






Request for New A/C Units in Time to Tackle Summer Heat



Request for New A/C Units in Time to Tackle Summer Heat

he Common Area Properties Committee (CAP) met in March for a quick and productive session to review the findings of committee volunteers assigned to inspect community centers and golf courses, as well as to vote to forward three projects to Sun City's Board of Directors for final approval.

SCSCAI's Director of Facility Maintenance, Brandon Balek, updated CAP members on the proposed purchase of three make-up air conditioning units for Desert Vista and Sun Shadows, respectively. According to Brandon, the units were quoted to cost \$38,120 each, which falls below the proposed budgeted amount of \$40,000 per unit. As the total funds needed for the project have already been deducted from the projected Reserve Fund Year End Balance, and because the purchase of the three A/C units is within budget, Brandon asked that the Committee recommend the purchase of the items to the Board of Directors. CAP Chairman Dick Clark called for a vote and the Committee approved the request to be placed on the April BOD agenda.

Next up, Brandon reported on the condition of tennis court No. 3 at the Pinnacle Community Center. Brandon said that while his staff was able to repair several of the surface cracks last summer, further deterioration has occurred that necessitates a complete resurfacing. Brandon explained that there is a remaining balance of \$52,050 set aside for court resurfacing

projects and that the cost to

replace tennis court No. 3 would be \$8,900. He asked that the Committee forward the project to the Board of Directors for final approval. The CAP Chairman called for a vote and the Committee approved the request to be placed on the April BOD agenda.

Brandon continued to update the Committee regarding ongoing projects that included the upgrade to the Starbright Theatre's sound system. Equipment has been ordered and should be installed during the month of March. Brandon also shared news about the replacement of the racquetball court floor at the Mountain Shadows Fitness Center. That project, he said, should be wrapped up in June.

The agenda then moved to individual Committee members to discuss the results of their monthly inspections of Desert Vista, the Pinnacle, and Palm Valley and Highland Falls golf courses. Volunteer Marise Mizel was the only volunteer to alert Brandon to a wall in the ladies locker room at Desert Vista. According to Marise, the wall, which has had a previous problem, had been cleaned per a prior request, but there now seems to be a recurring rust spot and a chalky deposit on the wall. Brandon told the Committee he would assign a staff member to look into the issue.

If you are interested in volunteering on the CAP Committee, mark your calendar to attend the April 7 meeting and talk with the Chairman. All homeowners are welcome. The meeting starts at 9 a.m. inside the Committee Room at Desert Vista.

Welcoming Sun City's 2020-21

WHAT is the Board of Directors? The Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc.'s, Board of Directors is an unpaid voluntary team of nine property owners elected by the Association members to represent their interests and ensure that Association management acts on their behalf. The president of the board is the chairperson.

HOW Does the Board of Directors Work? Directors officiate monthly general membership board meetings. They evaluate management performance and tend to major community-interest decisions. Board Directors have staggered terms, meaning that they are not all up for re-election in the same year.

Does the Board of Directors Matter? The purpose of the Board of Directors is to make sure that Association management is acting in the best interests of property owners. Each Board member has a fiduciary duty to the Association's members.

BOARD OF

Committees, Liaisons, Resident Volunteers: Sun City's Board directors head up nine standing committees of the Association and one advisory committee. Each committee is dedicated to uniquely specific functions and decision-making processes. Board members rely on resident volunteers who make up the committees' working arms to reinforce the efficient flow of daily operations.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE (ARC)

It's a beautiful day in our neighborhood. ARC was established to maintain and enforce community standards set forth by the governing documents to provide a well-ordered visual community. Following the completion of an Association member's property alteration, the committee reviews the project to confirm that it complies with the application and development standards.

ARC meets on the second Thursday of the month, at 1 p.m., at Desert Vista

DEED RESTRICTION HEARING COMMITTEE

DRHC is delegated the authority to hear formal complaints brought by the Architectural Review Committee alleging homeowners' property violations. A hearing on a property complaint is attended by a panel of at least three DRHC committee members. If a formal grievance is upheld, the panel may impose a fine of up to \$100 per violation. The fine may be continued on a weekly basis if the violation is not resolved.

DRHC meets the second Wednesday of the month, at 2 p.m., at Pinnacle. All DRHC meetings are closed.

COMMON AREA PROPERTIES (CAP)

CAP committee oversees Sun City's community-owned property. Volunteer resident inspectors/committee members make recommendations that ensure safety and prolong efficient operation of the community's physical property. CAP members also consult with the executive director about purchasing new or replacement machinery and equipment.





Co-existing With Coyotes

As we approach the end of the coyote breeding season, it is a good idea to keep certain facts in mind to help avoid nighttime visits or a potential pet attack. According to the Nevada Department of Wildlife, coyotes maintain a year-round presence in our community. While we may not see them, it is helpful to remember that they live among us.

As we enter April, coyote pups will start to learn how to hunt their natural prey of rabbits, rodents and pigeons. Please don't tempt pups into your yard by leaving out pet food and water, or uncovered trash cans.

By observing a few simple suggestions, you can avoid an unwanted coyote encounter.

- Never feed a coyote
- Secure garbage can lids
- Never leave your pet unattended outdoors
- Always walk your dog on a leash
- If you feed your pets outside, remember to pick up the food bowls as soon as your pet is finished eating
- Noise makers and motion-activated lights make for good deterrence

Meet Security Patrol's Newest Members

Security Patrol is proud to introduce Tsuneko Meyers and Rich Moeller to the community. Tsuneko is a driver and Rich has cross-trained as an Information Center volunteer and driver.

Driver training is rigorous, involving four sessions with a trainer on at least three different shifts. The trainee learns the responsibilities of each shift and becomes familiar with the neighborhoods. This is followed by four solo hours documented by the dispatcher or watch commander. On completion of the solo driving shifts, the driver is then placed on a shift that needs a driver or a shift that is requested by the driver, providing there is a slot available.

Tsuneko moved into Sun City Summerlin in 2018 and attended new member orientation in 2019.

"I joined Security Patrol because I wanted to learn about this community. I love this community and wanted to contribute," she said.

Patrol drivers encounter many situations involving neighbors who may need help.

"We see people who are ill, and I love the 'Thank you' we get when we tell people that their garage door is open," Tsuneko said smiling and she recalled several situations. "My experience as a customer service professional helps me to deal with people."

One of the challenges for drivers is finding a shift that fits with their personal schedule.

"I picked the 2000-hour (8 p.m. to midnight) shift because the 0800 shift required me to wake up before 7 a.m. It didn't work well."

Tsuneko concluded with, "I really like Security Patrol, and I feel good about doing the job."

Rich Moeller cross-trained as a driver then decided on the Informa-

Water exercise is one of the best ways to get exercise, have fun and increase your quality of life. We've got lots of news pertaining to Sun City's pools.

Off-Season Pool Work

Our Maintenance Department has been hard at work during this off season, getting the pools ready for the opening.

- The Mountain Shadows pool has been resurfaced.
- The Mountain Shadows spa has been resurfaced using Pebble Sheen, a higher quality, more durable finish that will last twice as long as a plaster finish.
- Additional lighting has been installed at the pool, and two outdoor ceiling fans have been installed at the pool area.
- Handrails at Mountain Shadows and Desert Vista have been sanded and polished. New handrail covers have been installed.
- Pool decks have been washed, patched where necessary, and painted. (The Sun Shadows pool deck will be replaced in May).
- Pool furniture has been inspected, cleaned and repaired as necessary.
- All pools have been cleaned and chemical levels tested by
 the Clark County Health Department

Revised Pool Rules

Based on input from residents and pool monitors, the Fitness Department has made changes to the pool rules. These include:

- Time in lanes, whether swimming or walking, has been increased from 30 minutes to 45 minutes.
- Dedicated lap swim times at Desert Vista and Sun Shadows (daily 6-8 a.m. and 4-6 p.m.) have been eliminated.



Pool Hours

All pools open at 6 a.m. The Desert Vista pools close at 10 p.m.; Mountain Shadows, Pinnacle and Sun Shadows pools close at 9 p.m.

Children at the Pools

Do you want to bring the grandkids? According to SCSCAI's CC&Rs, individuals under 19 years of age are considered children. In order to use the pool or be in the pool area, children must be 42 inches tall without shoes. Children must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.

Children's hours are 1-4 p.m. at Desert Vista (indoor pool only) and 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Mountain Shadows and Pinnacle. Children are not permitted at the Sun Shadows pool and Desert Vista outdoor pool.

To ensure a smooth, enjoyable experience at the pools, we encourage you to pick up a rules pamphlet from the Fitness Monitor desk.

- Showering and Sanitation Laws: Showering before entering the pool or spa is required by the Southern Nevada Health District in order to reduce the contaminants that are brought into the pool and spa. It is also highly recommended to rinse off by showering after exiting the pool.
- No adult disposable briefs, colostomy bags or catheters may be worn in the pool or spa.
- Street shoes are not allowed in the pools or pool areas. Dedicated and clean pool shoes are acceptable.
- Persons with a cold, cough, sore or inflamed eyes, any skin or communicable disease, or with open sores or bandages must not enter the pool or spa.

As the Health & Fitness Department wraps up the summer, in July and August, it will focus on overall health. From September to November, programs aimed at the lower body – hips, knees, feet, etc. will be targeted. Each month, Sun City's Health & Fitness staff will continue to dig deeper into each area of the body, and will work hard to bring residents educational experiences that provide a more indepth look into their own health and wellness.

Choose Healthy Meals as You Get Older

NUTRITIONAL TIP

Follow some simple tips for better health at each stage of life:

- Drink plenty of liquids and stay hydrated.
- Make eating a social event meals are more enjoyable with others.
- Plan healthy meals. Find sensible and flexible ways to choose and prepare healthy foods.
- Know how much to eat. Learn about portion size.
- Vary your vegetables, a good source of fiber. Choose colorful veggies.
- Eat for your teeth and gums. Eating softer foods can help.
- Use herbs and spices. Add flavor to your meals.
- Keep food safe. Throw out food that might not be safe and cause food-related illness.
- Read the nutrition facts label. Make the right choices when buying food.
- Ask your doctor about vitamins or supplements. Food is the best way to get nutrients, but sometimes vitamins and supplements can help.

PHYSICAL TIP: Improve Balance: Strengthen Your Core



Starting Position: Stand facing a desk or counter with your feet together.

Movement: Tighten your abdominal muscles and lower your upper body weight onto your forearms on the desk or countertop. Clasp your hands together and align your shoulders

directly over your elbows. Step back on the balls of your feet until you are balancing your body in a line like a plank. Hold the position. This is one rep.

Tip: Keep your shoulders down and back, and breathe comfortably.

Where To Start: If you're feeling unstable, you'll need to see a doctor before beginning an exercise routine. Instability may be related to problems with your inner ear organs, vision, muscles or joints. They all send signals to the brain, which processes the information and sends signals back to your muscles to make the movements necessary to maintain balance.

If your doctor recommends physical therapy to strengthen your core, you'll go through an evaluation to determine and prescribe the right exercise routine. Once you've been assessed, your physical therapist will likely guide you through a series of gentle stretches and strengthening exercises.

Don't wait for balance problems before you start working on your core. You can prevent balance problems, as well as back pain, by maintaining a strong core at all times.



AIR FORCE VES MAKES NAVALACADENT HISTORY Photo of ship by Steve Linder Photo of Jim by Bob Cohen/Link

n February 1813, while our young nation was fighting England in the War of 1812, The Navy sent 28-year-old Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry to Erie, Pa., with orders to complete the construction of a fleet of 10 ships to ensure that the U.S. kept control of Lake Erie. He completed the construction of the fleet the following August. The next month, he defeated the English fleet and ensured control of the Northwest Territories, after which he wrote in his final report that: "We have met the enemy and they are ours."

Flash forward to 2015, Sun City resident and Air Force veteran Jim Twohig began building a model of Perry's flagship, the Niagara. While Perry was able to build the original in approximately six months, it took Jim 3 years and some 2,000 hours working in the Model Builders Club studio at Desert Vista to complete his very detailed model. To be fair, as astonishing as Perry's accomplishment was, he had lots of help. Aside from kibitzing from his fellow Model Builders Club members, Jim worked alone.

Built to 1:64 scale, the model is 43 inches long, 27 inches high and 11 inches wide. And, like the original, is equipped with two long cannons and 18 cannonades.

The model has won Best of Show and People's Choice awards in the National Model Contest, in addition to First Place in the Best of the West contest. In 2016, it was exhibited at the Nautical Research Guild's Annual Convention – all very notable events. But those accolades pale compared to what was in the future. As detailed by Jim, "For over 150 years, the Preble Museum at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis has collected historically significant objects illustrating the history of the U.S. Navy. The War of 1812 Exhibit displays objects, equipment, paintings, uniforms, etc. from that era. While world-renown and priceless, the exhibit does not have a model of the USS Niagara!"

Enter retired Navy Captain Bruce Adams, President of the Sun City Model Builders Club and graduate of the Academy class of 1969. While attending his 50th class reunion at Annapolis last October, Bruce toured the Preble Museum and noticed that the exhibition lacked a model of the Niagara. He did not hesitate to bring that omission, and the fact that Jim Twohig's award-winning model existed back in Sun City to the attention of Museum Director Grant Walker.

Obviously interested, Director Walker asked for more information and detailed photos. Returning home, Bruce updated Jim on the possible opportunity to donate his model and make Academy history – a fact not missed by the Air Force veteran. Jim and Bruce then enlisted the help of fellow Model Builders Club member and graduate of the Naval Academy Class of 1969, retired Marine Corps Lt. Colonel Steve Linder. Steve took detailed photos that were used in the formal presentation to the Preble Museum's curators last December.

The result: An enthusiastic acceptance of Jim's model and the approving of funding of the "Crating, Shipping and Delivering" of the model Niagara. Jim's model will now be part of the Academy's history!






photo scavenger hunt challenges a photographer to photograph specific objects, colors or themes in a unique and cre-

Following is a brief description of the purpose of each committee. <u>In order to serve on a committee</u> <u>a person must be a member (owner) in the</u> <u>Association.</u>

Finance Committee – This Committee meets monthly, currently on the last Thursday of the month at 2 p.m. The Finance Committee has general oversight of the financial policy, including but not limited to, investments, audits and insurance, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, including ways and means for obtaining funds necessary to meet the authorized budget for carrying out the work of the Association. The Committee will review the annual budget, prepared by the Executive Director, make recommendations with respect thereto, and submit the annual budget and their recommendations in writing no later than the May Board meeting for Board approval.

Common Area Properties Committee – This Committee meets monthly, currently on the first Tuesday of the month at 9 a.m. The Common Area Properties Committee shall conduct a thorough inspection of all the Association's real and personal property. The Committee shall determine that said property is maintained in a manner to ensure safety of personnel, long life and efficient operation. The Committee Chairperson, or designee, shall provide monthly reports to the Executive Director and Board of Directors. The Committee shall be available for consultation to the Finance Committee during the budget process. The Committee shall also be consulted by the Executive Director on all individual purchases of machinery, electrical and mechanical equipment – both new and replacement, and shall especially be examined for a "need to replace." The Common Area Properties Committee consists of two divisions: (1) Engineering and Technical services and (2) Inspection, Investigation and Restoration services.

Clubs and Community Organizations Committee - This Committee meets monthly, currently on the third Thursday of the month at 9 a.m. The Clubs and Community Organizations Committee reviews and makes recommendations to the Board of Directors for action to be taken with respect to (chartered) club applications. This Committee develops and makes recommends to the Board policies and procedures as to standards for club oversight, facilities use and for the administration of proper relationships between the Association and its chartered clubs and community organizations. This committee may hear complaints involving chartered clubs and/or community organizations in accordance with the Association's Complaints and Hearing Protocol when necessary.

Election Committee – This Committee primarily meets in November, December, January, February and March to prepare for and debrief after the annual Board election. The Election Committee conducts all elections and prepares all ballots of the Association. There are no Board members on this Committee and the Election Committee is not chaired by a Board Member.

Architectural Review Committee – This Committee meets monthly, currently on the second Thursday of the month at 1 p.m The Architectural Review Committee is the only standing committee of the Association mandated by the governing documents and focuses on maintaining the standards of the residential units and the common areas to preserve and enhance the properties. Members of this committee conduct reviews before and after applications are processed and approved and does inspections of properties when there is an alleged violation of the Development Standards or Governing Documents.

Deed Restriction Hearing Committee – This Committee meets monthly, currently on the second Wednesday of the month at 2 p.m. The Deed Restriction Committee is designated authority by the Board of Directors to hear formal complaints brought by the Association alleging violation of the Development Standards. A hearing on a formal complaint is presided over by the Deed Restriction Hearing Committee.

Legal Services Committee – This Committee meets monthly, currently on the second Wednesday at 9:30 a.m The Legal Services Committee reviews the Association's Governing Documents, hearings, and related affairs. This Committee shall be comprised of members with legal or general business oversight skills that may include a working familiarity with managing updates to Governing Documents and knowledge of dispute resolution, mediation and arbitration processes. The Committee reviews and provides recommendations to the President, the Board or Executive Director regarding SCSCAI involvement in Ombudsman intervention, mediation or arbitration where independent review is requested. The Legal Services Committee's functions may include (a) Review of Governing Documents and recommending updates or revisions to the Board. (b) Review of pending or adopted state and federal legislation to determine the impact upon the Association and make recommendations to the Board. (c) Draft and recommend changes to the Complaint and Hearing Protocol and serve as the hearing panel when necessary. (d) Review and

provide recommendations on strategies to keep legal costs at a minimum. (e) Upon request of the Board of Directors or Association management, provide training and seminar services in areas where they have expertise. (f) Upon request of the Board of Directors, develop, review and recommend selection criteria for new legal counsel.

Golf Oversight Committee – This Committee meets monthly, currently on the third Wednesday at 1 p.m The Golf Oversight Committee keeps the Board of Directors advised of suggested improvements, enhancements or maintenance to the golf courses and makes recommendations as to: golf operations, golf fees, golf reserve funds, outside play and other pertinent golf issues. The Golf Oversight Committee hears suggestions and complaints from the residents in general, resident golfers and adjacent property owners and then makes recommendations for corrective action.

Information Technology Committee – This Committee meets every other month, currently on the last Tuesday at 9 a.m. The Information Technology Committee reviews and evaluates the adequacy of both the hardware and software requirements of the various using departments. The Committee will recommend cost effective improvements and changes in order to optimize the flow of user required information. The Committee will respond to specific requests as identified by the Board of Directors and Administration, including training requirements and dissemination of information.

Fitness Committee – This Committee meets monthly, currently on the second Thursday at 10 a.m. The Fitness Committee advises the Board of Directors of improvements and enhancements to the facilities and fitness equipment. The Committee reviews and suggests maintenance and operation of the fitness centers and other related community fitness assets to the Board of Directors. In addition, the Committee advises the Board of Directors and makes recommendations regarding residents' fitness suggestions, classes and complaints. The Committee also studies other fitness-related matters as requested by the Director of Fitness, Executive Director and/or Board of Directors.


