From the Executive Director

Link Always Looking to Improve

The November 2012 resident survey conducted by the Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc., included the question: How can we improve the Link magazine? Responses from residents fell basically into eight categories:

In fact, the Link does sell enough advertising to pay for itself and even generates a profit that is used to offset Association expenses. The Link is 100-percent funded by its advertising revenue. NO Association funds, including resident dues, are ever used to help pay for the Link. The Link is staffed by two full-time people – a managing editor and an ad coordinator, plus one freelance graphic designer. In addition, the Link's editor is Patty Rosia, who is the executive director of SCSCAI.

The Link is available online at www.scscai.com. The magazine posts to the Association's website approximately the last week of the month (ie: the May Link will be



available online by about April 22). In addition, the Link is forwarded to snowbirds who fill out the appropriate Change of Address form at the Link office at Desert Vista. Forwarding the Link through the U.S. Post Office does not work.

The Link features

stories about residents and their accomplishments every month as space permits in the Community News and Neighbors sections. The magazine actively seeks resident input regarding story ideas to: Jeannette Carrillo, managing editor, 363-1546, or jeannettec@suncitylv.com.

As for new people on the Link editorial board, there have been two in the past two years. Residents are welcome to participate in or join the Link editorial board, especially if they have publishing experience. The Link board meets the third Friday of the month at 9 a.m. in the Committee Room at Desert Vista.

As a result of the survey, the Link has made several changes suggested by residents, and is in the process of researching other ideas, including:

Accomplished

- Increase the print size.
- Have a monthly calendar for restaurant specials/events.

• The Link accepts residents' complaints about advertisers and has pulled ads.

In Progress

- A business plan to create a Link website.
- Future articles by SCSCAI Board members that update projects.

• A Dining Deals section that features special offers by local restaurants to SCSCAI residents only.

The Link thanks all residents who participated in the survey.

 The President appointed the following Board members to the SCSCAI committees: Properties, Sue Papilion; ARC, Ken Caroccia; Golf Oversight, David Steinman; Finance, Jim Akers; Legal Services Committee, Bruce Alitt; Information Technology, Leo Crawford; Community Preparedness Committee, Leo Crawford; CCOC, Ellen Bachman; Fitness Advisory, Dick Danzak; Link Advisory and DHRC, Ken Resnik.

(Note: There will be some changes regarding chairmanships at the next Board meeting, but this is what occurred at the last BOD meeting.)

- The Board of Directors approved a motion for the executive director to contact the two (2) attorneys/ law firms recommended by the Legal Services Committee and request proposals from them to be SCSCAI's general counsel. Their proposals should include rates, contacts and other pertinent information as required by the executive director. Said proposals are to be supplied to the Board and to notify these two (2) firms that the BOD would interview them at the next Board meeting, which is an evening Board meeting (April 8, 2013).
- The Board of Directors approved a non-budgeted project to install a new audiovisual entertainment system at the Desert Vista and Pinnacle fitness centers. This new entertainment system includes flat screen televisions, transmitters, receivers and other necessary equipment. Costs are estimated at \$5,147 for Desert Vista and \$4,442 for the Pinnacle. The project was unanimously approved by the CAP Committee to install the new system in Pinnacle and Desert Vista for less than \$10,000.
- Motion to accept the audit for the year ending June 30, 2012, and submitted by Hilburn and Lein CPAs on October 31, 2012.



• Are your trees encroaching into your neighbor's property? If so, be a good neighbor and trim the limbs back.

• How about those palm trees? All dead fronds should be removed.

• Don't forget to clean up those pine needles and pine cones that collect on your property.

Landscape

May I Talk About Safety While Working in the Yard?



Firefighters from Las Vegas Fire and Rescue Station 107 responded to a small brush fire above the Desert Vista parking lot on March 18. According to fire officials, a spark created by welding work was responsible for igniting the blaze.

• When operating power equipment, always be sure to read and follow the safety recommendations before starting a job.

• Personal protection equipment also is very important. I have heard people say, "Well, I can't hear very well as it is, so I do not need to use ear plugs." This is false. As long as you still can hear you can cause damage. I'm not just talking about hearing loss. I knew a guy who refused to wear protection because he couldn't hear well. He damaged the hairs inside the ear so they constantly produced a buzzing noise. It affected his ability to sleep or concentrate -24/7, the buzzing never stopped. Before he died he told me it was like having a bee in his head and it drove him crazy. So use all the PPEs that are recommended.

• Please keep the areas under your large plants cleaned out. I know this is very difficult, but as you may know a fire can start with just one spark. It happened recently near the Desert Vista Community Center. Untrimmed bushes are also a place for unwanted creatures to live.

Remember, the safer you are in your garden, the more you can enjoy it.

Security Patrol — A Sun City Summerlin Organization 254-2303

Peddlers and Solicitors in Sun City Summerlin

In tough economic times, working people often must take second jobs to help pay their bills. That young man who delivered a pizza to your home last night could be working a full time job during the day. Door-to-door solicitors who are marketing products and services such as satellite communication systems, home security alarms and magazine subscriptions have become increasingly prevalent in our community as they try to supplement their income.

"Most of them are good people," said Sun City Security Patrol Chief Bill Schoening. "I'm concerned that we are not frightened by folks who are just trying to earn an honest living when they come to our doors. We need to know our rights, as well as those of the solicitors, and we must use sensible caution."

Residents should talk through their security door, but should not open their door to anyone who is not expected by or known to them.

It was turning dark recently when the Security Patrol's dispatcher heard from a resident complaining about solicitors at her door. The resident explained that two men were trying to interest her in purchasing a home security system. They were aggressive in attempting to persuade her to allow them into her home, she said. The dispatcher sent a Patrol driver to the resident and then spoke with two more callers who said they were upset by the same solicitors. The Patrol driver engaged the solicitors in conversation, explaining that they should not be disturbing residents after dark. He

suggested that they discontinue their efforts until the following day and confine their solicitations to daylight hours. Both argued that they intended to continue their activities until 9 p.m. "because people are at home in the evening." After a prolonged debate, the Patrol driver convinced the sales reps that they were harming their company's reputation and no residents would be receptive to their nighttime sales efforts.

The Las Vegas Municipal Code 6.62.120, concerning location restrictions for door-to-door peddlers or solicitors, reads: "No person shall attempt to peddle or solicit at any dwelling where there is displayed near its entrance a sign bearing the words "No Peddlers or Solicitors" or similar words. Residents who do not want to interact with solicitors should post such a publically visible sign on their property.

If ever concerned about safety, residents are encouraged to call Security Patrol headquarters at 254-2303.
