### From the Executive Director

# Report Changes to Property Ownership as Soon as Possible

With a community the size of Sun City Summerlin, we have lots of projects that are in the works. One of the projects I am directly overseeing is updating homeowners' files. This consists of 7,089 homeowners. Not only do we have a physical file for each owner with their immediate information, but the information is kept in the Association's computer system.

One area that is critical for our record keeping is ownership of property. When there is a change of ownership, i.e. a sale of a property or change of a property ownership into a trust, we need to update SCSCAI's records to reflect that change. If you refer to the Association's bylaws Article VII: Officers 7.11 Executive Director: (h), "Maintain in the Association office accurate identifying information." You also can refer to additional sections of the bylaws, Article II: Members and Residency, 2.1 Membership Qualifications: (a) and (b), for even more clarification. As the executive director, I have an obligation on behalf of the Association to ensure that records of the Association are accurate.

For example:

Mary Smith (the owner of the property when it was purchased by Mary Smith)
Mary Smith Trust (after checking the Assessors information, Mary Smith recently
put her property into a trust)

Once information is updated, SCSCAI files can accurately reflect property ownership on the administrative side.

This type of property title change requires that the homeowner come into the Administration office to receive a new activities card in order to continue to use the facilities. This is a 5-minute process. If you go to one of the facilities or to a pro shop and are informed that your card has been deactivated, you will need to come to the Administration office so we can verify the reason. If your card was deactivated due to a property title update, we can replace your card quickly.

Please do not delay coming into Administration to complete the process. It is imperative that your information is accurate not only on our end, but with your activities card. We appreciate everyone's assistance in helping us get this project completed and apologize for any inconvenience. If you have any questions, please call me directly at 966-1409.

### A Reminder from Community Standards

Any changes or modifications made to the exterior of a residential property are subject to the governing documents of the Association, and prior approval by the Architectural Review Committee is required.

Lately, we have had many problems with changes to the exterior of homes without ARC approval. Ultimately, the homeowner shall bear the cost of correcting any violation. To avoid the possibility of such costly errors, please have a copy of an approved application in your hands before any exterior work on your property begins. If you have any questions, please call the Community Standards office at 966-1411.

## **Finance Committee**

### No ... Increase in Dues

There will be NO increase in membership annual dues for fiscal year 2015. The annual assessment will be \$1,284; the same as last year. A breakdown of annual dues is: \$1,062 for daily operations; \$192 to capital reserves and \$30 to new capital acquisitions.

The Association's reserve study has been updated. The current estimated reserve balance for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, is \$13,903,422. The SCSCAI Board had previously approved 80 percent funding as its goal; reserve funding should be at an 80 percent level at the end of fiscal 2015.

### Major capital reserve expenditures for 2015:

- Resurface Sun Shadows bocce ball courts.
- New pool furniture for Mountain Shadows.
- Remodel restrooms and slurry coat cart paths at Highland Falls.
- Remodel restrooms and hallway at Palm Valley.
- Turf reduction also will be done throughout the community to help save on water and maintenance expenses.

All of these are projected expense and revenue estimates for the year ending June 30, 2015.

We need to thank Linda Mertz, director of finance, and her staff for their excellent work in preparing and finalizing the 2015 budget.

The Association is in the planning stages for celebrating its 25th anniversary in October. A number of events are being planned at this time. All are welcome to participate in the planning, and all residents are encouraged to celebrate with the community by attending these special events.





### Reminiscing Tours of Duty: Writers Workshop's James Rankin Shares Tales of 30-year Career

ol. James C. Rankin, USAF, Ret., joined the Army Air Corps in 1943 in the middle of World War II and was stationed at Biggs Field, El Paso, Texas, After arriving in England he was pulled from his position as bombardier and sent to radar navigation school.

"At that time the group had more bombardiers than navigators," Rankin recalled.

Rankin's experience as a 1st lieutenant in post-war Germany, working with a German-speaking master sergeant, resulted in some important lessons learned early:

- 1. Sometimes things are not what they seem to be. Make sure you have the facts right before making a decision.
- 2. Never sit when someone is working. Two people working together will catch an error.

In 1955, Rankin, by that time a captain, transferred to Misawa Air Base in post-war Japan, where he flew F-86s (saber jets). Approximately 18 years later, Rankin was again stationed in Japan, this time on Okinawa, the southernmost island in the Ryukyu chain. As a full colonel, and director of flying at Kadena Air Base, Rankin had the opportunity to observe the differences between the Germans and Japanese with regard to being occupied by the United States military.


"The Germans were very afraid of us immediately after the war," Rankin said. "They would get off the sidewalk and into the street if possible when they saw us approach. They would stop what they were doing as we approached and watch as if they expected to be told to do something. Later, in a few months they (Germans) became more at ease and would speak first and often smile before we smiled at them.

"Japan was a different story, from my viewpoint," Rankin said. "They were even more afraid, early on, and almost obsequious. Perhaps it was their nature to be super cautious."

Between 1963 and 1968, Rankin and his family were stationed at Nellis Air Force Base in North Las Vegas, where he was assigned as a special assistant to the group commander. During this time, Rankin also was stationed in Oslo, Norway, as part of North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) operations.

"A great assignment," he said. "We loved both stations."

During Vietnam Rankin flew 126 missions in a specially equipped Phantom jet, where he was assigned to photograph North Viet Nam targets.

A brand new Colonel in 1970, Rankin was now working in the Pentagon for the Joint Chiefs of Staff. He was assigned to Lieutenant General (three-star) Louis Seith. Rankin recalled that the biggest, most involved project he worked on involved reorganizing the two Air Forces in NATO.

"In six weeks, we developed seven options that included hardware and logistics, and cost for each option. Since I knew the details of the options, I accompanied General Seith to meetings that were held to get approval of each military service and the secretary of state, Henry Kissinger," Rankin said.

### Malicious Scam Targets Bereaved Spouse

The loss of a loved one is difficult enough; still, the family of the deceased must be aware of the realities of scammers who may target them when they are emotionally vulnerable and less likely to be at their apprehensive best. There are cruel, but very clever thieves who read newspaper obituaries daily, looking for target victims to defraud. The ruse is particularly effective when a scammer relates factual information to the spouse of the deceased. Be especially cautious to avoid providing facts in a newspaper obituary that provide extensive biographical information about the deceased.

One particular swindle involves someone making contact with a surviving spouse by contriving a situation to claim an outstanding debt.

It goes something like this:

A phone call follows an obituary notice in the daily newspaper. The scammer identifies him or herself as a claims adjustor from a nationally recognizable life insurance company. Their job, they say, is to reconcile policies so that death benefits can be settled. They go on to advise the spouse, as the deceased's beneficiary, that there is a life insurance payout of X-amount, usually in the thousands of dollars, that they are about to forfeit because premiums are in arrears. However, if the spouse immediately remits the delinquent payments, the death benefit will be settled.

These alleged insurance adjustors can be persuasive. They relate personal information and are reasonably convincing. They know, and mention throughout the conversation, the names of employers, the deceased spouse's career and other such information. They take advantage of the fact that a spouse may be reviewing social security, pension and life insurance policies, and are hoping to cash in on timing.

One such scam was attempted on me, following the recent death of my husband.

In this case, the claims adjustor demanded I take care of the delinquent payments immediately.

"This must be taken care of right away," she told me. "It is important that you do not delay in correcting the policy so that a \$44,942 death benefit can be paid to you."

She told me to write down the amounts of the missed premium payments. The total, \$953, would have to be sent "right away," and she would instruct me about where to

wire the payment. At that point, knowing for sure that it was a scam attempt, I challenged her and she hung up.

Successful scams favor three incentives: greed, fear and immediacy. Never respond to intimidation that something bad will happen if you don't take "immediate action." And always be suspicious of anyone who instructs you to wire funds.

First, if you drive along Thomas Ryan Boulevard close to Anasazi, you will notice crews have been reducing plantings in the landscape. Not only will this save on water, but it will give the area a clean look. The plan is

to use rock, boulders, decorative walls and some art. Second is the patio area at Desert Vista, where the arts and crafts room is located. We have been killing the ornamental grass in the area to help make the patio more user friendly. Existing trees and plants will be removed and then two new trees and four pots with existing Sago palms that will be transplanted from another location will be installed. The area that is currently a planter section will be refitted with brick pavers to allow more people to sit and enjoy the view. If you notice any plants at intersections that block your visibility or keep you from making safe turns, let the Landscape Department know ASAP and we will look at it as quickly as possible. ## **Community Preparedness Committee**

### When the Heat Is On

In recent years, excessive heat has caused more deaths than all other weather events, including floods. A heat wave is a prolonged period of excessive heat, often combined with excessive humidity. Generally, temperatures remain 10 degrees or more above the average high temperature for the region during summer months and last for a long period of time.

- Listen to local weather reports and stay aware of upcoming temperature changes.
- Discuss heat safety precautions with members of your household.
- Have a plan for whenever you spend time at home, work or recreation.
- Have an emergency operations plan.
- Prepare for the unknown, such as a power outage. Be cautious about the need for fire prevention around the garage and outside areas of your home.
- Know where to go if your home's air conditioning fails cooling station or relief center.
- Assist elderly or sick neighbors. They are more likely to become victims of excessive heat and may need assistance.
- Ensure that pet needs for water and shade are met.
- You may wish to get trained in first aid to learn how to treat heat-related emergencies.

### What to Do During a Heat Wave


- Never leave children or pets alone in an enclosed vehicle.
- Stay hydrated by drinking plenty of fluids, even if you do not feel thirsty.
- Avoid drinks with caffeine or alcohol
- Eat small meals and eat more often.
- Take frequent breaks if you must work outdoors. Postpone outdoor games or activities.
- Check on pets to ensure that they are not suffering from the heat.

# How to Recognize and Care for Heat-related Emergencies

- **Heat Cramps** are muscular pains and spasms that usually occur in the legs or abdomen. They are caused by exposure to high heat. This is often an early sign that the body is having trouble with the heat.
- **Heat exhaustion** typically involves the loss of body fluids through heavy sweating. Signs of heat exhaustion include cool, moist, pale or flushed skin, heavy sweating, headache, nausea, dizziness, weakness and exhaustion.

### Treatment for Heat-related Emergencies


- Move the person to a cooler place. Remove or loosen tight clothing and apply a cool, wet cloth or towel to the skin.
- Fan the person. If conscious, give small amounts of cool water to drink. Make sure the person drinks the water slowly. If the person refuses water, vomits or begins to lose consciousness, call 911 immediately.





### ■ COLORFUL HISTORY, MEMBERS POPULATE PAN CLUB

Not only does the club have a funny-sounding name, but it comes with a pretty interesting history, said Pan Club President Linda Harrington. *Panguingue* (pronounced pan-ginn-gay), or Pan, is played every Tuesday from 11:15 a.m. to 3 p.m. inside the Mint, Sahara and Thunderbird rooms at Mountain Shadows.

"It was started by ladies looking for love, shall we say, in Alaska as a way to pass the time in between tricks," said Club member Luanne Toberman, shedding some light on the game's heritage. In fact, there's even a list of curious lingo one must become familiar with when learning to play Pan.

"You don't shuffle the cards, you muck them," said Elayne Tessler as she readied her table for the afternoon session. And, yes, there's even a mucker, or dealer.

As the games get going, words and phrases like "bong," "go on top" and "peckered" become part of the colorful conversations.

"Pan is a lot like gin rummy because you meld," or build sequences as you go along, said Elayne.

Popularized in the western United States during the gold rush of the mid-1800s, Pan is categorized along with rummy games. In Sun City, tables are made up of roughly eight players. Eight card decks are used with the 8s, 9s and 10s removed. Each player is dealt 10 cards. The remainder of the deck is placed face down and the top card is turned face up to begin the discard pile. The object of the game is to build sequences using 11 cards and then come out.

The Pan Club's current roster lists 128 members, a decline over the 169 members it had last year. And so Linda is doing a bit of promotion to get players interested.



"I never played cards until I came here," said Linda. "It's a fun, easy game. If you have card sense, you'll pick it up. I took lessons and in two days Al (the club's designated teacher) threw me out. He told me, 'You can do it.'"

To help those unfamiliar with the game, Al Weiner offers lessons every Thursday from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. It's a great way to see if Pan is for you. Lessons are free and do not count toward the two invitation sessions every Sun City club offers residents curious about membership.

While every table in the room plays Pan during the assigned club time, Linda said each tables' rules are a little different. Each table has a designated monitor, who determines table policy.

While women outnumber the men in Pan, there are a few males who dot the tables, and Linda said the club is always looking for new players – men, women, couples, friends.

"It's a great game to play. It keeps people out of the casinos and it's on our premises," said Ardith Asher, whose male-heavy table takes up residence at the back of the room.

"A mixed table is the best," said Sharon Carlson, sitting to Ardith's right.

Sharon and Ardith's table is made up of four men and two women.

"We have more fun than the others," Sharon said.




