Being social or getting together with friends and family is very important to everyone. Social activities are the essence of Sun City Summerlin, but where those activities once revolved around clubs, it is changing to activities involving food, music and conversation. In the past, Sun City had restaurants, but they became unsuccessful as national restaurant chains and casinos opened up nearby competition. While Sun City still owns the restaurants in the community and keeps them open for golfers, the association strives to find a solution to how it

can better serve non-golfers while still providing the concessions and refreshments all golfers require.

The Vista Grille has now been successfully leased to Five Star Tavern that serves good food and offers gaming and cocktails in a non-smoking environment. It has become a very popular place for dinner.

Tavern at the Falls, located next to Highland Falls Golf Course, not only serves food for golfers for breakfast and lunch, but it has become a favorite spot for women who gather for lunch. There are tasty salads, homemade soups and wonderful desserts available on a newly crafted menu. The Tavern at the Falls is not open for dinner, but it has a fun daily happy hour from 4-6 p.m. There is also a football brunch offered every Sunday so you can watch the game on the new large televisions. Plan on enjoying Thanksgiving dinner at the Tavern at the Falls. A holiday dinner will be served on Thursday, November 27, from noon to 6 p.m., for \$19.99 per person, which includes pie for dessert. Make your reservations now at 228-2136.

The Summit was a restaurant a long time ago, but it now serves as a rental venue and a fun gathering spot where residents can meet and socialize. Happy hour is served between 4 and 6 p.m., and there is a wide selection of wine and cocktails. Sandwiches are back on the menu, along with soup and chili. We are working on a plan to have live music at the Summit once a week and who knows what else. The Summit is open daily from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. to all residents, even if they don't want to eat because it is a place to meet others, first and foremost. 
President's Message

Community Preparedness Committee

Emergency Community Communications Unit

When telephone, radio, television and satellite systems become non-functional due to a disaster, the Sun City emergency communicators support the Sun City CPC emergency center. The unit is made up of amateur radio operators and auxiliary communication members.

It is the duty of CPC communicators to operate the Emergency Operations Center during emergencies to provide support to the Board of Directors, Sun City's departments, community and fitness enters, coordinating realtime information between Sun City Summerlin Security Patrol and managing radio communication interoperability with county, city, state emergency management and nongovernment organizations such as hospitals, the Red Cross, Salvation Army and churches. The Emergency Operations Center is the main gathering point where all information is collected and decisions are made.

It is important that Sun City residents be prepared in the event of a disaster or emergency. Have a family communications plan. Listen to TV and radio bulletins, if available. Have a plan for contacting or finding one another should an event occur. Some suggestions include:

- Make plans with relatives or friends outside Sun City, preferably out of state with household members with emergency contact information.
- Discuss how to prepare for emergencies that are most likely to happen here in Sun City. Read Community Preparedness Committee articles in the Link and attend Link seminars and training courses offered by the Community Preparedness Committee, Sun City Security and Las Vegas Fire & Rescue Station 107.
- Choose two places to meet:
 - 1. Right outside your home in case of a sudden emergency, such as a fire.
 - 2. Outside your neighborhood, in case you cannot return home or are asked to evacuate.

Choose an out-of-area emergency contact person. It may be easier to text or call long distance if local phone lines are overloaded or out of service. (For example, a different area code might work while a local area code may not work.)

If you have to evacuate:

• Decide where you would go and what route to take. You may choose to go to a hotel/motel, stay with friends or

relatives in a safe location, or go to an evacuation shelter set up in Sun City.

- Practice evacuating your home. Drive your planned evacuation route and plot alternate routes on your map in case roads are impassable.
- Plan ahead for your pets. Keep a phone list of petfriendly hotels/motels and animal shelters along your evacuation routes.

We are always looking for Sun City residents who are interested in volunteering and becoming part of the Sun City Emergency Operations unit. The only qualification we require is a willingness to "help one another when in need." For more information or to join, call Ken Johnson, 254-5840.

Remember, if you ever see any ice on walkways, report it as soon as possible so we can treat it. Call 254-4092 or 363-7655.

The other thing I wanted to bring up is how to notify me if there is an issue that needs to be dealt with. My office number is 254-4092, or you can call Lydia at the Golf Course Maintenance Department at 363-7655 and she will take a message. **Please do not make a request directly to a landscape staff member.** They are not allowed to make a decision or stop what they are doing to fulfill a request. All work requests must come through me from the office. Please understand that the chain of command must be followed. I appreciate your help with this.

EQUIPMENT ORIENTATION

Do You Have High Blood Pressure?

It is estimated that 1 out of 4 adults in the United States has elevated blood pressure, and that more than 30 percent of them are unaware of this fact. Since persons with hypertension may not exhibit any symptoms, they often go undiagnosed until complications occur. Regular blood pressure screening can fac-

ilitate early diagnosis and treatment, and reduce the risk of further complications associated with hypertension.

Blood pressure is the force exerted against the artery walls as blood is carried through the circulatory system. Blood pressure is recorded as a measurement of this force in relation to the heart's pumping activity, and it is measured in millimeters of mercury (mmHg). The top number, or systolic pressure, is the measurement of the pressure that occurs when the heart contracts or beats. The bottom number, or diastolic pressure, is the measurement recorded between beats, while the heart is at rest. The systolic number is placed over the diastolic number. An example would be 110/70 (read as 110 over 70).

Hypertension, or high blood pressure, is an indicator that the force required for blood flow is greater than normal. According to the Sixth Report of the Joint National Committee on Detection, Evaluation and Treatment of High Blood Pressure (JNC VI), a blood pressure measurement of less than 130/85 is considered "normal;" 130-140/85-90 is defined as "high normal." For more information, see accompanying chart.

Blood pressure is considered to be elevated when repeated measurement is greater than 140/90 of either the systolic, diastolic or both measurements. A diagnosis of hypertension is made when a person has had two or more elevated readings after the initial assessment. For your convenience, Summerlin Hospital provides free monthly blood pressure screenings for residents. For dates, times, see the box below.



Bev Frase: A Hero For Children

Bev Frase is a widow who has lived in Sun City for 18 years. I met the sweet, 84-year-old in the arthritis exercise class, where everyone knows her because at the beginning of class she lets out a loud whistle that alerts all members to quiet down and be ready for exercise! Bev told me her brothers were jealous because they couldn't learn to whistle like her. But that is not her only talent.

As a young married mom with a working husband and three little girls, Bev decided that since she loved children so much she would take in foster children. So she applied to the department of Social Services in Milwaukee for her license.

"I didn't do it for the money, that's for sure. We were paid about \$25 per month for each child. I did it for the satisfaction of providing a stable home for these babies," Bev said.

Bev said that she only had newborns to begin with, but that the children stayed with her sometimes for two or three years.



"But one little boy, Kevin, stayed with us until he was 5 years old. By that time he was an absolute part of our family and I couldn't give him up, no sir. So, we adopted him. ... Eventually he put himself through college and today he is a vice president of the U.S. Bank in Milwaukee. ... I love him dearly, and he loves me, too."

"And my daughters loved the babies as much as I did," Bev said. "It was a perfect home for training my children to become loving, nurturing mothers themselves, and I'm proud to say that they have been wonderful mothers."

A notary public is an official of integrity appointed by state government, typically the secretary of state, to serve as an impartial witness in performing frauddeterrent actions related to the signing of important documents.

A Notary's duty is to screen the signers of documents -such as property deeds, wills and powers of attorney - for their true identity, their willingness to sign without duress or intimidation, and their awareness of the contents of the document or transaction. Impartiality is the foundation of the

and Jill Myers (bottom) bound not to act in situations where they have a personal interest. The public trusts that the Notary's screening tasks have not been corrupted by self-interest. A notary's log book is a legal document that can be inspected by

the state secretary's office for use in court. Pam McCartney (top) and Jill Myers (bottom) are Sun City's two licensed notaries. Both have full time accounting department jobs. Pam is the Accounts Payable staffer, while Jill prepares payroll for 300 employees and has other accounting responsibilities.

An appointment should be made for notary service: Jill, 966-1413, Pam, 966-1406. No walk-ins, please. The fee for notary service is \$5 per document. When the appointment is made, the notary has a chance to review the purpose of the document to be notarized and advise if a witness is required.

Clients are cautioned never to pre-sign anything that is to be notarized. Documents must be signed in the presence of the notary. Neither can a document be notarized that is printed in a foreign language.

Pam prefers to notarize witnessed wills and documents, instead of real estate transactions. Jill's preference is real estate documents where a witness is not required. Most often, depending on their work schedules, a morning appointment can produce a finished document that same afternoon.
