President's Message

An HOA Lesson in Assessments, Fines and Liens

For many years the collection of delinquent assessments and fines was delegated to a collection agency. The Board of Directors had very little oversight of the collection process.

Nearly one year ago, a Collection Committee was created by the Board consisting of three Board members. The goal of the committee is to create collection criteria and policies, and to work more closely with the collection agency to use legal collection techniques. I serve as chairman of the committee along with Board members Ellen Bachman and Leo Crawford.

Sun City Summerlin contracts with a collection agency to take the delinquency from inception to collection of the debt or foreclosure of the home. The goal of the committee is to achieve collection and avoid foreclosure. A key to collection potential is the placing of a lien on the real estate for the failure to pay the monthly assessment and/or fines levied against the owners for violations of rules and standards of the HOA. A lien against a home for failure to pay assessments can be foreclosed, while a lien placed on a home for



finances are not subject to foreclosure, however, the lien remains against the real estate until it is cleared for sale of the home.

It is important that we have a legal collection procedure so delinquent accounts eventually pay their debts. Otherwise, the vast majority of owners who pay their bills on time are not forced to provide the extra funds to make up the difference for delinquent owners. The committee meets every other month in closed session to review progress on every delinquent account. The meetings are closed as the subject matter refers to the financial conditions of individual owners.

Desert Vista Landscape Plays Up Natural Beauty

Sun City resident Edward Arbuckle lives across the street from Desert Vista community center. Over the past few months he's seen the xeriscaping project along the property's main slope take shape. From its beginning in June to its culmination in August, the project has resulted in a massive transformation.

According to SCSCAI Landscape Director Louis Darling, the work is part of the Association's water-savings plan that was approved by the Board of Directors in May. The overall goal calls for a significant reduction in the Association's water use over the next year.

With this project, Louis says his crew removed approximately 23,000 square feet of turf, five pine trees and various other plants.

For Edward, that's good news, not just for Sun City but for the world.

"I'm sympathetic to landscape that's good with water," he said. "When I saw that work being done I thought, 'Somebody has done their homework.' I was glad to see an organized design plan."

Each evening, Edward described how he would see work crews drop off the rock and then he'd stroll down to take a look. "In no time at all they had that rock distributed," he said.

In all, 352 tons of red and yellow rock, along with 25 boulders was used to cover the hill. Another 83 tons of rock was used to create the look of the dry riverbed. Some boulders and desert spoons were recycled from other parts of the community where they could be spared. The transplants helped to reduce the cost of the renovation. Joshua trees, and vivid yellow and orange lantana were purchased and perfectly planted where they will blossom into brilliant ground cover in the coming months.

To Edward, the intersection is "a nicely scenic mini-hill within our urban setting."

While taking a series of photos (of which one is strikingly represented on this month's cover), Edward said he was accompanied by a local coyote.

"It was doing its best, along with passing drivers and a service truck, to determine whether I was hunting rabbits, lost or just confused. Clearly, the coyote didn't consider this a photo-op," he said.

Robert B. Taylor, III, M.D., F.A.C.S.

Dr. Taylor received his medical degree from the University of Texas at Houston. He completed his internship at the University of Pennsylvania and received advanced training in small incision cataract surgery and refractive surgery while completing his residency at the University of Oklahoma, Dean McGee Eye Institute. He completed additional LASIK and PRK surgical training in Toronto, Canada. His expertise in refractive surgery today includes not only LASIK but also ICL (implantable contact lenses). In fact, Dr. Taylor was among the first surgeons in the United States trained in this procedure.

Board Certified by the American Board of Ophthalmology, Dr. Taylor is a Fellow of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, the American College of Surgeons and the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery. He has served on numerous committees for the Clark County Medical Society. Dr. Taylor joined the Shepherd Eye Center in 2001.

Dr. Taylor enjoys spending time with his wife and four children. He enjoys cycling, and as an avid golfer tries to fit in a game wherever he travels.

But after so many years, there are a few things that have deteriorated or gone by the wayside that need to be addressed so that we can continue to keep our neighborhoods pristine.

Some residents have let their mailboxes deteriorate. It is each resident's responsibility to make sure their mailbox is refreshed. Too many of the boxes can be seen to have turned gray, rusted and aged. Further, the pole itself has been allowed in many cases to become decrepit, leading to a very sorry-looking, tired box.

You can easily replace your mailboxes, if needed, at Lowes or Home Depot. You just have to make sure the new mailbox looks like (or close to) your old one. Also, the pole always needs to be painted black. No other color is allowed. As for the mailbox, in some sections they are black; in most sections they are white. The bottom line: Whatever color your mailbox is, is the color you need to replace it with, no other color is allowed.

Note: If you live in a sub-association, you need not worry about your mailbox as a homeowner – your sub-association will take care of it.

I recently learned that there are quite a few handymen who will gladly repaint the pole and box for a nominal fee, and one might want to explore that possibility if unable to do the task. You will need to check the Link to see what handyman might do this job.

Mailboxes are a small detail, but sometimes it's the small details that color a neighborhood's presentation as a desired place to live, or as one that is starting to decay.

Let all of us do our part to keep up appearances and take care of these details so that we continue to present a warm, welcoming and fresh look to our community for the newcomers.

What Is Cardio Training and Why do I Need to Do It? (Part 1)

Cardio training is short for cardiovascular exercise, which is any prolonged movement that increases heart rate and blood circulation throughout your body for a sustained amount of time, about 20 to 30 minutes. Some examples of cardio training are walking and biking (indoor/outdoor), Nu Step, Elliptical, swimming and stair climbing. Most people use the cardio portion of their workout to help burn excess calories and improve fat loss. The reason to do cardio does not end with fat loss and weight management, however, because there are a wide variety of health benefits you receive from a regular cardio training program.

Benefits

- 1. Cardio improves the condition of your heart.** Your heart is a muscle just like any other. In order for it to become strong it must be worked. If you fail to work it, it will weaken over time and this can cause negative health effects. When you get the heart pumping at a faster rate on a regular basis you will keep it in shape and healthy. Some people get winded just walking around the grocery store. The primary reason for this is because they are neglecting to work their heart muscle.
- 2. Cardio improves your metabolism.** Metabolism is the process in which nutrients are acquired, transported, used and disposed of by the body. Why is that important to you? Because an increased metabolism means you will have an easier time maintaining your weight or losing weight.
- 3. Cardio increases your "feel good" hormones.** These hormones, endorphins, help ease symptoms of depression and fatigue, and can decrease your appetite. You will have a much more positive outlook on life simply because you are getting the stress-relief benefits from these hormones.
- 4. Cardio helps to manage your blood sugars.** By performing cardio training you increase your muscle's ability to utilize glucose, and you will have better control of your blood sugar swings. This is especially important for those who are diabetic or pre-diabetic.

Now that you know the basics of what cardio training is and some of its benefits, stay tuned for next month's article on how to get started. For those of you already doing cardio training you will learn how to increase your benefits and get more from your workout.

LVMPD's Tips for Residential Robbery Safety

The crime of residential robbery is a harrowing and possibly dangerous situation that can happen to anyone, anytime. Some victims are specifically targeted, or the crime can be one of opportunity. According to data provided by the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, residential robbery suspects usually work in groups, either day or night, and have different motivations than that of a typical burglar.

Understanding the Crime:

Deception. Trust no one unless personally known by you. Suspects are willing to use any type of deception to get their foot in your door. Give a verbal response to persons knocking at the door, but do not open the door.

Stealth. Quiet is usually a suspect's modus operandi as it draws less attention but, more importantly, allows a homeowner to usually be completely surprised upon access.

Top Tips For Home Security

Know your Neighborhood. Pay attention. Participate in a neighborhood watch, be cognizant of suspicious vehicles or people in your neighborhood. Keep vigilant and aware, take notes and contact authorities if needed.

Lock All Doors and Windows at All Times. Don't make it easy for anyone to enter your home uninvited. Keep your garage door closed at all times.

Deadbolts and Doors Matter. A deadbolt with a 1-inch throw on a solid core wood door, or on any metal or security door fastened with 3-inch screws is a good idea. Additionally, if your garage door opener requires replacement, consider a model that features an automatic door closure that automatically closes the door at a preset time.

Light the Night. Criminals hate lighted areas and love unlit areas around your home. Put porch lights on a day/night sensor to ensure regular nighttime operation, and routinely check for burned out bulbs.

Glass is Vulnerable. Install laminate over exposed glass surfaces or install window security screens. Install wooden dowels in sliding door and window tracks.

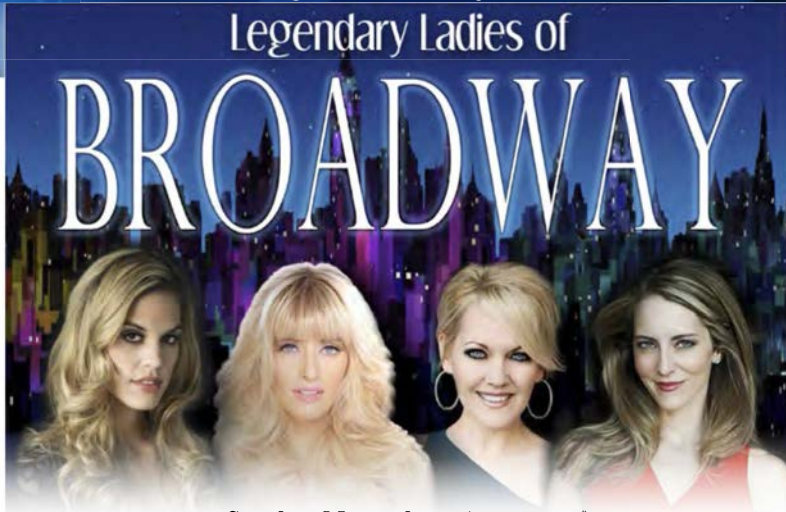

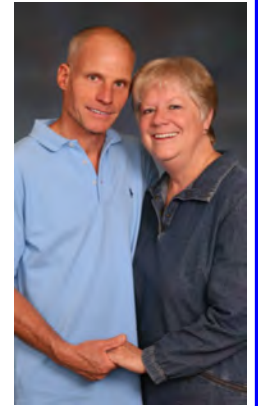

As the story goes, the game is named after a family dog.

Some 50 years ago, a few guys up at Bainbridge Island near Seattle were looking for a new way to occupy their kids. They came up with a sort of hybrid court game, taking elements from ping-pong, paddleball, badminton and tennis. Their family cocker spaniel, "Pickles," loved to chase stray balls, hence the name.

Across the United States 200,000 people are currently playing Pickleball, and almost every state and Canadian province has pickleball venues with 63 new courts per month being built, according to the national Pickleball Association.

What is the appeal? "It keeps me in shape," said Club President Augie Costanzo.

Pickleball has evolved into a sport that all ages can enjoy. When SCSCAI Board member Ken Carocchia's family comes to visit, his kids and grandkids want to get out on the courts.

The game equipment is inexpensive and portable, just a whiffleball and a paddle. There is no special attire required. The court is 20-feet by 44-feet for both singles and doubles. The net is hung at 36 inches. The service is underhand and volleying happens until there is a miss for score.

Club members can play at the Desert Vista tennis courts six days per week. Some of the nearly 70 members enrolled in the club also participate in tournament play around Nevada, as well as out of state.

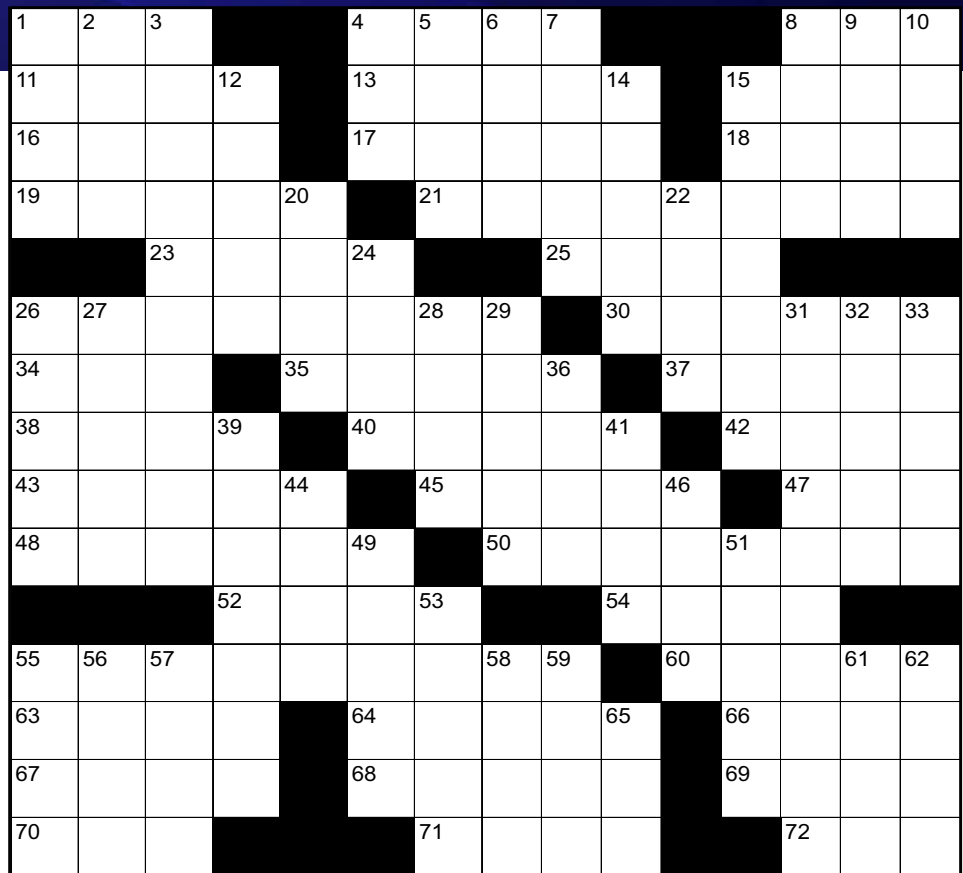

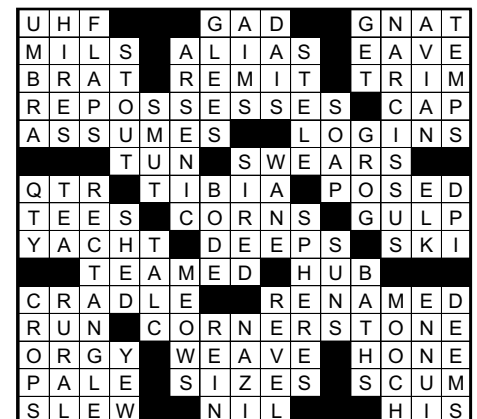
