for building or maintaining bone mass.

If you are unsure of where to start, consult with your doctor for clearance and guidance. There are many options for exercise at Sun City Summerlin through clubs and Fitness Department classes and seminars.

Water, Water Everywhere

Pool Monitor Freddy Leipzieger at Home in and Around the Water $\sim \mathcal{B}y\, Ann\,\, Kmit$

the have a local celebrity on the Desert Vista staff. It is none other than 86-year-old Freddy Leipzieger, a life-long champion swimmer, who has more than 400 medals to his credit.

Born in Germany in 1928 to Jewish parents, Freddy's family moved to Niteroy, Brazil, when he was 4 years old. Niteroy was across the bay from Rio, where he first started swimming in the bay.

"You had to be careful of the stingrays and wait until they swam away," he remembered with a chuckle.

Soon, Freddy joined a youth league and swam on the team. "I was undefeated in the breast stroke. It was my favorite," he said. He also specialized in the butterfly and swimming longer distances.

In 1949, Freddy immigrated to New York City, where he took a Red Cross life-saving class and got a job in Maine at a boy's camp. Even though he wasn't a citizen yet, Freddy was drafted during the Korean conflict.

"Luckily, I spent two years in Oklahoma doing official work. Afterward, I went to Miami University in Florida on a swim scholarship. I was the captain of the swim team. We had a great team. I graduated in 1958 with a degree in business administration."

Freddy found work in Miami Beach hotels and also taught swimming, his first love.

He married in 1960 and moved to Scottsdale, Arizona, and worked for Del Webb. But he came to Las Vegas in 1961 and found good work as a bellman and later as a bell captain at various hotels – the Sands, Hilton and MGM.

"It was a pleasure to work for the mob," he said.
"They took care of the players and the employees. I was proud to work at a good hotel."

He got to meet famous entertainers such as Dean Martin, Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis, Jr., and the King, Elvis Presley.

Freddy's work kept him from swimming for 30 years. But when he retired at age 80, he competed again, swimming in the Masters World Tournaments in Brazil, Argentina, Australia and Denmark, where he won five gold medals. He placed third in the world in the 50-meter dolphin (butterfly) event at Stanford

It's probably safe to say that everyone in Sun City has seen a white Security Patrol car in their neighborhood with the words "Neighbors Helping Neighbors" printed on each side. And a Patrol dispatcher probably has helped most of our residents at one time or another with their questions or concerns.

In addition to that, many of Security Patrol's volunteers are involved with other day-to-day chores. They perform tasks that make the patrol tick. Some of these responsibilities may interest you and move you to volunteer for the patrol.

Do you know your way around cars?

Security Patrol cars are driven between 15,000 and 17,000 miles a month, and they are washed weekly. Someone must check the oil, change occasional light bulbs and drive the cars to the dealership for routine maintenance.

Like paperwork?

Oh, my, could we use you! Even in our computerized world, completing forms from shredding to scheduling to keeping track of time, we still generate paper.

Are you a people person?

Our training team keeps Patrol members apprised of procedural changes. Our recruiting team recruits, and our telephone committee, chaplains and well-wishers keep us in touch with our members.

Interested in technology?

Our computers, telephones, CB radios and databases are kept efficient. Our IT team keeps the Patrol's technology current.

Have a knack for writing?

We need folks to write articles explaining our activities and needs, as well as to alert residents about scams and crime trends.

Are you a pet lover?

Our pet officers keep track of lost or stray animals, and try to reunite pets and owners. Pet officers leave reports of coyote sighting to the dispatchers.

Enjoy social activities?

Our social committee plans events for members and the community, including two annual flag retirement

STATISTICS

In one month, Security Patrol officers alerted residents to **287** garage doors that had been left open after dark. They did **370** house checks for vacationing residents and investigated **53** flashing emergency lights. The Information Centers at community entrances gave directions and guidance to **326** visitors. Day and night, drivers patrolled every street in Sun City Summerlin, adding **15,898** miles to the five cars' combined odometers.



The committee's goals and objectives are:


- **Disaster Training:** Provide training for residents on emergency procedures.
