





### Introducing a New Partner With Sun City Summerlin - Five Star Tavern

On behalf of the Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc., Board of Directors, I would like to welcome and introduce you to Five Star Tavern. Five Star Tavern has officially signed an agreement with Sun City Summerlin to lease the space currently known as the Vista Grille. Five Star Gaming, Inc., currently operates six taverns with gaming in Southern Nevada.

Five Star features a full menu, offering breakfast, lunch and dinner. Hours of operation will be 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The full menu will be served daily, from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m., with a limited, express menu offered during late-night hours. It will be a non-smoking facility (except for the outside patio area). There will be 15 gaming

machines on the bar top and several 60- to 70-inch televisions for sports fans. In addition, there will be booths and tables located throughout the space for dining.

For more information on Five Star's floor plan, see page 7. Please be aware that the final floor plan is subject to change. Five Star Tavern is looking at a July 1 opening, however,

We want everyone to have a say in running our community, but with more than 12,000 residents that's not really possible. So you elect a Board of Directors, consisting of nine members who make decisions on your behalf. On Tuesday, February 25, you will be voting to fill five of the nine seats on our Board. Please be sure to VOTE!

How does the Board of Directors communicate with residents so they can stay up on what's happening?

- **1.** The Board meets formally each month, sometimes twice in a month, where we discuss and vote on community matters. The agendas and results, as well as all backup material is posted on SCSCAI's official website, www.scscai.com.
- **2.** Many formal items are included in the Link magazine, along with information about most community activities such as Starbright Theatre performances, and facility activities and hours.
- **3.** The Link maintains an online version of the magazine at www.suncitylink.com, where you can find information on activities happening THIS WEEK IN SUN CITY, slideshows and videos of club and Association events, club blogs, breaking news, and dates and addresses of weekend estate sales.

- **4.** On the third Friday of each month at 10:30 a.m. at Desert Vista, the Board holds an informal get together called Coffee With the Board. At CWTB, residents can ask questions and discuss issues.
- **5.** Committee meetings are held each month (schedules are on the calendar page of the Link), where residents on the committees do much



of the staff work on issues affecting that committee; recommendations are then made to the Board. The Board chairperson of each committee is listed in the Link under "How to Contact Us" on page 4. If you want to be part of the decision process, attending the committee meetings is a good place to start. Don't be a Monday morning quarterback and complain about what decisions the Board made – participate in the decision process!

### A final note on Garbage.

Our governing directives clearly state that residents may not put out garbage before noon on the day before collection day. The later you put garbage out for collection, the less chance wind has to distribute it. Please follow the rules on putting out your garbage for collection.

- I. The Board of Directors unanimously approved the following: Resolved by the Board of Directors of SCSCAI that the proposed lease between SCSCAI and Five Star Gaming, Inc. (a copy of which is annexed in the Board backup) be and is hereby approved, and that the president be and is hereby authorized to execute the same and is appearing that there will be required other documents, approvals and consents necessary to effectuate the terms and conditions of said lease; it is hereby further resolved that the president be and is hereby authorized to execute such other documents approvals and consents as may be necessary as effectuate the terms, conditions and intent of said lease.
- 2. The Board of Directors unanimously approved the Century Link Metro Fiber/Ethernet 36-month contract at \$2,083.00 per month with a one-time installation/equipment charge of \$8,545.22.
- 3. The Board of Directors approved the recommendation of the Properties Committee that staff prepare a request for proposal to repair the Desert Vista parking lot, using the specifications from the 2006 engineering report that recommends removal and new compaction of the area [and any other suggestions in the report]. This project is on the second look review of the Board and will remain as such even after the RFPs are opened.
- 4. The Board of Directors approved an amended motion to include the additional wording in italics shown in No. 3 above.
- 5. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to acknowledge that the Board of Directors has fulfilled their duty as a Board in reviewing the July, August and September FY2014. Financial documents, in accordance with NRS 116.31083(6). The Association is in compliance with Paragraph (b) of the sub-section 2 of NRS 116.3115 and reserve funds have not been used for daily maintenance.
- 6. The Board of Directors approved a motion as follows: Motion to approve the revisions to Article III, Section A(6) of the SCSCAI Rules and Regulations, section re: Code of Conduct as follows: (As approved and recommended by the LSC)
  - A. ARTICLE III: ASSOCIATION RULES Members and Residents Code of Conduct Members and residents shall:

- Be held liable for any damage to, defacing of, or misappropriation and/or unauthorized removal of any Association property;
- 7. The Board of Directors unanimously approved to change the Shooting Club name to the Gun Club.
- 8. The Board of Directors unanimously approved a revision to Article V, Section A4 of the CCOC manual regarding Chartered Club ticket sales as recommended by the CCOC Committee.
- 9. The Board of Directors approved the Properties Committee recommendation to approve the Landscape Strategy Plan, which will act as a guideline to future landscape projects by staff.
- 10. The Board of Directors approved an amended motion to add the words "if practicable" at the end of paragraph No. 5, Objectives in the Landscape Strategy Plan.
- II. The Board of Directors approved the following: As budget guidance to the executive director, the Finance Committee recommends that the operating budget for fiscal year 2015 remain the same as 2014, not to exceed \$13,900,000.
- 12. The Board of Directors approved the recycling program previously approved at the October 8, 2013, BOD meeting with the following changes: There will be no recycle collection container (Dumpster) at Sun Shadows; the final cost of collection containers used inside the six (6) Association complexes will cost \$1,300; the contracts for the complex are attached (for approval).
- 13. The Board of Directors approved a motion to remove P&P (Investment Policy) 2.4.1 from SCSCAI's Policy and Procedures. The contents of P&P 2.4.1 will be then included in SCSCAI's Rules & Regulations under Rule VI, subsection 1.
- 14. The Board of Directors approved a motion to direct the LSC to conduct a review of SCSCAI's Policies and Procedures, and the Rules and Regulations and make recommendations to the Board at a future meeting. An amendment was approved to include the review of the Bylaws, too.
- 15. The Board of Directors approved the ratification of the approval of retaining Wolf, Rifkin, Shapiro, Schulman & Rabkin law firm for the Higher Ground related new lawsuits.

### Time to Get Ready for Spring

If you have not yet done your winter trimming, it's not too late. Get to work on restoration pruning similar to what we are doing on the streetscapes around Sun City. It's also a good time to get to work on your rose bushes.

This time of year, please be careful when working outside in the cold. Avoid working up a sweat because, if you stop and don't go indoors immediately, you can get chilled to the bone. It takes a long time to warm up again, prime condition for developing cold-related illnesses. So if you do work outside, be sure to maintain a steady pace and take breaks. ### 2014 BOD Election Voting Information – How to Vote

Election Day is Tuesday, February 25, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the Exchange Room at Mountain Shadows. The ballots will be secured in the Association office until the following day.

This year you will be electing five (5) residents to serve on the Board as Directors. The candidates will be elected for two-year terms.

The ballot format is the same as last year and is prepared for electronic counting. The ballot has two halves and a **pre-posted return envelope.** Instructions are printed on the ballot. Each household has five (5) votes. After marking the ballot, remove the "Instructions" side to remove your name and address. **Insert the ballot half into the envelope so that the bar code, which is used for validation, shows through the envelope's window.** On vote counting day, the Election Committee will cut off the bar code **before** removing your secret ballot. Your votes may be cast for one candidate or divided among two or more candidates.



### Conserving Water/Costs Core of Landscape Action Plan

The Sun City Summerlin Board of Directors passed a landscape plan in December. The Properties Committee has been working on defining this plan for the last six months because water costs Sun City more than \$2 million a year, and due to a 17-year drought, water will only become more expensive.

The plan calls for a reduction in water consumption by 20 percent over a three-year period, sets standards for plant removal and replacement, and encourages the creation and implementation of an attractive landscape design for the three major entrances into our community. In the next two months, the departments of Landscape and Golf Course Maintenance will put together an action plan that will affect the 2014/15 fiscal budget, which begins July 1. These plans will identify the areas of grass removal and other items that will start to bring them into compliance with the new landscape guidelines.

The biggest and most drastic visual change will be the removal of grass throughout the community. To maintain grass in Las Vegas, the Southern Nevada Water Authority reports that it takes approximately 6 cubic feet of water

per year. SNWA has a turf reduction plan that will reimburse Sun City with a little more than \$1 per square foot of grass removed. The Landscape and Golf Course Maintenance departments plan to select the grass on the steep sides of greenbelts and golf courses and around the community buildings for removal. The steep, grassy areas are dangerous to mow and our buildings have the highest landscape water bills. The change to our community buildings may be a shock to the senses, as rocks and plantings will look more like our yards than the grassy lawns we have all enjoyed. However, CAP does not want anyone to panic, as SNWA requires that beautiful plants and trees continue to cover 50 percent of the area where grass was removed

CAP will keep residents updated and informed as actual action items develop, and will meet with residents where grass and tree removal will have a direct impact on their property. Did you miss last year's Stepping On Falls Prevention Program offered by the Sun City Summerlin Fitness Department? If you did, here's a second chance to attend the falls prevention screening and the Stepping On Falls Prevention class. ### **AARP Offers Free Income Tax Service**

AARP volunteers will again be providing free income tax preparation for Sun City residents, beginning Thursday, January 30. The service will be offered in the Mint Room at Mountain Shadows community center on Thursdays and Fridays. Appointments are necessary and must be made in person with the Social Monitor at Mountain Shadows. Taxpayers need to bring in a copy of last year's return and social security cards, along with all W2s, 1099 R, INT, DIV, MISC, social security SSA-1099, W2Gs and broker statements with purchase date and cost of any stocks or bonds sold. You also will need receipts for itemized deductions for medical expenses, mortgage interest, real estate taxes paid, gifts to charity and any other miscellaneous deductions. Please note that we can prepare returns only for electronic filing with the Internal Revenue Service. Paper returns are not permitted. Also note that we

cannot prepare state returns, or returns with rental, business or partnership (K-1) income, other than simple interest, dividends and capital gains. For questions, call 341-6376.

### Shuffleboard Club Members Ken and Deanna Gager Get on With Living

huffleboard in Sun City Summerlin is a great sport for friendly team competition while enjoying the fresh air and healthy exercise that our doctors always prescribe.

In addition to all the healthy stuff, it is a great opportunity to meet interesting new members of our community with equally interesting stories. It is one of these stories I'd like to tell you about.

Ken and Deanna Gager are my new team members at the shuffleboard courts. I observed them compete in one of the games and they were quite experienced at team competition. Ken was particularly accurate with his puck shots. I noticed that his left arm was partially missing.

After the game, we started chatting, getting to know each other and I asked him where he lost his arm, assuming it was during military service. I learned it wasn't while in the military that Ken lost his arm, his left eye and the partial use of his right eye, where he is considered legally blind. This all was in service to his community as a member of the Nevada Highway Patrol. This physical damage was the result of a mail bomb that was sent to his home in Minden, Nev., on September 8, 1993.

Thinking that it was a 42nd birthday present from their son, who was in the military, Ken opened the package that exploded. Deanna was saved from extreme injuries because she had bent down to get something from the refrigerator's bottom drawer.

Former Nevada Highway Patrol officer Ken Gager and his wife, Deanna, moved to Sun City Summerlin in 2012. Ken Gager's story of survival is documented in a segment of the TV series "Real Stories of the Highway Patrol."

The explosion ripped a hole in the kitchen roof, shook loose every piece of drywall in the house, shattered windows, ruptured pipes and sent water gushing, filled the air with smoke and debris, and was heard five miles away. The bomb consisted of six sticks of dynamite packed tight in a bristling cocoon of fence post staples, nails and screws. Other shrapnel exploded with the release of a pressure switch.

The investigation of the bombing revealed that the bomb had been contracted by Robert J. Collins, whom Ken had arrested on burglary and fraud charges during a routine traffic stop. While imprisoned, Collins met Avrom Sander Finkel, the bomb maker. Following the explosion, both men were subsequently arrested and are now serving 75 years and 80 years, respectively.

The battle for Ken's life took four months and 25 surgeries on his arm, abdomen and eye, in addition to plastic surgery to repair the extensive damage done to his face. His story has been re-created in a documentary and in the television series "Real Stories of the Highway Patrol."

Ken and Deanna have been married 44 years. They moved to Sun City in 2012 and split their time between Las Vegas and their other home in Lincoln City, Ore. They are avid boaters and fishermen.

I asked the Gagers' permission to tell their story and Ken agreed with one exception – "Please call all the men and women in uniform heroes," he said. "I'm no hero. I'm lucky we are both alive to enjoy our children and grandchildren."

So the next time you're walking around the Mountain Shadows exercise track and see our shuffleboard club in the middle of playing, stop by and say "Hello" to the Gagers.

### Security Patrol Drivers Graduate Metro's Citizens' Police Academy

un City Summerlin Security Patrol drivers Thomas and Patricia Dennis were among 37 graduates of Metro's Citizens' Police Academy in November. For anyone wondering what the world of law enforcement is all about, the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department sponsors an exhilarating, hands-on program that allows citizens to experience most police department functions. CPA classes are taught by senior police officers who specialize in each class discipline. The Academy gives students first-hand information on how the Department operates, and examines the culture of police work. It provides an excellent opportunity for citizens to interact with police department officers. The CPA has become one of Metro's most popular programs and has a waiting list of applicants.

CPA students meet every Wednesday from 6 to 9 p.m. The academy involves both classroom and interactive instruction. Thomas and Patricia Dennis said they came away from the program with a realistic understanding about what it is like to be a police officer. Participants are given the same information that Metro's police recruits and officers receive.

Academy instruction includes Constitutional law and an overview of the legal system. There's a jail tour of the Las Vegas detention center and emphasis on gangs and narcotics trafficking. SWAT and K-9 demonstrations are conducted up close and personal. Other topics deal with

homicide, air support and the handling of potentially violent domestic situations. Thomas Dennis told

about their involvement in a mock, but very realistic domestic situation,

where they learned how police officers are trained to defuse the likelihood of violence. Police officers also described circumstances that might require use of force, and they expounded on such crimes as identity theft, fraud and vice.

Several of the classes took the Dennises out of the training center, allowing them an opportunity to ride along with an on-duty patrol officer. They underwent a closely supervised firearms session at Metro's firing range and they accompanied a patrol officer making an actual traffic stop. For one class, they sat in with a police dispatcher and a 9-1-1 communications specialist.


Thomas and Patricia's CPA graduation ceremony featured law enforcement speakers and an overview of Metro's police volunteer program. Diplomas were presented to each graduate by former Sheriff Douglas Gillespie. Upon graduation, participants become members of the Citizens' Police Academy Alumni Association. That association meets monthly and presents speakers from various law enforcement and legal agencies, and offers related tours.

#### Euchre, Uker, Yuker, Yoocur?

However You Spell It, It is a Great Card Game and a Terrific Club



The correct spelling of the card game is "euchre," but it is pronounced "yoo-ker." The Sun City Euchre Club meets for fun and cards every Wednesday at 6 p.m. at Mountain Shadows. If you are from the Midwest, you have probably played euchre before or know someone who has.

You don't need a partner to start playing euchre, although you are more than welcome to bring one, two, three or more! There are usually four players per table and seating is assigned for the first round. After that, players switch partners, so you'll get to meet and play with different club members.

Euchre is a relatively simple trump card game. It is played with a deck of 24 cards since all cards below 9 are removed. Each player is dealt five cards. The dealer places the remaining four cards face down on the table. The top card on that stack (or "kitty") is turned face up and can be declared trump. Moving clockwise from the dealer, each player has the option of "ordering" that card up and naming it as trump. The dealer must pick it up and discard one from his hand so he will still have five cards. If no one orders it up during the first round, the card is turned face down and the players have the option of naming any other suit as trump. Once trump has been named, the highest card in the suit is not the Ace . . . it is the Jack, which is called the right bower. The second highest trump is the Jack of the same colored suit. In other words, if hearts are named as trump, the highest card is the Jack of hearts. The second highest trump is the Jack of diamonds and is called the left bower. Each player gets to deal twice for a round of eight hands. This usually takes about 15 minutes. We play five rounds, take a break and then five more rounds. We usually finish a little before 9 p.m.


