

- The Board of Directors unanimously approved the expenditure of \$7,139.43 to purchase the outdoor pool furniture at Mountain Shadows.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the Finance Committee's recommendation to the Board of Directors to accept Fireman's Fund package and automobile renewal proposal for coverage currently in place, provided by Cragin & Pike, to be effective March 1, 2014, with an estimated annual premium of \$307,501.
- ◆ The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the Finance Committee's recommendations to the Board of Directors to accept the Fireman's Fund renewal proposal for umbrella liability coverage currently in place, provided by Cragin & Pike, to be effective March 1, 2014, with an estimated annual premium of \$72,307.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the Finance Committee's recommendation that the Board of Directors accept the Endurance American Specialty Insurance Company renewal proposal for environmental impairment (pollution) liability, provided by Cragin and Pike, to be effective March 1, 2014, with an estimated annual premium of \$3,444.29.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the Aspen Specialty Insurance Company renewal proposal for network security and privacy liability, provided by Cragin and Pike, to be effective March 1, 2014, with an estimated annual premium of \$4,411.59. - The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the Sequoia/Am Trust Insurance Company renewal proposal for Workers Compensation, provided by Cragin and Pike, to be effective March 1, 2014, with an estimated annual premium of \$133,132.

- The Board of Directors unanimously approved a motion to accept the National Union Fire Insurance Company renewal proposal for Security Patrol Accidental Death and Dismemberment to be effective March 1, 2014, with an estimated annual premium of \$5,745.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved to reinstate the activities card of Ms. Doane, who previously had a card for 17 years.
- The Board of Directors unanimously approved the following: The Ad-Hoc restaurant committee recommends the Board of Directors approve the motion to accept the Summit Restaurant Strategic Plan that opens the Summit rooms to resident usage on days that it is not rented out for catered events. The plan allows residents to enjoy the view, socialize with others and purchase food and drink from the snack bar's proposed new and limited menu from 7 a.m. to the Pinnacle's closing time. Located at the rear of the Desert Vista parking lot, 10362 Sun City Blvd, is a very important building staffed entirely by resident volunteers, who offer three very valuable services to those living in Sun City Summerlin.

- In the center of the building is the headquarters of the Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol. Patrol officers watch over our community, 24/7. Rain or shine, 365 days a year, the office operates five patrol cars. Volunteer positions include police chief, watch commanders, drivers, dispatchers and information center personnel. The three Information Centers operate daily from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. to provide visitors with directions and to help answer community questions. Security patrol may be reached at 254-2303.
- At the east end is Sun City Charities. This organization provides help to residents seeking to contact government services, and provides assistance with errands or rides to the supermarket or doctor's office. Volunteers also help residents change light bulbs, minor handyman services and more. The office is open Monday through Friday, 8:30 to 11 a.m. For more information, call 254–5831.
- At the West end you will find the Sunshine Service Club. These volunteers provide wheelchairs, crutches, walkers, shower seats and other health-related necessities for resident use free of charge (must present an Association ID card at time of pickup). When grandkids come to visit, the office also stocks folding day beds, car seats, porta-cribs and highchairs. Sun City To Save \$8,000 With New Recycling Program

They're here, and you can't miss them – the big, blue recycling trash cans that debuted throughout Association buildings on January 5. Going forward, residents will be asked to help Sun City's recycling efforts by discarding acceptable items into the appropriate bins.

The recycling initiative was passed unanimously by the Board of Directors in October. # STOP Sign Accident Causes Major Damage

Sun City Summerlin resident Emily Arena was attempting to make a left-hand turn onto Thomas Ryan Boulevard at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, February 18, when she was hit full on by a 2005 Chevy pickup that failed to stop at the flashing **STOP** sign located on the corner of Thomas Ryan and Sun City boulevards.

Upon impact, both airbags in Emily's 1995 Cadillac Sedan DeVille deployed, causing various contusions to her upper torso, several bruised ribs and injuries to her hand and left foot. Emily's car, which she described in "pristine condition that didn't have a scratch on it" was damaged beyond repair.

"I'm lucky to be alive," said Emily. "It's a good thing I didn't have a passenger with me because they would probably be dead."

Emily was rushed by ambulance to Summerlin Hospital from the accident scene. She was released later the same day.

"I want to tell everybody about this, and how important it is to obey the law," Emily said.

"Everyone knows me in that car. Now, my heart is broken. My ribs are broken. This really has turned my life upside down and taken over my life," said Emily,



describing how, six days after the accident, she has hardly left her home due mainly to not feeling well. Every day, she said, brings a new set of aches and pains, but also because she has to be available to answer phone calls from her insurance company and schedule doctors' appointments.

Now, without a car, Emily said she has to rely on friends to take her places. While she is eligible for a car from her insurance company, she said she doesn't want to drive.

"At first I was in shock and now I'm angry and a bit uneasy about driving," Emily said. "There's no excuse for this – to ruin peoples' lives. We are all vulnerable because we have lawbreakers here."

and enjoyable for all. Our pool rules are in accordance with the SCSCAI Rules & Regulations and the Southern Nevada Health District guidelines.

- 1. On-site showering is required prior to entering and re-entering the pool or spa. If lotions are used, individuals must shower again. Appropriate swim attire must be worn (no cutoffs or street/gym clothes).
- 2. Street shoes are not allowed in the pools or pool areas. Clean pool shoes are acceptable.
- 3. Persons with a cold, cough, sore or inflamed eyes, any skin or communicable disease, or with open sores or bandages must not enter the pool or spa.
- 4. Diving, running and horseplay are not permitted. Climbing over, swinging, or leaning heavily on lane ropes or ramp rails is not permitted.
- 5. Pool toys, such as balls, rings, diving toys, etc., are not permitted. Oversized inflatable or flotation devices are not permitted. Exceptions are safety devices, kick boards, noodles and arm floaties, as long as they are used properly and not for horseplay.
- 6. Children (under 19) must be 42 inches tall (without shoes) to use the pool and must be supervised by an adult at all times. Children (under 19) are not allowed in the spas.
- 7. Lane users must share lanes with those performing similar activities (i.e. swimmers, walkers, etc.) as much as possible by circling or splitting the lane in half. Time in lap lanes is restricted to 30 minutes when others are waiting and sharing is not reasonable.
- 8. Lap swimming time is from 6 to 8 a.m. and 4 to 6 p.m. at indoor pools. During these times, priority is given to lap swimmers in three lanes and one lane is set aside for walkers to share.

Rule pamphlets are available at each fitness center monitor station. Also, please be sure to communicate basic rules to your guests so that everyone's visit will be consistent and enjoyable.

Sun City Summerlin was built by Del Web 25 years ago. The design was to give retired people a nice place to retire to, keep active and enjoy themselves. To sell homes, Del Webb did a lot of greenscapes to attract buyers throughout the country, and it built a beautiful community that you all are proud to call home.

Now, fast forward 25 years, and things are changing in the valley and in the Southwest in general. That change is water. Water is one of the most valued resources throughout the world, and it's even more valuable here in the desert. Due to the drought that keeps the snowfalls low on our side of the Rockies, water is the No. 1 topic that all public agencies deal with, and that includes what happens in Sun City.

In the past few years, residents have seen a reduction in the use of turf grasses throughout Sun City Summerlin.

#### Purpose:

Security Patrol's primary mission is to provide security for Sun City Summerlin Community Association, Inc. property and to act as the eyes and ears of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department in this neighborhood. This is accomplished by patrolling the streets throughout the community,

establishing a visual deterrent and inspecting Association property after normal operating hours. Patrol drivers travel our streets, 24/7. Through these uniformed, volunteer Patrol drivers, dispatchers and information center officers, this mission has been exceedingly successful. Statistics show that Sun City Summerlin's crime rate is significantly lower than in surrounding areas.

#### Responsibilities Within the Scope of the Patrol: Security Patrol WILL:

- Ensure that SCSCAI property is secure after normal working hours by checking every Association building door between 10 p.m. and 4 a.m.
  - Report suspicious vehicles, persons or activities
- Perform house checks requested by residents who are away from their homes
- Investigate 911 emergency lights and take appropriate action
- Investigate open garage doors between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m.
- Look for lost residents and pets, attempting to reunite them with their loved ones
- Attempt to resolve a situation, if concern for a resident is reported to the Patrol
- Respond to, and document, accidents or incidents involving Association property
- Respond to alarms at Association golf cart barns, interacting with the alarm company and Metro
  - Provide a presence at special events when requested
- Deliver interdepartmental mail among Association buildings, twice daily
- Refer resident queries to the correct source if an issue does not relate to a Security Patrol function
- Report malfunctioning street lights, water leaks and road hazards
  - Provide assistance to residents in a disaster

 Cooperate with and assist Metro, Fire and Emergency responders when requested

# Functions Not Within the Scope of the Patrol

Security Patrol officers DO NOT:

- Handle tasks routinely accomplished only by law enforcement officers; neither do they enforce SCSCAI regulations
  - Do not patrol outside of Sun City Summerlin
  - Patrol in commercial areas
  - Attempt to arrest anyone
  - Carry weapons or restraint devices
  - Cite vehicles for moving or parking violations
  - Chase or stop speeding or suspicious vehicles
- Attempt to chase any persons out of Sun City Summerlin
  - Perform traffic control on public property or streets
  - · Investigate vehicle accidents, burglaries or vandalism
- Cite violations of SCSCAI Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions
  - Become involved in disputes
  - Attempt crowd control on public property
- Enter private homes or vehicles without an owner or neighbor present
  - Open locked doors or jump-start private vehicles
  - Use the Patrol car to push or pull private vehicles
- Transport civilians or animals in Patrol cars, unless approved by the watch commander



#### STATISTICS

In one month, Security Patrol officers alerted residents to 324 garage doors that had been left open after dark. They also did 447 house checks for vacationing residents and investigated 64 flashing emergency lights. The Information Centers at community entrances gave directions to 264 visitors and the five Patrol cars added 15,416 miles to their combined odometers.

# **Architectural Review Committee**

#### Some Information From Community Standards

It is not unusual for us to receive the same questions over and over from residents. This month, we are providing some of the information that is frequently requested. The Development Standards have recently been revised and updated, and will be included in your May Link. Please be sure to look for them.

Mailboxes – If you live in a single-family home, your mailbox and post is your responsibility. Your mailbox should be either black or white (depending on where you reside). All posts within the community are black. If they are faded, rusted or any other color, they need attention. If you need to replace the mailbox you probably will not be able to find an exact model. Replace it with one as close as possible to the original. They can be found at Lowe's or Home Depot, or call Community Standards at 966-1411 if you have questions.

**Sidewalks** – The sidewalk in front of your property is YOUR responsibility. If it is cracked or raised, it is up to you to repair it. If the damage is caused by a utility box of some kind, you can contact the company to see if they will repair the problem. You should also take care that your landscape rock does not become a tripping hazard by spilling onto the sidewalk.

Tree Limbs – Are your trees encroaching into your neighbor's property or over a sidewalk? If so, be a good neighbor and trim the limbs back. If the limbs are encroaching over a sidewalk, City of Las Vegas Code Enforcement will contact you if you do not maintain them. The City's requirement is that the limbs must be higher than 8 feet from the sidewalk.

**Corner Lots** – If you live on a corner lot that is separated from the street by a wall, remember, YOU are responsible for the maintenance of the strip of landscaping in between.

**Parking** – If you park your vehicle on your driveway, make sure that it is pulled up enough so as not to block the sidewalk. If you park in the street, please do not park any part of the vehicle on the sidewalk.

**Trash pickup** – Our pickup days are Tuesday and Friday. Trash can be picked up as early at 6 a.m. If your trash is not available for pickup at that time, Republic Services will not return to get it.

**Sub-association residents** – Remember that sub-association owners must first submit an ARC Application

to his/her association president for approval before submitting the application to the ARC.

Neighbor to Neighbor Issues – A complaint is deemed a Neighbor-to-Neighbor issue when a "considerable number of persons" are not affected by the problem. A Neighbor-to-Neighbor issue is considered a private nuisance.

Neighbor-to-Neighbor issues can involve a broad range of topics, including property line issues, party-walls, seeping walls, views, trees, shrubs, blowing leaves, parking, pet and bird issues, noise, odors and blowing trash to anything that enters your property from a neighbor's property that you feel interferes with the peaceful use and enjoyment of your property.

When the Community Standards Office receives a Neighbor-to-Neighbor complaint, one courtesy notice is sent to the offending party advising them of the alleged problem. If the issue is not resolved, the complainant can contact the appropriate city agency (animal control: 229-6444 #2; code enforcement: 229-6615; parking enforcement: 229-6432; Clark County Neighborhood Justice Center: 455-3898). The NJC helps resolve conflicts at no cost through a comprehensive information and referral program and through mediation services. Mediation is a process that assists disputing parties to resolve their differences confidentially and reach a mutually satisfactory agreement with the help of a trained, neutral third party mediator.

## Volunteers Work Toward Solutions in Water Savings,

**Energy Efficiency** 

As committee chairwoman of the Common Area Properties Committee, I am very proud that the committee has accomplished so much. Here is a list of additional projects that your fellow residents have worked on besides inspecting every

building, golf course and landscaped area.

- 1. Developed a new three-year Landscape Strategy Plan, which sets Sun City Summerlin on a path of water conservation while maintaining the beauty of our community. The committee recognized that many of our plants are slowly dying due to old age and heat stress, so a replanting guideline was developed that is aimed at ending the overcrowding of plantings. The landscape committee also met with the Las Vegas Water Authority to learn about programs to help reduce more of our grass areas because grass needs 6 feet of water to survive our summers. This plan was adopted and is in effect now. As staff action plans are solidified, more details on what exactly will help water reduction will be available.
- 2. The green sub-committee looked at electrical usage and developed a two-year baseline of usage so improvement can be tracked. Solar energy was seriously looked at in the form of covers over the parking lots, on golf carts and for the swimming pools, but it is still too expensive for the benefits. The golf courses use the most electricity pumping water, so the committee mapped out where some cuts in usage can be made at night. The green committee has now morphed into one that is driven by the executive director and staff since their budget performance is based on reducing expenses.
- 3. Reviewed requests for capital expenditures for fiscal year 2015 to make sure that it would be money spent on items that really needed replacement. Cost benefit analysis and total cost of ownership calculations were used to help justify the committee's recommendations to the board.
- 4. Resurfacing of the Desert Vista Parking lot was stopped by CAP because it was necessary to find a way to stop the spreading cracks instead of just covering them
