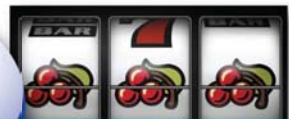

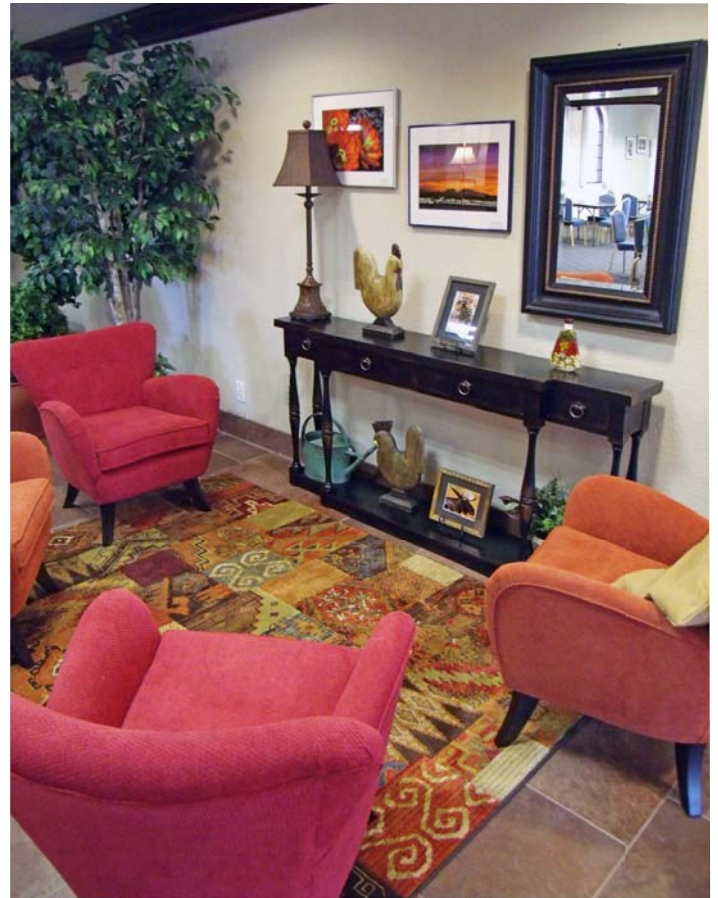

First, by the time you read this, the redo of the Mountain Shadows administration building should be complete. Enjoy the new facility! There are no other major facility upgrades scheduled

for this year. The tennis courts will get needed maintenance to seal cracks—the heat/cold/ground movement plays havoc with the surface of the courts and each year SCSCAI Maintenance Director Dennis McGrew and his staff work to get the courts back into shape. Also at the Desert Vista tennis courts, we should have a basketball hoop installed (thanks Murray Waxman) when you read this.

The Board (Common Area Properties Committee, under SCSCAI Vice President Sue Papilion) is working on a five-year landscape plan that takes into account desert landscape, water usage and aesthetics. We hope to not only reduce water and maintenance costs, but make

our common area property look better.

We (the Board through the restaurant committee headed by Sue Papilion) is spending a lot of time on setting the course for our restaurants. All our parking lots are due for maintenance, and that is included in the plans for this FY. Yes, that will be a big pain for all of us as the maintenance will require closing the parking lots when they are resurfaced. We will minimize the impact as much as we can, but it will not be fun.

The bathrooms at Highland Falls are due for refinishing and finally, the last project I will mention is the resurfacing of the Desert Vista swimming pool. Lots going on.

As a final note, when you see something that needs fixing, tell the monitor (fitness or social) or email a board member or Patty Rosia, the executive director. Please do not assume someone knows about the problem. Help us make our community the best place to live—anywhere!

- ♦ The Board of Directors approved a motion to accept the Restaurant Committee's recommendation to let the Templeton Gaming lease expire on July 31, 2013, based on their request (see letter in backup) to reduce rent to \$2,500 a month while SCSCAI's estimated expense is \$2,500 per month.
- ♦ The Board of Directors unanimously approved the SCSCAI community garage sale (at individual homes) for two (2) weekends (Friday and Saturday only). One sale date will be for the lower homes in SCS on the second weekend in October 2013. The second date will be on the third weekend in October 2013 for

homes at the top of SCS. All garage sales must be conducted between the hours of 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. on the scheduled dates.

- ♦ The Board of Directors approved to table an item regarding the Restaurant Committee's recommendation.
- ♦ The Board of Directors unanimously approved to accept the Property Committee's recommendation to not pursue the building of a dog park because there is no available location that is not in a flood zone area and since the city requires a fence around any such dog park that fence would restrict water and debris flow and cause flooding and damage when it rains.

Once in a while, when we push that button, or turn that switch, knob or handle, nothing happens. Simple things like opening the garage door, flushing the toilet or heating and cooling the home can't be accomplished. We've all had that experience at one time or another and it is an annoyance. conveniences are lost at the same time for a day or two or three? And to make it worse, what happens when the problem affects the entire community?

Such situations can become real, life-threatening emergencies. So how does one get help? Who do you call? What can you do?

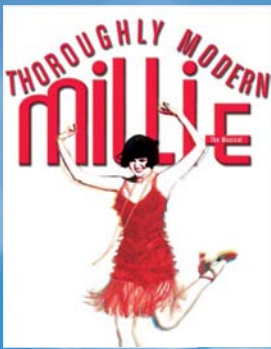

Phase II: Highland Falls Bunker Project

Phase II of the Association's repair and/or redesign of three (3) bunkers at Highland Falls Golf course will start this summer. Only bunkers at Highland Falls will be addressed this year.

The original architect's golf course dream design at Highland Falls was built with no ongoing maintenance considerations. Upon completion, the designer and Del Webb walked away, and the Association had to deal with the inherent problems of our golf course facilities. The Association must work daily to maintain the designer's dream. Many of the bunker designs require intense daily labor to maintain satisfactory condition.

Many of the old gunite bunker liners are in need of repair. Rocks are appearing in the sand at many locations, causing potential safety hazards. As a part of the project, new liners will be installed in the bunkers that are being redesigned or repaired.

The proposed changes to three (3) bunkers at Highland Falls are:

Hole 7 - One of the fairway bunkers will be completely filled in and sodded. Half of the original size of the second fairway bunker will be reduced, and a new liner, sand and sod will be applied to the smaller redesigned bunker.

Hole 7 - The greenside bunker's original design size will be reduced by half. A new liner, sand and sod will be installed.

Hole 8 - All three (3) greenside bunkers will have new liners installed and new sand.

Hole 8 - Fairway bunker will be eliminated and replaced with sod.

Hole 9 - Front-side green's bunker will be reduced by approximately one-third, and sod and a new liner will be installed.

All work will be done in-house by the golf course maintenance crew.

All work will be done in-house by the golf course maintenance crew.

Please remember that when the golf courses open after overseed, the grass is young and tender. Follow the rules and give the grass a chance to get established. Remember, this is your playing surface for the next NINE months.

In addition, some of the streetscapes throughout the community can be done over with rock, designing spaces with various sizes and colors to add depth and texture with fewer plants.

I myself am a plant lover and change is hard, but we must remember that we live in a desert and in an area where the soil is terrible. Now I am not talking about going back to being a desolate desert, rather a more sustainable landscape that we can enjoy for years. By reducing some plants and adding more decorative rock we can take a big bite out of our water usage and bill. That in turn should save us all some money.

Stepping On Falls Prevention Program

Last month my article discussed how to prevent falls by building balance and strength. This month we are putting my advice into action. The SCS Fitness Department will be sponsoring a new falls prevention program called "Stepping On." The program will begin with a falls prevention screening session held on September 25. Appointments are required and residents can sign up with the Desert Vista Social Monitor.

During the screenings, participants will fill out a questionnaire and perform a few simple balance and stability tests in which an individual's risk of falling will be assessed. Recommendations will be given depending on the results of the individual tests. Some participants will be recommended to attend the Stepping On Falls Prevention Program classes, beginning on September 30. Others may be referred to their health care provider for further intervention as necessary.

The Stepping On Falls Prevention classes will be held on Mondays, 1-3 p.m., from September 30 to November 11 in seven two-hour sessions. Participants must be pre-screened to attend these classes during the evaluations scheduled September 25. Sign up by calling the Director of Fitness at 363-1486. Class size is limited. When full, a waiting list will be collected for future classes.

The Stepping On Falls Prevention program is designed to challenge the older adult to appraise his or her risk realistically and provide a forum for gaining knowledge about safety practices. The aim is to facilitate the older person's taking control, explore different coping behaviors and encourage follow through on safety strategies in everyday life. The seven-week series will consist of education, group discussions, physical exercises and guest speakers. The classes will be taught by Kristie McWhorter, SCS Director of Fitness, who is also a certified group leader for the Stepping On Falls Prevention Program.

Exercise, Yoga Help With Healing After a Fall

“Kudos to the fitness classes in Sun City and to fitness teacher Doris for helping me continue to build my strength, flexibility and balance,” said Ellie Cunningham, working back from injuries sustained from recent falls.

“I attend fitness class three times a week and I attribute my survival of falls to the strength of my bony structure. Yoga also has been a great factor in my stability. Lack of balance, not paying attention to my surroundings and rushing about have contributed to my falls. In the past years, I

have tumbled up darkened steps, fell off a dance floor, slipped on wet pavement during a rainstorm and fell over auto guard rails in walkways. I have endured stitches on my chin, a bruised elbow and upper chest trauma.

“So I ask, ‘Am I not a survivor?’”

In addition to helping her recover from falls, exercise and yoga, especially the piriformis stretch, have played a vital role in making Ellie feel better.

“Both of these are consistent with each other,” Ellie explained. “I had the experience of waking up with extreme discomfort in my right buttock that radiated down my right leg and made walking difficult. I had a choice to stay home or go to my scheduled flexibility and strengthening class conducted by Doris. I chose to attend the class, exercising both upright and on the mat. It was not easy!

“After leaving the class, I felt better and by the next day the discomfort was gone. I credit it to exercise I do routinely and using good judgment.”

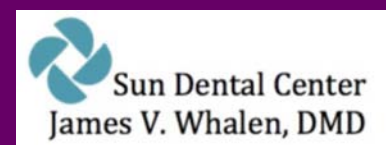

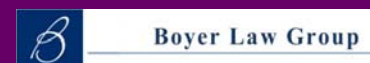

The Community Standards Department would like to remind residents of several SCSCAI guidelines when planning work/improvements to their homes. For more information, call the Community Standards office at 966-1411.

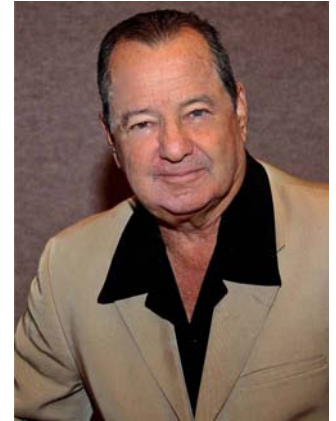
Paint

- ♦ **Home Exterior** – If you plan to repaint your home, you can stop by the Community Standards office, located in the crafts courtyard at Mountain Shadows community center, and browse through the approved color catalog. If it is more convenient, you can stop by Dunn Edwards Paints, 7450 W. Lake Mead Blvd. They also have a copy of the color catalog. All applications for painting must have color samples attached when submitted for approval.
- ♦ **Mailboxes** – In single-family homes, homeowners are responsible to paint the mailboxes and poles. They must be repainted the same color as they were originally painted, either black or white. In duplex complexes, the sub-association is responsible to repaint the mailboxes and poles.
- ♦ **Wrought Iron Fencing** – If your gates or fencing are beginning to rust or discolor, it is time to repaint them. Approved wrought iron fence colors are black, white, tan, beige, a color of the dwelling or existing wrought iron.

Front and Rear Landscaping

- ♦ **Landscape Cleanup** – Many trees and shrubs have been the victims of our dry summers and cold winters. Trim off all dead limbs and/or leaves if they can be saved, or replace them.
- ♦ **Palm Trees** – If the fronds are brown and drooping, it is time to trim them.
- ♦ **Weeds** – We are experiencing our annual weed infestation. We ask that residents do their part to keep them under control. If you live on a corner lot that is separated from the street by a wall, remember YOU are responsible for the strip of landscaping in between. Once the weeds are dead, they must be removed.

- ♦ **Pine Needles And Pine Cones** – These pesky little annoyances can make your yard look unkempt. They must be raked up or blown off and removed.
- ♦ **Landscape Rock** – Landscape rock must be a minimum of a ½ inch. All rock must be natural color. Black, green or other artificially colored rock are NO LONGER approved. Neither pea gravel, nor decomposed granite is permitted.
- ♦ **Prohibited Plantings** – Mulberry and olive trees are not permitted. You are free to plant any other type of tree or plant.

Miscellaneous

- ♦ **Walls and Fencing** – If you plan to add fencing on top of existing walls, it is your responsibility to ascertain the ownership of the wall(s) before you submit your plan to ARC. If the wall is not yours, you will require permission of your neighbor.
- ♦ **Patio Enclosures/Room Additions** – Please be sure to review your current (1/12/12) development standards prior to submitting your application. The standards are very specific as to the information necessary for approval of these projects, including building materials, colors and setback requirements.
- ♦ **Trash And Recyclable Containers** – Trash pickup days always seem to be the windiest. Make sure the receptacle lid is securely fastened and always tie trash bags. Secure recycled newspapers to keep them from “taking flight” around the community. Trash containers (and/or garbage bags) may not be placed in any part of the front yard for trash collection prior to noon on the day preceding the scheduled collection and must be removed by 7 p.m. on pickup day.

A FEAST FOR THE SOUL

Hiking Club Members Bask in the Beauty of Las Vegas

The trek begins with an email notifying members of the Hiking Club of the location, elevation, mileage and description of the week's trip. Some hike leaders include a topographic map of the destination, highlighting the trail and pinpointing the points of interest along the way; others include information that reminds members to pack a hat, water and sunscreen.

"You put all of your worries and problems aside for a while when you're out there," said Ann Cronin, a hike coordinator for Monday trips who also is a former hike leader for the local chapter of the Sierra Club. "It's really a feast for your eyes and for your soul."

The Sun City Hiking Club departs on two hikes a week from the lower parking lot at the Desert Vista community center. Hikes are planned year round. Monday hikes are rated between beginning and moderate levels and traverse an average of three miles total. Monday hikes last about five hours, from 7 a.m. to about noon. Wednesday hikes are more challenging, boasting six-mile, roundtrip minimums, but average about 12 to 15 miles round trip. Depending on the destination, hikes can encompass anywhere from four to 30 hikers. Ann explained that popular springtime hikes often can swell to upwards of 30 members when conditions are ripe for viewing spectacular desert flora and fauna. All hikes are well organized and feature a lead person as well as a "sweep," or a Club member who brings up the rear ensuring that all hikers are accounted for; coordinators always carry two-way radios.

"I really enjoy the wildlife and the birds. I enjoy a leisurely hike," said Club President Patricia Horsfall, who has been involved with the Club for two years. Patricia and her friend Larry Shahan got involved with the Club when they moved to Las Vegas from Calgary. While one of Patricia's favorite places to hike is Mount Charleston, Larry enjoys the magnificent sights he finds slipping through the slot canyons of Valley of Fire State Park.

According to Ann, the club focuses on four local hiking areas a year – Mount Charleston, Lake Mead National Recreation Area, Valley of Fire and Red Rock National Conservation Area. Trips are rotated according to the season.

"Pretty much all hikers are helpful and friendly folks," said Club member Brian Dodd, who enjoys the vibrant scenery of Valley of Fire. "(The park) is only hikeable around October through April because of the heat. I have explored the peaks and canyons throughout the state park over 10 years or so . . . we never see any other people where we go and there are some phenomenally beautiful areas there. I suspect that most places haven't had a human foot on them forever."

For those seeking more information on the Club, Ann suggests stopping by one of the monthly meetings. This month, the Club will meet at 8:30 a.m., September 12, at Desert Vista. There's usually some sort of slideshow presented by a member and time for socializing – a great opportunity to meet with and ask questions of the people you may be hitting the trail with.

Security Patrol Is Looking for a Few Good Men and Women



For the Security Patrol to cover Sun City Summerlin during one 24-hour period, 32 volunteers must pin on a badge, grab a two-way radio and go to work. It takes 18 drivers a day to keep three patrol cars circulating through the community. To round out the daily team, six dispatchers, two watch commanders and six staffers in the information centers are required – a total of 224 volunteers on the job, every week. The Patrol roster lists 238 members, exactly 119 men, 119 women. During summer months, up to 80 volunteers leave to vacation in cooler climates, or they are absent for personal reasons, such as health concerns. Covering the work schedule is met only because many of those who stay behind increase their shifts to two or more per week.

Patrol duties are not physically demanding. No one is expected to do anything that might be strenuous or unsafe. Drivers patrol in comfortable, well-maintained cars. Each Security Patrol Information Center is air conditioned and equipped with a restroom, a television, a computer, a two-way radio and a telephone. Dispatchers at Security Patrol headquarters work in a modern business office.

Patrol Drivers:

- ♦ Watch for and respond to anything that seems out of the ordinary. Drivers observe and report information, but they do not challenge questionable

persons. Security Patrol officers are not armed. The Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department is called to intercede with troublesome incidents or people.

- ♦ Check the security of community buildings after dark. They reunite lost pets with their owners and report water leaks, most often resolving such problems. If requested, Patrol volunteers inspect the outside of vacationing residents' homes to make sure their properties are secure.
- ♦ Alert homeowners to garage doors left open after dark, a major influence in reducing criminal activity.

Dispatchers:

- ♦ Respond to residents' concerns by providing helpful information
- ♦ Dispatch a patrol driver to offer assistance.

SCSCAI provides Patrol volunteers with uniforms. There are no financial expenses associated with Security Patrol service. Association membership is required and a Patrol driver must have a valid Nevada driver's license and satisfy insurance requirements.

We would like to pin a badge on your shirt. If you can serve four hours a week and you've got the right stuff to be a trustworthy Security Patrol officer, call 254-2303, or stop by Patrol headquarters to meet our personnel director.

MONTHLY STATS

In one month, 284 residents were alerted that their garage doors had been left open after dark. Patrol drivers investigated 41 flashing emergency lights, 807 homes were checked for vacationing homeowners and 244 visitors stopped by the Information Centers for directions and guidance. Day and night, drivers patrolled every street in Sun City Summerlin, adding a total of 13,719 miles to the five cars' combined odometers.
