Why Golf Is Good for You

Next, it is on to the practice range. I would like to hear from all of you who are interested in exercising with golf to let me know. We could add fitness classes, maybe right on the practice range! We'll call it "golfercise." Then, if you feel good about hitting balls and swinging the clubs — we can all play a little golf!

A New Look on Cheyenne Avenue

In 2008, negotiations between Sun City Summerlin and the city of Las Vegas were under way to bring a fire station to our community. The result was the creation of Las Vegas Fire & Rescue Station 107 at the corner of Del Webb and Sundial boulevards.

During the negotiations with the city, Sun City offered a site on the ninth tee of the Palm Valley Golf Course at no cost in exchange for a 2.5-mile-long strip of land outside the confines of Sun City along Cheyenne Avenue. The strip of land along Cheyenne Avenue was given to Sun City during the original planning of the community. For many years, Sun City spent very little money on maintenance of the land. From time to time, repairs to the walls that were knocked down by erratic drivers would cost the Association. Sun City saw an opportunity to rid itself of a liability when the subject of a new fire station arose. The City Public Works Department never liked the idea of taking the land and the maintenance associated thereto. To show you the creativity of the city of Las Vegas, we suggest you drive the 2.5-mile stretch of Cheyenne Avenue and observe the various objects and plants in place. The change is impressive and it changes the look of the northern border of Sun City. The city did end up paying Sun City nearly \$200,000 for the rebuilding of the ninth tee at Palm Valley. Sun City's





relationship with the city of Las Vegas is excellent, and we appreciate the improvements they contribute to our community.

Colorful Quilt Weaves a Patriotic Tale

Almost a century ago Frederick Forest Irish joined the U.S. Army to fight in Europe in the Great War. Fred was in the 129th Field Artillery, Battery F, of the 35th Division, from Kansas City, Missouri. His commanding officer was Lieutenant Harry S Truman.

On the eve of Independence Day, Sun City resident Don E. Irish recalls how his mother paid tribute to his dad's service, as well as all of the other men at war and the women who supported their efforts on the home front.

From his home, Don recounted how his mother, Zillah June Reed, Frederick's sweetheart, stayed at home. Zillah, being the second oldest of eight children, had responsibilities to assist her mother in caring for the younger children. When not watching over little ones or going about her daily chores, Zillah occupied her time by stitching a quilt to honor her beloved doughboy. When completed, the red, white and blue blanket sported 25 panels, each representing one of the many organizations and military units that had mobilized to support our troops.

When Frederick returned home from service in late 1918, he was thoroughly impressed by what Zillah had stitched. Over the years the quilt became a family treasure, preserved by members of the Irish family. Upon his mother's passing, the quilt fell into the possession of his sister Bettie, who safeguarded the heirloom. When Bettie died, the quilt passed to Don, whose desire to donate the quilt to the Museum of Liberty in Missouri has been a bit of a sentimental mission. According to Don, the quilt needs to be seen and celebrated as an artifact of history.

You see, after the war, the men from the 129th Field Artillery Unit routinely met each year in November (Armistice Day) to honor their fallen comrades at the Muehlbach Hotel in Kansas City, Missouri. At these reunions, Don's dad often spoke with Captain Harry S Truman. Many years later, Don himself developed a relationship with the then-President. In 1952, Don, a veteran of the Korean War, got a chance to meet privately with Truman at the White House. Their relationship became a strong friendship, and after Truman's retirement, he and Don met occasionally at Truman's office in Kansas City, Missouri.

The Liberty Memorial Museum was dedicated shortly after WWI. According to Don, the Irish family quilt is to be placed in the museum's collection to honor the women and men who were involved in the Great War who came from the Kansas City area.

Security Patrol Volunteers Are Your Neighbors

We cannot know how many times a would-be burglar has spotted a Security Patrol car and, knowing that the Patrol driver also saw him, he aborted his criminal intentions. While covering the community, Patrol drivers try to wave to each person they pass. They do so to be cordial, but also to make it known that the driver

has seen and may have noted information about the stranger. When someone doesn't look quite right – and it is impossible to define "quite right," because it is instinctive, a Patrol driver may stop to engage a stranger in polite conversation. Immediately, the person knows that the Patrol officer has had a close look at him or her. Most probably are good people, but some may have intentions that are not good. Occasionally, a Patrol driver will let a stranger see the driver jotting down his license plate number. How often has that changed a bad guy's mind about victimizing one of our residents? It's an immeasurable statistical benefit of Security Patrol.

Patrol drivers pay keen attention to younger-than-55year-olds when they're noticed walking through the community. Some are adult "boomerang" kids coping with a difficult economy that has compelled them to return home to stay with their parents. Last month, Security Patrol drivers stopped 296 times, after dark, to knock on residents' front doors alerting them that their garage door had been left open. No one knows how many times getting a door secured may have prevented a burglary. In one month, Patrol officers checked the exteriors of 419 homes whose residents were away from Sun City. Those inspectors discovered unlocked windows and doors that were later secured.

Security Patrol members, cooperating with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, acknowledges that there have been burglaries in the community. Still, Sun City's crime figures remain among the lowest in the valley. Metro recognizes that Security Patrol positively influences that statistic. The quality of volunteers who serve Security Patrol is praiseworthy and a fundamental reason for their work ethic is clearly apparent: They live here, too.



Plant Wilt Normal in Hot Weather

Summer is here again and I want to remind everyone about a couple of things. First, as I have written in the past is about the biggest killer of plants during the hot weather over-watering. When the temperatures get hot a plant will wilt a little and this is OK. When this happens, it is natural to want to add more water to the plant. However, adding unnecessary water does not allow the root zone to dry out and this can lead to root rot. After a while, adding too much water will kill the plant. It's always advised to check on how much water you are putting out. If you don't have preset, adjustable emitters that emit a certain amount of water, it can be difficult to judge how much water you are giving the plant. One way to figure out how much water is being used is to place a container under one of the emitters and turn it on or check it after the scheduled watering period the next morning. Then you can measure how much water the system emitted and adjust your timer accordingly. Most plants will require about 4 gallons per day during the summer.

The other reminder is to do your work during the coolest part of the day and to remember to drink plenty of



water while working in the yard. Eating is also very important. This advice is important when you are out and about enjoying your day, as well.

I hope everyone enjoys their summer.



Cyclists Take Exercise to the Streets

Daisey Parrish and Dick Edmister enjoy riding their bikes. In fact, the two have joined other like-minded residents recently who started an informal riding group in Sun City. The bicyclists are following a growing trend of people across the valley who are enjoying the many well accepted cardio fitness benefits cycling provides. Breaking out of the gym and onto the streets also has added a social element to their exercise that they find most rewarding.

"You may have noticed that cycling has become more common in Sin City," said Dick, who dusted off the cobwebs from the bike hanging in his garage. "That's because bicyclists enjoy our quiet streets. The community is also a good place to avoid traffic. Members of the group like to ride in small groups. It makes them more visible, and it is all around safer. Two flashy Spandex shirts are better than one."

The Sun City group differs from other groups with younger riders, as the most important criteria for selection of trails has been the avoidance of steep, uphill climbs and heavily traveled roadways. Unfortunately, there are no bike lanes or trails in Sun City, so ride leaders have been creative in defining segments that work for the group. Riders have about eight routes emanating from Sun City that were stitched together from Summerlin bicycle trails, parks and





designated bicycle lanes that traverse shady, well-groomed paths, natural washes and canyons and high-level pedestrian/bike bridges over wide, busy streets. Other destinations include pizza shops, taco and breakfast restaurants or simply a trailside shelter for a brown bag snack or meal. Ride leaders vary the routes to suit weather, traffic and other conditions. Sometimes they explore other potential routes in a process that looks a lot like being lost.

One of the best benefits of living in Sun City, Dick said, is the opportunity to enjoy a safe community and the chance to explore fitness outside the gyms and swimming pools. Cycling, he said, is a natural extension of walking, which many residents also enjoy. Drivers, however, need to understand that cyclists have a right to the roadways, too, Dick said. For information on cycling in and around Sun City, call Dick, 275-9500.

SHARE THE ROAD

- Bicyclists may ride on the sidewalk, but should exercise caution (by riding slower) and when passing pedestrians give an audible warning. Be aware that many pedestrians may not be thinking about bicycles coming up behind them.
- The shoulder of the road is not a bike lane unless there is a "bike rider" symbol stenciled on the pavement or a sign designating the bike lane.
- Drivers and bicyclists need to use special care in shared lanes, especially in right-turn situations. Bicyclists and cars must signal their intent. Eye contact is recommended.
- Cars passing bikes cannot pull back in front of a bike and cut it off. An acceptable clearance is required.



9 Holes at Palm Valley Due to Close All Summer

We are replacing all the broken asphalt cart paths on Palm Valley Golf Course with cement paths, starting Monday, July 6, for three months. The first nine holes will be closed to golfers due to equipment and workmen, who will work from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday. Golfers can play nine holes during the week for the special price of \$2 a hole and the course will be open for regular play on Saturdays and Sundays with only minor cart path detours. We expect to be finished with this huge project by September 30 and are sorry for the inconvenience to our golfers and residents.

Why The Work Needs To Be Done

Palm Valley Golf Course was the first course built in Sun City Summerlin more than 25 years ago. When the course was built, Del Webb installed approximately five miles of asphalt cart paths to get around the course for play. Over the years, the asphalt has broken down, and in some areas is worn down to gravel. The current path is in bad shape and has become a safety concern.

During the past year, the Golf Department has been evaluating what would be the best way to repair the cart path. Findings indicated that replacing the asphalt with concrete was the best solution. Future repairs to concrete are minimal compared to asphalt, which requires a seal coat and slurry seal maintenance every three to five years. That process alone requires the course to be closed to all golf cart traffic for several days.

The Board of Directors has approved the concrete project and work is set to begin. The process will include the removal of asphalt, and the preparation and pouring of concrete. Residents along the golf course will see construction equipment, including tractors and heavy-capacity trucks. The golf course will be noisy and busy for the duration of project. It is estimated that it will take approximately one week to complete each golf hole.

Golfers, July is a hot month, but great for keeping the limbs loose and pain-free. Handicaps go down and golf is more fun. Our courses are in great shape. Hopefully, they will stay that way throughout the summer months. During July there will be work on our courses. New concrete cart paths were authorized for Palm Valley, and

the work will begin this month. If Brian Bagwell, SCSCAI director of Golf Maintenance, is correct, it will take three months. This is the best time to do the work, as summer is our slow period. Work will be done on nine holes at a time. This schedule should keep the course open with nine holes every weekday and 18 holes every weekend. Weekday prices will be reduced to \$2 a hole for nine holes, or play nine holes again for an additional \$7! Please be patient with the workers, and remember they are improving the course for your benefit.

There also will be work on the bunkers at both courses. At Highland Falls, the bunkers will be hand-raked. This should improve the texture and make it easier to save par. Some of the bunkers will be changed, and some eliminated to improve the speed of play. Rakes will be kept outside of

Neighbors Talking to Neighbors

The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) has the responsibility of enforcing the Association's development standards. ARC oversees how our community looks overall. It is ARC's responsibility to ensure that Sun City maintains a unified aesthetic that protects homeowners' property values.

For instance, if weed growth is not controlled and becomes unsightly in a resident's yard, ARC will ask the homeowner to rectify the problem because an eyesore can negatively affect the community's real estate values. The same applies to a resident who makes design changes to his or her home that are not in compliance with established development standards.

Occasionally, ARC is asked to solve a problem existing between neighbors. Members of the committee review the complaint and make a reasonable judgment based upon the facts as to whether or not the dispute constitutes a neighbor-to-neighbor issue, or is one that would directly involve the Association.

A complaint is deemed a neighbor-to-neighbor issue when a "considerable number of persons" are not affected by the problem. A neighbor-to-neighbor issue is considered a

private nuisance. In such a case, the affected party may have to seek private mediation or legal help to resolve the problem.

Neighbor-to-neighbor issues can involve a broad range of topics, including property line issues, party walls, seeping walls, views, trees, shrubs, blowing leaves, pet and bird issues, noise, odors, blowing trash and anything that enters a resident's property from a neighbor's yard that is interpreted as interfering with the peaceful use and enjoyment of one's property.

If a neighbor-to-neighbor complaint is filed with the Community Standards office, a courtesy notice will be sent to the party informing them of the complaint. In many instances, the notice is enough to end the problem. No further action is taken by the Association.

ARC suggests residents exercise their best efforts to resolve problems through direct, responsible and amicable means. Make an effort to see your neighbor's perspective and try to work out a compromise. If direct communication and negotiation fail, the next step is to determine which agency to contact for further assistance. If the problem involves vehicles on the streets, call the city of Las Vegas Parking Enforcement, 229-6432; for complaints about pigeons, call the city of Las Vegas Neighborhood Response, 229-6615; animal or pet complaints, call the city of Las Vegas Animal Control, 229-6444, #2. For other issues you might want to consider the Clark County Neighborhood Justice Center, a local mediation service, 455-3898.






