## **SCSCAI Wants to Know**



#### On The Subject of Wi-Fi

The June Link featured a question to residents regarding their opinion on installing Wi-Fi throughout the community. As of the August deadline (June 24), the Link received 66 responses with most replies representing two residents per household. Overall, 49 responses, or

nearly 100 opinions declared NO, while 17 responses, or roughly 32 people responded YES.

In tallying the responses, questions arose that prompted the Link to offer a better explanation of the original question, in addition to offering some feedback.

It is important to note that a few residents answered NO while explaining that they had no idea what Wi-Fi is, but stated that the costs outlined in the question were prohibitive. The majority of NO replies cited the perceived high cost of installation and maintenance, with the question, "If the Association decided to install Wi-Fi would resident dues increase?"

Others added that because they have Wi-Fi at home, they did not see the need for public access throughout the community.

With regard to residents who answered yes, overall accessibility at the fitness centers and swimming pools were cited as prime locations.

#### Points of clarification:

## **SCSCAI President's Message**

Good day to all our Sun City residents. This month we'll look at some of the do's and don'ts of living in Sun City Summerlin. First, it's important for residents to understand that we are an open community; that is, we are not gated like some homeowners' associations. As a consequence, we do not, and indeed cannot, control

who enters our community by foot or car. The roads, streetlights and traffic signage are all the responsibility of the city of Las Vegas. Likewise, the trash contract with Republic Services is a city responsibility. We can try to influence changes in those services by contacting city officials, but ultimately the city makes the decisions. Note that we have great relations with our elected representatives and they have been very responsive to our requests for help.

When residents buy their home, they are given copies of Sun City Summerlin's governing documents. Included are documents that list detailed restrictions on fencing, house colors, etc. The Community Standards office, located adjacent to the crafts building courtyard, is here to make sure residents don't run afoul of these restrictions. So, if you are considering a project on the exterior of your home, including landscape, you must check with Community Standards to make sure the change is allowed. We do not want any residents to have to go through the expense of having to repaint their home because they chose a color that is not on the approved list. Talk with the Community Standards team. They are nice people and will help you do the right thing. And if you are aware of a violation of our community standards, contact the Community Standards team and fill out a violation form; it's kept confidential and someone will investigate.

Finally, please do not park on the sidewalks. With the rounded curbs, it's very easy to edge onto the sidewalks while parking and block the sidewalk. Many of our residents walk each day and it is dangerous for them to have to walk in the street to get past a car.

Next month we will review some of the projects that are budgeted for our new fiscal year, July 1 through June 30, 2014.

radio waves to provide wireless, high-speed Internet and network connections.

- Sun City Summerlin currently has areas within the community where Wi-Fi is accessible. Those areas include the back hallway near the fireplace at Desert Vista and the seating area outside the computer lab at the Pinnacle.
- A Wi-Fi signal is currently available to those with smart phones who have purchased an appropriate data plan through the device; on a laptop or tablet with a Wi-Fi card, or to those who have purchased a hotspot app.
- In providing the cost of Wi-Fi service in the original question, it should have been stated that the money to install and maintain the service does not mean that resident dues would automatically increase. Money to install Wi-Fi could come from new capital, which is a budget funded by a portion of resident dues. An estimate of costs was provided to offer perspective. The overall cost reported was the maximum price for Wi-fi installation, depending on the amount of cable needed at each location and the number of spots ultimately identified.

- Again, the question was just that, a question to determine what residents are thinking/wanting from their Association.
- The Link invites residents to submit questions on subjects they would like to see addressed. Submissions may be sent to link@suncitylv.com, and by writing QUESTION in the subject line.

#### How the question came about:

Some residents were curious about the source of the Wi-Fi question and other recent inquiries published in the Link. The answer is: An SCSCAI board member brought the Wi-Fi discussion up at a monthly Coffee With the Board meeting. The board member said he had been approached by residents who wanted to know if it was possible to access their laptops at the swimming pool. And because it is possible to access the Internet with a Wi-Fi connection, the discussion of where Wi-Fi is in Sun City, as well as the possibility of installing it community-wide, grew from there.

#### Annual Unit Owners' Meeting

• Motion approved to ratify the 2014 budget by the unit owners that includes an increase in the annual assessment by \$36.00 (or 2.88%), for a total of \$1,284.

#### Regular Board Meeting

- The Board of Directors approved the motion to accept the Zurich American Insurance Company's proposal for directors and officers, employment practices and fiduciary liability insurance, to be effective June 30, 2013, provided by Risk Placement Services, Inc. with an estimated annual premium of \$65,705. Coverage to be provided with the duty indemnification provision.
- The Board of Directors approved an age variance waiver. (Request A)
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved an age variance waiver. (Request B)
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved the following related to employee benefits:
  - Ratification of the expenditure of \$5,873.28 for new, short-term and long-term disability insurance through the provider Sun Life Assurance Company.
  - Ratification of the expenditure of \$6,887.04 for life insurance and \$48,137.40 for dental insurance through the provider Guardian Life Insurance of America.
  - Ratification of the expenditure of \$484,572.96 for employee medical health insurance through the provider Health Plan of Nevada.
- The Board of Directors approved a resolution authorizing Patricia Rosia and Cynthia Dobek to be named as designees for actions required regarding 401k Plan.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to amend the Fidelity 401k plan document to extend the original vesting schedule of 3 years to those employees hired between 8/1/12 and 6/30/13, so they are also grandfathered into the 3-year vesting schedule. The vesting schedule of 5 years would then begin with new hires as of July 1, 2013 and communicated as such through the Summary Plan Documents (located in HR) and an updated Employee Handbook.
- The Board of Directors approved the expenditure of approximately \$14,500 for the Eagle Crest Golf Course

restrooms. The work to be completed in-house.

- The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to dissolve the Folk Dancing Club.
- The Board of Directors approved the Sun City Liberal Club Constitution.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved the audit engagement letter for Hilburn & Lein for FY2013. The amount shall not exceed \$26,500.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved the Finance Committee's recommendation to transfer \$300,000 from the Operating Fund to Reserves to be completed by June 27, 2013.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved to table the following item until the July 16, 2013, executive session meeting:
  - Motion to approve the adjustment of accounts deemed uncollectible in the amount of \$35,306.49.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to amend the original resolutions approving the hiring of the various legal counsels (April 8, 2013 BOD meeting) with the notation that the engagement letters from each firm would be presented to the BOD within "40 days." The time of "40 days" shall be revised to read "120 days."
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved the Properties Committee's recommendation to purchase and install one adjustable basketball goal for tennis court #3 at Desert Vista, at the maximum cost of \$2,500.

## **Architectural Review Committee**

It is very important for all residents, especially newcomers to our community, to remember that all exterior work must have pre-approval from the Architectural Review Committee prior to beginning work. When each new owner goes through membership orientation, they receive all Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc., documents, including the Development Standards.

During that meeting, an SCSCAI membership coordinator explains the ARC procedure.

Every week, the Community Standards office receives scores of applications for all sorts of home improvement projects. The approval process for most projects can take

up to seven (7) business days, so please allow enough time before scheduling work. Residents should not begin any project until they receive a copy of the approved application in the mail.

All ARC applications must be accompanied by two sets of plans for the project being planned. If installing an item such as a security door or new outdoor lighting, a brochure or photograph showing the type and color of the item is acceptable and should be included. All paint applications must have color samples attached.

All ARC projects will be inspected by an ARC member 120 days after approval. By signing the application form, owners acknowledge that ARC members or the Community Standards Director have the authority to enter your property to inspect work associated with the request. (CC&R's, Art. IV Sec2(y). If you have any questions about the ARC procedures, please feel free to contact the Community Standards office at 966-1411, or communitystandards@suncitylv.com.



## Prevent Falls by Building Balance & Strength

Did you know that one out of every three seniors 65 years and older fall each year? According to the Wisconsin Institute for Healthy Aging, 20 to 30 percent of people who fall suffer moderate to severe injuries such as

lacerations, hip fractures or head traumas. Many people who fall, even if they are not injured, develop a fear of falling. This fear may cause them to limit their activities, leading to reduced mobility and loss of physical fitness, which, in turn, increases their actual risk of falling.

There are many things people can do to prevent falls such as check their home for trip hazards, strengthen their muscles through exercise and practice balance exercises. One of the most important exercises for maintaining one's balance is a simple sit-to-stand movement.



Find a chair that is not too low and has arms if needed (chair should not swivel or have wheels). Scoot to the edge of the chair. Place your feet shoulder-width apart and tuck them under your knees. Lean over your knees (nose over your toes). Push off with both hands using the armrests and stand up slowly. Hold for 5 seconds. To sit back down, feel the chair touch the back of your legs, bend at your waist and reach behind you for the armrests. Slowly sit back down, don't plop. Repeat this exercise five to 10 times a day. As it gets easier, reduce the use of your arms and eventually move to a chair without armrests.







Dear Sun City Homeowner,

We all enjoy our resort-like retirement community, which is a safe and peaceful place to live. Still, it must be acknowledged that we have experienced a rise in daytime break-ins. These burglars are careful to strike when you are not at home. They grab jewelry, firearms, small electronics and easy-to-carry items. They often enter from the back patio sliders and are out of the house in less than 5 minutes. SCSCAI's board of directors is providing this information so you and your neighbors can lower your chances of becoming victims of a burglary:

- Meet your neighbors all around you and agree to watch each others' homes.
- When you leave your home, drive around the corner and come back to see if there is anyone watching homes on your street.
- Hide your jewelry someplace other than in your bedroom and don't keep all of it in one
  place. Think about purchasing a safe or a safe deposit box.
- Consider installing protective film on your sliding door and front door side window.
- Make sure Security Patrol has your current emergency information.
- If you have an email address, sign up for e-news alerts at www.scscai.com.
- If you see something suspicious, trust your instincts: Call Security Patrol at 254-2303 or Las Vegas Metro police at 311, their non-emergency number.
- Form a Neighborhood Watch on your block by calling Crime Prevention Specialist Kathy Perkins at Metro's Northwest Area Command, 828-4305. Sun City will provide a room for your initial meeting.
- When someone comes to your door claiming to represent a particular company, ask to see
  photo credentials. If you don't answer the door, they may mistakenly think that no one is at
  home and may attempt to break in. There is no reason to open the door; simply yell through
  it, "I can't come to the door right now."
- Dogs are a good deterrent. If your dog senses something, let it bark.
- Join Security Patrol and volunteer four hours a week so that we can put more cars out on patrol.
- Keep your garage door closed and lock the door between your garage and your home.
- Alarms are helpful, but these thieves are not afraid of them because they are gone before anyone responds to the alarm.
- Do not put your red mailbox flags up to indicate outgoing mail. Instead, drop your mail into
  one of the drive-up post office boxes located at the entrances to all Sun City community centers.

Sun City Summerlin remains the safest community in Las Vegas, averaging less than two burglaries a week in almost 7,900 homes or less than 1 percent. By becoming proactive and taking smart initiatives, we can make it even more difficult for burglars to victimize us. Please understand that Metro police officers are taking action. Regularly, there are unmarked vehicles and police cars in our community. Additionally, our 300 SCSCAI employees are diligent in reporting anything they see that seems amiss. They already have been responsible for one arrest. If your Sun City property is leased to tenants, we urge you to mail this information to them. This is a great community and let's make it greater by watching out for ourselves and one another!

SOMEONE IS ALWAYS THERE TO HELP YOU

e know that you see the white hybrid cars with light bars on their roofs patrolling our streets. Be aware that the bad guys also see us," said Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol Chief Bill Schoening. "Often our high visibility is enough to convince a potential burglar to leave the area. Readers might like to know more about the tasks that patrol drivers do, as well as the myriad challenges they handle day to day. So, fasten your seatbelt and ride along with us for a 24-hour period."

Midnight to 4 a.m. Security patrol drivers circulating the community on this early morning shift stop at every community building to walk the grounds, making sure that all doors are locked. They check that nothing is amiss at the pools, tennis courts, recreation facilities, fitness centers and restrooms. When a maintenance or security problem is found, such as an unlocked door, an open gate or a water leak, the patrol dispatcher notifies maintenance workers and an officer remains onsite until the matter is resolved.

4 to 8 a.m. Patrol drivers inspect designated locations that are checked on every shift. Included are the access gate to the community from the Smith's shopping center and the emergency vehicle entrance from Cheyenne Avenue at Lotus Hill Drive. Drivers also inspect the Information Centers located at the three community entrances, as well as the security gates to maintenance yards where costly equipment is stored. Shortly after sunrise one morning, a patrol driver encountered an inappropriately dressed, confused

woman walking in the street. After the driver learned her name, the dispatcher researched the woman's address and called her daughter to meet them there. The patrol Officer then drove the woman home.

**8 a.m. to noon.** On this shift, patrol drivers are kept busy with as many as 30 house checks a day during hot weather months when snowbirds are away for extended periods. The officers inspect the security of doors and windows at each assigned home. They pick up packages, newspapers or advertising materials that may have gathered outside the home, securing those items so that the property does not appear to be unoccupied. The vacationing residents' designated contact person is notified about any unsecured doors or windows, as well as broken garden sprinklers or water leaks. It was during this shift that the Security Patrol helped Las Vegas Metro officers gain access to a home after a postal carrier reported that mail was not being picked up by the resident. The dispatcher reached an emergency contact person who had information about the resident and a key to the house. Police and emergency responders were called, but this incident ended in the worst possible way as the resident had died.

Noon to 4 p.m. Two times daily, a patrol driver distributes and retrieves inter-office mail from the administration department, building monitors, Community Services office, golf maintenance and pro shops. Also, patrol cars are refueled during this time. Together, the five cars are driven an average of 450 miles a day while patrolling the 73 miles of streets in Sun

City Summerlin. It was on this shift that a resident's daughter called the Security Patrol from Alaska, alarmed because she could not reach her Sun City resident father by phone. The responding patrol driver found the father well, but he had left his cordless phones out of their battery chargers. The officer used his own cell phone to call the worried daughter in Skagway, Alaska, assuring her "Your dad is OK" and letting the resident use his cell phone. While father and daughter talked, the officer replaced the phones in their chargers.

**4 to 8 p.m.** Patrol drivers respond to calls about suspicious cars, particularly a person who may be sitting in a

the solicitors and convinced them to leave the community because they were frightening residents after dark. They also were reminded not to approach any home that displayed a No Soliciting sign.

8 p.m. to midnight. On this shift, a patrol driver spotted an open garage door with no car parked inside, a statement to a potential intruder that no one was at home. Still, the driver walked around the property knocking on doors and windows. There was no response. The door leading from the garage to the house and the back patio door were unlocked, granting easy access to a burglar. The patrol driver knew she could not leave the site until the property was secured. The dispatcher

car parked on the street. At the beginning of this shift, the dispatcher alerted patrol drivers to be on the lookout for Spunky, a wayward Yorkshire terrier that was AWOL. Spunky's frantic owner explained that her grandchildren had left the back gate ajar and Spunky escaped. With three patrol drivers and Security Patrol's pet officer on the lookout, it wasn't long before Spunky was spotted, apprehended and safely returned to her owner. Sun City Summerlin pet owners should know that if their pet gets out, or if they see a dog running loose, a call to Security Patrol, 254-2303, will greatly improve the odds of a happy ending. Later, as it was becoming dark, the dispatcher was besieged with calls from anxious residents about an aggressive team of solicitors who were knocking on doors, attempting to persuade residents to let them into their homes. Two patrol drivers intercepted

notified the emergency contact person who came to the home and secured it, while explaining that the homeowner was playing in a daylong poker tournament. Thanks to Security Patrol's diligence the owner came home to a full house.

Assistant Security Patrol Chief Brian Dodd has the previous month's patrol data at his fingertips. When asked what the Patrol is doing about burglaries, he said, "We are driving 15,000 miles a month throughout the community and alerting residents to more than 300 open garage doors. In one month, we do nearly 800 house checks and our information center staffers answer roughly 300 queries from visitors and prospective home buyers. Proudly, our volunteers serve more than 4,000 hours a month."

## **Community Preparedness Committee**


#### The Sun City Emergency Radio Network

An essential element of any disaster preparedness plan is the communications systems that will be available should a disaster occur. Without good communications capability, the support teams would not be able to provide support where it is needed most. During summer 2009, the Sun City Summerlin Community Preparedness Committee (CPC) performed a communications needs analysis. As a result, the organization's board approved the purchase and installation of a radio communications system. To operate the radio system, CPC enlisted the help of radio operators (hams) who live in Sun City Summerlin. In addition, 12 amateur radio operators currently licensed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) volunteered to support the CPC radio network. By June 2010, CPC had installed its basic network of four base stations; and emergency support personnel were issued handheld radios.

A room in the Pinnacle Community Center became CPC's Emergency Operations Center, which would be the focal point for coordinating actions in the event of an emergency. In June 2012, two radio repeaters were installed at the Pinnacle that greatly improved the transmission and reception of CPC's hand-held radios, including hand-helds used by the Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol.

When Fire Station 107 was completed in June 2012, the facility included a room for an alternate CPC radio station and medical supply storage that became operational in August 2012. Besides providing CPC with better radio reception and redundancy, Station 107's equipment offers a better capability to contact other amateur radio emergency units outside of Sun City, such as emergency operations centers throughout the state of Nevada.

Our communications system is well placed to support our community in the case of an emergency. We need more licensed amateur radio operators. Join our team of dedicated hams and help make our system even better. If interested, contact Fred Boughton, 243-8205, or Ken Johnson, 254-5840.

## Sun City Residents Love Their Weird, Wild & Wacky Plants

A WORD ON SUCCULENTS.

Succulents are defined as hearty plants with fleshy leaves and stems used to store water. All cacti are succulents, but not all succulents are cacti. An agave is a succulent, however, it is not a cactus or vice versa.



Agave – Century plant. This desert denizen is best known for its magnificent center stalk that can spike as high as 26 feet. While it does not take 100 years for a century plant to bloom, it does take a while. Most centuries have to be at least 10 years old before they can generate the spike, followed by its bloom. Following the magnificent spurt, the plant, which uses all of its energy in the process, dies. But all is not lost as the center plant usually germinates several pups under its thick, protective leaves. New, young plants ensure that the century will go on.



share their feelings about the funny-looking cactus bent at a sharp 90-degree angle that marked the entrance to his home. "It's the hit of the neighborhood," said Dr. Dorfman, recalling his neighbors' comments. When the couple moved in, the doctor said his neighbors pleaded, "Please don't take that out or no one will be able to find their way home." The cactus is most likely a variety known as an old man cactus named for its white, hairlike bristles. "It's about 10 to 11 feet tall and as healthy as a horse," said Dr. Dorfman, assuring his neighbors that the plant will be around for a long time. To make sure the old man has company, another variety of cactus affectionately referred to as Old Woman of Mexico is suitable for potting and just as furry white.

Ocotillo – Although its appearance may signal to some that the ocotillo is a cactus, it, in fact, is not. It is a tree, and one that is extremely sensitive to cold. When temperatures dip into a freeze, it is a good idea to wrap your ocotillo to ensure it survives the cold snap. A popular nickname for the ocotillo is living fence. During the early days of barbed wire, farmers and cowboys in the Southwest would cut off ocotillo branches to help stake their barbed wire fencing. Later, when they returned to check their fences, they discovered that their fence posts had rooted and begun to grow. For botanical professional Carol Wright, who moved into Sun City a year ago, taming her large corner lot was a challenge she met head-on. "You can plant xeriscape but it doesn't have to be boring," she said of the ocotillo, Leylandii cypress, red twig dogwoods, crepe myrtle and various trees she's planted to help break the strong winds that sweep across her back yard. "You can grow pretty much anything you want as long as you put the work in," she said. "I looked for fast-growing evergreens, researched their ecology and water usage, got online and had a drip system put in." In the next few years, Carol says her cypress will grow to provide a natural fence, while other plants like her canna lilies, hibiscus, irises, hybrid roses and Meyer lemon tree will mature to provide lots of color and a tasty treat.



Saguaro Cactus - Many Native American legends exist about these kings of the desert that link the cactus to the origin of man. Not all Saguaros develop arms, but the arms are perhaps the best way to judge the age of the plant. For example, a cactus with five arms is safely estimated to be about 200 years old, reports the Saguaro National Park Service in Tucson, Ariz. Saguaros are among the few cacti that flower at night. Their large flowers are designed to be pollinated by bats. "We bought the Saguaros in April 1996," said Silvia Lamay of the giant pair she had planted in her front yard when they moved in 17 years ago. In that time, Silvia said the cacti have grown about a foot. The shorter Saguaro, which stands roughly 20 feet, has four arms, while the larger one, standing about 25 feet tall, began to sprout buds that will eventually develop into arms. "When we bought the spear, I never thought I'd see it get arms and now, this year, I see it's beginning to get arms," said an excited Silvia. "I've always been in love with succulents and cactus. I started collecting cactus when I was in Los Angeles and this garden has been like this from the beginning. It's changed over the years because some plants didn't do that well and we've replanted ones that like it and do well."


#### Learn the Ancient Art of Hula


