President's Message

Community Prepped to Face Challenges of Next 25 Years

October 2014 is 25 years after the first residents moved into Sun City Summerlin. Most of the early move-ins were on streets at the eastern end of Sun City, close to Rampart Boulevard. Since 1989, Sun City Summerlin has transformed into a first-class senior living community. Today, there remains demand from seniors to move into our community. The newcomers want to be a part of a community that offers senior-oriented activities while maintaining a clean and mature look on properties located along the 73 miles of streets owned and maintained by the city of Las Vegas.

It has been estimated that we have 13,000 residents in nearly 8,000 living units. That is a "small" city. Our population is slightly more than Boulder City, Nev. To maintain a small city, it takes a dedicated staff and residents who contribute their time and talents. Sun City has been fortunate to have many fine staff members over the years and this community would never survive without the dedication of its volunteer residents.

As we enter the next 25 years, we are going to be faced with the continued updating and refurbishing of our community facilities. Sustainability of water and power is going to be an issue of great importance to the Board of Directors.

Living within one of the greatest droughts of our region's history, residents must be aware of conservation measures. The Southern Nevada Water Authority may issue mandatory cutbacks on the use of water. This could have a real effect upon our golf courses.

Living in the desert, where we have more than 300 days per year of sunshine, makes us wonder where the use of solar panels will

go in the future and how it will be a factor in Sun City. Already, we see a solar installation at the Mountain View Presbyterian Church in our community. The church expects to cover a great majority of its electric costs from this installation. Fire Station 107 is presently installing solar panels and expects to cover over half of its electric costs to run the station.

We hope that Sun City never stands still and it reacts to the changes scheduled for the next 25 years.







Walk Your Way to Health & Happiness

Walking is one of the easiest, safest and most inexpensive types of physical activity. It's also relaxing and requires little athletic skill and does not call for club membership or special equipment other than sturdy, comfortable shoes. The results of walking are physically rewarding – a trim, fit

body better able to deal with the physical challenges of life and it will add enjoyable years to your life.

As always, consult with your physician before beginning an exercise program. For those with a long history of inactivity, problems with obesity, or don't like strenuous activity, walking is a great way to begin an exercise program. You can start slowly, then increase your speed and maintain a steady pace.

Walking will improve your cardiovascular fitness, muscle strength, balance and coordination. Walking gets the heart beating faster to transport oxygen-rich blood from lungs to muscles. Hearts and lungs grow more efficient with a regular walking regimen, reducing blood pressure. Walking is even a central element of medical rehabilitation. Recovery from many ailments, including a heart attack, is facilitated by a regular walking regimen. Walking also will improve your lower body muscle strength and balance.

When you're ready to begin, the best way to start is walking 10 to 20 uninterrupted minutes at least three times a week. Walk at a comfortable pace, slowing down if you find yourself breathing too heavily. Don't tire yourself. If 20 minutes is too much, cut back to 10 or 15 minutes. You can gradually increase your time and pace as your body adapts to the exercise.

Don't forget to drink lots of water and cool down after exercise by slowing down your pace. Stretching your muscles after a walk is always a good idea.

You are now ready to begin a walking program. A great way to start is to join us in the 25th Anniversary Fun Day 5K Walk, Breakfast and Old-time Candy Buffet on Saturday, October 11. Registration is open and ongoing at the social monitors' stations at each community center, and packet pick-up will begin at 8 a.m. on October 11 at Mountain Shadows. Las Vegas Mayor Carolyn Goodman will kick off the walk at 9 a.m. You can just do the small route around Mountain Shadows or you can do the whole route (approximately 3 miles) through Sun City neighborhoods. Either way, walking is a prescription for a healthier, happier life!

Burt Scheck enjoys his daily swim at the Desert Vista indoor pool. In addition to the exercise, he says the social aspect of the facility is unlike anywhere else.

Burt Scheck is 92 years old and his wife, Irene, has been his bride for 69 years. They have been residents of Sun City since 1990. Burt says, "At my age, exercise keeps your joints working and your heart healthy." He also believes in the Yin and Yang theory of keeping one's life in balance. In all, he says, "It's part physical and part mental, which is why he not only does his exercise regimen every day, but he also does puzzles, Suduko, Ken-Ken, Jumble and crosswords. All this keeps him in total balance.

Burt came out of the United States Army in 1945, and for about 10 years he found time to run five miles each day along the lakefront of Evanston, Ill. He also went to the YMCA and learned how to play handball. In 1955, he injured one of his knees, so running and playing handball were replaced with a strong regimen of swimming. He swam where and whenever he could. The swimming helped him recover faster than regular rehabilitation, he said.

In 2008, Burt underwent knee replacement surgery. When it came to his rehab, he remembered his days spent in Chicago-area pools and decided to do his physical therapy in the indoor pool at Desert Vista. The pool allowed him to swim almost whenever he wanted and, besides the exercise, swimming gives him a feeling of solitude, which, he says, helps make his mind stronger. Burt has swam at Sun Shadows, but he really enjoys the Desert Vista indoor pool because there is a social aspect to the facility that he didn't find elsewhere.

Burt says he believes in the Five Ds – dedication, desire, devotion, determination and discipline. His health and wellbeing is always on his mind, and he used the Five Ds to name his five sons – Dale, Dean, Donald, Duane and Danny.





Unless you know who is there, if you have an outside security door, talk through it. If you do not have a security door, it is

unnecessary to open anything. If you talk through a closed door, you should be heard by anyone on the other side

If you are awakened by a Security Patrol driver alerting you to an open garage door, or a flashing emergency light, he or she will be clearly recognizable. Through your front window you should identify a uniformed patrol officer with

a badge. The Patrol car with its rotating bright amber lights should be easily visible in front of your home. Jim Maher emphasizes that you will not offend the patrol officer if you do not open your door. He or she is interested only in checking on your welfare, or letting you know that something might be amiss at your home.
