B.O.D. MESSAGE



arch is an important month for Sun City Summerlin. This is the month that our annual budgeting process takes place and the financial plans for the next fiscal year are set. The outcome of those budget hearings is noted most keenly by homeowners in the form of their annual assessment fee. This is also the opportunity for stakeholders to observe the process, have input into the process, and gain more information about how our HOA's money is spent.

The budget and planning process begins with each department's Director meeting with our Executive Director and Financial Director. They prepare a line-by-line detail of past, current actual, and anticipated future, expenses. For some departments revenues are also included in the analysis. They then determine how a particular line item may be impacted for the upcoming year.

The Finance Committee, along with the Board of Directors, then goes through a several days process of reviewing each departmental budget with the staff. Many of the line items are more or less "locked in" and difficult to adjust. For example, how much we spend on water, utilities, insurance, payroll taxes, and other items that we have little control over. (And none of these are decreasing.) Others, like wages or landscaping, could only be limited by reducing services to our community, or by reducing the availability of amenities.

While we sometimes get feedback that asks why we can't just cut the budget, there are a limited number of items that can actually be considered. Rest assured, the Board and the departments are aware of the need to control expenses and to potentially increase revenues. And incremental steps are continually being taken to keep the budget as lean as possible.

When it comes to capital items and the maintaining of reserves, the Board also takes a conservative, but realistic, view of how to maintain the community. As can be anticipated, in a 35-year-old community there will be constant upkeep and repairs going on. It is the responsibility of the Board to make sure we have properly anticipated and planned for needed expenditures.

If you have questions or concerns about any particular area, you are encouraged to attend the budget hearings (either in person or by Zoom). You can also speak to the Board Member responsible for the department you are interested in. Or you can call either our Executive Director or myself to provide input.

Once the budget is determined, the full packet of information is provided to all homeowners for the ratification process. The budget and annual assessment is locked in by a homeowner vote in early June, and the fiscal year begins on July 1. Any change in the assessment begins on the anniversary date of the purchase of your home. That is why some homeowners see the change sooner than others.

It is a totally open process, and you have access to it all. We encourage everyone to be informed and to have the facts. Please continue to let us know your questions, concerns, and thoughts about our community.

Information and Sign-up Instructions for AARP Tax-Aide Program

AARP volunteers will again provide free Federal income tax preparation. The program will run from February 1 to April 13. This service will be offered in the Mint Room at Mountain Shadows on Thursday, Fridays and Saturdays. Our hours are from 9 a.m-12 p.m. and 1-4 p.m.

Appointment Sign-up:

There are two ways to sign up for a tax preparation appointment. Please do not call the Social Monitors at Mountain Shadows.

Items to collect and bring to your appointment:

It is essential that you bring the following items:

- · Copy of last year's tax return
- Social Security card and some form of picture ID
- If you want to do a direct deposit or direct debit, please bring a cancelled check.
- We also need the following statements as applicable: W2's, 1099R, Interest, Dividend, Social Security SSA1099, W2G, broker statements, proof of health insurance and any receipts for your miscellaneous deductions.

Process for Tax Return preparation:

- As in previous years, we are using the "DROP OFF METHOD" for tax return preparation. This means that we will schedule a pickup/review appointment at the time of your initial appointment. For Joint Returns both taxpayers must be present, at the pickup appointment.
- Please note we will only prepare returns for electronic filing, no paper returns. Also note that we cannot prepare state returns or returns that involve rental property deductions, business, or partnerships.

America has a proud tradition of St. Patrick's Day parades celebrated on March 17th. Parades began in colonial America with small gatherings of Irish soldiers who served in the British Army. In the mid-1700s, colonists of Irish descent who settled in Boston held parades. After the American Revolution, music was introduced to the procession, followed by a banquet.

During the 1800s, parades were neighborhood events where residents walked to local churches in honor of St. Patrick, the patron saint. In 1891, the parade route we celebrate each year in New York City was instituted. By tradition, the procession follows the painted green line stretching 1.5 miles along Fifth Avenue in Manhattan. Thousands of people from all walks

of life march to the sound of bagpipe and brass bands. Parades are celebrated in Boston and in Chicago, as well as in other American cities. Since the early 1960s, Chicago dyes the Chicago River green in recognition of the beloved holiday.

The St. Patrick's Day parade is a proud symbol of Irish American solidarity.



Easter Eggs Symbols and Traditions

Easter eggs are decorated to symbolize the resurrection of Jesus. The tradition dates back to early Christians in Mesopotamia who stained eggs red to honor the memory of the blood of Christ and his crucifixion.

This religious tradition spread to the Orthodox Churches of Eastern Europe and was later adopted by the Catholic and Protestant Churches of Western Europe. During the Middle Ages, religious followers were not permitted to eat eggs during the period of Lent.

Coloring the eggs can be achieved by boiling the egg in natural juices (for example: beet juice) or with artificial stains. Families, children in particular, delight in the fun activity of decorating eggs as a unique Easter tradition.

Today, many substitute real eggs for chocolate ones, or colorful plastic eggs filled with jelly beans. An Easter egg hunt ensues to the delight of children and adults.





2024 NATIONAL NUTRITION MONTH

National Nutrition Month® is an annual campaign by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. During the month of March, everyone is encouraged to learn more about making healthier food choices. This year's theme is "Beyond the Table," which focuses on all the various ways we eat—not only in the home but also on the go.

Healthy eating is recommended throughout life, but it is especially important for older adults. Food is medicine—enjoying all the nutrients found in food reduces the risk by 80% of chronic diseases such as diabetes and cardiovascular diseases.

Aging will look different for all of us, and it might have a different meaning to some people.

Aging gracefully might mean staying physically healthy or mentally sharp. How to do this? We fuel our body with the nutrients it needs to function, grow, repair, and thrive.

There is a lot of dietary information available, and it can get confusing. Sometimes it is important to get back to the basics. So, in honor of National Nutrition Month®, let's talk about the Six Basic Nutrients and what they do in our bodies.

- 1. **Water** helps regulate blood pressure and body temperature, carries blood and nutrients around the body, dissolves vitamins and minerals, and flushes waste. Most older adults need 20 to 25 mL per kilogram of body weight.
- 2. **Carbohydrates** are the body's main source of energy and normally make up 45-65% of the diet. There are three types of carbohydrates: starch, fiber, and sugar. Starch and fiber are "complex" and include whole grains, beans, and vegetables. Sugar is "simple" and includes natural sugars like dairy and fruit, and added sugars found in sweets.

- 3. **Fat** provides energy, supports brain function, and helps dissolve vitamins and minerals. There are two types of fat—saturated, which are solid at room temperature, and unsaturated, which are liquid at room temperature. Saturated fats tend to be more inflammatory and come from animal foods. For heart health, no more than 6% of daily calories should come from saturated fat.
- 4. **Proteins** are needed for immune health and for every cell to function, grow, and repair. There are two types of protein—animal and plant—and both contain "complete" proteins. Animal proteins tend to contain more saturated fat, while plant proteins have more unsaturated fat. Most older adults need 0.8 to 1.2 grams of protein per kilogram of body weight.
- 5. **Vitamins** are needed in small amounts for immune health and specific bodily function. For example, the eight watersoluble B vitamins help convert food into usable energy, while vitamin A supports eye and skin health. Most of the vitamins are only found in plant foods.
- 6. **Minerals** are also needed in small amounts for immune health and bodily function. Minerals like potassium help regulate blood pressure, while calcium helps with muscle contraction. Like vitamins, most of the minerals needed for optimal health are found in plant foods.

2023 Architectural Review Committee Year in Review

2023 was a busy year for the Architectural Review Committee (ARC). Moving forward, we thought you might be interested in learning what the committee members do on a day-to-day basis, and some of the accomplishments of our dedicated ARC Committee Members.

Application review and process

When an ARC application is submitted for approval, it must be reviewed and approved by three (3) committee members.

• $\frac{1}{1/2023} - \frac{12}{31/2023} - 1,876$ applications were reviewed and processed.

Variances

If project is denied during the review process, the applicant has the opportunity to appeal to the full committee for a variance at the next monthly meeting.

• <u>1/1/2023 – 12/31/2023</u> – 20 requests for variances were brought forward at the monthly meetings. Of those requests, 9 variances were granted.

Project Inspections

When 120 days have passed, the applications are divided between the committee members and the work is inspected to verify that the work was done as approved.

• <u>1/1/2023 – 12/31/2023</u> - 1,844 projects were inspected and closed.

Other ARC accomplishments

- Welcomed two (2) new ARC committee members to our committee.
- Revised/updated the Development Standards.
- Added nine (9) new exterior paint palette color schemes.
- Approved process and colors for concrete coatings.

Sun City Summerlin is as beautiful as it is because of its residents who generously volunteer their time to keep it that way. An enormous "Thank You" to our Architectural Review Committee for their part in these efforts. And a special "Thank You" to our residents who comply with the Standards to keep our community beautiful.

Political Signage

With another political season upon us, the following is to eliminate any confusion with what political signage is allowed in Sun City Summerlin.

The Sun City Summerlin Development Standards, which state our sign requirements, are in compliance with City of Las Vegas Code 19.06.140 and 19.08.129.

Consequently, residents are asked to conform to the SCSCAI 2023 Development Standards below, and the Nevada State Law and City of Las Vegas ordinance that takes precedence over our governing documents.

- (a) Political signs on each Dwelling are permitted, one per candidate, political party, or ballot question;
- (b) Must be located solely on Owner's property; and
- (c) Signs may be placed up to 60 days prior to election day and removed within 15 days following election day.

Any signage which deviates from the above will be considered a violation and will be treated as such.

Stop the World, I Want to Get Off (for at least a day)!

Do you remember, back in the day, party line connections for the phone? Neighbors sometimes listening in? "Get off the phone, I can hear you breathing!" LOL!

Over time, we had direct lines and then came cell phones. Ah! Cell phones, where one can be in touch 24/7, get notifications on all sorts of apps, do research, play games, text, ask directions and more. Let's face it, not only are we living in a fast-paced world, but many of us see how it appears to be speeding up even more.

Friday, March 1st, is The National Day of Unplugging, which is unplugging from cell phones and all social media and taking a technology break for 24 hours beginning at sunset on Friday. Why might this be a good idea?

According to my research, here are some facts that you may find interesting:

TRUCE Software surveyed 1,500 employees across varying occupations nationwide to gauge how smart devices are influencing their workday. The survey identified both counterproductive and unsafe behaviors regarding mobile device usage on the job, including:

- Lingering in the car, the restroom or taking an extended break to finish reading or watching something on a phone before returning to work (57%).
- Taking work-related calls while driving to or from the job (51%).

- Hiding a phone while in a meeting to continue to check messages or text with a co-worker (24%).
- Tripping, bumping into something or someone or experiencing other embarrassing missteps while looking at a phone (18%).

According to Healthline.com, it's easy to become addicted to social media because dopamine, the feel-good brain chemical, is released when you are on your favorite app or website. When the dopamine diminishes, you naturally want to go back to the source for more. The article goes on to say this is how the brain functions with all addictions.

Many of us of the older generation are generally not as addicted to cells or social media, but the suggestion is that one could easily turn to technology for comfort instead of connecting to real people no matter what the generation.

If March 1st is too inconvenient to unplug, any day you (or your family) decide to try this experiment, it may reveal how much more you are connected to technology than you imagined. If 24 hours is too much, pick a block of time every day to unplug if that feels more comfortable. A couple of resources suggest taking walks outside, reading a good book, playing a card game or experimenting with that recipe you never got to in the past, meditation, even cleaning out perhaps a closet or a drawer – anything you feel is beneficial for you to do to unplug and reconnect with yourself and loved ones. Embrace the power of ME time!

Blue sheet?? What is a blue sheet?

The Sun City Patrol continues to bring this paperwork to the attention of every resident of our community. It is a simple one page "fill-in-the-blanks". All questions are easy to answer. It is SO important for each of us to keep the information on this Emergency Contact Sheet up to date. In fact, it actually can be a lifesaver! These blanks can be found online at www.suncitysummerlin.com under Resident Services-Patrol-Emergency Contact Form. Or pick up a form at Sun City Patrol Base (far end of Desert Vista Community Center parking lot). It is white online but blue from patrol.

Too many folks put their family members living in another state in the emergency contact information, because they are the most important people in their lives. That is fine, **HOW-EVER**; also take the time to meet one of your neighbors. Hopefully you feel comfortable enough to give them a house key and add them to your Emergency Contacts. What if a member of your family, say, from Texas, would call the patrol office and ask for us to help find you. With a local contact we may be able to set their mind at ease quickly. Our Sun City Patrol can only help you if you first help yourself.

Keep in touch with your friends and the persons living near you, so when you don't show your face for a few days, they would question your absence sooner rather than later. Many of our residents live alone. **VERY IMPORTANT;** have a local person on your Emergency Contact form who has access to your home. Possibly have some sort of life alert system or carry your cell phone with you the next time you are taking a walk, or a shower, or some chores in the garage. Keep it by your bed at night or during a nap. It doesn't take up much space. That will give you a way to call for help if you should need it. Add the patrol number to your list of VIPs already on your phone: 702-254-2303.

Sun City Summerlin Patrol is so much more than you might think. We are the folks who want everyone to enjoy Sun City Summerlin. We are not the police; we are neighbors helping neigh-

bors. If you need help, please call 911. We have a unique position in our community. We care, we are committed, and we are on call 24/7!

ATTENTION DOG WALKERS: When you leave your home on a dark and dreary night to exercise your pooch just once

more, please be sure you are wearing something that will be seen by drivers. Also dress your dog in a reflective or lighted leash and collar.

provide pointers. There's always something new to learn and strategies to try out!






