# SECURITY PATROL SECURITY PATRO

#### From the Chief



**Brian Dodd,** Chief, Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol

"Well, what the @#&!\*% use is Security Patrol if you don't do xxx?" These are among the more devastating words a Patrol dispatcher can hear from a resident whom she or he is trying to help, especially considering that the dispatcher may be volunteering four or eight hours of shift work each week. To check what Security Patrol can and can't do,

readers can consult the list provided in April's Link magazine. From the list, you will see that we do a lot of diverse things, including ensuring our Association property is secure at night and providing a visible crime-deterring presence in our community. Mostly what we don't do is enforce anything, including CC&Rs. If you call us about something that you see is illegal or wrong, most of the time we will ask you to make the report directly and give you the phone number if needed.

A new activity the Patrol is starting is getting in touch with residents who have been targets of crime, asking if we can talk privately with them. It is entirely voluntary. Their answers might help us to recognize emerging trends and provide compatible safety information to Link magazine and Link website readers.

A major frustration we face is when we become aware of a crisis, yet can't do anything about getting it solved because the affected resident has not completed an emergency contact form. Either that, or the information on the form is not current. Imagine that you are away and we see water pouring out of your house or garage. If you have not given us a local emergency contact person who has a key to your house, we can't investigate it and the best we can do is get the water turned off outside, which may result in your plants dying.

An even more serious example is a neighbor who hasn't seen you in a while and notices an accumulation of mail and newspapers. When that good neighbor becomes concerned enough to call Security Patrol, we have a sequence of

measures we take that gradually escalate until the situation is resolved. Ultimately, it may result in Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department officers accessing your house by using a locksmith's services. How much easier it is when we can take care of the concern ourselves by calling your local emergency contact person. With proper approval, we can enter your home with your neighbor to see if you are lying on the floor, or just traveling away from home while having forgotten to cancel the mail and newspaper.

Emergency contact forms are available at Security Patrol headquarters at Desert Vista; at Mountain Shadows community center or on the Association's web site, www.scscai.com. Complete the requested information and take it to the administration department at Mountain Shadows. Do it now. We are all about "neighbors helping neighbors. Help us to help you.

Know that they are there to help you.







# **Safety Tips** Cynthia Beck, Crime Reporter, Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol

- Door peepholes cost less than \$10 and can be installed at any level on the front door.
- Unbreakable clear window film placed on the window next to front door costs approximately \$100, installed.
- When leaving on vacation, place a piece of furniture in front of the sliding patio doors. I place a small credenza with a lamp on it. Lamp is then on a timer.

#### Fresh Face for Desert Vista Parking Lot

Work to repave the Desert Vista parking lot began as scheduled on Sunday, June 1, with the removal of concrete bumper blocks. With that task accomplished, a crew of workers from American Asphalt set about replacing the old asphalt. The project continued for two weeks without incident and was completed on time and on budget (\$401,678.28). The project calls for a slurry seal to be applied 10 to 12 months from now. The overall contract includes a three-year limited guarantee of work (warranty).

#### **Mail Theft**

Residents should take precautions to reduce their chance of becoming victims of mail theft.

# AARP Income Tax Program Needs Your Help

# Landscape

#### The Men in Orange

I'd like to take the opportunity this month to introduce residents to their Landscape Department, better known as the men in orange, who work extremely hard to keep Sun City's trees, flowers, medians, green belts and community areas blooming and beautiful.

Overall, the Landscape Department is made up of 11 groundskeepers, a mechanic, a spray tech, three irrigators, two mow crews, a superintendent and me.

Each day begins at 5:30 a.m. and wraps up at 2 p.m. Crews take their morning break where they happen to be working at 8:30 a.m. and resume their individual tasks at 8:45 a.m. At 11 a.m. they return to the shop, located on Villa Ridge Drive near the intersection of Lotus Hill, and have lunch. Once a week, usually after lunch when all members are assembled in one place, we have a safety meeting during which I also check on the progress of the day's work.

Over the course of the week, tasks are assigned to different days. For example, on Monday we have a morning trash run. Each employee walks his area and picks up any trash he finds. Also on Mondays, we check all the equipment – oil and other fluids, lights, and turn signals, etc. – to ensure everything is functioning properly. On Fridays during pool season, workers are assigned to the fitness centers to clean the pool areas.

In general, crews are divided into small groups of one or two and assigned an area that they maintain. Del Webb



Boulevard has two workers who are responsible for maintaining the streetscapes; Mountain Shadows has one worker and so on. As for water, three irrigators are responsible for irrigation, hand watering and checking plant moisture. Weed maintenance and fertilization throughout all common areas require one spray tech. The largest crew, made up of three workers, handles turf – mowing, edging, line trimming, as well as tree and dead animal removal.

Now the fun stuff begins. For special projects like landscape construction, adding boulders, rock, concrete, rock walls or paver stones, I have two workers.

Last but not least, a mechanic works on the equipment, doing oil changes, tune-ups and helping with other tasks as needed.

So the next time you see your men in orange, be sure to give a wave. It's a great way to say thanks for all the hard work they do.

## Health & Fitness

#### **Enjoying Our Pools!**

Our fitness centers are used daily by hundreds if not thousands of residents who enjoy the wonderful amenities. Among these amenities are the pools and spas, which offer some of the most enjoyed activities at Sun City Summerlin. In order for all residents to enjoy their

experience at the pools, we suggest picking up a rules pamphlet from the monitor's desk and becoming familiar with the pool rules and water classes.

Showering & Sanitation Laws: Showering before entering the pool or spa is required by the Southern Nevada Health District as a means to help reduce contaminants. It is also highly recommended to rinse off by showering after exiting the pool. Although chlorine (salt or liquid) is necessary to keep the pools clean and sanitary, showering after swimming will keep your skin and suit in healthier condition. No adult disposable briefs are allowed to be worn in the pool or spa.

**Pool Chemicals:** Pools and spas are maintained on a nightly basis by the maintenance department's licensed pool operators. Chemical levels are checked nightly and balanced to be within guidelines. Chemical levels are also tested by an outside agency on a regular basis. Pools and spas are drained and water is changed at least every six months. When necessary (usually due to contamination) pools and spas are drained and refilled requiring a two-to-three-day closure.

Pool Water and Bodily Fluids: Association rules and the Health District restrict individuals with any open sores from entering a pool or spa. Regardless of where the open sore is, you cannot enter the pool or spa (even if the sore is on top of your head). For those who like to spend hours walking in the pool, please remember to vacate the pool often and use the restroom. Studies show that swimming pool urine combined with chlorine creates many health risks for individuals. Please use good hygiene and do not urinate in the pools or spas.

**Pool Water and Air Temperatures:** Indoor pool water temperatures are held between 85 to 87 degrees. Air temperatures are held as close to the water temperature as possible. Outdoor pool temperatures are more difficult to control depending on overnight temperatures and the presence of wind. During the high heat of summer, the heater is not used and the temperature of the water is determined by the sun.

# **Community Standards**

#### Some Information From Community Standards

It is not unusual for us to receive the same questions over and over from residents. Much of this information was provided in the April 2014 Link, but it was asked again during the June Coffee with the Board meeting.



Mailboxes: If you live in a single-family home, your mailbox and post are your responsibility. Mailboxes should be black or white (depending on where you reside. All posts within the community are black). If they are faded, rusted or any other color, they need attention. If you need to replace the mailbox you will not be able to find an exact model. Replace it with one as close as possible to the original. Some of these models also are available in locking units. They can be found at Lowe's or Home Depot, as well as many other retail outlets.

To ensure the safety of your mail, it is recommended by the post office to deposit your mail in the U.S. post boxes located inside the parking lots at Desert Vista, Mountain Shadows and the Pinnacle.

**Sidewalks:** The sidewalk in front of your property is your responsibility. If it is cracked or raised, it is up to you to repair it. If the damage is caused by a utility box of some kind, you can contact the company to see if they will repair the problem. You should also take care that your landscape rock does not become a tripping hazard by spilling onto the sidewalk.

**Corner Lots:** If you live on a corner lot that is separated from the street by a wall, remember, you are responsible for the maintenance of the strip of landscaping in between.

Tree Limbs: Are your trees encroaching into your neighbor's property or over a sidewalk? If so, be a good neighbor and trim the limbs back. If the limbs are encroaching over a sidewalk, city of Las Vegas code enforcement will contact you. The city's requirement is

that tree limbs must be higher than eight (8) feet from the sidewalk.



**Palm trees:** If the fronds on your palm trees are brown and drooping, it is time to have them trimmed.

Pine needles and pine cones: These annoyances can make your yard look unkempt. They must be raked up or blown off and removed from the property. Please be mindful of the appearance of your property.

Home Exterior: If you plan to repaint your home, you can stop by the Community Standards office and browse through our approved color catalog. The book may not be removed from our office. If it is more convenient, you can stop by Dunn Edwards Paints, 7450 W. Lake Mead Blvd., where there is a copy of Sun City Summerlin's approved color catalog. All applications for painting must have color samples attached when submitted to the Architectural Review Committee for approval. The Community Standards office does not supply paint samples.

**Estate/Moving Sales:** If you are moving or have had a death in the household, one two-day sale is permitted. A sale permit must be obtained from the Community Standards office and displayed at the residence on the day(s) of the sale. Items offered for sale must be the property of the resident requesting the sale. The Association reserves the right to enter the property to verify.
