# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we settle into that time of year when we can enjoy more activities without the concern of "over heating", I have continued to see a rise in our residents participating in all forms of recreational activities. Once again more and more residents are going to the card rooms and playing cards as well as other types of table games. I have seen many going to The Summit and playing table games after eating a meal. Many are having meetings at The Summit before, after or during a meal. The number of softball teams has increased so there are more games. Tennis and Pickleball games are being played all day long now. Try getting a tee time, golf is in full swing with all five golf clubs showing not only an increase in membership but an increase in the number of members playing each week. In case you have not noticed, our three courses look great after the overseeding, and we are the envy of the golfing community in the Las Vegas Valley. Our craft type clubs have also shown an increase in participation.

Why is this? I think that it is because of the "positive attitude" that permeates so much in our community. There seems to be someone with a positive attitude to lead all of our clubs and community organizations. I think that being positive is infectious and once we as a community get the ball rolling, that more and more residents join in. More residents are volunteering and joining our community organizations. Security Patrol is getting more volunteers as are Sunshine and Volunteers. The Neighborhood Watch Program is growing even faster. It is a part of the Neighborhood Preparedness Group but operates in conjunction with Metro and its Community Oriented Police program. Mary Fairhurst (435-214-6123) has taken on this job as coordinator and has set a goal of having 100 Neighborhood Watch groups in Sun City. Since September 1st, she has helped organize approximately 20 new groups. If you would like information on starting a group on your street, call her, she will help you. Just another example of a person with a positive attitude.

I mentioned earlier how residents are socializing more at The Summit and dining facility located at the Pinnacle Community Center. Another reason might be the starting of a "Loyalty Program". Once a resident signs up and provides an email address, phone number and/or ID card then one can begin accumulating points which ultimately leads to free meals or money deducted from one's bill. I know of residents who have already taken advantage of this program. Go to The Summit or Tavern at the Falls and sign up and begin earning points that can be used to pay for food and beverage. Remember, if you are looking for golf "deals" for the Thanksgiving weekend, the Pro Shops will be selling their deals and discounts for a very limited time. Stop by a Pro Shop and see if any of their deals can be used by you.

## Nominations Open for 2023 Board of Directors

Considering a run for the Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc. Board of Directors? Now is the time to declare your intent. The Board is the governing body for our Association which has responsibility for ensuring we have the best possible quality of life, combining good business practices with providing great amenities. Here is your opportunity to give back to the community that provides so much to us, the residents.

Three seats are up for election in 2023. Each elected Director commits to a three-year term on the Board. On page 90, the October LINK is an excellent description of what it takes to be a Director and an estimate of the time commitment required. Note that there are two qualifications to be a Board Member: ownership of a home in Sun City Summerlin and being a member of the community in good standing. A substantial time commitment is asked of Board Members, and it is very helpful to have been active in the community.

Letters of intent from homeowners in good standing seeking to serve on the Board of Directors must be received by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, November 30, at the Administrative Office located at

Mountain Shadows Community Center, 9107 Del Webb Boulevard. Each letter of application is to be accompanied by a signed candidate disclosure statement. An information packet with candidate guidelines and election timeline is available from the Administrative Office.

Names of eligible candidates will be provided to the Election Committee, a slate prepared, with voting taking place via mailed ballot. Ballots are due by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, February 21, 2023. Ballot counting takes place at the Association's Annual Meeting scheduled for 8 a.m. on Wednesday, February 22.

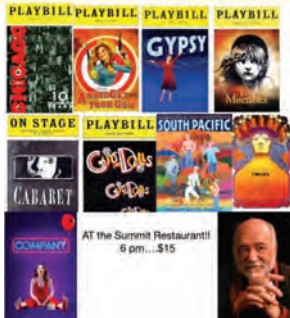

No matter, I find it really anxiety producing and discouraging to witness (and at times be in the middle) of conflict rooted in misunderstandings,

“agree to disagree” and still be friends without personalizing the diverging positions. Make sense?

I have a friend who is at the opposite end of the political spectrum from me. He sends out frequent email with information I certainly do not agree with. He recently asked me, “Say how come you have not blocked my email, like so many others? I know you don't agree with me.” I responded, “Well, don't we have to be open to *all* information available so that we can find the path that most agrees with our personal values?” He smiled and we had a cup of coffee together.

I guess everyone wants to be “right”. Most people believe they have a lock on the truth or the only path is *their* path. I will say that amazing things happen when we honestly look at the positions of others and open ourselves to compromise and change. We do best, when we accept others, and we have the greatest chance to be accepted ourselves.

ill intentions, hostile feelings, or coming from places of ego, stubbornness, and projecting feelings on other people which are without merit or facts.

You know, I hear people say, “That person just makes me so angry!” Really? Since when did you give another person control of your feelings? *Only you* can control your own feelings. Truer to say “When that person does XXX, I feel anger!” Our feelings are our own choice. It might be better to choose other feelings which are more productive and serve us better?

“I know what that person is thinking?” - “I know what they really want to do.” - “That person has so much nerve and just bullies everyone.” Consider that we are most often wrong when we assume or “project” feelings or motivations onto another person. We are most often best served by respecting the feelings of the other person, trying to gather objective facts, carefully analyzing the alternatives, engaging the other person in problem solving, and trying to find common ground to move forward. If you both still cannot agree, then you can always

There is so much joy in the world, it is a shame not to share it with others. Walking alongside others (even amidst differences) adds spring to our step and purpose to our journey.

There is so much stress in our world that we have little or no control over – must we manufacture and nurture more? We cannot control the world, but we can have control of ourselves. Then, we can work to make this a better world and a more peaceful, joyful, and rewarding life for ourselves.

# Don McWilliams: Proudly Served Our Nation in the AFRTS

*Social Monitor at Mountain Shadows and  
Resident of Sun City Summerlin*

**F**or the most part of my service, I was in the Armed Forces Radio + Television Service (AFRTS). When I tell people, the first thing they think about is the movie: Good Morning, Vietnam. That was the same kind of job I had, and it was mostly overseas.



The mission of AFRTS is to provide morale for the troops and their families overseas...a taste of home. Primarily, it is to deliver internal command information, so that they know what to do in case things happen while they are overseas, for their families and for themselves. That is the primary purpose of AFRTS. AFRTS provides television and radio programming without standard commercials. The commercials aired relay command information. Commercials focus on, for example: What would you do if there was a conflict in the area where you are stationed? How would you ready your family to be evacuated?

I enlisted in the Air Force in 1975. Four years later, I made an audition tape and subsequently joined AFRTS. Next, I attended broadcast journalism school at Fort Benjamin Harrison for an 8-week course. Wherever I served, the different branches of service were at the same station. Once I became a supervisor, I

was not on the air as much. Later, I had my own radio and/or television show.

I proudly served for 23 years and was stationed mainly overseas. My tours took me to Panama (where I was a disc jockey and produced television shows), Greece, Germany, and Korea.

One of my favorite memories, I interviewed B.B. King in Germany. I was stationed in Northern Germany, in Bremerhaven with AFRTS. B.B. King came to Bremerhaven, and he graciously invited me and my crew backstage to tell us his life story. He was one of my father's favorite entertainers. So, he autographed a lot of items for me. Those items I brought back with me to the U.S. for my father. I also interviewed other celebrities, including, Roberta Flack and Dottie West.



### *Funny story:*

Paula Abdul . . . at the time when she was new to the business . . . at that point I was a supervisor. One of my crew came to me and said that there is this new entertainer by the name of Paula Abdul, and she is doing a concert, and we might want to interview her. Don said: "Well I have never heard of her . . . what has she done?" My crew member said that she was likely to be a star someday. Don said: "I have never heard of her . . . find somebody else." And about a month later she had a big hit!

When I returned to the U.S., I did Combat Camera . . . I would go out and film various operations like bomb drops. Here in Nevada, there is a range up north called Range 63, where they do bomb drops. I would go up there and film operations for pilot training.

All in all, I enjoyed my career in the AFRTS.

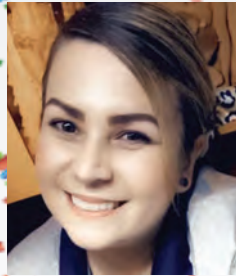

# IT'S "THANKSGIVING" BUT WHEN DID 'THANK YOU' BECOME OBSOLETE?

Seems a 'Thank You' has been replaced with an emoji or meme, if that, – and that's just a little sad. A few years ago, I was doing a presentation on customer service for professional bankers and I posed the question, "When was the last time any of you got a thank you note?" About 5 people raised their hands; then I asked, "When was the last time any of you *sent* one?" Not a single hand went up!

Growing up, if we got a card from Gramma with \$5 in it, we found a way to say thank you, a hand written note or, at the very least, a phone call. I've sent personalized gifts and gotten not so much as two words in an email. Not sure who is to blame, if anyone, or just a compliancy of the times. When did holding the door for someone become a sign of weakness? Did saying "excuse me" disappear with bell-bottoms? Not sure if it's rudeness or lack of awareness, as if learning common courtesies has gone the way of learning civics or cursive.

I find myself saying "excuse me" or "pardon me" if I go around someone at Walmart stacking shelves: I will hold the door at a 7-11 regardless of their age. I took thank you cards with me on business trips to write them out in my hotel room and mail them before I even left the city. I had someone tell me once they thought they had a full year before they sent out "thank you notes" for a wedding gift. Really, a *full year*?? Today, not sure if people are oblivious or simply don't care, whether they are rude or merely just self-absorbed.

Customer service seems to have morphed into anything but! I've found myself asking for a supervisor if I get good customer service on a phone, only to let them hear a compliment. Their

surprise says a great deal when they get a call like that, and that, in and of itself, says a lot as to who we have become. I know people will take the time to call and complain, but seldom take the time to say "thank you".

My intent is not to have everyone go out and buy a box of thank you cards (me, I make my own), but it costs us nothing to simply say "thank you," or "excuse me," or just a courteous "pardon me." I'd like to see a little more civility in the world, where manners replace the callousness we see in the world today. I miss the days where the words "sir" or "ma'am" were heard from people or all age, where a "thank you" or "pardon me" was not a surprise. I had a gentleman hold the door for me once, and said "thank you, Sir, that was the nicest thing that has happened to me all day." His response was, "Well, you must have had a really bad day!" He was right . . . but yet something so simple put a smile back on my face.

Many of us have so very much to be thankful for, and while all of life may not have been fair, if we live in Sun City Summerlin, overall, life is pretty good. Maybe we burnt dinner, maybe we had a bad golf game, maybe we need to call a plumber, but maybe, just maybe, someone held the door for us or simply said "thank you" today. I often refer to the kinder, gentler world I grew up in, and maybe those days are gone for good. But for this Holiday Season, this Thanksgiving, perhaps taking the time to say thank you, even for the smallest of gestures, will give us back a small piece of the way it used to be, if only for the moment. Who knows, it may just become a habit again . . .

Grateful people engage in more exercise, have better dietary behaviors, are less likely to smoke and abuse alcohol and have higher rates of medication adherence."

### 5 Ways to Practice Gratitude

**Health: What did your body do for you today?** Take a minute to acknowledge what your body does and thank yourself for the steps you take every day to keep it safe and healthy.

**Eat: What did you feed your body to nourish yourself today?** Take a minute to savor an especially good meal and to check out some healthy options for recipes.

**Activity: What did you do that you really enjoyed today?** Take a minute to think back on one particularly awesome moment.

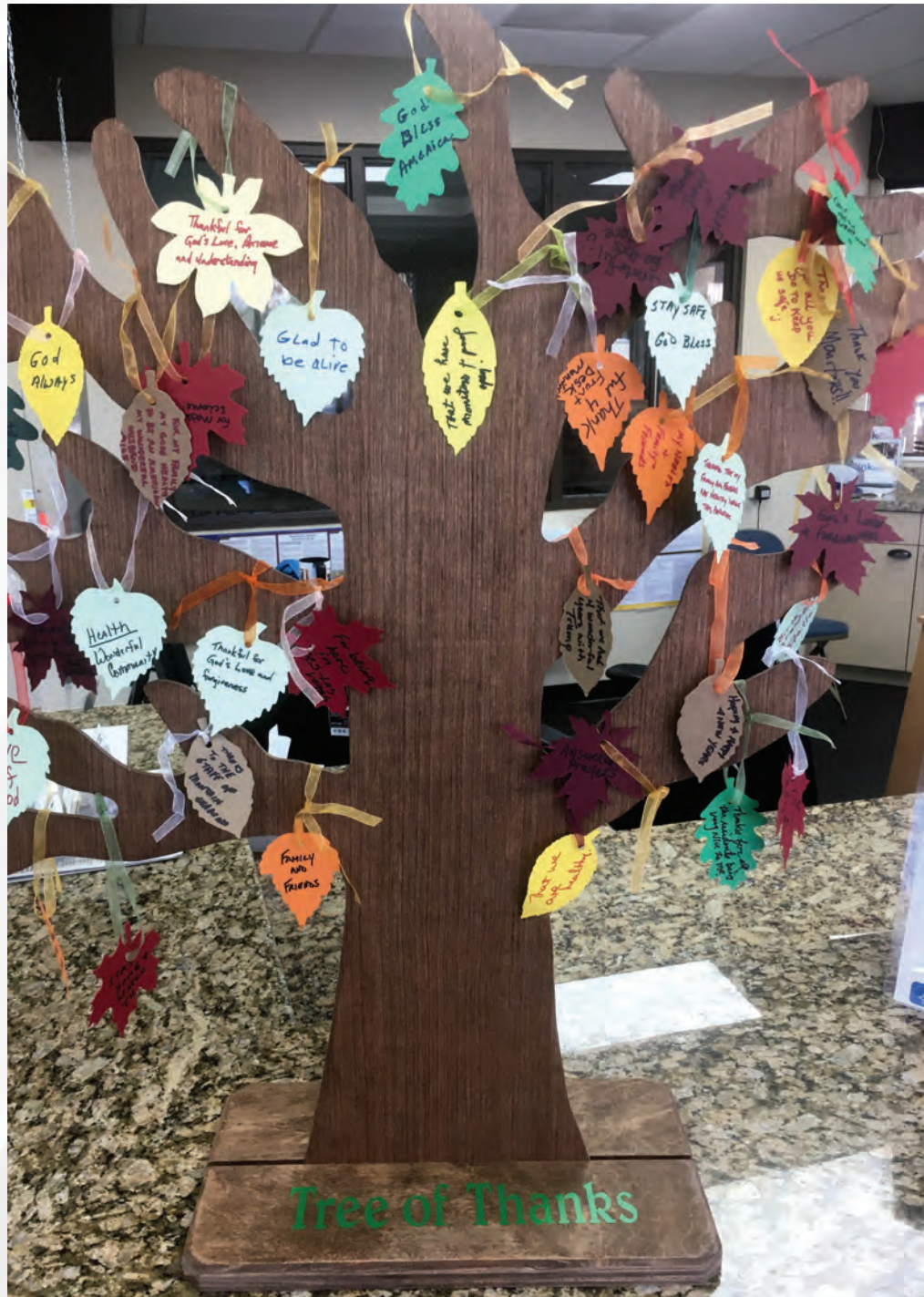
**Relationship: Whom do you look forward to connecting with?** Take a minute to smile as you think about this special person.

**Time: What are you doing right now?** Take a minute to be thankful for the gift of time.

Leah Buturain Schneider, a gerontologist, theologian, and mindful aging expert at University of Southern California-Los Angeles says, "Gratitude is not a feeling, it is a behavior we can practice every day of the year. What came to mind for me when I ran last year was an enthusiasm for the community and the residents; a willingness to volunteer; an advocate for the residents; an ability to enforce the governing documents without preference or favoritism; a willingness to participate in continuing education specific to board members; and probably most important, some business sense so necessary in the management of a corporation.

At times it can be difficult, but Board members must be tenacious in their quest to seek what is in the best interest for the HOA. I encourage those interested in a Board position to complete the paperwork this month and I applaud your service to the community. The HOA must remain and be about, "We the people . . . of Sun City Summerlin!!!"

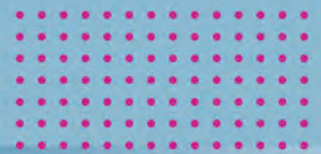

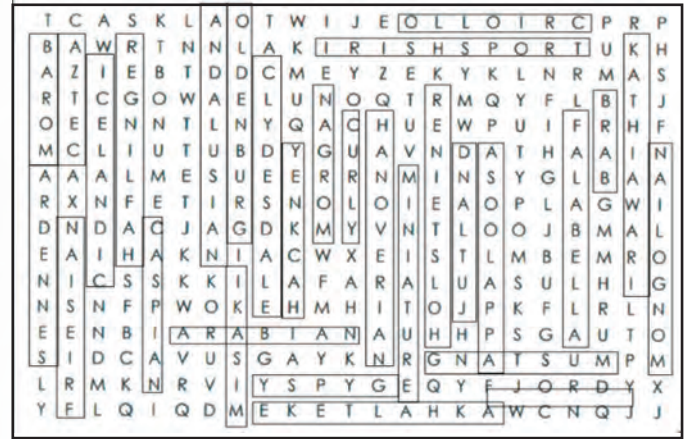

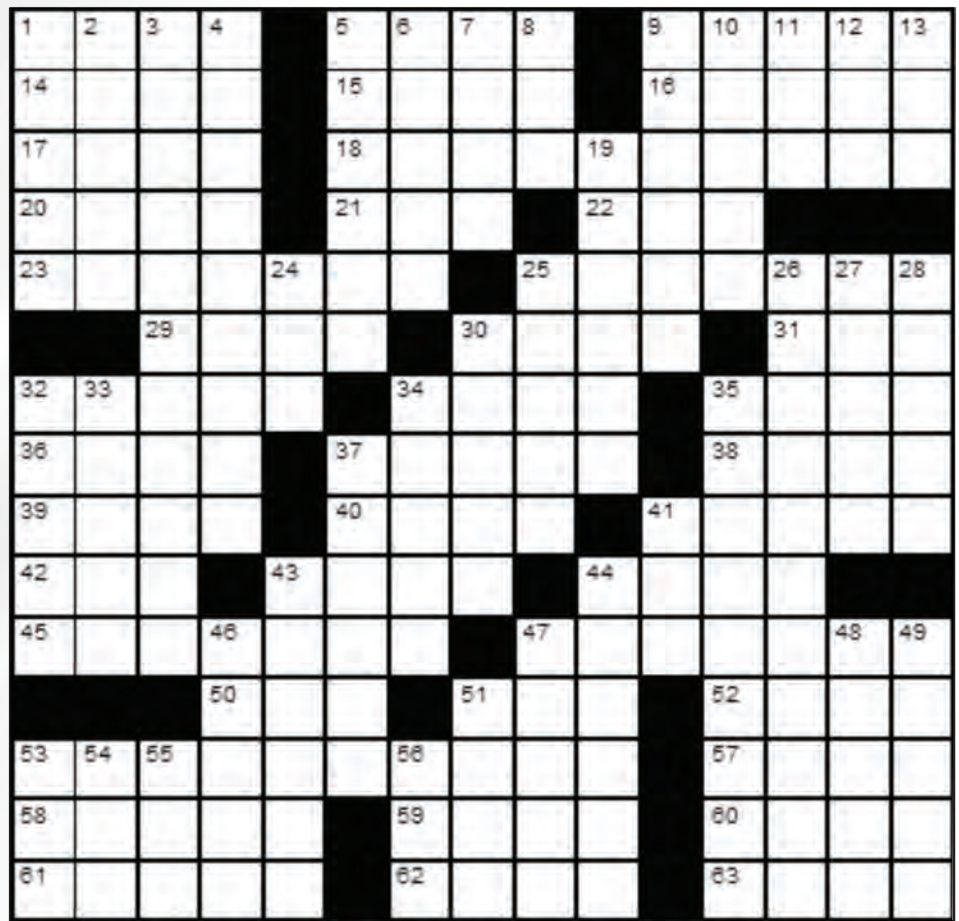

# Bruce Adams: Veteran Naval Officer And Witty Story-teller

*Resident of Sun City Summerlin*

**B**ruce Adams is writing a book...a collection of funny stories about his career. Some are short, some are a little longer. He enjoys telling his friends and fellow Model Builder Club members funny stories, little vignettes. And people tell him: "You ought to write that down." His stories are more or less true!

Bruce shares the following story . . . the time I was an Ensign, I was the Gunner Officer. I traveled for three days and was finally dropped on deck by a helicopter. We were in Vietnam. I was in charge of the gunner's mate. All the weapons, the big ship guns, the rifles, pistols, were part of my responsibility. We left Vietnam and were on our way to Hong Kong. My Chief Petty Officer, who was a real character, right out of a movie. One of those guys who is always in trouble. He was a WWII gunner's mate. He was an old time "West Pac Sailor," which meant that he had not been back to the U.S. in about 12 years. He lived in Japan and was on different ships. So, he said to me: "Mr. Adams: We are taking the machine guns down. They are going to be stored in the small arms armory." So, the machine guns were stored away in the armory. The Chief walked into the armory (a room in the afterdeck of the ship) and there way up high mounted were the two machine guns. So, the Chief says to one of the gunner's mates: "You sure that gun is empty?" He pulls the trigger and BANG! The bullet flies through the ship . . . goes through all these compartments finally hitting and destroying a filing cabinet! No one got hurt. What happened? Was there a court martial? No, nothing happened. Luckily, no one was hurt. We were at sea, 5-6 hours out of Vietnam heading to Hong Kong (one day away). The Second-Class Gunner's Mate who was really in charge, said: "The Chief is not allowed in the Armory anymore!"

*Now, back to Bruce.* He went into the Naval Academy in 1965, right out of high school and graduated in 1969. While in the Naval Academy, Bruce and fellow students were given lots of opportunities to do different training, exposing them to a wide array of situations. They went to sea on ships at the start of their second year. And at the start of their fourth year, they went out on ships as Officers. They were First Class Midshipmen. Bruce's first assignment as an Officer was on a little tiny destroyer 300 feet long . . . the USS Cromwell. The ship was on its way to the North Atlantic destined for a North Sea cruise. The crew was excited to be heading for Northern Europe, to Scandinavia. As Bruce recalls: "All we could think about was that we were going to meet all these beautiful blonde girls. We called it: The Blonde Girl Cruise." While they were crossing the

North Atlantic, the Russians invaded Czechoslovakia. They stayed at sea chasing Russian destroyers and never got to any port, never met any beautiful blondes. Instead, they stayed at sea for 8 weeks. They got lots of experience on the bridge training in naval operations . . . lots of sea time. Bruce recalls that he was a pretty good ship handler. The Captain said: "You don't have to go back for your last year. You can get a commission right now. You know everything you need to know; you don't need to go back for a year of school." So, that was the summer before the start of Bruce's fourth year. He stayed on and learned how the ship works, and how to work with enlisted men. Real hands-on team building. He and his fellow officers and crew worked with submarines and aircraft carriers about 6-8 ships, it's called a "Hunter-Killer Group" it's a carrier and a bunch of destroyers.

Bruce returned to the Naval Academy and got his commission. He served on numerous destroyers. His first two ships were in Vietnam. So, during the years 1969-1971, Bruce spent about 12 months of those 3 years in Vietnam.

Then, Bruce went to Graduate School, and earned a Masters of Science at the University of Washington. He returned to sea on another ship as an Operations Officer. Bruce got out of the Navy in 1979. He then stayed in the reserves and went to work for a variety of defense contractors. Bruce retired in 2005. His last few working years were really exciting, and pleasant. He spent a lot of time in the Middle East and had a ball! Bruce was doing marketing, meeting with government people, and experiencing different cultures. Bruce recalls: "It was great...you live on a first-class budget!"

Upon reflection, Bruce shares: "All in all, it was a good, rewarding career!"

# SECURITY PATROL

## What Do They Do?

There are 200 (plus or minus) residents of Sun City Summerlin, who generously give of their time to the community. These people are the members of Security Patrol. They come in all shapes and sizes, with many different expectations. Most are retirees with varied backgrounds and experiences. They all have one thing in common; they are doers. They live up to the patrol motto "Neighbors Helping Neighbors."

Security Patrol is *not* the police, it is *not* Rescue, it is a group who gives a helping hand, or a listening ear, or just human interaction when it is needed. You can find these folks on duty at all hours of the day and night. They are as close as your phone.

The infrastructure of Security Patrol has been built in such a way to have instant support for working members. There are many components to this group. Information Centers, those small buildings at three of the main entrances to Sun City are staffed between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. daily. They could be the very first face a new potential resident sees with a chance to have a conversation about our community. Importantly, they also can send you in the correct direction if you have lost your way. They have a myriad of resources on hand.

The white cars with the flashing yellow lights and the telephone number prominently displayed are on the road 24/7 with each driver or pair of drivers filling a four hour shift. They are on the lookout for folks who need help finding their way home, checking for the 9-1-1 lights available in each residence, reminding folks of any open garage doors, scrutinizing our association property to make sure doors are locked when buildings are not open. The drivers will also do house checks for individual homes when requested if the residents are traveling. That must be scheduled through the Security Patrol office at the far end of the Desert Vista parking lot.

There are dispatchers manning the phone line and helping the drivers to stay in touch with the base of operations. The Watch Commanders each have a twelve-hour shift to hold the entire group together. More support from behind the scenes with a wash crew keeping the white cars clean and tidy, a motor officer tending to the cars to keep them on the road, schedulers making sure all shifts are covered.

The Security Patrol trainers are the foundation of the group. Most of the members have never done this type of work before and

need to learn the skills for their particular job. Many hours of training must be completed before a member can venture out to use their newly found skills. All folks must continue to fulfill ongoing training requirements each year.

There is also the obligatory Board of Directors, but instead of having a president, that position is known as Chief. Second in command is Assistant Chief. The rest of the board are titled with familiar names; secretary, treasurer, and head of personnel.

Being a part of this group brings pride and accomplishment to the members. Many strong friendships are formed within the organization, particularly within the individual shifts. There are fun social events through the year and a chance to get together for general meetings. You may take a "ride-a-long" with a driver or visit with any of the members. Try out the Security Patrol if you are looking for something different and rewarding.

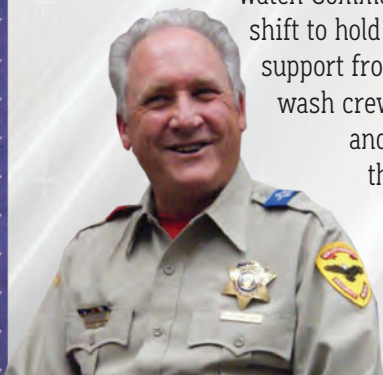

## WHAT ON EARTH IS “NO-SHAVE NOVEMBER” AND “MOVEMBER?”

The month of November celebrates many holidays and designated days such as Veterans Day, Thanksgiving, All Saint's Day, Day of the Dead, National Diabetes Month, National Gratitude Month, National Pepper Month, and No Shave November/Movember. mustaches they vowed to keep for the whole month. Not only did the movement want to raise awareness for men's health issues but also for men's suicide.

While Movember was created in Australia, No Shave November was created in the United States in 2009. No Shave November became popular after Matthew Hill passed away due to colon cancer in Chicago in 2007. His eight sons and daughters started this campaign in 2009, in memory of their father. Although still rather an obscure cause, over the past couple of years many people have participated in this campaign and helped to raise money for a noble cause.

In fact, between the two movements, they have managed to raise millions of dollars for cancer research at present. In addition, the organizers hope that No Shave November and Movember will not only bring about awareness of cancer, but also help to incorporate a creative way to call attention to cancer and the need for research.

# Jim Twohig: A Lifetime of Service as Air Force Jet Instructor Pilot & Airline Captain

**I**n 1967, Jim graduated from the University of San Francisco and faced two choices: the Draft or Graduate School. He signed up for the Air Force to Fly Thunderbirds ... those planes Thrilled him!

That was back in 1967. By 1969, Jim was up for either an assignment or off to Pilot School. Jim had no experience flying and was competing with other student officers for a limited number of assignments.

He was given a slot at Vance Air Force Base in Enid, OK. Jim went there in 1969 and got out in 1973. He became a Jet Instructor Pilot.

Jim and five other instructors were "frozen" in their jobs because there was a need for more and more pilots (since the war was going on). Jim trained hundreds of pilots...close to 300! Although Jim wanted to go and fight in the war, the Air Force needed experienced flight instructors to stay with the program and train pilots.

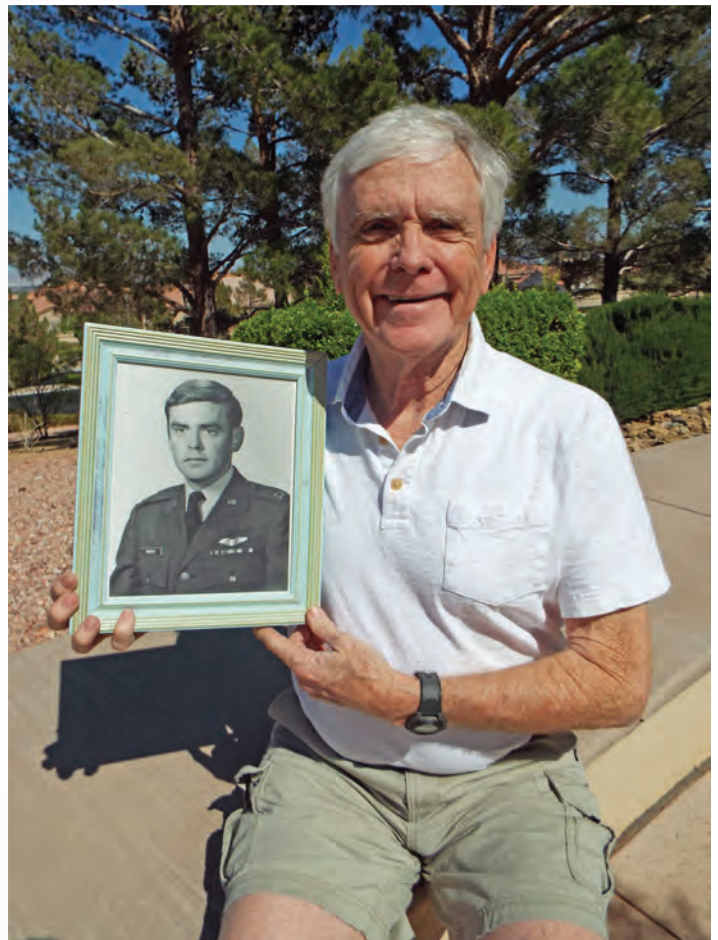
The war wound down in 1972, and Jim ended up getting out of the Air Force.

Jim became a commercial pilot, first flying for PSA - Pacific SW Airlines, based in San Diego. They had a pilot force of 300. At the time when Jim applied to work for PSA, 10,000 applied, 5,000 were actually qualified and only 12 were hired! Of the 12, Jim was one of the lucky ones! Jim flew for PSA from 1973 to 1987. U.S. Airways bought PSA in 1987. Jim continued flying with U.S. Airways from 1987 to 2004.

During most of his career, Jim flew 737 and 757 aircraft. In the last eight years of his career, Jim was the Captain, sitting in the left seat, flying Jumbo Jets in Europe, the Caribbean and Mexico. Jim was the recipient of 11 "Type Readings". He was qualified to fly 11 different types of commercial airplanes.

When Jim retired in 2004 at age 60, he flew private jets for a few years, fully retiring in 2006.

In July 2010, Jim got a phone call at 3 a.m., from U.S. Government officials requesting that he go to Iraq and help the Iraqis repair



their national airline. He spent six weeks in Dubai getting the program up and running. Subsequently, Jim went to Baghdad and was stationed at "Camp Liberty" with daily trips to the airport to supervise the repair of the national airline. He was in Iraq for one year.

Jim speaks with pride and fondness of his service in the Air Force and of his distinguished flying career.



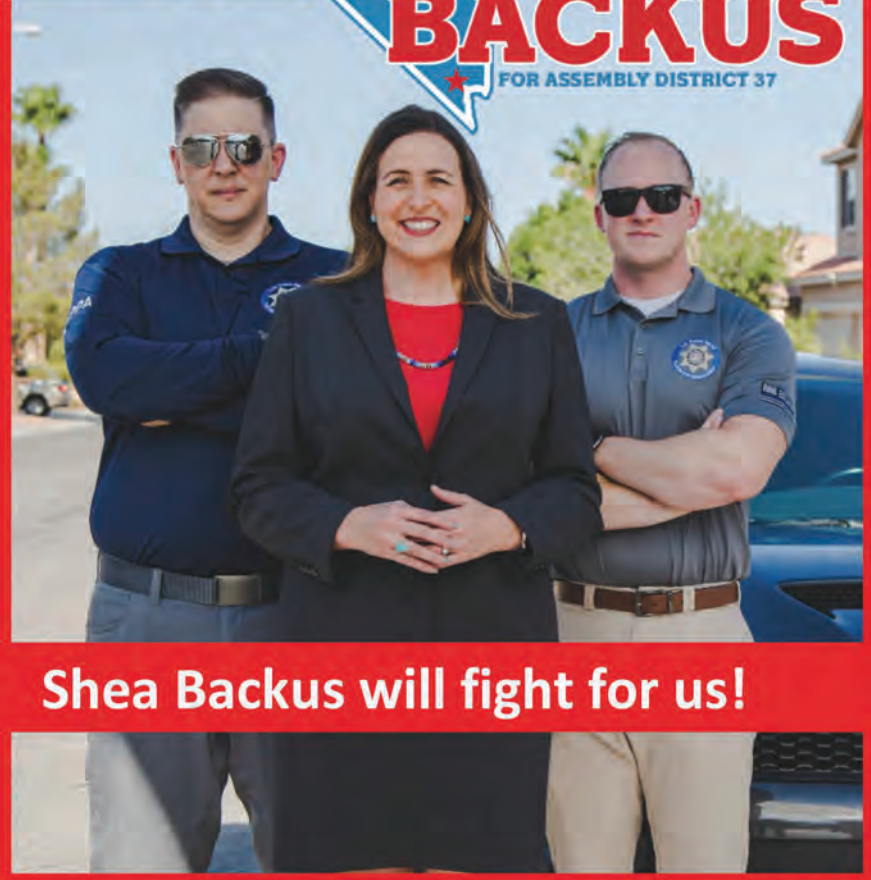
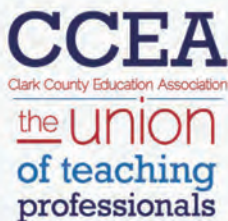

# Stephen Linder: Proud Marine Corps Pilot

*Resident of Sun City Summerlin*

**I**n high school, Stephen wanted to go into the military. He applied to, and was accepted by, the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, in June 1965, and graduated 4 years later in June 1969. A year before he graduated, Stephen decided that he wanted to be in the Marine Corps because it was a smaller service with excellent esprit de corps. He was commissioned into the Marine Corps as a Second Lieutenant. Stephen went to The Basic School in Quantico, Virginia, for six months, and trained to become a Rifle Platoon Commander. Once completed, Stephen was selected to go to Flight School.

But it was 1970, the Vietnam War was raging, and the Navy could not train enough Marine Pilots. The Marine Corps contracted with the Air Force to teach a group of Marines to fly jets. Stephen went from Quantico to Reese Air Force Base in Lubbock, Texas. For a year, he did undergraduate pilot training with the Air Force and flew the T-41, T-37, and T-38. Stephen graduated from Air Force Flight Training in February 1971 and received Air Force Wings. From there, he went to the Marine Corps Air Station in Yuma, Arizona, to get his Navy wings and

became a Naval Aviator.

Stephen recounts a funny story: "The first day I reported for duty in Yuma, I had on my Marine Alpha uniform, and I proudly wore my Air Force wings. I soon found out that my Air Force wings were not welcome! I only wore them for a short time, less than one hour! The only wings a Marine should wear are the Gold Wings of a Naval Aviator. So, I found that out very quickly and I took them off."

After earning his Naval Aviator wings, Stephen went to a training squadron to learn to fly the A-4 Skyhawk. He did that advanced training for six months, and received his Military Occupational Specialty (MOS), specializing in flying the A-4.

Then, Stephen was scheduled for training to go to Vietnam. They transferred him to El Toro Marine Corps Air Station near Santa Ana, California. One of the things he had to do was qualify to deliver nuclear weapons. So, as a part of that training, he did low-level bombing then received another MOS as a nuclear weapons delivery pilot. And, at the same time, qualifying in a brand-new version of the A-4, the A-4M. The cockpit smelled like a new car (highly unusual for working aircraft).

By then, the Vietnam War was slowing down (April 1973). The Military stopped sending pilots into combat, so Stephen never went to Vietnam.

Stephen decided to further his career by putting in a request to become a Flight Instructor, which was approved. He was



transferred to Beeville, Texas, to be a Flight Instructor in the two-seat A-4 (the TA-4) and was scheduled for a three-year tour (from August 1973 to August 1976). But two years into his tour, the Marine Corps was looking for pilots to fly the new AV-8A Harrier (the Marine Corps purchased 110 single-seat Harriers from Great Britain in 1970). He was accepted into that program, cutting short his three-year tour. In August 1975, Stephen went to Cherry Point, North Carolina, to learn to fly Harriers. He learned how to fly and "hover" the Harrier and then served overseas in Japan. While in the Harrier detachment in Japan he flew non-combat missions in Korea, Australia, and the Philippines.

Stephen spent nine years on active duty after graduating from the Academy. He left active duty in 1978 and did not fly again. He got a civilian job in Chicago, and went into the

Reserves, retiring in 1995 as a Lieutenant Colonel. His job eventually brought him to Las Vegas.

Stephen shares: "I have the utmost admiration for the Marines who served in Vietnam and got shot at. Some people didn't make it home. I had a relatively easy career because I didn't have to go to Vietnam. I was ready but didn't end up serving over there."

Now Stephen enjoys the reunions. The Harrier and Skyhawk Groups meet regularly (Stephen sits on the Board of the Skyhawk Association). And every year, there is a Tailhook Reunion of Navy and Marine Corps pilots who get together in September in Reno, Nevada. Stephen enjoys meeting up with friends from the past and reliving the "good old days."

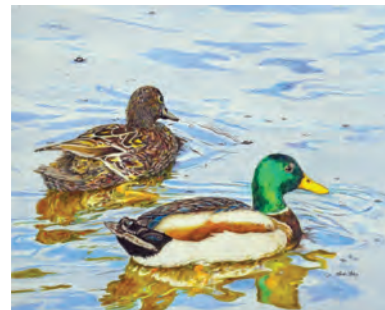

# Model Builders

*Bruce Adams, Veteran and  
President Model Builders Club*

One of our Model Club members, James (Jim) Twohig, built a fabulously detailed model of the US Brig Niagara. This is a renowned ship in US history. It was the flagship of Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry in the historically significant Battle of Lake Erie, during the War of 1812. Commodore Perry flew his flag "Don't Give Up the Ship" from the mast of Niagara during the battle. (We all know that famous quote, and the original flag itself is enshrined at the US Naval Academy Museum.) Jim's Niagara won several local awards at model shows and, was displayed at the Nautical Research Guild Annual Convention here in Las Vegas in 2018.

I am a graduate of the US Naval Academy and, returned to Annapolis in October 2019 for my 50th Class reunion. While there, I visited the Naval Academy Museum, to enjoy the artifacts and displays, and to do a little research for Jim Twohig on the actual color of Commodore Perry's Battle Flag, flown from the Niagara. The Museum's display includes a great deal about Commodore Perry, including the flag, his uniform, sword, sextant, other personal items, and a beautiful description of the important Battle of Lake Erie (1813). What was missing from the display was a model of his flagship during the battle! There was no model of the US Brig Niagara!

Upon my return to Las Vegas, I spoke with Jim Twohig, debriefed him on my visit, and told him of the fabulous display, and the lack of an accurate model of the Niagara. I asked him if he would be proud to have his model displayed in the "Commodore Perry" exhibit in the Naval Academy Museum. He replied in the affirmative, and we both enthusiastically began a campaign to contact the Museum, to determine if his ship model would be welcomed.

I contacted the Director of the Museum, Mr. Grant Walker, told him about Jim and his model of Niagara, and sent him a presentation including detailed pictures of Jim's model. The Curator was enthusiastic. He wanted Jim's ship in the museum, to complete the historic "Perry" display area.

Jim worked with the Museum to coordinate the shipping of his model to Annapolis. It was delivered in 2021, and was immediately placed in a conspicuous location in the "Perry" exhibit.

Sometimes we talk about very high-quality ship models. We use the term "Museum Quality" for exceptional models. But we have never actually had a "Museum Quality" model accepted by a museum, until now! And not just any museum, but the US Naval Academy Museum, repository of the history and artifacts of the entire US Navy! This is truly an honor for Jim Twohig, and for all of us at the Model Builders Club.



On June 22, 2022, Jim Twohig, and Naval Academy Graduates Bruce Adams and Stephen Linder, visited the Naval Academy Museum, and were thrilled by the display presentation. There sat Jim Twohig's beautiful Niagara model, as a centerpiece of this important display. Jim was welcomed by the Curator, Mr. Grant Walker, who told us of the importance of this exhibit, and thanked Jim Twohig for his generous donation of the Niagara.

There are tens of thousands of visitors to this museum every year, and all will gaze on Jim's model. The ship resides in a place where the relics of past US Navy victories are celebrated. Alongside the famous "Don't Give Up the Ship" flag from 1813, is Jim's model, which also flies a miniature of that flag from its main mast.

Few model builders can make the claim that "my ship model resides in a famous display, amongst a world-class collection of historic ship models."
