s you already may have heard – Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc., (SCSCAI) is scheduled to end on June 15, 2039. As a result, SCSCAI's Board of Directors is seeking to amend its Articles of Incorporation so that our corporation will "live" in perpetuity. We will be seeking a vote of our members to convert the Association from a nonprofit cooperative corporation without stock under NRS 81, to a non-profit corporation formed under NRS 82 – this ballot will come to you with your April Link.

If we don't make this adjustment in our corporate status before 2039 we will have a catastrophic loss of property and property values. If SCSCAI were to cease to exist as a corporation we would lose all of our assets, including all of our meeting facilities, club workshops, fitness centers and pools, golf courses, etc. This loss of property would have a devastating impact on all of our residential property values. We must stop this from happening – so when the ballot to vote on the change of our corporate status comes to you – with your April Link – please vote to approve the change and return your ballot.

In addition, the Nevada State Legislature has imposed a tax on all non-profit Article 81 corporations, including our Association. This tax will cost us at least \$15,000 per year. We can avoid this tax by simply amending our corporate status to a non-profit NRS 82 corporation. Neither the Association nor its Board of Directors will gain or lose any authority due to this amendment. We can avoid problems in the future by amending the life of the corporation to perpetual rather than the 50-year life we currently have.

These changes have been vetted and recommended by our legal counsel, our finance director and unanimously approved by the Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc., Board of Directors.

Please vote to approve the conversion of our corporation this April. The money and value you will be protecting is your own.



joined the new, exciting world of telecommunications.



The password is Welcome! Please note that the password is case sensitive and you must type in the exclamation point. After that, log-in requires confirmation of Sun



City Summerlin's terms. It's simply a button that you will need to press to accept. If you should find a dead spot, let us know and we will address it. Keep in mind that these Wi-Fi facilities were installed to make it easier for residents to communicate and to keep in touch with the world; they are not meant to download lengthy files such as books or videos.

### PREPARED Community Preparedness Committee

Sun City BEATNIKS, Watchful Walkers Who Monitor Their Neighborhood Beats

ike members of Sun City's K9 Corps who walk with their dogs while increasing the visibility of the Security Patrol, residents who exercise by walking for their health frequently walk familiar routes. In doing so, they socialize with neighbors along the way and have developed an awareness of what should be typical activity in those neighborhoods. Similar to the K9 Corps, health walkers who cover a routine beat also can stay alert for trouble signs. Sun City's K9 Corps has surpassed Neighborhood Watch Committee expectations.



Members will be issued tie-dye wristbands to identify themselves as BEATNIKS At the end of January, 108 civic-minded pet owners were monitoring their neighborhoods. Pat Ross, a Friday night Security Patrol dispatcher, confirmed that the dog-walkers are reporting a variety of problems, and "They are identifying themselves when they call us (as K9 Corps)," Pat said. Watch Commander Silvia LaMay added, "We're getting a lot of calls from the K9 walkers, especially to tell us about open garage doors at night."

At a recent Neighborhood Watch Committee meeting, a resident explained how he wanted to join the K9 Corps, but had a problem: "I don't have a dog," he said. "I do walk, every day, for my heart and I would like to join the program. Do I have to get a dog?"

The response from committee members informed the resident that he had just initiated the groundwork for Sun City's Beatniks – dogless residents who walk just for the health of it.

"I always see residents walking for their own health and enjoyment in our community. Walking is the best exercise for your heart and now it also can be the best exercise for keeping our community safer," said Kristie McWhorter, Sun City's fitness manager. "Walking for exercise will strengthen your heart, and walking with another purpose, such as helping to keep our community safe, just makes your heart so much stronger."

The rules are pretty much the same as the K9 Corps, excluding the requirement to carry a plastic waste bag. If you see something, say something. It's still that easy to do.

Although the focus is on crime prevention, the true premise is about neighbors helping neighbors. While walking their beats, health-concerned Beatniks will notice newspapers, advertisements or packages collecting in driveways, or empty trash containers that may not have been returned to a garage. Other indications, like lights that have not been switched off in the morning, or bulbs that are not lit after dark, could point to clues that something is amiss at a home.

Depending on the incident, Sun City's walking Beatniks will call Security Patrol, 254-2303, or if they spot an emergency situation, they may take it upon themselves to dial 911. They are NEVER to confront suspicious persons. Walkers should carry a cell phone to report incidents and might want to have a pen and paper to note an address, a license plate number or a car's description.

If you've been making excuses not to exercise for your own bene. t, this is your chance to strengthen your resolve, while also making an important contribution to your community. ## COMMUNITY STANDARDS

**Mission Statement:** The mission of the Community Standards Department is to maintain, preserve, enhance and protect the property values and assets of Sun City

Summerlin. Working closely with two standing committees, the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) and Deed Restrictions Hearing Committee (DRHC), the assignment is carried out with respect to and

concern for Sun City's property owners. Kate Carroll manages Community Standards; Barbara Davidson is the department's administrative assistant.

It is Community Standards' responsibility to review and investigate property violation reports, maintain

correspondence and records, and act as the advocate for the Association at deed restriction hearings. Community Standards conducts necessary property inspections, notifies property owners of noncompliance and requires them to remedy violations.

The Architectural Review Committee has approval authority for all new construction, including changes to the exteriors of structures and landscape. The ARC exercises judgment to the end that exterior property changes conform to and complement existing surroundings. Plans for such changes are submitted to the Community Standards office in application form for review by the ARC committee.

Application Process: Any proposed exterior modifica-


tion to a property must be submitted to the Community Standards Department for ARC review and approval. Alteration plans will be reviewed for compliance to the requirements of the Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs), or

Restrictions (CC&Rs), or simply the development standards guideline. Each request must be submitted on an ARC application form prior to the commencement of any work. The form is available in Community Standards office. According to Barbara Davidson, "If the property to be modified is in a

sub-association, the president of that Association must indicate sub-association approval by signing the application before the resident submits it to Community Standards."

Authorization can take up to a week.

ARC members conduct necessary inspections and if it is determined that work completed on a property is not in compliance with development standards, the Office of Community Standards notifies the applicant of noncompliance and requires the owner to correct the effort. "We will gladly work with property owners to help them resolve a problem within a reasonable amount of time," Kate said.

Owners who fail to conform to a Community Standards notice of noncompliance will be requested to appear before a panel of the DRHC, whose members will conduct a hearing on the matter. DRHC members will render a decision, and if their verdict is against the property owner, the committee will impose applicable fines.

Maintaining Sun City's standards for development ensures that new improvements will not negatively impact the value, use or enjoyment of neighboring properties and will contribute to the overall attractive-



ness of the community. The ARC also is charged with achieving design compatibility between abutting properties, as well as avoiding unsightly views.

Sun City's Development Standards includes written guidelines defining design, size, location, structure, color and other relevant criteria for exterior property improvements, including landscape. When considering property repainting, there are 56 ARC-approved color combination schemes, using 39 acceptable paint colors. It is noteworthy that pink no longer is one of the acceptable colors.

"Frequently, I suggest that property owners drive around the community to look for paint colors that appeal to them," explained Kate. "If they see colors that they especially like, all we need is the property's address to identify the colors on that house," added Barbara. Then, they can plan their home's primary color, as well as the color of the garage door and trim colors that they want on their freshly repainted home.

New Business: A resident has requested that at least one outdoor pool remain open for an additional month each year. After discussion, it was decided that Brandon Balek, building maintenance supervisor, and Kristie McWhorter, SCSCAI fitness manager, will do research as to how much more money it would cost to keep one outdoor pool open past the now-November I closing date.

#### **Team Report:**

- Allan Bell did a drive-through with Louis Darling, SCSCAI landscape manager, and reported that they will re-inspect in March or April when plantings bloom and turn green again.
- John Ankrapp, motor officer for CAP, reported that he reviewed five old trucks and two cars and gave his recommendations to Dennis McGrew, SCSCAI building maintenance manager, and Louis Darling. John's report recommended that the rolling stock cited for replacement be done.
- Marise Mizel, from the Desert Vista inspection team, reported that the inspection of the community center was completed, and that the Friendship Tree will be cleaned around the bottom.
- Rhoda Ring reported that 150 chairs need to be redone at The Summit.

### Staff Update:

Brandon Balek reported that Request for Proposals have been sent out for the pool and spadecks at Mountain Shadows and the decks and outdoor pool re-plaster at Desert Vista. Brandon also met with contractors to construct the shade cover at Mountain Shadows' outdoor pool, with Louis Darling's crew removing pine trees and placing pavers and planters ahead of construction.

The work is targeted to be done before the pool opens on April 1.

At Sun Shadows, the two sun shades that were approved by ARC and CAP have been installed at the bocci ball courts at Sun Shadows.

Brian Bagwell, golf course maintenance general manager, reported that turf removal is done at Highland Falls and Palm Valley; rock work should be completed soon.

Paul Henderson will look into putting a sign at the Highland Falls parking area for cart service to assist people getting up to the facility.

Kristie McWhorter reported the same color scheme as Mountain Shadows will be used at the pool areas at Desert Vista and the Pinnacle. Old furniture will be sold to residents. The short fences on the pickle ball courts will have plastic covers put on for safety.

#### **Special Projects:**

Ken Resnik reported that the project at Mountain Shadows is on track. Highland Falls has a Request for Proposal outstanding, and construction should be scheduled for July and August when golf play is slow. Ken then reminded everyone to vote yes on Article 81-82, and to let all our neighbors know how important this ballot item is.

Paul Henderson handed out a drawing of a new golf cart shed planned to accommodate an additional 20 golf carts to be constructed at Eagle Crest. After discussion, a motion was made to recommend the plan to the Board of Directors to construct a 20-foot-by-40-foot stand-alone golf cart storage shed, not to exceed \$50,000. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

### 'Tis the Season to Walk

Walking will improve your cardiovascular fitness, muscle strength, balance, coordination and metabolism.

arch is one of the best months to get outside and start walking! The weather is perfect – not too cold and not too hot. Plus, walking is one of the easiest, safest and most inexpensive types of physical activity. It's also relaxing and at the same time invigorating. It requires little athletic skill and does not need any special equipment other than sturdy, comfortable shoes. Walking is fun and natural – good for your mind and self-esteem.

As always, consult with your physician before beginning an exercise program. For those with a long history of inactivity, problems with obesity, or who just don't like strenuous activity, walking is an excellent way to begin an exercise program. You can start slowly then increase your speed and maintain a steady pace.

Walking will improve your cardiovascular fitness, muscle strength, balance, coordination and metabolism. Walking gets the heart beating faster to transport oxygen-rich blood from the lungs to the muscles. The heart and lungs grow

more efficient with a regular walking regimen, reducing blood pressure. Walking is even a central element of medical rehabilitation. Recovery from many ailments, including a heart attack, is facilitated by a regular walking regimen. Walking also will improve your lower body muscle strength and balance.

When you're ready to begin, the best way to start is to walk 10-20 uninterrupted minutes at least three times a week. Walk at a comfortable pace, slowing down if you find yourself breathing too heavily. Don't tire yourself. If 20 minutes is too much, cut back to 10 or 15 minutes. You can gradually increase your time and pace as your body adapts to the exercise.

Don't forget to drink lots of water and cool down after exercise by slowing down your pace. Always remember to stretch your muscles.

A great way to start walking is to join us on Saturday, March 25, for our Second Annual Walk Into Spring 5K and 1 Mile Walk. For more information, see page 23.

### Charli's Corner

How to Use the Treadmill to Get the Best Results

on't Use Hand Weights. Using hand weights while walking on the treadmill is NEVER a good idea. Cardio training is to keep your heart and lungs strong, as well as burn calories. Lifting weights while walking diminishes your cardio capacity and is unsafe for you and others around you if you happen to slip or trip. You're not able to do a full range of motion, making the exercise ineffective for building muscles. Keep your cardio training focused on cardio and weights in the weight room.

Use Proper Posture. Holding on to the top of the treadmill prevents your improvement in balance and coordination, and creates poor posture. Swinging your arms helps with balance and increases your cardiovascular fitness. Walking without holding on to the handrails will burn 20 percent more calories. Slow the treadmill down and/or lower your incline so that you can swing your arms naturally as if you were walking outside. As you feel more comfortable, increase your speed or incline.

Dr. John Whyte, M.D., M.PH. and chief medical expert for the Discovery Channel, says, "Holding on is horrible for good posture, and developing your core. It causes problems with your spinal alignment, weakening your lower back muscles. Rather, walking naturally on the treadmill with arms at sides will help to create better balance."

Use the side rails or front handles if you use a walker, or to momentarily hold on while changing your program, sipping water or taking your heart rate.



Treadmills Move Us Forward. Walking backwards or sideways on the treadmill may seem like a wonderful way to challenge yourself. It's also a great way to trip, fall and hurt yourself and others. Plus, it is NOT allowed. However, the elliptical machine is designed to be used in a forward and backward motion, allowing you to work your gluts and hamstrings more efficiently than forward walking can. To train your hips, and outer and inner thighs, use the cable machine to do weighted side leg lifts. You will gain more strength in your hips, glutes, core, and outer and inner thighs.

To learn how to use the elliptical or the cable machine for new exercises, sign up for an Equipment Orientation class. Check with your Fitness Monitor for times and dates.


Guests of the day enjoyed listening to InBee and Coach McCall tell stories of their times together playing golf and competing for the Nevada

### STRATEGIC PLAN CARVES OUT A DEPARTMENT OUTLINE

(EDITOR'S NOTE: THIS STORY COVERS THE EVENTS OF THE SECOND FOOD & BEVERAGE STRATEGIC PLANNING MEETING. FOLLOWING THAT WORKSHOP, AN OFFICIAL F&B PLAN WAS DRAFTED AND PLACED ON THE FEBRUARY 7 BOD AGENDA. DURING THAT MEETING, THE BOARD VOTED TO TABLE THE ITEM TO A FUTURE AGENDA. DETAILS OF THE PLAN MAY BE VIEWED ONLINE ATSCSCAI.COM.)

Roughly 20 residents turned out for a working session of SCSCAI's Board of Directors on the topic of Sun City's Food and Beverage Department. The workshop, which took place in mid-January, marked the second time the Board had met to develop a strategic plan for the Food & Beverage Department. The meeting was called to order by SCSCAI Executive Director Paul Henderson.

Points on the agenda included:

- How to best accommodate golf tournaments at Highland Falls
- Gaming
- Catering

On the subject of golf tournaments, Paul explained there are plans in the works to go out for bid on projects that will enclose the patio at Highland Falls and expand the Tavern's dining room in an effort to accommodate 144 seats (the size of a full-size golf tournament). In addition, the current kitchen layout will be evaluated and appliances updated, and there was a new idea proposed to build an outdoor kitchen on the lower patio at a cost of around \$20,000.

"The major objectives are to support golf course patrons, provide a food and beverage amenity for residents and a source of revenue to offset the cost of providing the amenity," Paul said.

A third plan under consideration at Highland Falls targets expanding the parking area by paving over the drainage culvert at the east end of the parking lot. Paul said that a plan for the parking lot would be submitted to an engineering architect for feasibility and cost. According to Paul, adding more spaces to the lot should

help the Golf Department attract more tournaments.

The proposed work at Highland Falls would take place in June, July or August in an effort to limit the disturbance to golf play.

As the discussion transitioned into the actual work needed to be done at Highland Falls, ie: potentially reconfiguring the kitchen layout or remodeling the bar area, the subject turned to gaming.

As residents may be aware, the restriction on gaming in Sun City expires in 2018.

"I don't want to come across as the advocate for gaming, but I believe adding gaming will bring us revenue," said Paul. "The restaurant will be more successful with gaming."

While Sun City has not seen an official proposal from its current gaming tenant, 5 Star Tavern at the Palm Valley Golf Course, Paul said that the owner of that business has expressed an interest in bidding on a gaming route if the Board decides to go in that direction.

Overwhelmingly, the Board expressed a tepid interest in gaming and agreed that it did not want to enter into competition with 5 Star Tavern.

The Summit was next on the agenda. Paul began the session by saying that before anything can be done at that venue he needs clear direction from the Board as to whether they seek a commercial enterprise or a resident amenity.

One by one, Board members agreed to reserve The Summit for resident use.

"I do not support using it as a profit center," said Ellen Bachman.

"I agree with Ellen, but only with a lengthy commitment," said Karl Wiedemann, who explained how ideas have come and gone at The Summit with insufficient time allotted for them to succeed.

Following a discussion that welcomed resident input, Paul wrapped up the meeting with a reminder that clubs can reserve The Summit for free for their events; the snack bar will remain open to service golfers; a policy needs to be established for when the room isn't being used; and, most importantly, SCSCAI needs to create a master calendar that schedules the main room on a first-come, first-served basis.

### Do You Know? Information for Renters



Do you know that as a renter in Sun City Summerlin it may be possible to purchase an activity/ID card that grants access to the amenities Sun City Summerlin has to offer? These include the use of all three fitness centers, the tennis courts, racquetball court, as well as indoor swimming pools and spas.

In order for a renter to obtain an activity card, he/she must take a copy of the lease agreement to the Administration office as proof of his/her residency. Once that is done, the renter may purchase an activity card for \$100, which is valid for 12 months. If there are two renters residing in a home, each must pay the \$100 fee to obtain an activity card. For those who rent on a month-to-month basis or for a period shorter than a year, they must continue to show proof of their lease each time it is renewed. Failure to do so will result in suspension of the card's privileges.

Each household is entitled to 24 guest passes per year, and guests must be checked in by the activity-card holder. Additional guest passes after the original 24 may be purchased at \$5 each for adults; \$2 each for those 18 and under who must be accompanied by adult.

### Watch Commanders

un City Summerlin Security Patrol functions on four levels: Dispatchers, which you read about in an earlier edition of the Link; drivers; Information Center officers; and watch commanders. Watch commanders supervise all disciplines during their 12-hour watch. The shift schedules are 11:30 p.m. to 11:30 a.m. (the next day), and 11:30 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. The assistant chief monitors them.

mander takes information about the vehicle and photos of damage done to the property. Then, the appropriate forms are filled out and sent to the Association. When Metro police is involved, the watch commander obtains an incident number from the Metro officer and logs the information.

A report from a patrol driver or call from a neighbor about a suspicious situation is imme-

diately forwarded to the watch commander. Upon arriving at the location, the watch commander assess the situation and, if necessary, contacts Metro police. Many times, the situation is resolved by talking with a resident or neighbor.

During a vacation house check, a patrol driver may see something suspicious about

the house. Perhaps a screen door is opened or a window is slightly opened and was not reported earlier. The driver will radio the dispatcher and the dispatcher will alert the watch commander who then goes to the residence and checks the situation attempting to resolve the problem. Most often a phone call to the resident's emergency contact resolves the problem.

In addition to their regular duties, watch commanders will act as dispatchers or drivers if a shift is short of personnel. Watch commanders must qualify as a dispatcher and a driver. Therefore, candidates for watch commander must complete both dispatcher and driver training programs.

The job of watch commander is vital to the success of your Security Patrol. Watch commanders are your friends and neighbors who care about the health and safety of their community. If you are interested in joining your Security Patrol, please phone Security base at 254-2303.

Watch commanders need to have at least 500 hours and two years of service as either a driver or dispatcher. Training begins with qualifying in the missing discipline i.e. driver or/dispatcher. Once that requirement is achieved, then training as watch commander begins. The experience gained from both disciplines gives a watch commander a greater depth of knowledge, allowing them to handle problems as they arise; and ability to restore calm to residents when there is an emergency.

When an accident occurs on Sun City property, a call for help concerning a neighbor or parent, the watch commander receives the calls and investigates. Keeping in radio contact with the dispatcher, the watch commander will visit the resident or neighbor inquiring if help is needed. If the resident needs health care, the watch commander will call Metro at 311 for a welfare check. For a safety problem, the watch Commander will call the appropriate service, such as the gas company for gas leaks.

At the scene of an automobile accident that involves Sun City property, the watch com-



The show will be held at Desert Vista, inside the ball-room, and will be open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. each day.


