# DIRECTFrom the Executive Director

Let's Stop Talking About Closing a Golf Course un City Summerlin was originally conceived as an active adult golf, recreation and retirement community. Over the years, there have been studies and many discussions regarding the closing of one or more of the golf courses, however the end result always has been to continue to operate and maintain the three golf courses we own.

The Board of Directors is adamant that it is not considering closing a golf course now or ever in the future. Here's why:



• At a conservative estimate, there is approximately \$1 billion worth of residential property in Sun City Summerlin. Recent Southern Nevada history demonstrates that the closure of a golf course in a golf/residential community results in a significant loss of property value to all property in the immediate course area. It is estimated that residential properties adjacent to a golf course would lose more than 15 percent of their value if a course were to close. I believe that we would lose more

than \$40 million in property value for each course we closed.

- Based on the zoning requirements of the city we must retain 20 percent of our total property as open space. If we close a golf course we would still have to maintain the area as open space. The maintenance of the open space would still require a significant budget investment every year with less revenue. While the golf courses require a significant portion of our operating budget; they also provide a significant portion of revenue.
- Our residences were sold to us with the assurance that there always would be golf courses in our community. If we closed a golf course there would be numerous property owners who would bring lawsuits against the Association. These suits would be very costly to our Association and possibly devastating to our continued existence.
- The golf courses and other amenities in the community have made Sun City Summerlin a very desirable place to live, which secures and sustains our property values.

We are a golf and recreation retirement community and will remain so. THE GOLF COURSES WILL NOT BE CLOSED NOW OR IN THE FUTURE. The executive Board and staff are working diligently to maintain the community and specifically the golf courses in top shape. We also are working hard to market our golf courses to increase golf revenues; thereby reducing the burden of golf on our operating budget.

# PRESPresident's Message

#### Possible Changes to Our Trash Pickup

or many years, the city of Las Vegas has operated under a 20-year agreement with Republic Services to pick up our trash twice per week and recyclable materials once every two weeks.

For the past few years, Republic Services has been successful in changing that agreement with the Clark County Commission, the City of North Las Vegas and the city of Henderson. The new agreements provide for trash and recyclable materials to be picked up once per week. In late 2015, Republic opened a \$40 million recycling processing plant that has enabled it to include more residents in the program.

Republic is changing its rolling stock to trucks manned by one employee. The truck will have a device that picks up a container and dumps it into the cargo area automatically. Republic's plan is to provide every residence with two standardized containers, one for trash and one for recyclables. Containers will come in three sizes: 35 gallons, 65 gallons and 95 gallons. It will be up to the customer to decide the size that fits their individual household needs.

This program is in negotiation between Republic Services and the City of Las Vegas. It is expected to begin in 2017 or 2018, depending on those negotiations. The new program will present some interesting challenges:


The new containers could be larger than the ones you currently use and there may be residents who want to store them outside of their home. Sun City's CC&R's are very clear, which state that no container may be visible from a neighboring property or the street on any lot. However, the CC&R's provide for the erection of a wall in the side yard where the containers may be placed behind. Any structure of this nature has to be approved by the Architectural Review Committee.

The retention of trash for a one-week period may present some problems due to the storage of the container in the garage, especially during the hot season. Residents will have to be creative in their methods of storage. Pushing containers on wheels down some of our steep driveways also will be a challenge for some residents. Hopefully, Republic will have a procedure to help with this task.

On September 14, the Resident's Forum will present an evening with Las Vegas Mayor Carolyn Goodman and City Manager Betsy Fretwell. We have asked Betsy to give an update on the change in trash collection in Sun City. We hope you attend this meeting.

#### Our Wi-Fi Is An Open Network

There are issues with open Wi-Fi, which need to be addressed.

he Wi-Fi network at Desert Vista is an open network. What that means is that anyone within the signal range of Desert Vista's Wi-Fi can access it if they know the password.

There are issues with open Wi-Fi, which need to be addressed. One big issue with open networks is that anyone within range of the Wi-Fi access point can connect to the network, and that user has as much access to the other devices on the local network as anyone else.

Someone with bad intentions could lurk within the Wi-Fi's range and try to collect sensitive data, such as passwords, account numbers, logins etc. Since this network was established for our residents it has to be open. If you use an open network such as ours you have to be vigilant. Don't use it to do your banking, shop online or for any other purpose where you have to furnish sensitive information. Sensitive infor-

mation includes, but is not limited to, bank accounts, brokerage accounts, credit card information, Social Security numbers and passwords.



Our Wi-Fi network is throttled, which means that you cannot download large files, such as movies. We also have tried to prevent access to inappropriate materials such as pornography.










#### Francis J. Noll, M.D.





# Charli's Corner

Getting the Most
Out of Smith
Machine Squats

quats are one of the best exercises you can do to strengthen your core and legs. Performing squats correctly every day will help keep you in shape and strong enough to do many of your normal daily activities. Using the Smith Machine while doing a squat teaches you how to extend your hips back and behind you, creating less stress on your knees. It also gives you the opportunity to add additional weight as you become stronger.



Start with no weight or light weight on the bar. You can add weight as needed and as you get stronger. Always do slow and controlled repetitions with your core engaged at all times (drawing your belly toward your spine).

Place the bar at shoulder height, step under the bar and place your shoulders up and under the bar. Un-rack the bar onto your shoulders and keep your feet hip distance apart. Walk forward 12 to 18 inches, leaning back into the bar and slowly lower your body into a squat keeping your knees behind your toes. Make a 90-degree angle at your knee and hip, engage your abs and keep your back flat. Push up and return to the starting position. Repeat 10 to 15 reps for two to three sets.

While using the Smith Machines at Desert Vista and Mountain Shadows fitness centers you can face the wall or toward the center of the room because the bar is straight up and down. At the Pinnacle fitness center, you will need to face toward the wall because the bar is angled away from the wall. You will want to let your hips extend behind you, keeping your spine at a 30-degree angle, push up and repeat.

If you have further questions on how to perform a Smith Machine squat or a squat with other equipment, sign up for an equipment orientation class or ask a SCS fitness specialist.

Learn how to use the strength and cardio equipment properly and safely in each fitness center. A fitness specialist will demonstrate proper equipment usage and answer your exercise questions. # Stepping On Falls Prevention Program

Pre-screening begins September 20. Appointments are Required

I think I have gained confidence." ~ Mary Jo Richards he SCS Fitness Department will be sponsoring another falls prevention program called "Stepping On." This program begins with a falls prevention screening session held on September 20 by appointment only. Residents may sign up for an appointment with the Desert Vista Social Monitor.

During the screenings, participants will fill out a questionnaire and perform a few simple balance and stability tests in which an individual's risk of falling will be assessed. Recommendations will be given depending on the results of the individual tests. Some participants will be recommended to attend the Stepping On Falls Prevention Program classes beginning on October 5. Others may be referred to their health care provider for further intervention as necessary.

The Stepping On Falls Prevention classes will be held on Mondays from 1-3 p.m. (except for class #1) from October 5 to November 14 (seven weeks, two-hour sessions). Participants must be pre-screened to attend these classes during the screening session held on September 20 and commit to attending all classes. Sign up for both the screening and the class with the Desert Vista Social Monitor. Class size is limited. When full, a waiting list will be collected for future classes or cancellations. For more information on this program, contact the Fitness Manager, Kristie McWhorter at 363-1486.

The Stepping On Falls Prevention program is designed to challenge the older adult to appraise his or her risk realistically and to provide a forum for gaining knowledge about safety practices. The Stepping On program's aim is to facilitate the older person's taking control of their situation, explore different coping behaviors and encourage follow-through on safety strategies in everyday life. The seven-week series will consist of education, group discussions, physical exercises and guest speakers. The classes will be taught by Kristie McWhorter, SCS Fitness Manager, and Heather Senn, Fitness Assistant, who are certified group leaders for the Stepping On Falls Prevention Program.

# SCSCAI Strategic Plan, Part I: A Vision for Landscape and Golf Maintenance

(These stories are part of a series on a community strategic plan presented by SCSCAI's Executive Director Paul Henderson to the Board of Directors in July. Coverage of other department plans will be featured on suncitylink.com and in future issues of the Link. All meetings are open to residents. Check suncitylink.com or scscai.com for meeting dates and times.)

How to deal with deferred maintenance dominated the first day of SCSCAI Executive Director Paul Henderson's presentation to the Board of Directors over a two-day strategic planning session.

According to Paul, the meetings were designed to outline a one- to two-year vision for Sun City and pull together a BOD-approved plan that would become the strategy for the staff to accomplish. The presentation began as the current strategic plan nears its completion.

"These items are designed to promote pride in ownership among our resident owners and maximize return on investment," said Paul as he presented slides that prompted a review of "Where Are We Now," "Where Do We Want to Be" and "How Do We Get There."

In assessing "Where Are We Now," many BOD members agreed that deferred maintenance projects have earned their way to the top of the community's to-do list.

"Some buildings are not as neat and clean as they should be," said Paul. "The problem is deferred maintenance and we need to stop the deferred maintenance and get to working on things like building landscape, streetscapes and golf peripheral maintenance."

In the landscape and golf maintenance departments, seemingly smaller projects have been moved to the back burner over the last three years as crews have been reassigned to take care of compelling needs like turf reduction and resulting capital projects. While those jobs have netted the Association savings in water and its monthly utility bill, the progress has dead-ended work on several fronts. Add to that a reduction in full-time labor and a shift to seasonal and part-time workers and the departments are finding themselves in a hole that's hard to get out of. To keep up with the work, the Association has outsourced jobs like the recent cleanup of Thomas Ryan at Lake Mead Boulevard. But while the cleanup part of the job went well, Landscape Manager Louis Darling pointed to peripheral items that

didn't, namely broken irrigation lines and sprinkler heads, as well as displaced rock that his crew had to go in and fix after the paid contractors had left.

To BOD Treasurer Ken Resnik's question, "Do contractors make life easier?" the reply would seem to straddle the fence.

When talking about deferred maintenance, the topic is, of course, money. Projects get deferred because there is not enough money or manpower to do everything that needs to be accomplished. When that happens enough times wear and tear begins to show its age.

For some Board members, the topic transitioned naturally into a discussion on the current annual assessment, with several directors agreeing to an evaluation of the \$107-a-month fee that has remained the same for four straight years.

In an attempt to avoid a cycle of funding outsourced catchup projects, Paul said, "I think we need more staff." The statement resonated strongly with several Board members who agreed that some of the points brought up during the meeting will need to be addressed this year despite not being included in the 2017 budget.

# SCSCAI Strategic Plan, Part II: A Vision for Food & Beverage

Controlling costs, gaming and reviewing the current business plan for Tavern at the Falls and The Summit were top topics during the second of three department strategic planning sessions. The meeting was presented by SCSCAI Executive Director Paul Henderson and Food & Beverage Manager Barbi Meinel to the Board of Directors. The meeting was open to residents.

Using the current strategic plan as a guide, Paul began by reporting that "Restaurant business activity is increasing, jumping from \$200 to \$3,000 a week two years ago to \$2,000 to \$3,000 a week today at Tavern," he said. At The Summit, receipts have improved to nearly \$500 a week while rental revenue has remained static at around \$30,000 a year for the last three years.

Paul said that while The Summit operates mainly as a snack bar for golfers, the room has welcomed residents during successful events such as the recent Fourth of July BBQ. Going forward, Barbi added that she would like to plan more events for residents in the room that enjoys one of the valley's best views of the Las Vegas skyline. Last month she welcomed Sanders Family Winery in Pahrump to present a wine tasting event and this month she is looking forward to scheduling a tiki lounge night on September 28. As far as The Summit goes, Barbi said that consistency with hours has been a problem and that oftentimes the business plan has seem muddled.

"Do we want to focus on golfers or attracting outside rentals?" she asked.

For BOD member Ken Caroccia, the subject of targeting corporate rentals to occupy daytime hours and social events for residents after 5 p.m. is an idea he'd like to explore. While BOD Secretary Ellen Bachman likes the idea of The Summit getting outside use, she wanted to be clear about expressing her opinion that the room is an amenity for residents and clubs should be considered in whatever plan materializes for the room.

Switching gears from The Summit but staying on the topic of rentals, BOD member Jim Akers said he'd like to see the dining room at the Tavern expanded and the kitchen redesigned to offer something more than hamburgers. His idea would increase the current seating area from 60 to 120 or so with the intention of attracting more golf tournaments (a full golf tournament is composed of 144 players).

"Spend the dollars and go straight out from the dining room to the pond," Jim said. Such a renovation would create a tunnel for the cart path below. Adding to the idea, Paul said that he's considered such a buildout and could see taking either one-third of the pond to create additional parking spaces or look to a valet service.

When not booked with a golf tournament, Barbi said, "Right now I'd like to utilize my talents as a chef to work on the menu and create a full-service, casual dining experience at the Tavern."

One of the last items addressed concerned the subject of gaming.

Paul reminded the Board that the restriction on gaming machines in Sun City as outlined in the Howard Hughes Corporation charter will expire in 2018.

"If we want to consider gaming then we're going to need to start thinking about it now," he said, adding that the application process to install gaming machines at Tavern and/or The Summit is at least a year-long process. And because you can't have a discussion on gaming in Sun City without talking about the Association's tenant, Five Star Tavern, Paul said that it might be a good idea to get some feedback from residents on what they think of the restaurant that has been operating in the community for nearly three years.

According to Paul, Five Star's owner has committed to renewing his lease for Five Star Tavern and is interested in discussing additional gaming opportunities in Sun City.

The red poles, like the flashing lights placed atop many of Sun City's STOP signs, are intended to increase visibility and safety. The red sign sleeves are fully reflective for better nighttime viewing. All drivers are required to stop at STOP signs. It is the LAW. In the city of Las Vegas, failure to stop at a STOP sign can result in a ticket up to \$395.

#### Do You Know?

Sun City Allows Three Types of Sales

Do you know there are three types of sales that are permitted from a Sun City residence? Each type of sale is clearly defined in our Sun City Summerlin Rules and Regulations. They are: Sun City area garage sales, moving sales and estate sales. Landlords are encouraged to remind tenants of regulations regarding these three distinct types of sales.

A recent decision by the Sun City Summerlin Board of Directors was made to discontinue the previous spring Sun City Garage Sale at the Mountain Shadows parking lot. In its stead, home garage sales will now be permitted in the spring as well as the fall. Residents may conduct garage sales at their homes on days designated by the Association. There will be two weekends this fall (October 8-9 and 15-16) and two weekends next spring (April 15-16 and 22-23) when home garage sales will be permitted. Garage sales at any other time are in violation of our Sun City Rules and Regulations, and those conducting sales on un-authorized days may be subject to a penalty. (Note: The City of Las Vegas Code permits only two garage sales at a residence per calendar year.)

A moving sale is considered anything where a resident moves out of Sun City, while an estate sale is defined as a sale that follows a death in the immediate household. A permit is required for each sale.

Permits for moving and estate sales must be obtained prior to the event from the Community Standards office located in the craft/patio area of the Mountain Shadows Community Center. These sales are limited to two days only, with the days selected by those conducting the sale. The validated permit for the moving or estate sale must be displayed for all to see next to the house number. Failure to obtain a permit for such sales could result in a penalty.

All properly conducted moving and estate sales are posted on the Link website, at suncitylink.com, on Thursday afternoon. Thursday postings advertise sales scheduled for the upcoming weekend.

#### If It's Too Hot for You, It's Too Hot for Your Dog

Please take note of the high temperatures as you contemplate a walk with your pet. It doesn't take long for a dog to overheat in temperatures over 100

degrees. If your dog is used to a daily walk, start out early in the morning or after the sun has set. Always carry fresh water for your dog and keep the walks short — 10— to 15-minute walks are good for summer. Be sure to check your dog's paws for any blistering following a walk and be aware of the symptoms for heat exhaustion. Some include excessive panting, limping, lethargy, salivation, bloody diarrhea, bloodshot eyes, vomiting and constantly laying down. If you think your dog is overheated, cool it with a cool towel on its abdomen, give it water and rest. Be alert and take your dog to the vet if you fear it's having a heat stroke.



#### The Art of Tree Removal

Sun City Summerlin has a tree policy that can be accessed online at www.scscai.com under Policies and Procedures. The policy concerns any tree located in the landscape common area or on any one of the three community golf courses.

Trees are planted throughout the golf courses and serve many purposes. On the golf course, trees can provide safety and protection from errant golf shots. Trees also provide shade and beauty for our residents, golfers and the wildlife we enjoy here in Sun City

Summerlin. Trees help with cooling and cleaning our air, and they are a benefit for our environment. That said, situations can arise when it is discovered that a particular location may not be the best spot for a tree. For example, sometimes the shade a tree provides may be detrimental to Bermuda grass growth. In this case, the tree/trees are removed.

Over the years, the golf courses have made many changes in the landscape. When originally planted, most of the trees were located in grassy areas where they received all the water they wanted because they were being watered with the grass. Most recently, Sun City has participated in many turf conversions that have resulted in very different watering schedules for some trees. The new drip-style irrigation has left some trees struggling. My staff recently removed four pine trees at Palm Valley No. 5 tee location. Golfers were quite upset as these trees provided shade when they waited for the group ahead to continue their golf game. However, the trees were not in good condition and needed to be removed. We replaced the pines with three multi-stem Palo Verde desert museum trees. These trees grow very well in Las Vegas and will grow at a fast rate, providing shade again as quick as possible. The fourth tree was not replaced. We plan to finish the area with landscape plants to help beautify the location.

When requests for tree removals come in for the golf course, please understand that there are many factors we must consider before making the decision to take out a tree. The tree may not block golf balls for you, but it very well could be what is saving your neighbor.

# ARCHITECTU Architectural Review Committee

Development Standards: Roadmap to Keeping Sun City Beautiful

his article is about understanding the Development Standards of SCSCAI, and how it works within our Architectural Review Committee. Our staff and committee volunteers work continually to help Sun City Summerlin maintain high standards of appearance and thus upkeep our property values. As Committee volunteers we all reside in Sun City, and we all live by the same community rules as you do.

Each year ARC processes and inspects hundreds of applications for a variety of homeowner requests to alter, add to and maintain their homes and landscaping. We do our best to accommodate every request and assist residents through the process. Sometimes, though, what the resident wants to do is clearly outside of our guideline and we simply cannot approve.

We rely on a comprehensive list of Development Standards or basic architectural rules and regulations that we are to abide by. These are standards set many years ago when the community was founded, and they were put in place to protect our property value and enhance our Sun City living experience.

Sun City Development Standards is not something that most folks deal with every day. The Development Standards is a 25-page document that isn't necessarily meant for your reading enjoyment. It is, however, the guideline used by ARC.

Our experience in working with neighbors over time has taught us that it might be worthwhile to remind residents that we have an obligation to follow the architectural and landscaping rules – The Development Standards. By checking out these guidelines before starting an unapproved outdoor project, a resident may find that he/she has saved a lot of headache and/or a financial investment. Never assume that it is OK to begin altering your outdoor space without first checking the Development Standards.

Security Patrol managers are committed to treat members with respect and professionalism, as well as provide them with a safe and comfortable work environment. A new volunteer may choose to train as a Patrol car driver, a dispatcher at headquarters, or serve in one of our three information centers at community entrances.

Any resident with a valid SCSCAI membership card is welcome to inquire about joining the Security Patrol. A patrol driver must have a valid Nevada driver's license.
