President PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

ood day to all Sun City Summerlin residents, especially all our newcomers who are obviously astute decision makers since you chose to join our community. Welcome!

This is my first President's Message since the Board selected me as Board President (not counting my fill-in for Joe O'Connell last month) and I first want to congratulate the folks you elected to the Board in the election: Ken Resnik, Jim Akers, Gerry Sokolski and Dick Clark. For Gerry and Dick, welcome to the Board. I hope you enjoy the experience, and I know you will work like all Board members do to keep SCSCAI the best homeowners' association (HOA) anywhere.

So, what can we all do to keep our association looking great?

- 1. As I said last month, obliterate the weeds! Between the rain and the warmer weather, the weeds and grasses are growing, well, like weeds. Just before writing this note, I spent an hour attacking weeds, especially dandelions. They are everywhere. If there is a space between the sidewalk and a wall on your property, that space is probably yours and you must maintain it. There are a very few exceptions, mainly on a busy street like Thomas Ryan. If not sure, call Community Standards at 702-966-1411.
- 2. Maintain your mailbox. If you have not already done so, your mailbox very likely needs painting or replacement, as does the mailbox post. We have restrictions on mailboxes and posts, so call Community Standards before doing anything.
 - 3. We do not have a "prize patrol" that drives around looking for things needing repair. We rely on you to let us know if there is something needing fixing. See a leaking faucet, let us know. Someone has an issue on their property such as a whole bunch of weeds, let us know. A tree branch is blocking a stop sign, let us know. If you see something, say something.
 - 4. As of March 1, you must have acted to keep your trash cans out of sight. If you have not already done so, call Community Standards on alternatives.

As a last thought, let's all be good neighbors and help each other when someone needs help. If a neighbor has trouble moving their trash can to the curb, help them out and move their trash cans when you do yours. Remember, you might need help some day.

HOW EVERYTHING WENT RIGHT FOR SMASH BROADWAY COMEDY, 'THE PLAY THAT GOES WRONG'

Hilarious Disasters Abound in Broadway Comedy, 'The Play That Goes Wrong'

If ever there was truth in advertising, it's the hit British comedy and Broadway smash, "The Play That Goes Wrong," says producer Kevin McCollum.

McCollum ("Rent," "Avenue Q") teamed up with famed writerproducer J.J. Abrams ("Star Wars," "Star Trek," "Lost") to bring this international hit about a hilariously disastrous production of a murder mystery to the U.S.

Abrams saw the show in London, when he took a day off from filming "Star Wars: The Force Awakens."

"I was amazed by the whole construction of it," he says. "The way it was put together. The rhythm of it. The cleverness. The brilliance of the performers."

BRINGING BRITISH COMEDY TO THE STAGE

The show is the brainchild of Jonathan Sayer, Henry Shields and Henry Lewis.

Fans of British comedy, from silent films to "Mr. Bean," they drew upon their own theater-disaster stories to craft a script filled with outrageous, slapstick calamities, Sayer says.

"There's always a little bit of some kind of experience we've had, that informs some of the moments," he explains. "But we take it to a much, much more excruciating place."

Word of mouth propelled the show to the Trafalgar Studios in the West End, where the show acquired producers to take it on tour in the United Kingdom.

A HILARIOUSLY CATASTROPHIC SET

The three writer-actors then teamed up with set designer Nigel Hook's to create even more catastrophes. Hook's two-level set, which won a 2017 Tony Award, provides a cascading series of malfunctions. The result is, "We get a laugh at least every six or seven seconds," Shields says.

This new-and-improved version opened at the Duchess Theatre on the West End in 2014, where it captured the Olivier award for Best New Comedy and is still running.

"The Play That Goes Wrong" is now the longest-running play on Broadway, and has been produced in cities across the globe.

"Finding something that is such a pure, unadulterated, hysterically funny and bighearted piece of entertainment is no small thing," Abrams says. "It's about remembering that one of the great reasons we are alive is to come together and to laugh."

rtist at work" signs are appearing in and around our Sun City Summerlin, indicating a student artist from the Las Vegas Academy of the Arts is changing an ugly utility box into a beautiful artwork to be enjoyed by all. These students are being mentored by several of our Sun City Summerlin artists.

Sun City Summerlin resident and a Las Vegas Arts Commissioner, Sandy Karpel, in cooperation with the City of Las Vegas, is leading this student/mentor initiative. Seven student artists from this Clark County School District's elite magnet school have survived a very competitive selection process to be chosen to paint utility boxes in our area. Joining these

students, all in their senior year of study, are Sun City Art Club members and other Sun City artists acting as mentors. This cross-generational pairing appears to benefit all those involved.

Susan Neiry, Art Club member, is mentoring Alejandro Ponce. The two have collaborated on a design that reflects the desert in which we live. All the painting is being done by Alejandro. The location of the utility box is on the northeast corner of Sun City and Lake Mead boulevards. This particular utility box will depict two Sun City wildlife favorites, a quail and a gecko. In addition, on the Lake Mead facing panel, a big horn sheep is centered in the outline of the state of Nevada.

According to both Susan and Alejandro, what began as a partnership has developed into a friendship. Susan hopes to follow Alejandro's career as he plans to continue his art education after high school. Of Alejandro's talent, Susan said, "He is fabulous."

Natalie Delgado, art instructor at Las Vegas Academy of the Arts, said of the seven students paired with Sun City mentors, "Their first collaborative meeting was magical to witness. Each student had an assigned senior mentor or mentors and immediately everyone worked together discussing ideas and designs."

Painting of the utility boxes that control traffic signals is a city-wide project sponsored by the City of Las Vegas. Artwork

in other areas of the city has been completed by many professional artists. The student/mentor effort is unique to our Sun City area. In addition to the utility box at Sun City and Lake Mead, other nearby locations where artists and mentors are working are the Walgreen's corner of Cheyenne Avenue and Durango Boulevard; the northwest corner of Rampart and Del Webb boulevards; the southwest corner of Lake Mead Boulevard and Hills Center Drive; and the northeast corner of Anasazi Drive and Summerlin Parkway.

Sun City Summerlin residents are receiving the benefits of this wonderful program as the art work will remain in the community for all to enjoy.





Going Gray: Community Standards Approves New Paint Colors



ver the years, the Office of Community Standards has received requests to add to the Association's approved house paint colors. Most recently, the feedback has been for a choice of gray tones.

As a result, in November, the Architectural Review Committee approved six gray color schemes to present to the Board of Directors for approval. At the February 5 meeting, the Board agreed to add the new colors. Almost immediately, the Community Standards Office had residents coming in to apply to have their homes painted in the new colors. If you've been contemplating a change in your exterior painting, stop by Community Standards to take a look at the newly approved colors.

Every spring, Community Standards reminds residents of the following. Please be a good neighbor and address any general maintenance issues:

- How do your awnings look? Can they use some cleaning, repair or replacement? Maybe you just want to change to a new color. The approved color chart is available at the Community Standards Office at Mountain Shadows.
- Don't forget about your windows and screens.

- How about your mailbox post? It should be either black or white (depending on where you reside). If it is faded, rusted or any other color, it needs attention.
- Take a look at your wrought iron fencing. If it is faded or rusted, it should be repainted.

Landscaping Tips

- Treating your lawn with a pre-emergent won't eliminate all weeds from your property, but it will surely reduce them. If you live on a corner lot that is separated from the street by a wall, remember, you are responsible for the strip of landscaping in between.
- Are your trees encroaching into your neighbor's property? If so, be a good neighbor and trim the limbs back.
- How about those palm trees? All dead fronds should be removed.
- Don't forget to clean up pine needles and pine cones that collect on your property. They seem to have a way of migrating uninvited to your neighbors' property as well.





NPT Radio Operators: Ready When All Else Fails

n a crisis situation, the primary purpose of the Neighborhood Preparedness Team's HAM radio operators will be to communicate with Clark County's Emergency Operations Center. County Emergency Operations radio personnel will provide crucial data to Sun City's 24 amateur radio operators, who will relay that information to residents.

For example, in hot weather, an extended electrical power outage could become an emergency situation, leaving residents without radio, television, computer, telephone, air conditioning, lights, garage door opener, refrigerator, microwave oven and other electrical appliances. Oxygendependent individuals could become at risk. Essentially, communication would be nonexistent at a time when it is most needed, and anxious residents would want to understand what is causing the power disruption, how widespread it is and when power should be restored to them. In such situations, emergency management would priori-

tize a huge volume of cell phone traffic that could cause individual users to experience busy signals

on inoperable private cell phones. Eventually, power could fail in cell towers and phones would become use-

Amateur Radio Emergency Service and Radio Amateur Civil Emergency System personnel are licensed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and trained in emergency communications procedures. They drill frequently to maintain readiness. Members are certified in emergency man-

agement proto cols, and they receive training through Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)



There are 24 amateur HAM radio operators in Sun City who are tasked to communicate with Clark County during emergency situations.

courses. Nevada High Frequency and UHF/VHF emergency radio systems are compatible to communicate with the state capital in Carson City, as well as 75 federal and non-government agencies through the National Emergency System.

In a crisis, few things are more disturbing than not knowing what is happening. Affected residents have lots of questions. The HAM Radio team is tasked to establish and maintain information between Sun City and local government agencies. And because recovery begins when communication is reestablished, Sun City's Neighborhood Preparedness Team understands that a solid communications plan must be in place before a serious incident occurs.



Security Patrol Needs Your Help

un City Summerlin Security Patrol is privileged to serve our community. The Security Patrol base is open 24/7, and dispatchers and drivers are on duty in four-hour shifts. Last year, the Patrol responded to 2,796 open garage doors and 512 (911) emergency lights. Drivers performed 5,152 house checks for residents on vacation. The Information Centers (ICs) were visited by 2,268 interested people, and volunteers provided community maps and general information about Sun City Summerlin.

More challenging situations required residents' emergency contact information. Patrol Chief Sandy Lyons recalled a situation that occurred on a cold December day. A neighbor reported that a water pipe was broken at a residence and water was pouring out onto the street. The dispatcher immediately phoned the resident. The resident's voice mail answered and the dispatcher left a message. Next, the dispatcher phoned the emergency contact and, again, left a voice message. A Security Patrol driver was able to turn off the water at the sidewalk. Later in the day, the emergency contact phoned base to say that the resident was in the hospital and reported he would make the repairs. He thanked Security Patrol for contacting him.

Here's Where Security Patrol Needs Your Help

If you live in Sun City (some homeowners rent out their residences and don't reside in SCSCAI, so this information is

important to their renters), please make sure that the blue Emergency Contact form (available at Security Patrol headquarters) is filled out and returned to Security Patrol. The completed form also can

be returned to the Association's
Administration Office at Mountain

Shadows or any of the Patrol's
Information Centers. This
request is especially important
for new residents. Until Security
Patrol receives an updated Emergency Contact form, only the previous owner's name and contact
information remains on file. Please
note that at least one contact should
be local, preferably a Sun City resident. Out-of-state relatives cannot
close an open garage door or turn off
flooding water.

Address Lights

Please check to see if the light within the street address box located adjacent to your garage door is working. In case of an emergency, the address light helps Security Patrol drivers and emergency responders find your residence quickly. The light bulbs can be purchased at Pep Boys and Cheyenne Auto Parts. The lamp number is 1891. To get assistance with installation, call Sun City Charities/Volunteers at 702-254-5831.

Emergency 911 Light

The lamp light located outside your front door serves as an emergency 911 light. If it is blinking, a Security Patrol driver will respond and ring the doorbell and knock on the door to inquire if assistance is needed. The switch is tricky. To make sure that only the regular light is on, push the switch completely up; half-way results in a blinking light and a Security Patrol response.

Thank you to those residents who have provided their emergency contacts to Security Patrol so that we can serve you efficiently. Security Patrol is always looking for new members. Please phone base at 702-254-2303 to ask how you can volunteer.



JIM BROWN, IWO JIMA AWAITS

eventy-four years ago, more than 100,000 U.S. Marine, Army, Navy and Air Corps personnel fought the battle of Iwo Jima — a battle indelibly etched into our history by the iconic raising of our flag over Mount Suribachi. But those troops didn't just miraculously appear at Iwo Jima; they were transported there by men such as then future Sun City resident Jim Brown.

A native of Glendale, Calif., Jim was just 15 years old when WWII started. In the spring of 1944, a Navy recruiter came to Jim's high school looking for future sailors.

"I was 17 and had to get my parents to sign consent papers before enlisting," Jim said. "They signed and two days after graduation I reported into boot camp in San Diego. On my first day, the Chief Petty Officer of our barracks came in asking if anyone could type. I had been a journalism major in high school, so I raised my hand. No one else did and whether that was because they didn't know how to type or just knew better than to volunteer I'll never know. In any case, I became the company yeoman.

"Many of my high school classmates benefitted from my job. You see, I made out the duty rosters so my friends never pulled night duty and always managed to have duty when calisthenics were on the schedule."

After boot camp, Jim was assigned to radar school. Radar was new at that time so that was a choice assignment. After graduation, he was assigned to the newly commissioned USS Sevier, APA 233, an attack transport built in the Kaiser shipyards in Vancouver, Wash., near the Oregon border. The ship was commissioned on December 5, 1944. Her new crew, including Jim, was being assembled in Seattle. A skeleton crew, with Jim as radar operator, was sent to pick up the ship and bring it to Seattle.

"Coming through Puget Sound we encountered heavy fog and were forced to navigate by radar only. At this point, you have to remember, I'm a teenager just out of school and I'm the eyes of this brand new ship. So, when I got a return from what appeared to be a large ship ahead of us, it had my full attention! The bearing (heading) of that ship did not change, but the distance did. It was getting closer. In radar school we were taught that a constant bearing and decreasing range meant that a collision was imminent. I notified the bridge; nothing happened. The range kept decreasing. Once again I notified the bridge; nothing happened. Finally, on the third call, the skipper ordered full astern to stop the ship. A large yacht passed under our bow. Collision avoided. My reward was to be kept on radar watch until we arrived in Seattle. Missed my liberty, but was able to catch up on my sleep, "Jim said.

It was December 1944 and there was a war being waged in the Pacific and the Sevier was needed. On December 20, the Sevier left Seattle for San Pedro., Calif., to undertake about 30 days of ship shakedown and crew training. On February 6, she departed San Pedro for Hawaii, where she picked up men of the 4th Marine Division and joined a convoy headed to Iwo Jima. Once the Marines were off loaded, the Sevier moved off shore and waited for the battle to be won and the 4th Marines to be evacuated. In the interim, the Sevier functioned as a temporary hospital ship. On March 20, with the evacuated Marines on board, the Sevier returned to Hawaii. During the month of April, the Sevier underwent repairs to the main thrust bearing.

Quilt Club

Days for Girls Project Spreads Smiles, Dignity

What does Sun City Summerlin Quilt Club (SCSQC) and schoolgirls in a remote region of Africa have in common? They both want girls to stay in school.

Girls in Liberia often miss school and drop out because they do not have access to reliable feminine hygiene and health education. SCSQC members put their quilting techniques to work by sewing and assembling Days for Girls sustainable feminine hygiene kits. Club members donate fabric, soap, washcloths and other materials to make and assemble the kits. Most importantly, members donate their time and quilting skills to make high-quality sustainable kits. Recently, these kits were distributed to schoolgirls in the remote Kuwaa region of Liberia in Africa. Without a reliable way to deal with menstrual cycles, girls use whatever materials they can find, sometimes resorting to grass and leaves. This often leads to infections. Without a solution, girls often miss school and drop out. In the past year, SCSQC has sewn

and assembled more than 150 kits for schoolgirls in Liberia. Each kit is washable and reusable and can last three years. Our kits have provided 27,000 days that girls are able to stay in school. Each kit is distributed with important health education for the girls.

The Days for Girls program increases access to menstrual care and education that shatter stigmas and limitations for women and girls, helping to create dignity, health and opportunity for all. Worldwide, Days for Girls International has distributed more than 1 million kits in the past 10 years. In addition, SCSQC makes and distributes hundreds of quilts to local charities each year. These efforts are funded, in part, by the Club's annual raffle quilt and window sales.
