Link, SCSCAI Websites, E-News Bulletin Best Ways to Keep Up With What's Happening in Sun City





President's Message



David Steinman, President, SCSCAI Board of Directors

Recently, I was elected by your Board of Directors to serve as president of the Board until the end of February 2015. This is the third time I have served this community as president in my nine-year tenure. Other changes have occurred at the leadership level. Sue Papilion resigned as president of the board at the second meeting in May. She was subsequently appointed interim executive director of Sun City Summerlin

and will serve until a permanent executive director is found by the board. Due to a resignation by the vice president of the Board, Jim Akers was elected to the position and now serves as vice president-treasurer. Longtime resident and former board member Tom Brennan was elected to the Board of Directors and appointed an assistant treasurer.

Other changes are taking place in our restaurants. In late July, Five Star Gaming assumed its position as lessee of the Vista Grille, offering 24-hour food, drink and gaming. This move relieves Sun City of being in the food service business at Palm Valley. When we found out that gaming would not be permitted at Highland Falls by Howard Hughes Corporation, Five Star elected to terminate its agreement to

manage the food and beverage operation at Tavern at the Falls.

This has caused Sun City to re-enter the management of the Tavern at the Falls. I invite all residents to visit the restaurant at Highland Falls and meet the new manager/ chef, Barbi Meinel. She has created a completely new menu featuring an array of salads and sandwiches that are served from 5:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. The facility will remain open after 3 p.m. for drinks and light food.

About one year ago, Sun City Summerlin was awarded a \$2,000 grant from the city of Las Vegas to construct an electronic information sign on one of its information centers. When it was determined that the sign would cost substantially more than the grant, the project was shelved. When I was at City Hall early in the summer, I was asked if I could come up with a use for the grant money before it expired in June.

We went to work and designed 19 informational street signs to be placed in and around Sun City Summerlin. We found the cost would be \$3,200. The Public Works Department of the city of Las Vegas stepped forward and funded the \$1,200 over our grant award to make the project happen. You have probably noticed some of the signs that will help our new residents and visitors to our community find the facilities they are looking for.

We are fortunate to live in this first-class retirement community. Your Board of Directors will continue to work hard to maintain that image and reality.



The Summit Opens to Rave Reviews





Landscape

Water, Coyotes Two Facts of Life in Sun City

I have two items I want to share with you.

The first is water. As you may have read in my previous articles that water continues to be the biggest issue facing the Southwest and here in Sun City. Because of this, SCSCAI's Board of Directors has approved a three-year strategic plan to reduce the water usage throughout Sun City. Some of these improvements include reducing the number of plants and water-loving plants wherever possible. You may have seen this going on at Thomas Ryan Boulevard and east area of Lake Mead Boulevard.

Another way to reduce water consumption is turf reduction. We still have large areas in the community where reducing turf will make a lot of sense, such as the greenbelts. These areas have large spaces that are heavily sloped. Those slopes make the greenbelts unusable and somewhat dangerous to maintain. Over the next three years, we plan on changing these areas and others to desert scape. Since all the parks are also flood control zones, they will maintain usable turf for your recreational use.

The first of these parks that will be revamped is Sundial West Park. The park is located between Big Timber and Highvale drives on Sundial Drive. We need the support of the community on this three-year plan.

The next topic I'd like to discuss is coyotes. As you all may know, coyotes are a native part of the western United States. They spread throughout the states when the wolf was exterminated across the lower 48.

Coyotes are very adaptable canines. I even had one as a pet when I lived in the San Bernardino Mountains in California. She was always a little wild and she still had a wild side until she died after 15 years. But back to the article. Coyotes love an easy meal. You should never feed or leave food out for them. Once you do that they will associate Sun City as a food source. This is not fair to your neighbors or the coyotes. It's a death sentence for the coyote and harmful to people and their pets. Coyotes will eat almost anything. So, if you feed other wildlife, be aware that coyotes will be attracted to the food and the wildlife. If you feed your dog outside make sure to clean up soon after it is finished. When walking yourself or your dog, be aware at all times that coyotes are here. Normally, if you scream at a coyote it will leave. But if it doesn't, it may be a good idea to carry something to scare it off, such as mace or an air horn, which is recommended by the Nevada

Department of Wildlife. Take note, the air horn also may scare your dog, but it's better than what could potentially happen.

Community Preparedness Committee

The Scoop on Adult Immunizations

Immunization. Isn't that for kids? Not any more. Especially for those above the age of 50, adult immunization is a very real concern. I remember getting shots in school every year and dreading it, as did the student body.

So, what immunizations do seniors need?

To start with, an annual influenza or flu shot is recommended. This vaccination will decrease one's chances of getting the flu during flu season, which runs from September to April every year. Why do we have to get a flu shot every year? Flu strains change every year, so new vaccines are created annually.

Another shot seniors need to be aware of is tetanus, which is now Td or tetanus /diphtheria. The vaccination is usually needed every 10 years, and then there's the one-time substitution dose of Tdap or tetanus /diphtheria/and pertussis vaccines. These are due to the recent increase in pertussis, commonly called whooping cough.

How about chicken pox or varicella? I remember my mother putting me and all the neighbors' children in the same bedroom with the first kid who got the chicken pox, saying it's better to get it as a child than an adult. Unfortunately, all of us who had the chicken pox as children now have the virus called herpes zoster or shingles living within our bodies. This means we are prone to painful outbreaks of herpes zoster or shingles. Common symptoms of herpes zoster or shingles include a red blister-like rash along with flu-like symptoms. Although a chicken pox/varicella vaccine is available, it is mostly administered to children to help prevent initial infection. The shot is recommended now for seniors over the age of 59.

Other vaccines to consider are pneumonia or pneumococcal vaccine if you are over the age of 65 – younger if you have chronic disease. Repeat this vaccine once every five years. MMR or measles /mumps /rubella vaccine is recommended for those born after 1956. And hepatitis A&B vaccine is recommended if you are around people with hepatitis A or B, traveling to areas with a high incidence of hepatitis A or B, or you have multiple sex partners. The senior population is the second highest population after teenagers for diagnosis of STI or Sexually Transmitted Infections.

It's a Small World After All

hough many in Sun City Summerlin have had interesting lives, Elena Urisman has experienced a truly amazing existence. Elena, when sharing her story, always ends with the statement, "God bless America" – a blessing many of us take for granted or rarely give thought. For Elena, it is a joy she lives every day.

Born in Stalinist Russia, Elena was orphaned at one month of age when her father was killed in the early days of WWII; her mother died shortly after giving birth to her. Her only living relative, her maternal grandmother, unable to cope with the deaths of her husband so quickly followed by the deaths of her son-in-law and daughter, felt it best to place baby Elena in an orphanage. Her grandmother then fled to Odessa to join relatives only to find they all had been killed.

A frail child, Elena was adopted by a loving and prominent Jewish family. Her father was a well-known dancer in Russia. Her adoptive parents provided well for her, and she led a happy and privileged childhood.

After the war, Elena's grandmother returned to the orphanage to find her granddaughter and was told that information regarding the child could not be given to her. Elena's grandmother pled with an orphanage official who took pity on her as she explained Elena was her only living relative. Upon becoming aware of Elena's whereabouts, she visited the girl's adoptive parents

Elena's adoptive parents agreed that the maternal grandmother could be a part of their daughter's life only if the grandmother was to be her nanny and never reveal to Elena her true identity. And so, throughout the years, the stories Elena's nanny told her were about her actual family, though little Elena didn't know.

During her late 20s and already a mother herself, Elena saw the passing of her adoptive mother, who had died a few years after her adoptive father. When it came time to claim a small inheritance left to her by her adoptive mother, Elena had to view official documents. This was the first time she learned that she was adopted. At that time, she also discovered that it was her maternal grandmother who had been her nanny and nurtured her.

Today, Elena has two families to know and love her — her adoptive family and members of her birth family. She, her husband and daughter moved to the United States as refugees and continued to build a wonderful life here.

Security Patrol

Fiscal year 2014 Security Patrol Car Report

In July, Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol purchased three new Patrol cars from Centennial Toyota, which won the contract by submitting the lowest of three dealership bids. In fiscal year 2014, Security Patrol was maintaining three cars that each had more than 100,000 miles of service. The replaced Patrol cars were traded in with 120,265, 138,235 and 147,355 miles on their respective odometers.

This is a brief summary of Patrol car performance for the fiscal year that ended in June 2014, including comparisons with the prior six years. The report and graphs were prepared by Secutity Patrol Watch Commander Bob Segler, who maintains operational statistics on the Patrol cars.

Security Patrol has increased the total miles of Patrol driving each year for the last three years. The Patrol's fleet set a new record in fiscal year 2014 by driving a total of 179,341 miles. Acknowledging that the five Security Patrol cars leave the community only for automotive maintenance or fuel, the record-breaking mileage was achieved almost entirely while patrolling streets in Sun City Summerlin.


According to Bob Segler, fleet miles per gallon increased from 41.0 to 41.8 and the Patrol purchased nearly \$800 less








Security Patrol's motor officers began buying different tire brands to improve previous short tire life. The initial results show 29 tires purchased in fiscal year 2014, down from 45 tires bought the previous year.
